THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS FOR THE DIOCESE OF

ST. EDMUNDSBURY AND IPSWICH.

OBJECTS:

- 1.—Federation. To supply an organisation which shall unite the separate companies of Church Bell Ringers within the Diocese for the purpose of mutual support and encouragement in the performance of the duties of their office, and in the practice of their art.
- 2.—Recognition. To obtain full recognition of the ringers office as essentially a branch of the Church's work; that ringers and their services (qualifications for which demands much time, skill, and mental labour) may be placed upon a true and acknowledged basis.
- 3.—Promotion of Change Ringing. To encourage, cultivate, and foster the art of scientific Change Ringing by frequent meetings in various centres for practice or peal ringing; and to provide, as far as possible, and at a reasonable cost, instructors when and where required.
- 4.—Reform. To correct abuses, irregularities, irreverent and unbecoming behaviour in the ringing chamber; to promote a proper appreciation of it as a part of God's House; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment of the ringing chamber, as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition, to advocate needful repairs and renovations; and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of bells and their fittings.

CONSTITUTION.

- 1.—The Guild shall consist of (a) Members, (b) Performing Members, (c) Honorary Members, (d) Life Members.
 - (a) Members may be elected at any meeting when there are five other Members present. Or, by two other Members, before starting for a peal. No peal shall be recorded unless the subscriptions of all taking part in it are paid.
 - (b) Performing members may be elected as soon as they have rung 120 changes on a Tower Bell; or on two Handbells retained in hand.
 - (c) Honorary Members may be elected on a life payment of £2 2s. 0d.; or 2s. 6d. a year; the other Members (including the Clergy), 1s. 6d. a year.
 - (d) Life Members, residing out of the Diocese, to pay 5s.
- 2.—The Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, each District Secretary, and seven elected Members, who may co-opt three other Members.
- 3.—All these shall be subject to election at each Annual General Meeting, held after Easter Day at Ipswich and Bury St. Edmunds alternately.
- 4.—Each Archdeaconry may have its own Secretary, and hold its own Quarterly Meetings.
 - 5.—A District Secretary, in his District, shall
 - (a) Arrange for Meetings for Practice.
 - (b) Arrange for Instruction.
 - (c) Collect the Subscriptions of all Members.
- N.B.—In each company there shall be chosen a Secretary (or Captain, or Ringing Master), who shall collect all Subscriptions as soon after January 1st as possible, and send them to the District Secretary.
- 6.—This Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Change Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the Rules and decisions thereof.

RULES.

- 1.—Subscriptions shall be due on January 1st. New Members elected after October 31st shall not pay a second subscription for the next year.
- 2.—Any Member whose subscription is unpaid on December 31st and, on being reminded, does not pay his subscription, shall lose his membership. Lapsed Members may be reinstated on payment of 1s. in addition to the annual subscription.
- 3.—Junior Members, under the age of 17, may pay half the subscription and no entrance fee, but in that case may not wote at meetings and will not receive a Report.
- 4.—The Committee may, at its discretion, allow a Tower to compound on payment of 1s. 6d. per bell yearly; this to include all the Ringers, Clergy, Steeplekeeper, and Clerk; provided their names are sent to the Secretary with the subscriptions before January 31st each year. Members who wish to be elected in any other month must pay the usual amounts for that year. As many Reports as there are bells will be supplied to the Secretary of a Company so compounding. In return for this privilege, Members of such a Company should feel in honour bound to obtain as many Honorary Members as possible for the Guild.
- 5.—All ringing at Meetings of the Guild shall be such as is approved by the Central Council, and the decisions of the Central Council shall be recognised in recording any ringing performances.†
- 6.—The Committee may remove a Member from the Guild for serious offences against the Objects and Rules.
- 7.—These Rules can only be altered by a General Meeting, after notice given at a previous General Meeting or at each Branch or District Meeting. The Objects and Constitution can only be altered by a resolution passed at two General Meetings. Provided that the amounts of Subscriptions can be altered at a General Meeting after three months' notice.

Secretary's Report for 1938.

It is with great regret that we have to record the death of the Archdeacon of Suffolk, Ven. J. G. R. Darling, M.A., one of our Vice-Presidents, also of Mr. Arthur Symonds, of Lavenham, one of the founders of the Suffolk Guild and a good instructor and help to young ringers.

Mr. C. J. Trotman, of Woodbridge, he, too, had taught a young band to ring and did a great deal in making the ringing chamber at this tower so bright and clean; and Mr. Harry Smith, of Assington, not known so well as above members, but very

interested and keen to teach the art of ringing.

Meetings have been held at Beccles, Ipswich, Hollesley, Kedington, Stratford St. Mary, Debenham, Sudbury, Newmarket, Woodbridge, Elveden, Saxmundham and Redgrave.

We should like to thank all members for their support and help and especially to the District Secretaries in collecting members' subscriptions.

COMMUNICATED BY REV. H. DRAKE.

The representative of the Suffolk Guild on the Rural Community Council was asked to arrange for a dozen members to meet the Duke of Kent on his visit to the county on June 8th. As head of this organisation, his Royal Highness wished to see what was being done in this, the latest county to have a R.C. It was impossible to get anyone from West Suffolk. but others from nearer towers (including Miss Sylvia Bowyer, who works there), met at the County Hall. The representatives met in the Council Chamber, where a few were presented to his Royal Highness. The rest were in the car park below, where he went up to several by himself, and spoke to them in turn, thus almost the first he spoke to were ringers, and he had a long talk to our members, being much interested in our art, of which before he had never heard. As two of our members were at Leeds for the Central Council the previous day, it had meant an early start, and a long journey to arrive in time, but we felt that it was worth it to have interested Royalty in our art, a matter which so many in high places take for granted.

Ringing Master's Report, 1938.

The year 1938 provides us with the largest number of peals yet recorded for the Guild—116. This total would without doubt have been higher but for the very severe weather at the end of the year. These peals have been rung in 47 towers in Suffolk and two in Essex. St. Mary-le-Tower, Ipswich, heads the list with 12 peals—10 of Maximus and two of Royal. The St. Mary-le-Tower Society as will be seen from the peal list, has had a record year and remains in the front rank of twelve bell bands. Helmingham and Framsden have 13 peals between them and the band attached to these towers has again provided some very good performances, including four new Surprise Methods. The band centred around Stowmarket continues to do good work and is responsible for the three peals on the fine ten at Stonham Aspal.

Our six bell bands have again been active, having rung 41 peals, including 9 in seven methods. A peal of more than usual interest was recorded at Debenham on December 3rd by a band of "Williams." The responsibility of conducting was shared by 40 members, as against 36 last year. It is worthy of record that several members have rung their first peal or their first in various methods.

By ringing in 51 peals for the Guild, Miss Sylvia Bowyer, of Ipswich, has set up an outstanding record of enthusiasm and ability, which should prove an example to our young ringers.

Bell restoration has taken place at Saxmundham, where the ring of six has been re-hung, and also at All Saints, Sudbury; whilst a welcome addition to the eights in the county has been provided at Hollesley, where a new peal has been installed as a golden wedding memorial by Sir John and Lady Jervis-White-Jervis. Is it too much to hope that the bell-hangers' services will be requisitioned for other of our Suffolk peals which are in a bad state, notably Horham, the oldest ring of eight in the county, and the fine old peal at Boxford, both of which are now unringable?
