# REPORT,

*Presented at Easter, 1924.*

---

After the strenuous few years of the formation of the Guild, the first year of its existence since Easter, 1923, has been a quiet time of consolidation.

There is, therefore, little to record; there have been 76 peals rung up to the end of 1923, some of which were in new methods.

The Secretary has had a number of enquiries and requests for advice as to the management and re-hanging of bells, and several new companies have been formed; some new companies have joined us, such as Mendlesham and Easton. Unfortunately, there seems no diminution of the disastrous practice of "clocking," and so ultimately cracking bells, in spite of Dr. David's earnestly expressed desire. The Secretary does not know of a single parish where this practice is not considered the right thing to do at a funeral; we know how difficult it is to change funeral customs.

The question of Districts, and whether more general meetings should be held, are matters we should now settle, and also whether the Guild should issue a Certificate to its members.

No deaths have been recorded, except that of Mr. W. Grimes, of Hadleigh, who not only died "in harness" but actually in the belfry. His works do follow him—may he rest in peace.

## RINGING MASTER'S REPORT.

---

The nine months from April 1st to the end of the year, 1923, produced 76 peals, an average of about two per week. Of these, four were rung in Essex, 12 in West Suffolk, and 60 in East Suffolk. Many bands have done well and shewn their loyalty to the Guild by their performances, but there are a few that deserve special mention. These are the two new Surprise Methods, "Lancashire" and "Edinburgh," at Leiston; the Double Norwich Major and Stedman Triples on Handbells by the Leiston band; the first Cambridge Surprise by a local band at Debenham; the peal of Surprise Minor by the Thornham men; and the Spliced Minor in ten methods at Wrentham.

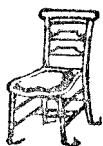

**OBJECTS.**

1.—**Federation.**—To supply an organisation which shall unite the separate companies of Church Bell Ringers within the Diocese, for the purpose of mutual support and encouragement in the performance of the duties of their office, and in the practice of their art.

2.—**Recognition.**—To obtain full recognition of the ringers' office as essentially a branch of the Church's work; that ringers and their services (qualification for which demands much time, skill, and mental labour) may be placed upon a true and acknowledged basis.

3.—**Promotion of Change Ringing.**—To encourage, cultivate, and foster the art of scientific Change-ringing by frequent meetings in various centres for practice or peal-ringing; and to provide, as far as possible, and at a reasonable cost, instructors when and where required.

4.—**Reform.**—To correct abuses, irregularities, irreverent and unbecoming behaviour in the ringing chamber; to promote a proper appreciation of it as a part of God's House; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment of the ringing chamber, as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition, to advocate needful repairs and renovations; and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of bells and their fittings.

## CONSTITUTION.

1.—The Guild shall consist of (a) Members, (b) Performing Members, (c) Honorary Members, (d) Life Members.

(a) Members may be elected at any Meeting when there are five other Members present. Or, by two other Members, before starting for a peal. No peal shall be recorded unless the subscriptions of all taking part in it are paid.

(b) Performing Members may be elected as soon as they have rung 120 changes on a Tower Bell ; or on two Handbells retained in hand.

(c) Honorary Members may be elected on a life payment of £2 2s. od.; or 5/- for the first year and 2/6 in subsequent years ; the other Members (including the Clergy), 1/- a year.

(d) Life Members, residing out of the Diocese, to pay 5/-.

2.—The Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, each District Secretary, and seven elected Members who may co-opt three other Members.

3.—All these shall be subject to election at each Annual General Meeting, held on Easter Monday at Ipswich and Bury St. Edmund's alternately.

4.—Each Archdeaconry may have its own Secretary, and hold its own Quarterly Meetings.

5.—A District Secretary, in his District, shall

(a) Arrange for Meetings for Practice.

(b) Arrange for Instruction.

(c) Collect the Subscriptions of all Members.

## RULES.

1.—Subscriptions shall be due on January 1st: New Members elected after October 31st shall not pay a second subscription for the next year.

2.—Any Member whose subscription is unpaid on December 31st, and on being reminded, does not pay his subscription, shall lose his membership. Lapsed Members may be reinstated on payment of 1/- in addition to the annual subscription.

3.—Junior Members, under the age of 17, may pay half the subscription and no entrance fee, but in that case may not vote at Meetings and will not receive a Report.

4.—The Committee may, at its discretion, allow a Tower to compound on payment of 1/- per bell yearly; this to include all the Ringers, Clergy, Steeplekeeper and Clerk; provided their names are sent to the Secretary with the subscriptions before Jan. 31st each year. Members who wish to be elected in any other month must pay the usual amounts for that year. As many Reports as there are bells will be supplied to the Secretary of a company so compounding. In return for this privilege, Members of such a Company should feel in honour bound to obtain as many Honorary Members as possible for the Guild.

5.—All ringing at Meetings of the Guild shall be such as is approved by the Central Council, and the decisions of the Central Council shall be recognised in recording any ringing performances.\*

6.—The Committee may remove a Member from the Guild for serious offences against the Objects and Rules.
