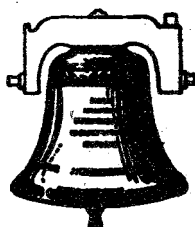

INDEX AND DIRECTORY OF TOWERS

The following table is used to show the condition of the ring:

- 10 — Excellent, Ball bearings, modern frame and fittings.
- 9 — Excellent, Plain bearings, modern frame and fittings — or ball bearings in an old frame.
- 8 — Good going order.
- 7 — Fair going order.
- 6 — Poor going order.
- 5 — Ringable if cleaned up and odd fittings and ropes provided.
- 4 — Ringable with difficulty and a degree of risk after making odd repairs.
- 3 — Unringable mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2 — Unringable mainly because of frame and/or fittings.
- 1 — Hung dead.
- 0 — Some bells unhung and on the ground.

While every effort has been made to ensure that the information given is accurate, the Technical Adviser would be very pleased to hear of any corrections.

TREASURER'S REPORT

This year has been an eventful one from the financial viewpoint with all the Districts and the Special General Meeting voting for the subscription increase for 1981. It was encouraging to see that so many members are now aware of the need to pay realistic subscriptions.

This year has also been marked by a number of fund raising efforts which have helped to reduce the deficit on the general fund and boost the restoration fund:-

In addition Sally and Alan Munnings have been busy selling calendars and the profit from this, which is expected to be over £400, is being divided between the general fund and the restoration fund. This item, which will be included in the 1981 accounts, should go a long way to putting the general fund on a sound footing.

The Accounts for 1980 have generally turned out more favourably than originally expected, many items of expenditure being lower than anticipated whilst the income items were generally higher. It is indeed pleasing to note that our membership has grown by 10% to 554 and perhaps the only note of caution that should be entered is that whilst about 130 new names appear on the membership lists this year about 80 names have disappeared. As well as recruiting new members we must all make every effort to retain our existing members, and this is perhaps particularly a task for our Deanery Representatives.

Donations have as usual been made to the Friends of the Cathedral, the Friends of St. Peters Sudbury and the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust. In addition this year leaving gifts have been given to the Bishop of Dunwich and the Provost.

It will be noted that the income from covenants has grown to over £50 p.a. and that over the seven year life of these covenants this will represent a significant sum. However, there are still a large number of members who pay tax but have not yet completed a form. I can but plea to everyone, who can, to fill one in and return it to me - it costs nothing!

During the year the Guild purchased a new stock of badges and a supply of rule books and these are shown in the balance sheet at their cost value. In addition there are in stock 16 badges from the old stock and 294 certificates which are not shown in the accounts.

There is one change of practice in this year's accounts concerning insurance which has previously been charged wholly to the general fund. The cost of providing cover for the maintenance committee is now charged to the Jubilee Fund, with the general fund bearing only half the cost of the third party cover and the premiums relating to the Guild's assets - the handbells, shields, masters badge and library.

The Restoration Fund is again in a healthy state, but it should be remembered that in Suffolk we have a large number of towers in need of restoration and it is essential that this fund is in a position to encourage parishes, to start restoration work, by giving significant grants. The special donation of £100 received during the year is available to be used, at the Technical Adviser's discretion, to aid various small schemes.

The balance on the St. Peter's Sudbury Fund has grown during the year in preparation for financing the soundproofing work which is currently in hand there.

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

This is the seventh annual report I have penned as Ringing Master of the Guild, and I begin it with an acute awareness of the changing faces, yet unchanging aims, of the Guild. During 1980 this fact was brought home to me by the death of Jim Pipe. Having just celebrated the 60th anniversary of his first peal (rung before the Suffolk Guild was formed!), Jim's ringing life had been a long one: yet it is not from his later years that the following quotation comes:—

'There are many towers with bells in good condition but with no ringers to sound them, and I think it is our rightful duty to visit these isolated parishes now and again to convey the joyful message of the bells to the public. That the people still love the sound of their Church bells properly rung, there is not the slightest doubt, and I dare say many young recruits in all parts of the county will be attracted to our art, compensating us in time for our trouble and finally proving themselves assets to the Guild.

Upon examination it will therefore be seen that our duty to the Church, the public, the Guild and ourselves, is to see to it we are strict Sunday service ringers, visiting occasionally those towers where there are no ringers and keeping an ever open eye for the right type of young person as a potential ringer and giving that training which will ensure good striking and keenness, and a worthy member of the Guild.'

Jim wrote those words in 1946 — they remain as true today as they were then: only the faces change.

