## OBJECTS

1. **Federation.** To supply an organisation which shall unite the separate companies of Church Bell Ringers within the Diocese for the purpose of mutual support and encouragement in the performance of the duties of their office, and in the practice of their art.

2. **Recognition.** To obtain full recognition of the ringers office as essentially a branch of the Church's work ; that ringers and their services (qualifications for which demand much time, skill and mental labour) may be placed upon a true and acknowledged basis.

3. **Promotion of Change Ringing.** To encourage, cultivate, and foster the art of scientific Change Ringing by frequent meetings in various centres for practice or peal ringing ; and to provide, as far as possible, instructors when and where required.

4. **Reform.** To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as a part of God's House ; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof, as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition ; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of bells and their fittings.

## CONSTITUTION

1. The Officers of the Guild shall consist of : The Lord Bishop of the Diocese as President, Patrons, Vice-Presidents, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor and Technical Adviser.

2. The Guild shall consist of (a) Ringing Members ; (b) Honorary Members ; (c) Life Members.

(a) Ringing Members may be elected at any meeting where there are five other members present, or, provisionally by two other Members, before starting for a peal. Ringing Members may be elected as soon as they have rung 120 changes on a tower bell or on two handbells retained in hand. The subscription of Ringing Members shall be 2s. 6d. per year.

(b) Honorary Members may be elected on a life payment of £2 : 2 : 0 or 2s. 6d. per year.

(c) Life Members, residing out of the Diocese, to make a single payment of 5s.

3. The Committee shall consist of the Vice-Presidents, the Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer, and twelve elected members, to be subject to election at each Annual General Meeting, who may co-opt two other members. Seven to form a quorum.

4. The area covered by the Guild shall be divided into districts each of which shall have its own Ringing Master and Secretary. The Secretary will :—

(a) Arrange Meetings for Practice.

(b) Arrange for Instruction.

(c) Collect the subscriptions of all Members.

**N.B.** In each Company there shall be chosen a Secretary or Captain, or Ringing Master, who shall collect all subscriptions as soon as possible after January 1st and send them to the District Secretary.

(d) Forward these subscriptions to the General Secretary together with his receipt book and details of any expenditure, at the end of the year for audit.

5. The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

## **RULES**

1. Subscriptions shall be due on January 1st. New Members elected after 31st October will not be required to pay a second subscription for the following year.

2. Any Member whose subscription is unpaid on December 31st shall lose his membership. No peal shall be recorded unless the subscriptions of all taking part in it are paid. Lapsed Members may be reinstated on payment of 2s. in addition to the annual subscription.

3. Probationers under the age of 16 may be elected on payment of half the annual subscription.

4. The Committee may allow a Tower to compound on payment of 2s. 6d. per bell yearly ; this to include all the ringers whose names shall be sent to the Secretary at the time of payment of the annual subscription. The number of reports issued will equal the number of bells.

5. Should a ringing Member, having paid five consecutive years' subscription, remove from the Diocese, he may without payment, become a Non-Resident Member for such time as he continues to reside outside the Diocese.

6. All ringing at Meetings of the Guild shall be under the direction of a Ringing Master and shall be such as is approved by the Central Council. The decisions of the Central Council shall be recognised in recording any ringing performances.

7. The Committee may remove a Member from the Guild for a serious offence against the Objects and Rules, subject to appeal at a General Meeting.

8. The Objects, Constitution and Rules can only be altered by a General Meeting after three months' notice given at a General Meeting.

9. A peal fee of 6d. per rope is payable in respect of all peals rung for the Guild. Conductors are responsible for collecting these and forwarding them to the General Secretary. No peal will be recorded unless the peal fees have been paid.

### **RINGING MASTER'S REPORT**

A somewhat quieter year as regards peals, only 82 being recorded against 135 in 1957. Six peals of Doubles include 2 "firsts" on the bells, Hereningham and Eriswell. 38 of Minor were rung, of interest were 10 methods at Theberton, 7 Surprise at Aldeburgh and Blythburgh and 8 Surprise at Cavendish, whilst from Oakley comes the first on the bells.

Plain Bob Major at Lavenham (Silent) maybe will take on in other methods (Congratulations), likewise to the band who rang in the Melbourne peal in honour of the birth of a daughter to George and Diana Pipe, their earliest return will be welcomed by us all.

Only one peal of Caters was rung, against two of Cam Royal.

Quite appropriate was the peal of Little Bob Royal at Bury for the induction of the new Provost, Rev. J. Waddington, from St. Peter's Mancroft, whose band so ably completed the double.

