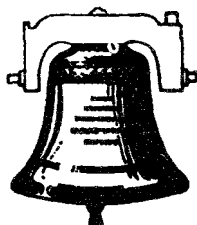

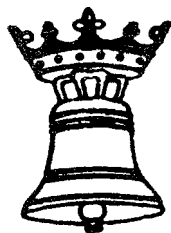

INDEX AND DIRECTORY OF TOWERS

The following table is used to show the condition of the ring:

- 10 — Excellent, Ball bearings, modern frame and fittings.
- 9 — Excellent, Plain bearings, modern frame and fittings — or ball bearings in an old frame.
- 8 — Good going order.
- 7 — Fair going order.
- 6 — Poor going order.
- 5 — Ringable if cleaned up and odd fittings and ropes provided.
- 4 — Ringable with difficulty and a degree of risk after making odd repairs.
- 3 — Unringable mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2 — Unringable mainly because of frame and/or fittings.
- 1 — Hung dead.
- 0 — Some bells unhung and on the ground.

While every effort has been made to ensure that the information given is accurate, the Technical Adviser would be very pleased to hear of any corrections.

T R E A S U R E R ' S R E P O R T

This years accounts reflect the effects of the 100% increase in subscriptions approved at the Annual General Meeting in April 1978, and as a result the General Account is almost in balance. However provision has had to be made for an "extraordinary item" - the underprovision in the 1978 Accounts for the cost of printing etc of the 1978 Report. A sum of £220 was provided in the 1978 Accounts in respect of this item based upon quotations received at the end of 1977, however, when the report was finally presented to the printer in the Summer of 1978 his quotation had increased as a result of inflation, the increased size of the report and problems with the reproduction. The net underprovision amounted to some £96 and if it had been included in the 1978 Accounts the deficit for that year would have been £180.

It was hoped that the increased subscription levels would generate significant surpluses to enable the accumulated deficit (now standing at £205) to be eliminated; this has not happened and in these inflationary times further increases are required merely to keep the general account in balance.

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

1979 has been a year of quiet progress throughout the Guild. On the face of it, there has been little to observe — and anyone who gauges a Guild's achievement solely by the number of peals rung would think that this year was one of retrogression. I know from visits to meetings and towers, and from comments made by individual ringers, that there has been a great deal of activity — largely at parish level — amongst Suffolk bellringers. A Flower and Bellringing weekend at Blythburgh, and a one-day exhibition about ringing at Sudbury, only just managed a brief mention in the local press: and neither the press nor local broadcasting services have time to give to reporting more personal, but just as significant, achievements by our members.

An analysis of this year's 84 peals shows that during 1979 eighteen members rang their first peal. Our congratulations to them:— Mary Allum, Robin D. Allum, Sarah Burns, Sandra L. Crick, Christopher B. Edmunds, G. James Gardiner, Karin Lynn, Barry Mansfield, Kenneth W. Mulley, Gerald J. Nason, David Noy, Pauline J. Pearson, Anthony D. Petter, Daniel R. Riddleston, Tim Shaw, Janet E. Stevenson, Timothy Thompson and Ralph E. Wright. Particular mention must be made of the Blythburgh peal by six first-pealers from Laxfield, and of the Polstead peal with four local first-pealers in the band. Well done! The ranks of the conductors were swelled this year by newcomers Michael Baldry, Robin Allum and Roger Peters, and we hope to see their names recurring frequently. Harry Archer rang his 100th peal during the year, and Roger Peters his 200th; Mrs. Patricia Bailey, having now rung 250 peals, became the first lady member to peal 100 Suffolk towers; and the first ever peal was rung at Tattingstone. Peal footnotes show that a large number of people progressed to peals on higher numbers of bells, and of greater intricacy of method.

The indication of increased achievement gleaned from peal footnotes is backed up by the regular practice-night progress that has been made both by individuals and by whole bands; by monthly District practice meetings being an accepted and regular feature of the calendar, where a few years ago they were unusual; and by each District holding its own Striking Competition and social event.

The Guild occasions worthy of note are three. The A.G.M. meeting was at Ipswich, ringing taking place along three routes of towers into the town. It was good to see members who are not used to 12-bell ringing having a pull at St. Mary-le-Tower on A.G.M. day; and it should be noted that the number of members with experience on 12 is gradually increasing. The Striking Competition was held at Kersey, and we welcomed back Howard Egglestone as our judge for the day. The Mitson Shield was awarded to Lavenham.

A second Guild Training Day was held in the Stowmarket area. Theory and practice sessions on Plain Bob, Treble Bob and Stedman occupied the morning and afternoon, and after tea instruction was given in ropesplicing. My grateful thanks to all members of the Recruitment and Training Committee for their work in organising and running this very worthwhile day. By popular request there will be another Training Day in October 1980: the variety of topics covered will again ensure that *anyone* can derive some benefit from attending.