The changing faces are reflected week by week in the quarter peal and peal columns of the Ringing World. We congratulate twelve members on having rung their first peal during 1980. They are:— Josephine M. Beever, Christine E. Bishop, Edmund Christian, Elizabeth J. Christian, George S. Gardiner, Thomas W.H. Gardiner, John le Grove, Basil K. Hart, Iain M. Howlett, Janet M. Langham, Andrew C.W. Pryce and Alison J. Whitby. Two peals in particular strike me as worthy of special mention as enterprising achievements, namely the peal in eight methods by an all-Laxfield band and the local band peal at Exning which included three first-pealers and a first as conductor. It is good to see more familiar names in the peal columns have progressed to peals on higher numbers of bells and in more intricate methods.

First peals since restoration were scored during the year at Earl Soham, Hadleigh, Rushmere and Wickham Market; and one new tower name came into the records — that of Hessett, where five bells had hung unpealed for 256 years! Anniversaries marked by peals during 1980 included George Finch's 90th birthday, Jack Pilgrim's 80th birthday, the 50th anniversary of the first peal of Pudsey S. Maximus at Ipswich and the centenary of the hanging of Iken bells.

Quarter peal ringing tends to be patchy: where it is practised regularly, its value in promoting good striking is appreciated. I recommend a monthly or bi-monthly quarter peal attempt by Sunday service bands as a way of promoting and encouraging good striking.

The Guild AGM at Sudbury and the Striking Competition at Wingfield (won this year by the St. Mary-le-Tower band) were enjoyable as ringing and social occasions. The third Guild Training Day, held once again in the central area of the county, had a large attendance. Instruction was given in the classroom and in the tower on Plain Hunt/Plain Bob, Plain Minor methods and Conducting — with a joint evening session led by Ranald Clouston on Belfry Maintenance.

I am extremely grateful to Tower Captains, District Ringing Masters, and members of the Recruitment and Training Committee for the hard work put into training Guild members during 1980.

As I mentioned at the beginning of this report, I have been Ringing Master for seven years, and I would now like to retire from the post. It has been a privilege to serve in the position and I am most grateful to Guild members for their cooperation and support during my term of office.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is pleasing to be able to report that the most important meeting – the Annual General Meeting – was much more successful this year. It is difficult to judge whether the two Sudbury towers were the attraction or whether the return to the more traditional format attracted over one hundred members to what turned out to be a rather lively meeting. The contentious topic was the proposal to increase subscriptions and fees and it was not until later in the year that this problem was finally resolved and the increase approved when a General Meeting was held at the end of a very successful Training Day in October. Prior to this General Meeting steps had been taken to ascertain the feelings of members before the final voting.

The business of the Guild has proceeded smoothly during the year with well attended Management Committee meetings and the Recruitment and Training Committee and Restoration and Maintenance Committee meeting regularly. It is good to see the tireless efforts being made by Roly Whiting and the Maintenance Committee showing results as more of this work is being tackled. Your Central Council Representatives attended the Council meeting at Winchester and Southampton; the new Council triennium begins in 1981 with the same four members remaining as your Representatives.

The weather clerk was again beneficent to us when we met for the Striking competition in May. It is also pleasing to see District Striking Competitions taking place. It is not so pleasing to have to report a further decline in attendance at the Social in December. Could this be the time to reconsider the style of this event? That we meet on a social basis must surely be good but perhaps members would give the matter some thought and let the organisers know what changes, if any, ought to be made.

Membership has increased a little; a considerable number of people have joined the Guild and it hardly needs a mathematician to point out that quite a number have left – or have they just not been asked to renew their subscription? It is my firm belief that the system of Deanery representatives could do a great deal to help in this aspect, and others, with the work of the Guild. It appears that the responsibility of this small but important Office could be operated with much greater efficiency throughout our territory. How about it Deanery representatives, can you make this and the following years the start of an efficiency campaign?

1981 will see three new District Secretaries in Office and whilst it is encouraging fresh faces accepting responsibilities let us not forget those who have relinquished Office and thank them for the time and effort which they have given the Guild. Without your District Officers the work of the Principal Officers would be almost impossible to cope with. Trevor Bailey, who served for a very long time as an Officer of the N.E. District was elected a Vice President at Sudbury in recognition and appreciation of his unceasing and efficient work.

1980, in my opinion, has been a year of progress with encouraging signs of more to come. Thank you all for your efforts – keep up the good work. Finally, but not least, our thanks are due to all who have worked on behalf of the Guild and again this year let me say how much my family and I have appreciated the welcome and support we have received when we have visited the various meetings and events held during the year.

TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

1980 has seen the rededication of the rings at Rushmere St. Andrew and Wickham Market, and the addition of a sharp second at St. Mary-le-Tower, Ipswich. The towers at Haughley, Cratfield, Woodbridge St. Mary, Sproughton and Barham have been restored and work is in hand at Pakenham. Work is projected to the tower and bells at Worlingham and the tower at Chevington.

