

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

A much improved year with 110 peals rung against 79 in 1959.

With only one peal of Max we record 11 of Royal. Of interest were two of London when more scored their first in this now popular and interesting method. Also Grunisburgh Surprise by C. J. Sedgley was rung for the first time as was the Major. Although no peal of Cinques or Triples were rung, there are three of Caters. 29 peals of Major were made up by a variety of Surprise methods and Double Norwich not entirely forgotten.

Undoubtably an interesting Minor year with 62, of these 18 were in seven methods, two of seven Surprise, 11 in more than seven methods—i.e. 9 (3), 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17 and 22.

Whilst congratulating the conductors, and all who took part in these peals, special mention goes to the 11 Surprise at Blythburgh only to be surpassed by 14 Surprise at Barking, a record for the Guild. Likewise the 12,240, in 17 methods at Askbocking also a record. To the band our congratulations. Two peals of Minor were rung on handbells. Les Melton calling his first "in hand," and the other the first peal by Miss Irene A. Cross of Exning, at the age of 14. "Well done."

Five peals of Doubles also include one on handbells.

These peals were rung in 42 Towers and the conducting was shared by 30, to be headed by Rod Pipe with 24.

Again this report would not be complete without mention of that young man of Ipswich, George E. Symonds, who at the closing of the year rang faultless in a peal of Cambridge Surprise Major—a shining example to all at the age of 86. Lastly, do you take the "Ringing World?" If not, start without delay by post and keep our only journal well maintained and cheap.

GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

On reviewing 1960 I think that we could describe it as a successful year. It has been one of considerable change in that from the beginning of the year the new districts came into operation. I had hoped that they would be an improvement and although the attendance at some meetings has not been as good as the officers would like the fact that our membership now stands at 514—an increase of 21—does speak well for the work that they have put in. We must do all that we can to attract young people to take up the art and there are signs of improvement from various parts of the Diocese which we hope will lead to more bells being rung regularly for Sunday Service.

This has been a good year for peals, a total of 110 being recorded. This is an increase of 31 over 1959. In this sphere Minor and Royal appear to have been the highlights.

It is good to note the spirit of progress and competition which has emerged. We regret however, that one band had the misfortune to ring a 'peal' which was afterwards proved false and therefore does not appear in these records. Peal No. 2465—one of Grandsire Caters rung at Grundisburgh in 1957—has also been found to be false and Mr. Roderick Pipe has had the painful task of withdrawing it. It will be seen that the peal totals have been adjusted accordingly. Whilst on this subject I must apologise for omitting a peal from the 1959 report and it will be seen that this has been printed this year. It is obvious from the individual peal totals that several of our members will figure in the Ringing World lists of leading peal ringers for 1960 and we must offer them our congratulations.

The Annual General Meeting was held at Bury St. Edmunds on April 23rd. This proved to be a successful occasion and our thanks are due to the Provost (the Very Rev. John Waddington), Archdeacon Norton, Canon Godfrey, the organist and verger at the Cathedral and the Bury St. Edmunds ringers for their co-operation.

Once more we have lost a number of good friends through death including Rev. Paul Greaves, Rev. F. S. W. Simpson, James Rumsey, George Pryke and William Weedon. To the relatives of these and any others I have failed to mention by name we offer our sincere sympathy.

The accounts have held their own this year showing a small excess of income over expenditure. Whilst this in itself is gratifying it must be remembered that expenditure was actually less than the previous year which showed an excess of expenditure over income. We have been enjoying the income from the sale of badges. The stock of these is almost exhausted and if we should decide to purchase a further supply this will greatly increase expenditure during 1961.

The Central Council Meeting was held at Folkestone at Whitsuntide when the Guild was represented by Mr. C. W. Pipe, Miss R. J. Seabrook and Mr. J. W. Blythe.

