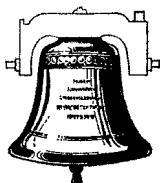

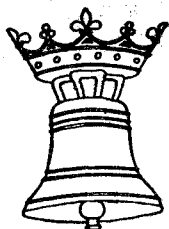

OBJECTS

1. **FEDERATION.** To supply an organisation which shall unite the separate companies of Church Bell Ringers within the Diocese for the purpose of mutual support and encouragement in the performance of the duties of their office, and in the practice of their art.
2. **RECOGNITION.** To obtain full recognition of the ringers' office as essentially a branch of the Church's work; that ringers and their services (qualifications for which demand much time, skill and mental labour) may be placed upon a true and acknowledged basis.
3. **PROMOTION OF CHANGE RINGING.** To encourage, cultivate and foster the art of scientific Change Ringing by frequent meetings in various centres for practice or peal ringing; and to provide, as far as possible, instructors when and where required.
4. **REFORM.** To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as a part of God's House; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof; as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of bells and their fittings.

CONSTITUTION

1. The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
2. The Officers of the Guild shall consist of: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese as President, Patrons, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer, Report Editor, Auditor and the Technical Adviser.
3. The Guild shall consist of (a) Ringing Members, (b) Probationers, (c) Junior Members, (d) Honorary Members, (e) Life Members.
 - (a) Ringing Members may be elected at any meeting where there are five other members present; or, provisionally by two other Members, before starting for a peal. Ringing Members may be elected as soon as they have rung 120 changes on a tower bell or on two handbells retained in hand. The subscription of Ringing Members shall be 50p per year.
 - (b) Probationers may be elected at any meeting where there are five other members present. This grade of membership is, for those learning change ringing but who have not yet rung 120 changes on a tower bell or on two handbells retained in hand. The subscription of Probationers shall be 25p per year.
 - (c) Junior Members under the age of 16 years, who shall pay half the annual subscription.
 - (d) Honorary Members may be elected on a payment of 50p. per year.
 - (e) Life Members residing out of the County to make a single payment of £1.

4. The Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer, Report Editor, Technical Adviser, Pearson Handbells Trustees, District Chairmen (ex-officio), District Secretaries (ex-officio), together with two elected members from each District, seven to form a quorum. The Committee will meet a minimum of three times during the year.
5. The area covered by the Guild shall be divided into Districts, each of which shall have its own Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Committee, who shall be elected at the District Annual Meeting. Each District will elect two representatives to serve on the Guild Committee. The Secretary will :
 - (a) Arrange Meetings for practice.
 - (b) Arrange for instruction.
 - (c) Collect the subscriptions of all members.

N.B.—In each company there shall be chosen a Secretary, or Captain, or Ringing Master, who shall collect all subscriptions, as soon as possible after January 1st. and send them to the District Secretary.

 - (d) Forward these subscriptions to the General Secretary together with his receipt book and details of any expenditure, at the end of the year for audit.
6. The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

RULES

1. Subscriptions shall be due in advance on January 1st annually.
2. Any member whose subscription is unpaid on December 31st shall lose his membership. No peal shall be recorded unless the subscriptions of all taking part in it are paid. Lapsed members may be re-stated on payment of 10p in addition to the annual subscription.
3. Should a Ringing Member, having paid five consecutive years subscriptions, remove from the Diocese, he may without payment become a Non-Resident Member for such time as he continues to reside outside the Diocese.
4. All ringing at meetings of the Guild shall be under the direction of a Ringing Master and shall be such as is approved by the General Council. The decisions of the Central Council shall be recognised in recording any ringing performances.
5. A peal fee of 10p per rope is payable in respect of all peals rung for the Guild. Conductors are responsible for collecting and forwarding them to the General Secretary. No peal will be recorded unless the peal fees have been paid.
6. The Secretary may pay, on request, 2nd class return railway fare, together with a maximum of two nights' hotel expenses to such representative attending the Central Council Meeting, provided that the total indebtedness of the Guild for all representatives does not exceed £20 in any one year.

7. The Committee may remove a member from the Guild for a serious offence against the Objects and Rules, subject to appeal at a General Meeting.
8. The Objects, Constitution and Rules can only be altered by a General Meeting after three months' notice given at a General Meeting.

