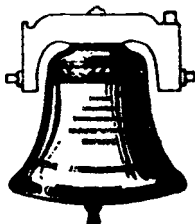

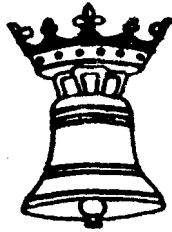

The following table is used to show the condition of the ring:

- 10 — Excellent, Ball bearings, modern frame and fittings.
- 9 — Excellent, Plain bearings, modern frame and fittings — or ball bearings in an old frame.
- 8 — Good going order.
- 7 — Fair going order.
- 6 — Poor going order.
- 5 — Ringable if cleaned up and odd fittings and ropes provided.
- 4 — Ringable with difficulty and a degree of risk after making odd repairs.
- 3 — Unringable mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2 — Unringable mainly because of frame and/or fittings.
- 1 — Hung dead.
- 0 — Some bells unhung and on the ground.

While every effort has been made to ensure that the information given is accurate, the Technical Adviser would be very pleased to hear of any corrections.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

This year has again seen a number of fund raising events and we are very grateful for those members who have organised these events:—

Subscriptions have now reached realistic levels in relation to our expenditure, (£3 for Ringing Members for 1981) and we can now look forward to only modest increases, probably below the rate of inflation, for the next few years. It is encouraging to note that our membership figures have kept up despite these increases in subscriptions and the challenge is there for all of us to keep on recruiting new members to replace those who leave the area and to try and retain for the exercise those who remain in the area.

Completion of the accounts has been unusually prolonged this year because the records for the North West District have been misplaced as a result of the District Secretary's move from the County. It has proved impossible to totally reconcile the transactions for that District and the miscellaneous expenditure item in the General Fund reflects that problem.

Donations have been made as usual to the Friends of the Cathedral, the Friends of St. Peter's Sudbury and the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust. The Guild's insurance policy continues to provide cover for third party liability for all members, the Guild's assets — handbells, shields, masters badge and library — and personal accident cover for the members of the Maintenance Committee.

It is encouraging to note that there have been three applications for grants from the Restoration Fund this year. Now that the Fund is in the position to give significant grants (about 10%) it is to be hoped that Parishes will come forward and start to clear some of the large backlog of restoration work that exists in Suffolk.

Mention should also be made of the new account appearing for this year only — St. Martin's Exning Augmentation Fund. This fund was established because the Restoration Fund cannot aid augmentation works; but the Guild felt that in the case of Exning there were exceptional reasons for augmentation to provide a ring of six in that area of the Guild. The grant which was approved at last year's A.G.M. has therefore been funded partly by special collection/fund raising events and partly from the General Fund. The grant should be paid over early in 1982.

## RINGING MASTER'S REPORT - 1981

For most of my professional life the words 'steady progress' flowed from my pen on to countless reports and they are the most appropriate for ringing in the Guild during 1981.

117 peals were rung which is a return to a three-figure total after two rather lean years. Congratulations to the nine members who rang their first peal during the year — Peter J. Ablitt, Adrian J. Blumfield, Clare Christian, Amanda K. Fielden, Andrew D. Fisk, Robin Rowley, Robert J. Scase, James A. Smith and A. Deborah M. Thorley. Nicholas C. Wade and Deborah Thorley scored their first peals as conductor and joined the seventeen resident members who called peals in 1981.

Peals meriting a special mention are:— Bob Maximus by a N.E. District band; Bob Major by an all-ladies band (the first on the new light eight at St. Mary-le-Tower) and the new record length of Doubles for the Guild rung by a resident band.

After an absence of over ninety years the historic tower of Creetingham (home of the Wightman family) returned to the list of peal towers. Mrs. Patricia M. Bailey has now rung peals in 125 Suffolk towers and is the first to reach this total. Peals were rung to mark the Silver Wedding of George and Diana Pipe.

The Striking Contest was held at Buxhall on May 16th and St. Mary-le-Tower retained the Mitson Shield; the entry was down on previous years — eight bands competing.

There were no handbell peals in 1981 and throughout its history the Guild has been somewhat lacking in this respect so it was an encouraging sign that the first Handbell Training Day took place in Stowmarket on June 6th. This proved to be very arduous for the gallant tutors in charge of the various groups and I am very grateful to them for their efforts and also to the pupils who ventured into this demanding aspect of our art.