Most disappointing of peals during the year was the failure to ring the Cam Max in honour of the 'first ever' rung at S.M.L.T. 50 years ago. This proved we still badly need those 12 bell practices, but which seem to be losing interest. Is the time not far away when we shall have neither a 12 bell band or someone who can call a peal of Cinques? Do let us revive this! Likewise handbell ringing, no peal has been recorded. Quite a few familiar names are missing from our peal columns throughout the county, it is hoped, only temporary, as this also means absence from service ringing.

We all now look forward to the amalgamation of the districts which, it is hoped, will be an asset to the running of the Guild and ringing in general. With your fullest support this should materialize.

"Grundisburgh bells on the air", it is hoped is the beginning to further broadcasts from the good peals we have in Suffolk. "Congratulations Grundisburgh, a loyal job well done". Furthermore to finish the year with "Holt's Original", the only peal of Grandsire Triples rung. To Rod Pipe, the conductor "Congratulations". Likewise to Pat Clarke for scoring her 100th peal at 22, and last, but not least, to that still so young enthusiast, George E. Symonds, on completing 72 years as a ringer and over 90 peals of Maximus to his credit.

### **GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT**

On the whole 1958 has been a quieter year, but has nevertheless been an active one in many ways. Meetings have been held throughout



the Diocese and it has been a source of disappointment to some of our District Secretaries that the attendance has not always been good. A great deal of thought and work has been put into the proposed re-organisation which it is hoped will streamline the organisation of running the affairs of a Guild such as this. Let us all aim at making 1959 a successful year from this angle. Your presence and enthusiasm can greatly enhance the attraction of this side of our activities and strengthen the bonds of fellowship between members and districts. The presiding Master at any meeting wishes to do his best by ALL present and we can best help him by studying something fresh at home beforehand, and a willing co-operation at the Tower. This applies more especially to the beginners, but also to the more advanced who can do much by standing behind the others to guide where necessary, and advancement be attained. Finally we must not overlook the fact that however good we may be we must still strive to improve our striking.

Returning for a moment to the proposed re-organisation of the Districts, I would refer to the dilemma in which many Secretaries find themselves when trying to arrange dates for meetings. This is one thing which we should be able to overcome. It should be possible to fix dates for the whole year without any clashing whatsoever under the new scheme. In the past many meetings have been ruined because of this.

We have seen several changes in the District Secretaries this year, Mr. Cook has retired from Eye District but has continued to collect subscriptions pending either a new appointment or re-organisation. Mr. Anthony Mann has taken over from Mrs. Peachey in the Mildenhall District, Mr. L. Wright has replaced Mr. Brown in the Bury St. Edmunds District, and at the end of the year Mr. Clifford Lovett took over from Mr. C. W. Pipe in the Woodbridge District. Our sincere thanks are due to all these as well as to all those who are still in office.

The Annual General Meeting was held at Bury St. Edmunds on Saturday, April 12th. This was a well-attended meeting and greatly enjoyed by all members and visitors attending. At this meeting it was proposed that we should invite Mr. R. A. Vestey, of Great Thurlow, to become a Patron of the Guild as a mark of our appreciation of his services to ringing in the Diocese and I am very glad to inform you that he has graciously accepted.

It is with regret that we record the passing of The Very Reverend J. L. White, Provost of St. Edmundsbury and a Vice-President of the Guild. Ernest Grimes of Ipswich, George Wightman (formerly of Cretingham and more recently of Great Baddow), Arthur Coleman of Cotton and Edward G. Grindell of Southwold. Our sympathy is extended to the relatives of these and any others who may have passed on to higher service during the year.

Once more it is gratifying to report that the accounts have managed to hold their own, this is only possible by the full support of members in the prompt payment of their subscriptions and dues. I much ap-

preciate your help in this respect and look forward to your continued co-operation in 1959.

Further restoration has taken place this year at Oakley and St. Margaret's Ipswich, whilst at Eriswell both augmentation and restoration have been achieved mainly through the assistance of American Servicemen in the area. Both the leading Bell Founders have been involved and further restorations are envisaged at Eye, Offton and Marlesford. Our thanks and support are due to all connected with these projects. During 1958 grants were made to Theberton and St. Margaret's Ipswich.

On the question of peals, I feel I cannot say more than that it has been a good average year, 82 having been recorded. But I would say that it is indeed an honour to have a peal rung for us on the other side of the world. "Congratulations George and Diana".