At Rushmere St. Andrew Taylors have overhauled the ring of six and rehung the bells with new fittings in a new metal lowside frame. At Wickham Market the Whitechapel Foundry has overhauled the ring of six and rehung them with new fittings in an H type frame set lower in the octagonal tower. Both sets of bells are a pleasure to ring. At St. Mary-le-Tower Ipswich the space in the new frame left for a sharp second has now been filled with a new bell cast by Taylors from the metal of the cracked and damaged Mickfield tenor to three, cast by Thomas Gardiner of Sudbury in 1716, and the treble there cast by Thomas Mears II in 1816. Mickfield church is redundant and is on the market for sale, so it was necessary to remove the bells anyway.

At Earl Soham the sound deadening properties of the single floor between the ringers and the bells has been increased, and the writer feels that any further improvement must be by means of another floor between the girders supporting the frame so creating a dead space. He considers the present situation tolerable, and the promised grant from the Bell Restoration Fund has been paid.

During the year your Adviser continued his inspections of Suffolk church bells. His reports cover 399 sets of bells in the diocese, some of which have been examined twice in the last 25 years. During 1980 he inspected the rings of bells at Sibton, Chediston, Carlton, Haughley, Whepstead, Middleton, Barnham, Woodbridge St. Mary and reinspected Pettistree.

At Sibton the five bells are now unringable, and hang in a two tier wooden frame. The tenor's headstock is now in two pieces on a window sill and the bell is supported stationary from beams across the pit.

At Chediston the six bells remain ringable in a modified ancient four bell frame of unusual design, which is also found at Cratfield, Bramfield, and Middleton; perhaps made in the 16th Century. The bottom sill beams in the centre are inclined upwards from the walls and interlock in the middle around a central opening. Interesting, as the design is not known to occur anywhere else in England. The fifth bell is badly cracked in the crown, and a new frame and fittings are needed.

The four bells at Carlton cast by Thomas Andrew of Bury St. Edmunds in 1598 form his only ring; in fact his only other existing bell is at Nedging. The Carlton bells are in a bad state and quite unringable.

At Haughley the tower has been restored on the outside, and it is hoped to get all five bells ringing again. They hang in a timber frame erected by Bowell of Ipswich in 1896 with fittings of the period. The third has a broken wheel, but the writer was able to swing each of the other bells in full circles on his visit. A pit remains in the frame for a treble to make six.

The ring of five at Whepstead remain in quite good order, though they will soon need turning. The tower is in a poor state and needs attention.

At Middleton the ring of five is in a poor way with only the treble fit to swing chime through a small arc. The fourth is well hung, but is badly cracked in the crown; the other three have very decayed and weak fittings.

At Barnham there are four bells; the third is badly cracked, and all have iron straps under their mouths to catch them in case the securing ironwork or headstocks failed. Only the tenor is sounded. There is an Ellacombe chiming apparatus which it is hoped to bring back into use for the three uncracked bells.

At Woodbridge St. Mary the tower wobbles appreciably N-S and upsets the ringing of the second, third, sixth and seventh bells. It has been shown that roping the sixth on the other side of the wheel halves this wobble in rounds, so this modification should be made first, to check on the benefit obtained when changes are rung. If not enough, then we may have to redesign the frame to have say the third and sixth swinging E-W. Quite apart from the difficulty in ringing the bells as they are now, the wobble is bound to have a detrimental effect on the tower which has just recently been restored at considerable expense. So something must be done. At Stradishall Mr. D. Kiddy has continued his work on the bells and he has now roped the tenor on the other side of the wheel to reduce the tower rock here.

At Leiston your Adviser visited when the bells were being rung to check on tower rock, etc. This was satisfactory, but parts of the frame are loose in the tower. He made recommendations to correct this.

At Cratfield the tower is restored, and it is desired to see if the six bells can be made ringable again. Currently the clappers are connected to a chiming manual; these would need to be disconnected and some other work done before this could be attempted. Your Adviser has listed the items and advised the parish.

The metal frame at Wenhasston is badly in need of painting, and your Adviser visited and discussed the problems with Mr. C. Ainger. As the tower is near the sea corroding steelwork must be avoided to ensure long life.

At Mendlesham woodworm attack has required the fourth bell's wheel to be replaced. The tower at Sproughton has now been restored and the bells are now being rung again. It is hoped that they will soon be rehung.

At Pettistree the tower has also been restored and moves are now being made to rehang the ring of six which has not been rung in changes for over 30 years. The writer has reinspected them, and has made up a scheme for such a restoration.

Lawshall has an unringable five in a minor key with a cracked third bell. It is hoped to replace this bell with one from Bruisyard to make a major five. Witlesham has an unringable six, and there is some interest to get them restored.

At Barham there are four bells in poor order. Your Adviser patched them up for swing chiming and obtained an old clapper from Rushmere which he fitted to the treble to replace one which has fallen out and been lost! Alan Smith kindly provided some old bell ropes.