The Guild Training Day was again organised in and around Stowmarket but was poorly supported apart from the Grandsire group, which had been requested by members. A further effort has been scheduled for October 1982 and the Recruitment and Training Committee hope for a good turnout. Whether, after some years of being run on a Guild basis, this function would now achieve more real success by being organised at District level remains to be seen.

The level of quarter-peal ringing seems to have been maintained and shows the healthy state of many of our Sunday service bands. The Guild quarter-peal week again gave rise to several bands extending their expertise and furthering the progress of their beginners.

Finally a thought for 1982 and beyond — during the past three years only a handful of the Guild's peals in seven or more Minor methods have been rung by resident bands — plenty of scope for tower captains and ringing masters to encourage a little more adventure in our six-bell ringing.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT

One of the enjoyable aspects of belonging to a Guild of Ringers is the hospitality which one receives as visits are made to meetings and services during the year. It is always good to see old friends and to make new ones and Shirley, Simon and I thank you all most warmly for the way in which we have been received wherever we have been. Our thanks are also due to District Officers and individual members for the support and help which they have willingly given during the year. Finally, but by no means least, our thanks are due to George Pipe who is not seeking re-election as Chairman. George has given much to ringing, especially to Suffolk ringing, and we shall remain in his debt for a very long time.

Throughout the year the routine of the Guild has proceeded smoothly. The Management Committee has met three times at Buxhall with reasonable attendance and your representatives went to the Central Council Meeting at Rochester. One of the contentious items discussed there was a scheme for grading ringers. More recently the Guild was invited to participate in the pilot scheme for this grading, but the Managing Committee decided not to take part. The Striking Competition took place at Buxhall; there was a Handbell Day and a Training Day at Stowmarket and the Social at Stonham Aspal. The Social format changed a little – the emphasis being on dancing of all kinds without the humorous sketches which have become more and more difficult to produce. Credit is due to all the people involved in the planning and organisation of these various events.

As part of our celebrations for 1983 – the Diamond Anniversary of the Guild – it is planned to hold a dinner at the Town Hall in Ipswich (only 120 tickets available). A record of Suffolk Bells is also planned.

Whilst thinking of the future we should also be thankful for those whose foresight in years gone by left us such a rich heritage of churches and bells. Unfortunately in Suffolk we can no longer rest on the good deeds of others and now we must realise how great is the responsibility resting on our shoulders for maintaining and restoring our bells. We have more to do in this county than most others and now is the time to realise just how great is the lead we are giving in the Exercise. Please back your Guild and District Officers in this very important work and if you can do nothing else at least you can covenant your subscription so that the Guild can derive more financial benefit from your money and thus be able to help more parishes with better grants towards their bell restoration work. In the long term it is not only a benefit to us now but also an investment, the value of which our children will surely thank us for. On the other hand, will they thank us for neglecting further the work which so urgently needs attention?

Let us look forward to a happy year of ringing in 1982 and couple with it a special effort to try and help in some way towards the restoration of our Suffolk bells.

## TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

During 1981 your Adviser inspected the rings at Sudbury All Saints, Covehithe, Ipswich St. Matthew, Barking, Weybread and Thorndon. He visited Exning to give advice on the broken tenor wheel and Occold to get details of the cracked treble.

At All Saints Sudbury the heavy eight was rung for the first time for some 15 years, but even now only two faces of the tower have been restored and the other two do need attention. The pre-Reformation sixth bell is seriously worn where the clapper strikes and requires further turning. So at the moment ringing has to be limited to special occasions.

The Covehithe bells and towers are vested in the Redundant Churches Fund. The independent crown staple in the third bell has sheared off inside the headstock and the gudgeon pins knock in the bearings as the bell swings. The tenor's wheel needed repair and a new runner board was required. Other work was noted as desirable in the longer term. It was hoped to put the essential work in hand.

St. Matthew's Ipswich bells had an overhaul in 1903 and had a new frame and fittings; a treble was added in 1933. Now they are in only fair order due to wear in the moving parts. A full overhaul was recommended in five to ten years.

At Barking Alfred Howell recast the old five bells into a ring of six with the same total weight in 1911 and he hung them in a new metal frame with new fittings. There were some minor defects, but they remain in quite good order. In the longer term, say twenty years, ball bearings should be fitted.

The very special ring of six at Weybread cast in 1879 by Messrs. Moore, Holmes and Mackenzie was the first ring by this firm of amateur bell founders. The bells and metal frame trial erected in their foundry yard are illustrated in 'Bells and Belling in Suffolk' page 50. Some of the fittings have been replaced since 1879 and the tenor is not ringable as the gudgeon pins bolted to a modern replacement headstock are not in alignment with the bearings. The writer recommended new fabricated mild steel headstocks, gudgeon pins, ball bearings, replacement or adaption of the present wheels to fit the new headstocks, new pullies, etc.