But if George has honoured us I believe that Grandfather Jim has given us a masterpiece in his Christmas Day broadcast. Apart from being a first class effort by all the band, the bells started from and returned to rounds in what we all agree is a short time and this is what to my mind gave it that touch of perfection and labelled it "First Prize — Thank you Grundisburgh!"

This year we are printing a directory of towers for the first time since 1939. A great deal of hard work and research have gone into it and for this we owe a note of thanks to our technical adviser, Mr. Clouston.

Space and time are too limited to record all the many things that have been put into 1958, but I cannot close without expressing my thanks to all members for everything they have contributed, however small, and may 1959 prove to be even more worthy.

### TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

During 1958 the writer inspected and submitted detailed reports on the contents of a further 28 towers in the Diocese, making the total to date, 141. Of these 28, seven contained rings of bells, these being, Sudbury St. Peter, Shimpling, Wetheringsett, Witnesham, Offton, Troston and Baylham. All are in an unsatisfactory condition, and those at Shimpling, Witnesham, Offton and Troston are unringable. Offton bells have now been removed for rehangng.

Faculties or Archdeacon's Licences have been granted during the year for the following work : —

**Kettleburgh.** Lowering the three bells to the ground for safety.

**Marlesford.** Rehangng the five bells with a new treble to make six in a new metal frame.

**Icklingham St. James.** Recasting and rehangng the cracked 18th Cent. single bell.

**Offton.** Rehangng the five bells with a new treble to make six in a new metal frame.

**Sudbury St. Peter.** Repairs to the church fabric which includes overhauling the bells.

**Orford.** Restoring the top of the tower to its original height, provision being made for the re-installation of a ring of bells later.

**Troston.** Restoration of the tower which will be followed later by the restoration of the ring of six bells.

**Eye.** Rehangng the bells and recasting the tenor which is cracked in the crown.

**Ipswich St. Francis.** The installation of the 14th Cent. third bell from Stanton St. John in the tower of this new church being built on the Chantry Estate. The tower is only big enough for this one bell which will be swing chimed.

**Great Thurlow.** The addition of a treble bell to make six.

During the year the rings at Eriswell, Oakley, and St. Margaret's Ipswich have been rededicated after receiving attention from the bell-founders. The single bells at Pettaugh, Brantham, and Claydon have been completely rehung, and the writer has done some minor work at Great Wenham, Shelley, Semer, Nedging and Naughton to enable the bells to be safely sounded.

The writer has addressed a weekend course at Belstead House, Ipswich on bells and change ringing, and he has paid further visits to 16 churches to give advice or to inspect completed work on the bells.

There is a good chance that the bells at Aldeburgh will soon receive attention, but the prospects are not so bright in the case of St. Mary-le-Tower, Ipswich.

The writer has for some while wanted to assess the state of every ring of bells in the Diocese and to revise the information given in the 1939 Guild Report. With this in mind he has in the past year made inspections of 25 rings about which he had no information. Of these the great majority were found to be unringable. In addition he has rung in 36 towers in the Diocese in the year and has seen the bells being swung and observed frame movements, etc. The information so collected has been incorporated in the list given in this report of the rings and their present-day state.

The writer would like to record his thanks to Mr. Ronald Steward who has been of great assistance with ladders and equipment, and also to Mr. Leonard Last for so kindly organising outings to rings in the Diocese which are almost never rung so that an assessment could be made of their state.

A number of members of the Guild, and especially Mr. Trevor Bailey, have been very helpful with information on the state of some of our rings.

Excluding the East Bergholt ring which must be considered as abnormal, the 242 rings listed can be grouped thus :—

Excellent .....	51 rings
Good .....	66 rings
Fair .....	35 rings
Poor .....	12 rings
Code 0 to 5 .....	78 rings

Of this latter category of 78, only 11 are listed as code 4 or 5 which could be rung at a pinch for short periods, and the remainder are quite unringable.

This position is far from satisfactory and Guild members should make every effort to get something done in the too numerous black spots.

The need for more recruits to take up ringing is always in the front and it is gratifying to know that training is going on at Aldeburgh, Kelsale and Leiston, but we must not stop this work if we are going to keep our Church bells ringing.

News has come to me of inspection of the bells and fittings at Rendham and a hope that the bells will be ringing again soon.

The proposed new districts came under discussion at the Leiston meeting, these will, if accepted by the Guild, make the administration work easier and better attendance at meetings.

One last word for 1958, don't forget to take the "Ringing World" in 1959.
