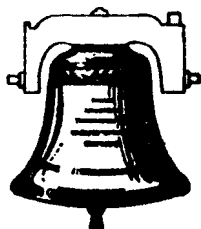

- 10 — Excellent, Ball bearings, modern frame and fittings.
- 9 — Excellent, Plain bearings, modern frame and fittings — or ball bearings in an old frame.
- 8 — Good going order.
- 7 — Fair going order.
- 6 — Poor going order.
- 5 — Ringable if cleaned up and odd fittings and ropes provided.
- 4 — Ringable with difficulty and a degree of risk after making odd repairs.
- 3 — Unringable mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2 — Unringable mainly because of frame and/or fittings.
- 1 — Hung dead.
- 0 — Some bells unhung and on the ground.

TREASURER'S REPORT

This year has in many ways been quite satisfactory from the financial viewpoint. With the accumulated deficit on the General Fund being eliminated in 1981 this years surplus has enabled the accumulated surplus to grow towards an adequate balance. Our finances are now on a sound basis and we can look forward to very modest increases in future years. It should, however, be noted that a number of the expenses (hire of halls secretarial expenses and wreaths) were unusually low this year.

Membership levels have been maintained although a detailed examination of individual entries will show significant additions and deletions. The number of recruits who leave the ringing exercise in any year means that we must continue to recruit significant numbers of new members to the Guild if our membership is not to drop. The number of covenanted subscriptions continue to be disappointing; in fact as a result of deaths and movements out of the area etc. the number of covenantors actually declined during 1982. The unclaimed tax rebate on uncovenanted subscriptions amounts to over £400 each year.

Donations have been made as usual to the Friends of the Cathedral, the Friends of St. Peter's Sudbury and the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust. Donations were also made in 1982 to the Ringing World Editor's retirement gift and the presentation to the retiring Technical Adviser. The North East Open Day, which raised £91.50 more than financed these latter two items. The Guild's insurance policy continues to provide cover for third party liability for all members, the Guild assets (handbells, shields, master's badge and library), and the personal accident cover for the members of the maintenance committee.

This year two large grants of over £1,000 each (just over 10% of the cost of the work) have been promised from the Restoration Fund. Although there was no specific fund raising for restoration the fund income has maintained its level. However there is still a large backlog of restoration work to be done in Suffolk.

The records for the North West District for 1981 surfaced during the year and it proved possible to reconcile most of the entries. This year has been less fraught with this type of problem but the late payment of subscriptions etc. does pose difficulties when trying to close the accounts down by mid January. Assistance by Tower Captains/Secretaries and Deanery Reps in ensuring that all subscriptions are paid as soon as possible would be greatly appreciated.

Ringling Master's Report for 1982

1982 must surely be the Year of the Doubles. More peals of Doubles were rung by the Guild than in any previous year although almost half of them were in 42 methods/variations. Two new Guild records were set in the Doubles sector - 52 m/v at Saxmundham in May and 12120 in 12 m/v at Brandeston in April. There are those who decry the ringing of Doubles but to them I would point out that 80% of Suffolk towers are fives and sixes (indeed only Northamptonshire has more fives) and that a large number of our Sunday Service ringers regularly ring Doubles - myself included.

With her total of 60 peals Mrs. Patrick M. Bailey has set up a new ladies' yearly total for the Guild. This surpasses the 1970 total of 53 by my eldest daughter Katharine, which in turn broke the record of Mrs. Sylvia Pipe who as Miss Bowyer scored 51 in 1938. The only other lady to have rung fifty plus for the Guild in a year is Mrs. Muriel Page who totalled 51 in 1970.

Mrs. Bailey has also now rung peals in 150 Suffolk towers, being the first to do so; Leslie Brett has pushed the highest individual peal total for the Guild beyond the 1100 mark - the 1100th being rung at Helmingham and the method was also Helmingham, fifty years after he had taken part in the first peal in this useful but neglected method. Heartiest congratulations.

Congratulations also to those who rang their first peal in 1982 - Kay D. Nunn, Clive A.J. Williams, Colin C. Morton, E. Linda Schofield, the Reverend Martin J. Turner, Mary P. Smith, Iain W. Mitchell, Ray Lewis, Mary G. Evelyn, Alison J. Evelyn, S. Norman Whiting; to David Noy who scored his first as conductor; to David Tovell who called the first peal for no fewer than seven of our pealers; and to Peter Archer who has joined the select band who have run peals in 100 Suffolk towers.

