## RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

Having kept no records prior to the Annual General Meeting when you elected me to the post of Ringing Master, this report covers only the last eight months. But good work has been done during the year and 135 peals have been rung for the Guild in 63 different Towers. Euston has had its first peal and Stoke-by-Nayland its first since augmentation. Long silences have been broken at Chediston (32 years), Laxfield, Dennington and Weybread (23 years), and Whepstead (24 years). Two records for the Guild come from the 15 Doubles Methods peal at Ixworth and the first ladies peal to be rung in Suffolk. "Well done girls" now what about a Royal peal in the near future?

Six firsts of Bob Triples at Elveden it is hoped will lead to other Methods.

Our worthy Secretary has had a busy year and is top peal scorer with 40 to his credit not forgetting that "go anywhere" enthusiast Ted Chapman, with peals over the border, but who has also rung 40 peals for the Guild this year. He has been a great help to John in reaching their fine total as also to Jack Gibson who is runner-up with 39 peals to his credit.

Two Golden Wedding peals have been rung, one for that evergreen youngster, George E. Symonds, at St. Mary le Tower and the other for Fred Brunning, still a very interested member of Eye. Congratulations to Bob Lester on his 200th peal, who although having been barred by illness, it is hoped he will soon be "peal fit" again. This all-ringing family is doing good work in their area with service ringing. A party from here attended the Annual Social at Lavenham organised by Rosemary Seabrook, the Lavenham ringers and their wives. Some 90 ringers were present and an enjoyable evening was spent by all.

It is most pleasing to see first pealers and conductors. I would also like to mention Ken Brown and Leslie Melton both of whom have been going places.

Although they are now the leading local band, our friends at Bures have been very quiet --- no peals recorded. It is hoped that this is only a temporary relapse.

We welcome home from National Service, Jim Morley and Chummy Allum, and maybe others. Wherever they ring they should be a great asset to the band and given the opportunity, will be conductors. On the shortest day, Pat Clarke took part in two peals and finished in good form. "Well done Pat!"

At the time of writing we are looking forward to the 12-bell practices, which I advocated, with help from St. Mary le Tower. It is hoped much good will be forthcoming.

## GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

This has been yet another year of steady progress. Membership appears to be maintained at a high level and meetings have been held throughout the Diocese although the attendance at some was not up

to the usual standard. Instructors have been active teaching recruits and we must all back up their efforts during the months ahead so that Sunday Service ringing can be maintained and improved. Once again our thanks must be accorded to the District Secretaries for their hard work. Please continue to give them your wholehearted support as this is the finest way in which we can all express our appreciation of their services.

The finances appear to have held their own despite the increasing cost of living, but the accounts do not show the complete position as not all funds had reached me by December 31st. Grants have been paid to Wenhaston, Stoke-by-Nayland and Theberton from the Restoration Fund and collections for the fund have been made at some meetings during the year and it is to be hoped that this will become normal procedure at ALL meetings in future.

Mr. Sedgley retired from the office of Ringing Master, a post he has held since 1923. In recognition of his many years of service he was unanimously elected a Vice-President. Mr. Les Brett, the popular Framsdon Conductor, was elected to succeed Mr. Sedgley and we all wish him success in his task. Mr. Ronald Clouston has been appointed Technical Adviser to the Guild and his report is printed in this issue.

During 1957 we rang 135 peals, the highest total ever recorded by the Guild, being 8 more than the previous record of 127 peals in 1954. Over 200 members took part in these peals and although rung on all numbers of bells, no peal of cinquies is recorded.

This year saw the introduction of the Guild Badge which, I believe, has had a good reception. 328 were purchased, and at the time of writing 170 have been sold. They are 3s. each and may be obtained from Miss Rosemary Seabrook, Mr. K. G. Brown, or myself.

It is with regret that we record the passing of Messrs. Wm. Wightman and E. Goodwin, to whose families, and those of any others who may have passed on to higher service, we extend our sympathy.

The augmented ring of six at Theberton was dedicated on December 14th. This proved to be a large gathering of ringers from all parts of the County. First the warm welcome and inspiring service in the beautifully restored church, to be followed by the pleasure of ringing on the pleasant toned light ring of bells will linger long in the minds of those present. Afterwards in the Hall, at the social gathering, the Rector received from Mr. C. W. Pipe (Vice-President) a donation from the Guild Restoration Fund.

Other restorations are pending. Oakley bells are already in the hands of the founders and work is being contemplated at Eye and Marlesford. These are good signs for the future and we shall all look forward to these schemes being brought to successful conclusions.

May we all resolve to make 1958 an even better record year than 1957.

## TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

During 1957 the writer has inspected and reported on the bells in 51 of our Suffolk church towers, these reports being duplicated to the parish concerned, the Archdeacon and the Hon. Secretary of the Diocesan Advisory Committee, of which the writer is a member.

Of these 51 churches, thirteen could be considered to contain rings of bells though a number are now quite unringable and in one case, Orford, some of the bells are cracked and unhung.

The unringable bells reported on are at Shelley (5), Westhorpe (5), Nowton, by Bury (6), Little Thurlow (5), and Clopton (6).

The remaining reports related to Marlesford (5) where the treble has fallen out of its bearings and the main frame has completed its useful life : Eye (8) where the bells badly require overhauling, Iken (4) one of our few ringable fours, Winston (5), Otley (6), Harkstead (5), Oakley (6).

Faculties have been granted during the year for the following work :

Ringsfield. Overhauling the two existing bells and adding a middle bell. The whole being rehung in a new framework for ringing in full circles with space for further bells. This work is now complete.

Eriswell. The addition of two trebles to the existing three. The whole to be hung for change ringing.

Oakley. Provision of a new frame, recasting of the 1828 fourth bell cracked in the crown, and rehanging with new fittings.

During 1957 the bells at Theberton were rededicated after a lengthy silence. A new treble has been added to the old five and all are now hung in a new metal frame with modern fittings.

It has been a great disappointment to the writer that an order has not yet been placed to have the eight bells at St. Margaret's, Ipswich, overhauled. With the twelve at St. Mary-le-Tower in poor order, ringing in Ipswich cannot be expected to flourish under the present conditions.

The writer has now reported on the state of the bells in 113 of our Suffolk towers which number some 500. The results so far indicate the very poor state of many of our belfries and in a number of towers containing up to four bells most unsafe conditions. Far too high a proportion of the bells are unsafely clocked due to decayed and insecure fittings.

The writer would be pleased to hear of any member of the Guild who is physically active and mechanically inclined to assist him in this work. It would be preferable if such a person lived near Ipswich but this is not essential. The work is of considerable interest as no complete engineering survey has ever been made of bells in the Diocese and one never knows what one is going to find.

John Taylor and Co., and a new treble added, being the gift of a parishioner, Mr. Reuben Wright, as a memorial to his wife. The rededication took place in mid-December and was carried out by Canon J. R. Chapman, a former Rector of Theberton. The following week the first peal ever rung at this tower was recorded in 2 hours and 31 minutes, conducted by the District Ringing Master.
