THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS FOR THE DIOCESE OF

ST. EDMUNDSBURY AND IPSWICH.

OBJECTS:

- 1.—Federation. To supply an organisation which shall unite the separate companies of Church Bell Ringers within the Diocese for the purpose of mutual support and encouragement in the performance of the duties of their office, and in the practice of their art.
- 2.—Recognition. To obtain full recognition of the ringers office as essentially a branch of the Church's work; that ringers and their services (qualifications for which demands much time, skill, and mental labour) may be placed upon a true and acknowledged basis.
- 3.—Promotion of Change Ringing. To encourage, cultivate, and foster the art of scientific Change Ringing by frequent meetings in various centres for practice or peal ringing; and to provide, as far as possible, and at a reasonable cost, instructors when and where required.
- 4.—Reform. To correct abuses, irregularities, irreverent and unbecoming behaviour in the ringing chamber; to promote a proper appreciation of it as a part of God's House; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment of the ringing chamber, as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition, to advocate needful repairs and renovations; and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of bells and their fittings.

CONSTITUTION.

- 1.—The Guild shall consist of (a) Members, (b) Performing Members, (c) Honorary Members, (d) Life Members.
 - (a) Members may be elected at any meeting when there are five other Members present. Or, by two other Members, before starting for a peal. No peal shall be recorded unless the subscriptions of all taking part in it are paid.
 - (b) Performing members may be elected as soon as they have rung 120 changes on a Tower Bell; or on two Handbells retained in hand.
 - (c) Honorary Members may be elected on a life payment of £2 2s. 0d.; or 2s. 6d. a year; the other Members (including the Clergy), 1s. 6d. a year.
 - (d) Life Members, residing out of the Diocese, to pay 5s.
- 2.—The Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, each District Secretary, and seven elected Members, who may co-opt three other Members.
- 3.—All these shall be subject to election at each Annual General Meeting, held after Easter Day at Ipswich and Bury St. Edmunds alternately.
- 4.—Each Archdeaconry may have its own Secretary, and hold its own Quarterly Meetings.
 - 5.—A District Secretary, in his District, shall
 - (a) Arrange for Meetings for Practice.
 - (b) Arrange for Instruction.
 - (c) Collect the Subscriptions of all Members.
- N.B.—In each company there shall be chosen a Secretary (or Captain, or Ringing Master), who shall collect all Subscriptions as soon after January 1st as possible, and send them to the District Secretary.
- 6.—This Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Change Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the Rules and decisions thereof.

RULES.

- 1.—Subscriptions shall be due on January 1st. New Members elected after October 31st shall not pay a second subscription for the next year.
- 2.—Any Member whose subscription is unpaid on December 31st and, on being reminded, does not pay his subscription, shall lose his membership. Lapsed Members may be reinstated on payment of 1s. in addition to the annual subscription.
- 3.—Junior Members, under the age of 17, may pay half the subscription and no entrance fee, but in that case may not vote at meetings and will not receive a Report.
- 4.—The Committee may, at its discretion, allow a Tower to compound on payment of 1s. 6d. per bell yearly; this to include all the Ringers, Clergy, Steeplekeeper, and Clerk; provided their names are sent to the Secretary with the subscriptions before January 31st each year. Members who wish to be elected in any other month must pay the usual amounts for that year. As many Reports as there are bells will be supplied to the Secretary of a Company so compounding. In return for this privilege, Members of such a Company should feel in honour bound to obtain as many Honorary Members as possible for the Guild.
- 5.—All ringing at Meetings of the Guild shall be such as is approved by the Central Council, and the decisions of the Central Council shall be recognised in recording any ringing performances.†
- 6.—The Committee may remove a Member from the Guild for serious offences against the Objects and Rules.
- 7.—These Rules can only be altered by a General Meeting, after notice given at a previous General Meeting or at each Branch or District Meeting. The Objects and Constitution can only be altered by a resolution passed at two General Meetings. Provided that the amounts of Subscriptions can be altered at a General Meeting after three months' notice.
- 8.—Should a ringing member, having paid five consecutive years subscription, remove from the Diocese, he may without further payment, become a Non-Resident member for such time as he continues to reside outside the Diocese.

CLARKE, FRED C., GRUNDISBURGH. One of the old generation of ringers, whose son and grandson have both followed in his footsteps.

POPPY, ERNEST F., STOKE ASH. One of the best known members of the Guild; a keen ringer and Churchman, he was a Churchwarden of his parish church, Stoke Ash, and member of the Rural District Council. His peals, which included many of more than ordinary interest, totalled 346, of which 89 had been rung for the Suffolk Guild. He had a great knowledge of East Anghan ringing lore, which made it a pleasure to meet and talk with him. His genial personality and sage counsel on committee will be greatly missed.

Ringing Master's Report, 1939.

During the year 1939, covered by this Report, 54 peals were recorded for the Guild, all with one exception, rung in the County; 139 members taking part in them and 24 appearing as conductors. These peals were all rung in the first eight months of the year, there having been a complete cessation of peal-ringing since the outbreak of war.

The St. Mary-le-Tower Society again had a successful year, ringing 7 peals on their own bells, including the first of York Surprise Maximus ever rung; they also rung at Debenham, the first of York Surprise Major for the Guild, and the only peal outside the county, Cambridge Surprise Maximus at Yarmouth, the first on the bells.

The Stowmarket band, with several good performances, including a successful day at Elveden and Mildenhall on Easter Monday, have again done well. It is a pleasure to record a peal of Bristol Surprise at Leiston, bringing to mind, as it does memories of the great days of the local band. We miss the customary outstanding performances of our Helmingham friends, this being the first time for several years we have not had to record "the first in the method" by them, we shall look confidently for a revival here, when the dark days of war have passed. Our six-bell ringers have some meritorious performances to their credit, including three peals in seven different methods. We should like to see more of our six-bell bands throughout the county appearing in our records.

The Directory has again been included in the Report, in the hope that it will be useful to ringers when arranging visits to other towers. We are indebted to Mr. Fred Bowell, of the Ipswich Bell Foundry, who has a great knowledge of Suffolk bells, for his help in revising and bringing it up to date.

As this is the last Report that will be issued—in all probability—for some time, I should like to conclude by asking members to do all they can to interest and train beginners in the art. Meetings can be arranged on Saturday afternoons and evenings in the summer time, and if visitors are welcomed and encouraged, much can be done. If tower bells are not available, get the handbells out and practice on these, there is no more fascinating branch of our art. It should be realised that there is just as much interest—and perhaps more credit due—in getting a beginner through his first 720, as through his first peal.