I trust that the progress we have made as individuals and as a Guild during 1979 will continue, increasingly, in the 1980's.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The first and most important event of any year in the Guild Calendar is the Annual Meeting. This year it was held in Ipswich and, at the request of the previous A.G.M., a new format was tried with the business being conducted following an earlier Service and before the tea. A disappointingly small number attended what should be the highlight of the year's activities and no one reason can be discovered for the lack of support. Perhaps we shall see better times at Sudbury in 1980. Could it be that members are not really interested in the running and organisation of the Guild? I hope not because to be organised as a Guild, as we are, is of benefit to each and every one of us.

Penzance was the venue for the Central Council meeting and in spite of the very long journey all your representatives attended, the Secretary being co-opted on to the Public Relations Committee of the Council. At Guild level the Management Committee has met regularly and been well attended. The Recruitment and Training Committee has also met regularly and organised a very useful and interesting instruction day in October. Unfortunately there has been little or no activity from the Maintenance Committee — very disappointing.

Another sunny Saturday in May heralded the Striking Competition at Kersey when we were able to briefly welcome back Howard Egglestone as judge. The S.E. District fund raising event for Guild funds was very poorly supported and the Social, again held at Hintlesham in December, showed a decline in attendance.

Membership totals have fallen during the year — reference to the figures elsewhere in the Report will disclose the details — to add another disappointing aspect to the year's work but it is pleasing to note the increase in Junior members. Please do not let them become disillusioned, rather do all you can to encourage them in their efforts.

I would again like to express my thanks to all of you who have worked in various ways for the Guild. The support and help which I have received from Guild and District Officers as well as members is most gratifying and without it my job would be very difficult indeed. On behalf of my family I would also like to thank everyone for the genuine welcome we have received at various events and District meetings.

Finally, let us give some thought to the previous year with its problems and try to resolve them so that we may go forward, not only in 1980, but in the years ahead as a strong and resolute Guild determined to recruit and teach more members so that our Art may flourish and our work for the Church may prosper.

TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

During the year the Sudbury St. Gregory ring of eight was reopened after a long period of silence; best thanks to Walter Perry and his team of assistants for their efforts on this work.

The tower restoration work at Tunstall was completed and the six bells are now ringable again. The stay on the fifth was shortened by the writer on his visit so it does not now catch the support for the ladder to the roof. The bells were rehung with new frame and fittings in 1951 and remain in quite good order.

At Tattingstone the new ringers' gallery has been designed, made and erected, and the shorter rope lengths make the bells easier to handle. Congratulations to the local ringers under Bertha Hardman who have done the work themselves. They still need a treble to make six; unfortunately a suitable second-hand bell has not appeared and a new bell may have to be cast.

At Stradishall Dennis Kiddy has bolted the main bearings to the top of the timber frame and has put in tie rods through the side frames and the support beams. This has improved matters a great deal and the bells are easier to ring. One support beam under the tenor has a rotten end and is propped up from the floor below; the next stage will need to be to properly support and locate this beam from a rolled steel joist set into the tower walls.

At Monks Eleigh some tower repair work has been undertaken, but in the architect's view not enough to enable all six bells to be rung in changes. The outside tower faces have been restored, but it has been found that the rubble core is not in good condition.

At Burgh the bells are now ringable after tower repairs, and at Sproughton the tower is being restored at the time of writing. Sudbury All Saints church tower remains in a poor state, but it is hoped that work will soon be done to prevent matters getting any worse, and in the fullness of time to do a complete restoration.

At Chevington the 19th Cent hollow top stage of the tower has been causing concern, and there is a probability that it will be removed, which will restore the tower to its appearance before 1817. This will make it desirable to overhaul the bells to put them into condition for regular ringing.

Your Adviser with the church architect inspected the cracks in the tower of St. Margaret's, Ipswich, when the bells were being rung. He found them much as he had noted them in his reports of 1956 and 1965. The tower needs stiffening at the level just below the frame. The tower cracks in this zone at Stowmarket have changed little since his report of 1960 and here again stiffening is necessary.

At Barsham the thatched roof of the church was burnt out, but fortunately the round tower and the ring of five have not been harmed. At Hadleigh it is hoped to reopen the fire escape route from the tower on to the nave roof; the risks will be much reduced if the heating system in the base of the tower is removed.

Your Adviser inspected the ring of five at Stoke Ash, augmented from four to five by Bowell in 1937 and hung in the old frame which now distorts more than it should. Otherwise the ring remains in quite good order.

At Rendham the ring of six is not in good order due to a weak lower frame, worn bearings and decayed fittings. At Frostenden he found a derelict three with a cracked treble in a five bell frame, and at Barham he reinspected the four bells which are in a poor state and hung in a frame now unfit for full circle ringing.

At Sudbury St. Peter thought has been given to a scheme for external sound deadening to allow peal ringing and yet enable the clock chimes to be heard on other occasions. Doors on the inside of the louvred openings have been suggested and approved by the Redundant Churches Fund and their architect, but the Fund needs an indemnity against damage etc from the Guild and this is being looked into.