At Thorndon the six bells are only just ringable, and an overhaul is long overdue. The treble has worn bearings, the second has a makeshift locally fitted timber headstock in four pieces glued together which creaks as the bell swings, the second and third bells need turning and the frame support structure is of questionable strength. The bells need a new frame and fittings.

At Cretingham the tower has been repaired and the bells rung; alas the rope guides have not been replaced and handling is a little difficult.

At Exning the shattered tenor wheel has been replaced. The cause of the accident was not apparent in spite of close inspection; something fouled the wheel when ringing was in progress which locked the rim to the frame. A new treble to make six has been cast and will have been fitted by the time this report is in your hands.

At Hadleigh the seventh bell's clapper has broken. Earlier the six and tenor clappers broke and were replaced in spheroidal graphite cast iron. Hopefully this will be the end of the matter as it is the larger bells which suffer from this problem with clappers made from modern 'wrought iron'. This is quite different from the wrought iron made by the puddling process which has excellent fatigue-resisting qualities.

At St. Mary's Woodbridge the writer roped the sixth bell on the other side of the wheel and this does appear to have had a beneficial effect on the go of this bell and

on the others swinging north-south. Taylors have fitted new pullies, new clapper bushes, refaced the clapper balls and fitted a new set of bell bolts. The ball bearings have been cleaned out and repacked with grease.

Advice has been given to Sproughton on strengthening the tower and to Chediston where repairing the cracked fifth would leave a tenor with badly worn bearings. It is hoped to make a full restoration in both towers.

Haverhill church tower has been restored and the timber props holding the pinnacles and parapets removed.

The writer has now held office as Hon. Technical Adviser for 25 years and it is interesting to see what has been done in this period. 17 rings have been rehung with new fittings and a new frame and seven others with new fittings in the old frame, on average one job a year. Additionally three rings have been hung in ball bearings for the first time.

In the 1958 Report an analysis of the state of our rings of bells was shown; the 1981 state compares as follows:

There is one less ring of bells as we have lost the unringable five at Lydgate. We still have a great many rings hung in plain bearings which are reaching the end of their useful life. If one feels that one only ought to ring a peal on bells rated as good or excellent, one's choice has been reduced from 117 to 98. However the situation is not quite as bad as that as a number of rings rated as fair could be improved if time was spent on special maintenance work. Overall we are only just about holding our own on restoration work and much remains to be done.

The writer is not offering himself for re-election as he feels that it is important that others should have the opportunity to develop the skills necessary to do this work. He will, of course, retain his interest in Suffolk bells and hopes to continue to collect data for a second edition of Raven's *The Church Bells of Suffolk* in 1990 on the centenary of the first edition, as well as to advise on faculty applications relating to bells in the diocese.

He thanks everyone for their support over the last 25 years.

## MAINTENANCE OFFICER'S REPORT

1981 has turned out to be a quiet year maintenance-wise and your Maintenance Committee members received very few requests for assistance during the period under review. Indeed, much of my Report covers work which has been undertaken by enthusiastic 'locals'. In the N.E. District, Trevor Hughes and David Noy carried out general maintenance work at **Heveningham**, whilst at **Rendham** the Treble has been fitted with a new elm headstock which Trevor obtained from a local wood-yard. At the same time John Powter replaced the original plain bearings with new ball bearings.

In the N.W. District, Dick Shipley and other members of the Bury Norman Tower band have carried out general maintenance work at **Dalham** and the enthusiastic local band at **Exning**, under the leadership of Ian Whitear, have played a major part in the recent augmentation of their bells from 5 to 6. The repainting of **Marlesford** bellframe, which I mentioned in my previous Report, has since been completed by members of a newly formed local band and so has the work at **Debenham** which I also reported on last time. At **Woodbridge** members of the local band have assisted Graham Knight of Taylor's to carry out some professional restoration work. The pulleys, clapper bushes and bell bolts have all been replaced and the ball bearings cleaned out and repacked with fresh grease (this latter operation necessitated raising each bell away from the bellframe). Taylor's are charging almost £1400 for this work – a sobering thought is it not!