REGULATIONS relating to PEARSON'S HANDBELLS

1. The Pearson Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustees. They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
2. The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustees by the borrower, and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustees if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
3. The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustees by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without the prior consent of both the Trustees.
4. The bells must be returned to the Trustees upon request. The Trustees should endeavour to give seven days' notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
5. If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
6. The Trustees are responsible to the Committee of the Guild for the administration of the bells, and their decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by the Committee.
7. The Trustees and the Committee of the Guild would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

STRIKING COMPETITION RULES

1. The competition shall take place on the second Saturday in May or on any other date as shall be decided by the committee.
2. All bona fide members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
3. No member may ring in more than one piece.
4. A band competing as a representative band of a particular tower must have at least 4 members shown in the annual report as members of that tower.
5. Each band must have a representative present at the draw, the time of the draw to be advertised in The Ringing World.

6. Two minutes round ringing and stand will be allowed for practice before the test piece.
7. The test piece will generally be of 240 changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method. In the event of a team ringing doubles a cover bell must be used. The length of the test piece may be shortened at the discretion of the Ringing Master in the event of a large entry.
8. A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available to teams meeting short at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
9. Three judges, appointed by the committee, will be present. Their decision is final.
10. The Mitson Shield is, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for its location, safe keeping, etc.

INDEX AND DIRECTORY OF TOWERS

The following table is used to show the condition of the ring:

- 10—Excellent. Ball bearings, modern frame and fittings.
- 9—Excellent. Plain bearings, modern frame and fittings—or ball bearings in an old frame.
- 8—Good going order.
- 7—Fair going order.
- 6—Poor going order.
- 5—Ringable if cleaned up and odd fittings and ropes provided.
- 4—Ringable with difficulty and a degree of risk after making odd repairs.
- 3—Unringable mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2—Unringable mainly because of frame and/or fittings.

1—Hung dead.

0—Some bells unhung and on the ground.

GENERAL SECRETARY AND TREASURER'S REPORT

Last year I began my report by commenting on the continuing influx of new ringers to our art, and the desirability of well established centres of ringing welcoming learners. It is pleasing to find that some such centres have responded well to those words: it is sad that others have not. I am convinced that towers and Districts with a high proportion of Junior and Probationer members are planning wisely for the future. Overall, membership figures are down this year — which was to be expected in a year when subscription levels were raised. There are still people in Suffolk who want their ringing on the cheap, and are not prepared to contribute a mere 50p per year towards the encouragement and increase of ringing fellowship and the maintenance of bells in this Diocese. That is what subscriptions are used for.

Meetings

Central Council

Your four representatives all attended the annual meeting at Leamington Spa. Due to the drop in Guild membership, our 1972 A.G.M. can only elect three representatives to the Council to serve for the next three years.

My thanks go to all District officers and committee members for their efforts in 1971, and my best wishes to all members for good ringing in 1972.

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

1971 started badly for the Guild with the sad loss of R.E.Lester. Bob was an untiring enthusiast whose untimely death leaves a considerable gap in ringing activities in this Guild. An indication of the affection and esteem in which he was held by his fellow-ringers was the impressive attendance at the memorial service and the response to the appeal to provide a lasting commemoration in Barking church.

Another service which will long be remembered by those present was the ringers' service at Bures, at which the local congregation and ringers from near and far joined together to celebrate the twentieth anniversary of the eight at Bures.

Ringing activities continued at a reasonably satisfactory level. Whilst some towers have not been quite as active as in past years, others continue to show improvement and new activity is very evident at St. Clement's, Ipswich, Kersey and Palgrave.

The striking competition at Benhall was a great success. Twelve teams competed and a feature of the day was the many visitors attracted to the contest. The local band made first-class arrangements as well as performing very creditably in their first competition. The Lavenham band were worthy winners of the shield for the second year running. The rules of the competition are published in this report for the first time. After nine years of continued growth of the competition it is felt by the committee that the time has come to regularise the rules and to try to achieve the initial aims of the competition, which of course is to encourage Sunday service ringing.

Peal ringers have again been very active and so far as peal ringing is an indication of the strength of ringing in the Guild we can be very satisfied. 131 peals were recorded, second only to last year's record. Of this total there were several highlights. We can be proud that the first peal of Bristol Royal rung in the Eastern Counties was rung by a resident Guild band at Grundisburgh. The Tuesday night band at that tower, having achieved a guild record by ringing 24 Surprise Major methods, are now starting to make progress in "all the work" Surprise Major peals. The officers' peal at Henley and the peal of Rutland Major rung at Soham in conjunction with the Ely Diocesan Association were noteworthy peals, as was the splendid achievement by the young band (average age 14) which rang the peal of Plan Bob Minor at Theberton — a triumph of youth indeed, and something which reflects great credit on those who have taught these young ringers. Personal achievements included J.Martin Thorley's 950th peal and Leslie Brett's 700th. Congratulations are due to the following first-pealers: Sanda Cunningham, Diana Harrold, Mervyn Bewley, Ian Lockwood, Jonathan Peters, St. John Perry and Timothy Soanes. It is always pleasing to see young conductors coming on to the scene, and John Loveless, Adrian Knights, John Mayle and David Salter are to be congratulated on the progress they have made in this field this year. It can be said that the standard of peal ringing in Suffolk is of a reasonably high level at the moment, but I would remind peal ringers that the only way to keep it this way is the introduction of new blood to peal ringing at every opportunity.