At the end of the year two energetic District Secretaries, Miss R. J. Seabrook and Mr. A. R. Bridges, relinquished office. I feel that I cannot let this pass without expressing our grateful thanks to them both. This does not mean we are without Lady Secretaries as Miss Evelyn Cansdale has taken over from Miss Seabrook and Miss Marion Branch, of Halesworth, from Mr. Bridges.

On the occasion of the visit of the Archbishop of Canterbury to the Cathedral at Bury St. Edmunds we were represented by Mr. C. W. Pipe.

With these reflections on the past year I will close by expressing my thanks to one and all for their support and hope that by our united endeavours 1961 will be even more successful.

TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

During 1960 the writer has submitted a further 21 reports on the contents of our Suffolk church towers, bringing the total inspected to date to 208. Of these 21 reports nine related to rings of bells, being those at Stowmarket, Ipswich St. Mary at Quay, Bradfield St. George, Barnardiston, Elmswell, Burgate, Glemsford, Wissett and Stradishall. Of these Bradfield St. George, Barnardiston and Elmswell are quite unringable and the others though ringable, are in need of attention from the bell-hanger; Burgate has unfortunately a badly cracked tower.

The Diocesan Advisory Committee on the Care of Churches, of which the writer is a member, has considered a number of

faculty applications covering projected work on bells and towers.

A faculty has been granted to Aldeburgh to recast all except the present second bell of 1622 and to rehang the six bells in a new timber eight bell frame. This work is due for completion before Easter 1961.

The top of the tower at Trimley St. Mary (one Bell), has now been rebuilt and Westleton have a faculty to erect an open turret for one bell to replace the flint tower which fell down many years ago and the more recent timber structure which was destroyed by a land mine in the recent War.

Wissett tower is to be repaired and it is to be hoped that the parish will in due course be able to undertake the rehanging of the bells in a new frame.

The three bells at Thorpe Morieux are to be rehung and the existing frame strengthened.

The Eye bells are still at the bell-foundry. Examination of the bell frame and the support beams beneath which have been covered up by floor and ceiling boards has disclosed that it would be best if they were all replaced. Unfortunately this will involve the expenditure of a far greater sum than was originally envisaged; so please remember that the fund for these bells is still open and that Claude Rush, who has already done so much to raise money for this worthy cause, is very ready to receive your contributions. If more money is not forthcoming then the alternative is putting the bells back in the existing frame and support structure which will not give as satisfactory a job as we all hope for.

At Wickham Market it is proposed to put in a new first floor to the tower some 10ft, above the ground to make a new ringing chamber. This will allow the ground floor of the tower to be used as a porch and will shorten the draught of rope and will make the bells easier to handle.

Your Adviser recorded an interview for the B.B.C. during the year on his inspection work in the Diocese, and also addressed the Aldeburgh Festival, being greatly assisted by a number of members of the Guild who came along to ring hand-bells to illustrate the talk. From July 18th to 21st 1961 there is to be held an exhibition of church treasures from the Archdeaconry of Suffolk in Blythburgh Church and the writer hopes to put on view items relating to the bells in the Archdeaconry such as plaster casts, rubbings, etc.

Your Adviser's thanks are again due to Mr. Ronald Steward for helping him on his inspections and to Mr. Leonard Last for organising an outing to ring on bells to assess their state.

NORTH-WEST DISTRICT REPORT

There were four Ringing Meetings in the district, at Rougham, Euston, Newmarket and Mildenhall, and eight Practice Meetings, which were very well attended.

The collections at Ringing Meetings realised £3 5s. 6d. for the Bell Fund.

I would like to thank the members for their support and hope to have more support next year. I would also like to thank all those who provided transport.

Sunday service ringing takes place in a number of our churches but I feel that the effort of the ringers of St. Mary's Grundisburgh should not be passed by without mention. The bells were rung twice every Sunday and every Thursday evening throughout the year, and out of these 156 meetings the average attendance of its ten resident ringers was no less than 92.

We are sorry to lose our Ringing Master, Mr. L. N. Melton, who on January 2nd, 1961, joined the Royal Air Force. His presence in the years to come will be missed.
