#### Committee:

The President, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Ringing Master, General Secretary and Treasurer, Report Editor, Technical Adviser, Pearson Handbells Trustees, District Chairman and District Secretaries (exofficio), together with two representatives from each District.

#### OBJECTS

- FEDERATION. To supply an organisation which shall unite the separate companies of Church Bell Ringers within the Diocese for the purpose of mutual support and encouragement in the performance of the duties of their office, and in the practice of their art.
- RECOGNITION. To obtain full recognition of the ringers' office as
  essentially a branch of the Church's work; that ringers and their services (qualifications for which demand much time, skill and mental
  labour) may be placed upon a true and acknowledged basis.
- PROMOTION OF CHANGE RINGING. To encourage, cultivate and foster the art of scientific Change Ringing by frequent meetings in various centres for practice or peal ringing; and to provide, as far as possible, instructors when and where required.
- 4. REFORM. To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as a part of God's House; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof; as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of bells and their fittings.

#### CONSTITUTION

- 1. The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- The Officers of the Guild shall consist of: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese as President, Patrons, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer, Report Editor, Auditor and the Technical Adviser.
- 3. The Guild shall consist of (a) Ringing Members, (b) Probationers, (c) Junior Members, (d) Honorary Members, (e) Life Members.
  - (a) Ringing Members may be elected at any meeting where there are five other members present; or, provisionally by two other Members, before starting for a peal. Ringing Members may be elected as soon as they have rung 120 changes on a tower bell or on two handbells retained in hand. The subscription of Ringing Members shall be 50p per year.
  - (b) Probationers may be elected at any meeting where there are five other members present. This grade of membership is, for those learning change ringing but who have not yet rung 120 changes on a tower bell or on two handbells retained in hand. The subscription of Probationers shall be 25p per year.
  - (c) Junior Members under the age of 16 years, who shall pay half the annual subscription.
  - (d) Honorary Members may be elected on a payment of 50p. per year.
  - (e) Life Members residing out of the County to make a single payment of fl.

- 4. The Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer, Report Editor, Technical Adviser, Pearson Handbells Trustees, District Chairmen (exofficio), District Secretaries (ex-officio), together with two elected members from each District, seven to form a quorum. The Committee will meet a minimum of three times during the year.
- 5. The area covered by the Guild shall be divided into Districts, each of which shall have its own Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Committee, who shall be elected at the District Annual Meeting. Each District will elect two representatives to serve on the Guild Committee. The Secretary will:
  - (a) Arrange Meetings for practice.
  - (b) Arrange for instruction.
  - (c) Collect the subscriptions of all members.
    N.B.—In each company there shall be chosen a Secretary, or Captain, or Ringing Master, who shall collect all subscriptions, as soon as possible after January 1st. and send them to the District Secretary.
  - (d) Forward these subscriptions to the General Secretary together with his receipt book and details of any expenditure, at the end of the year for audit.
- The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

#### RULES

- 1. Subscriptions shall be due in advance on January 1st annually.
- 2. Any member whose subscription is unpaid on December 31st shall lose his membership. No peal shall be recorded unless the subscriptions of all taking part in it are paid. Lapsed members may be restated on payment of 10p in addition to the annual subscription.
- 3. Should a Ringing Member, having paid five consecutive years' subscriptions, remove from the Diocese, he may without payment become a Non-Resident Member for such time as he continues to reside outside the Diocese.
- 4. All ringing at meetings of the Guild shall be under the direction of a Ringing Master and shall be such as is approved by the General Council. The decisions of the Central Council shall be recognised in recording any ringing performances.
- 5. A peal fee of 10p per rope is payable in respect of all peals rung for the Guild. Conductors are responsible for collecting and forwarding them to the General Secretary. No peal will be recorded unless the peal fees have been paid.
- 6. The Secretary may pay, on request, 2nd class return railway fare, together with a maximum of two nights' hotel expenses to such representative attending the Central Council Meeting, provided that the total indebtedness of the Guild for all representatives does not exceed £20 in any one year.

- The Committee may remove a member from the Guild for a serious offence against the Objects and Rules, subject to appeal at a General Meeting.
- 8. The Objects, Constitution and Rules can only be altered by a General Meeting after three months' notice given at a General Meeting.

#### REGULATIONS relating to PEARSON'S HANDBELLS

- The Pearson Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustees. They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
- 2. The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustees by the borrower, and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustees if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
- 3. The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustees by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without the prior consent of both the Trustees.
- 4. The bells must be returned to the Trustees upon request. The Trustees should endeavour to give seven days' notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6. The Trustees are responsible to the Committee of the Guild for the administration of the bells, and their decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by the Committee.
- The Trustees and the Committee of the Guild would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

- 3-Unringable mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2-Unringable mainly because of frame and/or fittings.
- 1-Hung dead.
- 0-Some bells unhung and on the ground.