At Stoke-by-Nayland and Marlesford the modern metal bell frames need painting and your Adviser has done what he can to get the parishes to put this work in hand.

At Groton with Mrs. S.J. Elliott he inspected the unringable five which are chimed from an Ellacombe manual. He made a number of adjustments, and explained what should be done on a routine basis. A new frame and fittings are needed here before we can ring them again.

At Earl Soham some sand has been put above the ringing chamber ceiling but not enough to bring the sound level down to an acceptable condition. Your Adviser has made some recommendations which he hopes will make conditions in the ringing chamber acceptable and enable us to pay the grant we have promised.

At Newmarket St. Mary the top of the tower and the timber clock bell turret do need an overhaul. The bells are too loud on the west and north sides and boarding up to the base of the tracery on these sides has been suggested. Ian Whitear kindly visited on a later occasion when a broken stay was not replaced for some months.

In the Norman Tower, Bury St. Edmunds, the trebles to ten are a little difficult to pick out in the ringing chamber when all the bells are being rung. In 1977 your Adviser suggested to the Department of the Environment that there should be a sound hatchway in the upper floor under these bells but one was not provided. On raising the matter again it was found that there had been a change of architect in the interval. Hopefully the problem will soon be solved.

The Ipswich Town Churches Trust has been set up to look after the redundant churches in the town which include St. Lawrence with its pre-Reformation ring of five and St. Clements with John Darbie's only remaining ring of six.

Looking ahead to 1980 prospects are brighter; Rushmere St. Andrew's bells are to be rehung with new fittings in a new frame set lower in the strengthened tower; Wickham Market bells are also to be rehung with new fittings in a new frame in the restored tower. At Worlingham the five are to be augmented to six and hung with new fittings in a new frame set lower in the tower. In all three cases the towers in the recent past have not been in a fit state to stand the bells being rung in changes.

George Pipe and your Adviser have jointly written a book on Bells and Bell-ringing in Suffolk which the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust is to publish early in 1980. The proceeds from the sale will be devoted to the work of the Trust so we do ask you all to buy a copy for your records and publicise it among your friends. It is now 90 years since Raven's *The Church Bells of Suffolk* appeared and this work has now become quite rare; so it is high time there was another book on the subject. Perhaps in 1990 a second edition of Raven's work may appear if your Adviser can collect the material and there is sufficient local interest.

OBITUARIES

Edwin R. Goate – Beccles

For almost one hundred years between them Eddie and his father Rupert were associated with the famous campanile at Beccles. Edwin's contribution both to the N.E. District of the Suffolk Guild and to our neighbouring Norwich Diocesan Association was considerable both as a ringer and conductor and in teaching and administration. His genuine welcome and wise counsel will be greatly missed.

Mrs. Leslie Mills – Bures

Emily Mills served our Guild for thirty-five years in what is often a most effective and helpful way – behind the scenes. A committed Christian, loyal to her own Church and its work in Bures she also became a capable ringer who did much for our South West District. It was a joy to her when her son and grandchildren took up the Art.

Alan Peachey – Lakenheath

Alan held District Office in the N.W. in the early seventies. Not an advanced ringer, he was quite happy ringing the tenor behind – this in no way lessened his keenness or his ability to chair the local meetings.

J.W.H. Preastner – Wickham Market

Our Auditor for over thirty years, Joe Preastner died in April. Well known in the Woodbridge area, in later years he became a Reader and happily combined his Diocesan duties with Sunday service ringing. It would be hard to find a man more proud than he of his tower.

Ronald W. Steward – Ipswich

The untimely death of Ron Steward stunned his ringing friends in Suffolk and Essex and it brought into sharp relief the need we all have to share our problems with each other, whether they be domestic, professional or in the belfry. Ron was one of the best known ringers in our Guild; a keen six bell man, ringing over 400 peals and helping on our maintenance and restoration side. He was the first person to ring peals in one hundred different Suffolk towers.

A.F. Turner – Lavenham

Almost the last of Arthur Symond's famous band, Frank was a founder member of our Guild in 1923 having done his early ringing under the old Ely association. Like all that band he was equally well at home on hand and tower bells with an intense pride in Lavenham bells.

A.R. Woodard — Needham Market

Roy Woodard came from a fine ringing stable: Leiston. To ring peals of London and Bristol before the war with Charles F. Bailey was some achievement in that disciplined band. He later rang extensively in the Stowmarket area. Roy was brother to the late Claude Woodard of St. Margaret's, Ipswich, and died at the age of 71.

A. Stanley Woodard -- Woodbridge

In the early 1930's the late Frank L. Fisher taught a new band of eight young men at St. Mary's Woodbridge, a tower which had a strong company at the turn of the century. Stanley was one of that band and maintained his membership there for the next forty-five years. A quiet unassuming man he always made us welcome and derived great pleasure from hearing his own bells rung well.

We also remember any ringers' relatives who have died during the past year and the families of the above.

May they rest in peace.