My thanks to all members and district officers who have worked so

hard in Guild affairs in 1971, and to all those who have given my wife and I such a friendly reception in our travels around the county.

TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

1971 was a quiet year for bell restorations. There were no rededications but a number of jobs are in hand or contemplated, so 1972 should be better.

Nayland bells are expected to be back in the tower ready for ringing in January, and the bells at Great Barton and Bacton are expected to be removed for overhaul at about the same time.

It is hoped that the Cathedral bells in the Norman Tower will soon be rehung in a new frame though finance for this project is still a problem. A new frame is vital here for a satisfactory result for, as your Adviser pointed out in 1959, the present one distorts appreciably when the bells are rung.

At Worlingworth it is hoped to recast the cracked tower and rehang all the bells from new headstocks.

During 1971 your Adviser inspected the rings at Withersfield, Kedington, Hintlesham, Pakenham, Long Melford, Wickhambrook and Winston.

At Withersfield the five are in a poor state, and nothing less than a new frame and new fittings will make them fit for change ringing.

Kedington bells were overhauled and put in a new frame as recently as 1935-6, but the clapper joints are unsatisfactory and some of the bells are odd struck. The elm headstocks are becoming wormeaten.

Hintlesham also had a new frame and fittings, in this case in 1905. The bells still go quite well though there are a number of defects which if corrected would have made them better.

At Pakenham the third and tenor were rehung between the Wars but the other three have fittings dating from 1863 and 1872. In these latter cases the securing ironwork is corroded and weak. The five hang in a large 6ft. 9ins. high mediaeval frame designed for three bells. Fortunately the bearing level has been lowered to a third the way down the frame from the top by the addition of a false top cill. In the longer term a new frame is needed.

At Long Melford the bells and fittings are in quite good order, having been overhauled by Taylors in 1924. The tall frame dates from 1744 and is decayed in places. The main problem here is the cracks in the tower both in the older 1725 part and in the upper part of 1903 and some strengthening will be needed. Ringing meantime has been restricted to major festivals.

At Wickhambrook the five bells are not in a ringable condition, and are now equipped with levers in place of full wheels. A new frame will be needed before they can be rung in changes again.

Your Adviser visited Winston to see if an unwanted bell at Sutton by Woodbridge would make a tenor to the minor five there. A pit is left in the frame for such a bell. The bell would fit but unfortunately nothing had been done about the defects noted in his 1957 report and the fittings

of the five bells are in poor order. It would be more important to attend to them rather than make them six.

At Tattingstone the tower is nearly completely restored. Three of the five bells have been swung in full circles, another is in a fit state to be rung but the remaining one is obstructed and some modification will be needed.

At Westhall the tower has been repaired. The bells were rehung by Days of Eye in 1913 though now the 1616 treble is badly cracked from the crown to mid waist. The parish is obtaining new ropes which will enable the bells to be tried out.

The five at Chevington were rung for the first time for some 35 years during 1971 but they are hard work even after fitting the frame tie rods. New bearings are needed and the frame needs anchoring at the bottom cill level to the lower walls.

An old, faithful member of the Waveney Valley area, Fred taught scores of youngsters to ring at Brome, Oakley and Wingfield. He will be sadly missed but his son Alan carries on his good work.

GILBERT GOODSHIP – Grundisburgh.

One of the Exercises' gentlemen, Gilbert's whole ringing life was devoted to teaching and encouraging new bands wherever he went. A capable ringer on all numbers, he rang over 60 peals for the Guild.

ROBERT E. LESTER – Barking.

Bob Lester's contribution to the Suffolk Guild was considerable – his ability, his advice and his eagerness to teach change-ringers. He held Guild office, taught his whole family to ring and was extremely loyal to his Church and to ringing. He rang 374 peals for Suffolk, conducting many of them.

ALEC THOMPSON – Stradbroke.

Those who visited Stradbroke for either peals or meetings will miss Alec's red, shining and smiling face, always there to welcome us. A call-change ringer who never ceased to marvel at Change-ringing; it was his custom to sit in the belfry for the first hour of a peal.