#### 1970 ANNUAL REPORT

As your Report Editor, I should like to explain briefly some changes in this year's Report, and on behalf of next year's Editor, to make an appeal regarding the 1971 Report.

In the recent discussions about Guild finance, one point was made repeatedly: that our funds are under strain, and that the biggest strain of all is the cost of printing our Annual Report. No one seemed eager to sacrifice the quality of the Report (acknowledged to be one of the finest in the country), but all were anxious to save on its cost - a challenge to any editor! That is why, to save space and therefore money, we have omitted the District Secretaries' reports and adopted the "Ringing World" style of peal report. Now it is up to Suffolk ringers to decide whether these changes were necessary or desirable (I think they were), and whether they ought to be kept next year.

And speaking of next year, I should like to encourage all who find errors in this Report - in peal totals, tower information, ringers' names, or whatever - to let the Report Editor know (in writing, preferably), so that the 1971 Report can truly be an accurate record of our Guild's activities. May it also be pointed out that advertising revenue is the best subsidy of Report expenses, since it benefits the advertiser, the Guild, and readers of the Report. If you yourselves are able to advertise, or if you can persuade firms you know to do so, the Report Editor would be pleased to hear from you.

#### GENERAL SECRETARY AND TREASURER'S REPORT

The figures below suggest that membership of the Guild has remained static during the past year. However, whilst numbers may be constant, the people who go to make up those numbers are ever-changing: and 1970 is no exception. At practically every District meeting, some new members have been elected; and this is as it should be. But your officers would like to see an **increase** in numbers, not simply a valiant effort to maintain the present level of membership. As I look back at records for the past five years, I find that in 14 towers there has been a marked increase in Guild membership (in some cases a completely new band) during that time: but in long-established centres of ringing there seems to be a reluctance to train new recruits. We cannot expect new blood always to come to us—we must take the initiative in increasing the strength of ringing in Suffolk.

#### Meetings

The A.G.M. at Ipswich was well attended. Our President, the Bishop of the Diocese, preached at the service, which was followed by tea and the business meeting. At the meeting, Mr.Leslie Mills of Bures was elected a Vice-President in recognition of his untiring efforts on the Guild's behalf in connection with the Olde Tyme Rallye at Long Melford in 1969. Notice was given of a General Meeting in the autumn to consider the possible abolition of probationary membership. This meeting, held at Barking, was attended by about 80 members. The motion to abolish probationary membership was defeated. A motion to increase the Ringing Members' subscription to 50p (other grades of membership being increased pro rata) and to raise the peal fee to 10p per rope, as from 1st January, 1971, was carried overwhelmingly.

The Striking Competition was held at Higham on 16th May, the Shield being won by the Lavenham band. This event continues to arouse a keen competitive spirit, and to be a notable event in the Guild social calendar.

On 19th September, a service of dedication of the new Ringing Master's Badge of Office was held at Great Thurlow. The dedication, by the Archdeacon of Sudbury, took place in the presence of the donor, Mr.R.A. Vestey, Patron of the Guild. The fine craftsmanship of a fellow-ringer, Mr.Peter Sloman of Essex, who made this Badge, has already been much admired.

The Committee has met three times during the year, there being an average attendance of eighteen.

#### Finance

Concern over the ever-rising cost of printing our Annual Report, together with a realisation of the necessity to increase the income of the Restoration Fund in order that we may make more realistic contributions towards re-hanging work within the Diocese, pointed the need to increase subscriptions and raise the peal fee. As it is, the General Account for 1970 shows a deficit of some £30: but as only one grant of £20 (towards the restoration at Kersey) has been paid during the year, the Restoration Fund balance has increased by £69.

#### Central Council

Our four representatives all attended the annual meeting at Ilkley.

My thanks to all District Officers for their co-operation in 1970, coupled with best wishes for the expansion of all Districts in 1971.

#### RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

1970 has been an extremely active year, with a great deal of effective work being done in all parts of the Guild. We are all aware of the great importance in teaching learners, and it has given me great pleasure to see a great amount of enthusiastic teaching going on in many places in the Diocese. In particular the South-West District is really buzzing again, and there is very pleasing progress being made at Wickham Skeith and Benhall.

Members have turned out in force to most of the main functions of the year. It is always encouraging to your officers when we get the support which we have had this year.