Archie Fitch has done a tremendous amount of clearing out and cleaning up in **Sudbury All Saints'** belfry and, thanks largely to his sterling work, it is now possible to ring these bells again, albeit for a short while at any one time as further builders' work is necessary to the tower structure before any general ringing will be allowed there. I can also report that further progress has been made with the sound control installation at **Sudbury St. Peter's** and I am greatly indebted to our old friend Walter Perry for his considerable help with this project.

A final word of warning – please keep an eye on your clapper securing devices and make sure that castellated nuts are properly locked with a split pin. **Sudbury St. Gregory's** have been troubled of late with clappers working loose but fortunately no serious damage ensued.

Lastly, a very big 'thank you' on behalf of the Guild to all the above-mentioned 'do-it-yourselfers' and, of course, to anyone else who has done maintenance work which has not yet been brought to my notice. Please carry on the good work and so help to preserve as many of our 'rings' as possible for posterity.

## OBITUARIES

### **F. Borley and E.J. Steed – Buxhall**

Frank and Ted, two Country Gentlemen, and how we in the Guild and people in Buxhall miss them. They loved their village, their Church and their ringing and in true Christian spirit always gave a warm welcome to the belfry, happy to ring or to listen.

### **A. Brown – Ixworth**

Arthur Brown took up ringing late in life but this in no way hindered his enthusiasm and he was a most useful and welcome member to the local company. With his flair for looking after the bells, providing diagrams, hospitality for visitors and the like we wish we had known him longer.

### **S. Bunting – Exning**

Stan worked so hard to see Exning bells augmented to six but sadly died last March, in the knowledge, however, that the work would be done. He was ringing there between the wars and was a contemporary of that well-known Newmarket ringer and conductor, Albert Austin.

### **A.B. King – Rushmere and Hasketon**

Bert King claimed links with the Art back to the mid 19th century when his father and grandfather were ringers at Hasketon and Woodbridge. A most interesting man, he kept a diary of his First World War experiences. After retirement he left his beloved Hasketon and joined the Rushmere band.

### **W.E. Maulden – Framlingham**

Willoughby, known affectionately as Sonny, was a most talented ringer on Tower and in hand with quite the most beautiful handwriting one could wish to see. Despite his great age (nearly 90) his memory was amazing – something he shared with his lifelong friend, George Symonds; fellow ringers as they were at Framlingham in 1900. During a spell away from Suffolk at the beginning of this century Sonny became a member of Alfred H. Pullings famous handbell band. Like his whole demeanour, his striking was immaculate and how he loved Bristol, Double Norwich and Stedman.

### **G. Miller – Lakenheath**

Gerald Miller, like many another in that somewhat remote part of Suffolk, never had ringing on a plate as the saying goes. Somehow this seemed to strengthen resolve and we have many instances of long and loyal service to Church and Guild in that area of which he was an example.

### **F. Mortlock – Lavenham**

One word describes Fred, perhaps there were others – a Character! He was the last of old Arthur Symonds Lavenham band; one of over sixty ringers he taught. An engineer and staunch country boy Fred, like his contemporaries, learnt his theory on handbells and then under strict discipline the Art in the great tower there. It was a hard school no doubt, but he was proud of that pre-war band.

#### **E. Murrell – West Stow**

Ted was connected with West Stow tower for many years – one of those bright and cheerful people it's always nice to have around. He liked to teach as well and helped Chris Nunn, Brian Wells and others to 'master the intricacies'.

#### **F. Ruffles – Earl Soham**

Known to his close friends as 'Pudden', Frank was well-known in the Framsdén-Debenham area, ringing before the war with such worthies as W.C. Rumsey and W.J. Groom. After 1945 he became one of Leslie Brett's band and enjoyed his Surprise Major, his outings and his cigarettes. Frank rang about 100 peals for the N.D.A. and Suffolk Guild and we shall miss his cheery face and dry comment.

#### **A.W.J. Thompson – Southwold**

Arthur (Pimp) Thompson was in essence an Edwardian athlete! Not only a ringer for over 50 years, he was a local identity in N.E. Suffolk playing successfully cricket, hockey, rackets and golf. Heavily involved in the town's affairs in Southwold and knowledgeable of its history, Pimp was also a coastguard and fireman. His daughter, Margot, is married to another former Chairman, John Blythe.

#### **F.E. Wiseman – Rushmere St. Andrew**

Frank was our senior member, in his ninties and a ringer for over seventy years. A watchmaker, he brought the same attention to detail into his ringing and was Captain at Rushmere for many years. The stern exterior hid a warm and kind personality and we mourn his passing.

We also remember any ringers' relatives who may have died during the past year and the families of the above.