The Towers of the redundant churches at Ipswich St. Lawrence and Ipswich St. Clement are defective and cracked, and ringing has had to stop for the time being.

Your Adviser gave a talk on Belfry Care and Maintenance to the Guild Training Meeting on 25th October which was well received.

At last 'Bells and Bellringing in Suffolk' has appeared, and George Pipe and the writer have been busily signing copies. Some 3000 have been printed and we hope that you will all make a point of getting copies at £1.95 for yourselves and your friends.

The Diocesan Advisory Committee for the Care of Churches, on which your Adviser has served for over 26 years, has been reorganised; and he has agreed to become a member of a Panel of Consultants.

MAINTENANCE OFFICER'S REPORT

Members of your Maintenance Committee have been able to help resolve a goodly number of problems during the past twelve months. Trevor Hughes and David Noy have been particularly active in the Northeast District where at **Laxfield** they were able to free a seized pulley and advise the local ringers regarding the fitting of rope bosses in an intermediate floor, secure a worn Slider which had a disturbing habit of jumping off its pivot and tighten some loose wheel securing bolts. Treat worm infected woodwork at **Little Glemham**, carry out general maintenance at **Yoxford** where the headstocks were found to be very rusty and the 4th and 5th bells found to be loose on their headstocks, fix some heavy duty P.V.C. mesh behind the Louvres in **Aldeburgh** tower and liaise with Mr. Clouston over the problems which currently prevail at **Cratfield**.

Tony Petter has carried out some general maintenance at **Tunstall** and the bell-frame etc. has been repainted by a locally recruited labour force. Tony is also currently engaged in repainting the frame at **Marlesford** with Nevopalene C, a chemical rust stabiliser which has been advertised in 'The Ringing World' from time to time. One big advantage is that it is not necessary to get right down to the bare metal before applying it and so a considerable amount of laborious preparing can be avoided, if it works! At **Debenham** the local band are repainting their bell-frame and at **Woodbridge** (St. Mary) the local ringers are planning a major restoration job and a fund has been launched to finance this.

Members of the local band at **Mendlesham** fitted a new wheel to the 4th. This item was purchased from the Whitechapel Bellfoundry. **Exning** also have been trying to obtain a replacement wheel and have been quoted £170 by Taylor's for a new one.

At **Stoke-by-Nayland** the P.C.C. has had the very large louvered openings professionally rewired by a local building contractor and members of the local band have cleaned out the belfry prior to repainting the metalwork. Work is also in progress on the installation of an effective sound control system at **St. Peter's** church in **Sudbury**. Walter Perry, Leslie Mills, Richard Knight and myself are currently involved in this project and, hopefully, the work will have been completed by the time you get this report.

I would like to thank the members of the Maintenance Committee, on your behalf, for the work which they have undertaken during the past year and to ask you all to lend a helping hand whenever it is necessary. I feel that much of the work which I have detailed above could have been considerably minimised and perhaps even been avoided altogether if regular attention had been given to these matters in the past. Sadly, Suffolk came 'top of the league' in the list of unringable towers which the Central Council of Church Bellringers published at the last A.G.M. In most cases I fear that there is not much we can do to reduce this total but we can at least all do our best to ensure that those bells which are still available to us shall not cease to be so on account of neglect on our part.

Victor Lockwood — Earl Stonham

There have been several ringing families in the Stowmarket area and Vic came from such a one. Much of his ringing was done with Garnham Blaxhall, Harry Lister and the Mendlesham and Cotton Companies. He rang 9 peals for the Guild.

Albert E. Whiting — Helmingham

Tubby Whiting rang over 200 peals for the Guild, mostly at Helmingham and Framsdén. His father, George, and grandfather, Noah, were ringers there before him and possibly his great-grandfather. Certainly he could claim a link back to the historic restoration of the bells in 1816.

Cecil W. Pipe — Grundisburgh

As a boy Jim taught himself to handle a bell and progressed from there to ring on the higher numbers of bells — that part of our art at which he excelled. He served the Guild as Secretary and Treasurer for ten years from 1945, and as a Central Council Representative from 1946 to 1977 and for many years as a Vice-President of the Guild. 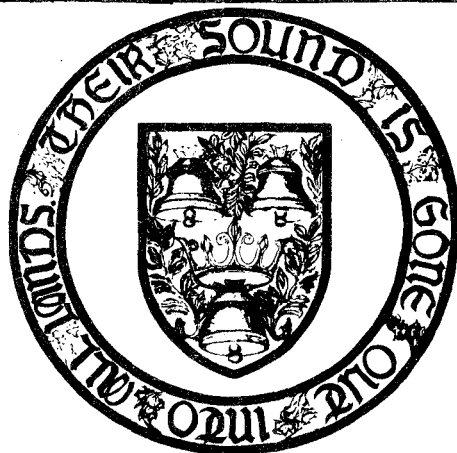