The Striking Competition was again a very successful day, being held this year at Higham on a very pleasant spring afternoon, and with excellent local arrangements. The trophy changed hands this year, and all present agreed that Lavenham were worthy winners with a splendid piece of ringing. Again the overall standard of the day spoke well for the general standard of ringing in the county.

There was good Guild support, too, at Kersey, when the bells were rung for the first time this century — and what a fine six they are! The parishioners of Kersey deserve the highest praise for their effort in getting the tower and bells restored; and Eddy Hynard and the local company have our warmest good wishes for the future, and I am sure our support.

Many people made the long journey to Great Thurlow to express our appreciation to Mr. R. A. Vestey for his generous donation of a Ringing Master's Badge of Office. Our thanks are also due to Peter Sloman and to Leslie Mills for their parts in production and arrangements for this historic occasion in the annals of Suffolk Ringing.

It is, however, in peal and quarter-peal ringing that the Guild has reached new heights in the scope of the ringing and in the numbers rung. The grand total of 186 peals rung is 62 more than the previous highest total. Whilst appreciating that there have been two peal tours within the county,

this still means that our members have been more active in peal ringing than ever before.

Of course this means that there have been some remarkable individual accomplishments this year, and pride of place must go to J. Martin Thorley. whose 94 Guild peals constitute a new record for the Guild; also it is the first time that a resident member has rung 100 peals in a year. aratulations are also due to another member of the Thorley family. Katharine, who rang more peals (53) for the Guild than any other lady ringer has rung, and of course is certainly the youngest lady ever to have amassed that total. Other personal records worthy of mention include Cecil W. Pipe's 750th peal (in the 50th anniversary year of his first peal); J.B. Pickup's 400th peal, and five members attaining their 100th peal: Katharine Thorley, Vernon Bedford, Alan Bridges, Alan Feaver and Lawrence Pizzey. Many new methods have been rung for the first time for the Guild, and Leslie Brett achieved two unusual milestones, in that he "rang the alphabet" in Surprise Major methods and completed peals on the 34 ringable octaves in the county. The Spliced Surprise Major record for the Guild has been increased from 12 to 17 methods during the series of peals at Grundisburgh. Congratulations to Michael Howes on calling a peal of Stedman Caters, and to George Symonds, who continues to astonish everyone by calling a peal of Bob Major at the age of 95 years a remarkable achievement.

Whilst all these records have been set we must not lose sight of the splendid effort made by many of our younger ringers: the Peal Week in September was successful on many counts, not least by the amount of first-pealers. My congratulations go to the following who rang their first peal in 1970: Gordon Adams, Janet Bannard, Margaret Brown, Bryan Crouch, Trevor Hughes, Dana Josephson, Henry Miller, Theresa Orris, Michael and Roger Peters, Roland Peck, Margaret Read, Marion Saker, David Salter, and Norman Tawn. Also to our new conductors this year: Katherine Thorley, Trevor Hughes, Roy Lockwood, and Fred Steward.

Quarter-peal ringing has shewn great activity and a special mention must be made of the Benhall Sunday Service band, who have rung 23

quarters this year, in their own tower.

All in all a very successful year, in which most members have played a full part. There is, however, one small danger signal which must be heeded. Whilst our overall membership showed a slight increase, there was a decrease of 12 amongst probationers. We must not make the same mistakes as we have in the past. Whilst it is very pleasant to have an unchanged band and meet regularly to improve our ringing, we must always be trying to introduce young blood into the Exercise. We must keep teaching: while we have so much activity within the Guild, it must be easier and quicker for keen youngsters to learn than ever before. It is up to us to introduce them to the art and to encourage them to learn. There cam be no such thing as resting on our laurels; in the long term this is retragressive.

Thank you for your support and the friendly welcome you have accorded to my wife and myself during our travels around the county, and I wish you all a further successful year in 1971.

#### TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

The major event in 1970 was the rededication of the six bells at Kersey. The bells now hang in a new metal frame a stage lower in the tower than formerly, and the cracked tenor has been recast. Recently your Adviser visited with the church architect and discussed what could be done to keep the dampness out of the bell-chamber and the need for repositioning the clock weights. He found the fifth bell's clapper not in the centre of the bell and he removed some packing to bring this about; this followed comment that the bell was a little odd-struck.

Your Adviser has inspected the rings of bells at Hessett, Blaxhall, Drinkstone, Benhall, South Elmham St. Cross, Helmingham, the tenor at

Worlingworth, the fourth at Leiston, and the fourth at Acton.

At Hessett the five bells are not easy to ring. The timber bell-frame shifts and in the long term requires renewing. Your Adviser suggested fitting some vertical tie rods in the short term to improve matters. The tenor, which was recently rehung in ball bearings, is still the worst bell to ring because of this frame movement. The second and third bells are cracked in their crowns.

At Blaxhall, the parish cannot afford a new bell-frame. The bells had not been rung in changes for some time before your Adviser's visit and he saw each bell swung in a full circle. A decayed floor just below the bells was removed some years ago and was not replaced, and he recommended that the strength of the next floor down (which is also the ceiling of the ringing chamber) should be checked and reinforced, if necessary, to stand a clapper dropping out of one of the bells. He felt that it would be safe to resume ringing, subject to this precaution.

At Drinkstone, the six bells were last rehung by Days of Eye, in 1891. Permission had not been granted to ring them for a number of years by the previous incumbent. Your Adviser made routine adjustments and greased the bearings and with some local ringers found that they were comparatively easy to ring, and in his view quite safe to be regularly rung for services.

At Benhall, following his inspection and report in 1967, the local ringers had been busy improving conditions, and he was very pleased to confirm on his 1970 visit that this effort had produced worthwhile results. He discussed with the band some remaining items.

At South Elmham St. Cross there are five bells which were last overhauled by Alfred Bowell in the 1920's. Your Adviser swung each bell in a full circle and found the bells quite ringable. Woodworm is attacking most of the timber in the tower and the parish was recommended to have this treated.

Worlingworth tenor is seriously cracked in the crown. Three cracks with a total visible length of 33 inches radiate from the iron cast-in staple. The pitches of the bell suggest that even when undamaged the tone was not too good, and it would be best for the bell to be recast when funds permit.

At Helmingham the eight bells were cast to commemorate the Battle of Waterloo and they hang in a two-tier timber frame, with the third and fourth above. As inspected this upper tier was wedged to the tower walls;

this is not desirable. They were last overhauled in 1900, and your Adviser recommended a new frame set lower down in the tower as the long-term aim.

At Leiston the fourth bell had become unringable and your Adviser on his visit tightened up all the securing ironwork and the gudgeon bolts. He reversed the clapper staple as the clapper ball was 1 inch nearer one side of the bell than the other with the plane of the mouth horizontal. It has since been reported to him that the bell now goes extremely well though it is still a little odd-struck.

At Sweffling the problem is the state of the tower parapets, especially on the east side, overlooking the nave roof. Your Adviser visited with the Diocesan Advisory Committee and discussed the problem with the churchwardens, the incumbent and the church architect. Here again lack of funds is the main problem.

At Acton it was reported that the fourth bell was making an unexpected noise as it swung in a full circle. Your Adviser found the north ballbearing housing loose in the frame. One bolt had sheared off a long while ago and had not been replaced, and the only remaining one had worked loose. He tightened the latter, and recommended the replacement of the broken bolt.

At Hartest, where the bells were rehung in 1953, a leaking tower roof has been causing damage to the floors and fittings below. The roof has now been repaired but the damage remains to be made good. interest report that the first book to on change-ringing. TINTINNALOGIA published in 1668, is thought to have been written by the Rev. Richard Duckworth, the then Rector of Hartest. A facsimile edition of this very rare work is now available.

At Gazeley, Mr. Alan Feaver is hoping to get the six bells ringable This will not be easy as it is over 100 years since they were last rehung and the fittings are in a poor state, especially the headstocks.

At Chevington, where the five bells were completely rehung in a new six-bell frame in 1905, ringing the bells in full circles ceased about 1935. Your Adviser has seen all the bells so rung and found that the two tenors were hard work. The main cause seemed to be the distortion of the top of the frame due to lack of enough vertical tie-rods and to worn bearings. With the aid of a parishioner he has drilled five holes right through the frame around the two tenor pits and has fitted tie-rods. He is grateful to Mr. Neville Whittell for having the rods made up. Bad weather after Christmas prevented the bells being tried out in 1970.

A major disappointment in the year was the hanging of the fine ring of

eight at St. Peter's, Sudbury, stationary.

The six bells from Nayland which have been at Loughborough for some years are now to be rehung for change-ringing and the five bells at Worlington are to be rehung in a new frame with new fittings. Adviser has recommended that the design of the new frame should be capable of extension to take a new treble without modifications.

It is with regret that we note the passing during the year of the following members of the Guild:

#### FREDERICK J. CRAPNELL, Grundisburgh.

"Fred" Crapnell, one of the Guild's veterans, passed to his rest early in the year, having attained the age of 88. A blacksmith by trade, he was a good churchman, and was most regular in attendance at his local tower. He gave faithful service to the Church in Grundisburgh for over 50 years.