The Guild's Handbell Day was a disappointment and this function has been discontinued for the time being. The Striking Contest was won for the third time in succession by St. Mary-le-Tower but the entry was one of the lowest ever - it is to be hoped that this year with the experimental interdistrict eight-bell competition being held in the evening more teams will enter to commemorate the Guild's diamond jubilee. However the Training Day was a success, despite the cancellation of one group, and the Quarter Peal Week once again showed the strength of many of our local area bands.

During 1982 the Guild introduced Ipswich Delight to the exercise - ringing peals of it on 8, 10, and 12 bells. A peal of Stedman Cinques was rung at St. Mary-le-Tower in January as a thanksgiving for the ministry of Canon Geoffrey Tarris during whose incumbency the bells were restored. Peals of Bristol and Newgate Maximus were recorded and the Guild's heaviest peal so far - at Sherborne Abbey in February.

My remarks of last year seem to have been taken to heart and in 1982 the Guild rang a goodly number of peals of Minor in seven or more methods. May this continue in 1983 and may I also hope for a greater number of Guild members taking part in peals of Major. Although 1982 was the third most prolific year for peals in the Guild's history I would like 1983 to have a lot more peals BY the Guild rather than just for the Guild.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

1983 is now upon us and it seems only a very short time since I wrote my Report for 1981 but I must stir myself and report and record for posterity the events of 1982. Before I do I must offer my thanks to the many loyal members of the Guild for their support and help. Without you, the members, there would be no Guild and it is as well for some of us to remember this fact. Thank you all, too, for your welcome all over Suffolk - it really is appreciated. Very sincere thanks were expressed to Ranald Clouston when he retired from the post of Technical Adviser; the Guild presented Kitty and Ranald with a pair of engraved glass goblets as a gesture of our thanks. Ian Whitear succeeds Ranald and I am sure he will measure up to the high standards set by his predecessor.

Under the guidance of our new Chairman - the Reverend Lawrence Pizzey - the Management Committee has met regularly and your Council Representatives travelled to Bedford for the 1982 meeting. The usual Guild events were held at their appropriate times with the exception of the Social which was cancelled. The Management Committee felt that it was wise to do this because of the various difficulties and I feel they were right since little by way of protest has come to me. Perhaps it was time for a change anyway - inter District cricket matches, barn dances and other social events have been arranged during the year so it may be that this is the direction in which we should be moving.

With three other members I went to Northampton in October to attend a Central Council Seminar on Bell Restoration Funds. It was a useful and very interesting day. How pleasing it was to discover how well we, in Suffolk, are doing in this field - as I said last year, leading the Exercise - and to realise the depth of knowledge held by and the respect given by others to our Treasurer Alan Smith. I make no excuse, therefore, for briefly returning to this theme and urging you all to do all you can, by whatever means, to further the restoration work of the Guild. We have one of the biggest jobs to tackle in the whole of the country and the help of every member is needed.

Over a period of time I have been asked at meetings and by individuals to give a 'job description' of the Deanery Representative's work. This I have done in some detail and by the end of 1982 it was in the hands of each District Chairman. Please ask them for details if you have not already heard them and if you have now seen them then please give some thought to the problems. If you, as an ordinary member, don't know your Deanery Rep. then consult the list of names given elsewhere in this Report and then seek out your Deanery Representative. They are the vital link between you and the various District and Guild Officers and they are the first to approach with your ideas and/or problems. I hope they will make themselves known to you and I hope you will help them to improve the way in which our Guild functions. It is at this level that the real work and improvements can be made.

As I have visited the various quarterly meetings during the year it has been very encouraging to see the considerable numbers of young people joining our ranks. Whilst I can appreciate their reluctance to air their views in front of some of the 'old stagers' let me assure them that their ideas are always welcomed. Some of them will have to shoulder the burden of office in future years and we must, therefore, help and guide them whenever possible.

Finally let me thank all my fellow Officers for their help and hard work during the year. It is their good will, patience and forbearance which keeps our Guild running in such a smooth manner. To them and to you all I wish happy ringing in 1983.

TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

It is with some trepidation that I start this report, it not being easy to follow in the footsteps of a man of the calibre of Ranald Clouston and to whom I owe a great deal of thanks for his support and teaching.

During the year as Technical Adviser, towers visited include Palgrave, Bardwell, Dalham, Felsham, Chevington, Tattingstone and Great Waldingfield.

During the visit to Palgrave the frame was tightened up and each bell rung singly. Here, however the basic problem is that the 1908 bell frame by Day is on three layers of much older timbers which are inadequate to prevent it moving both vertically and horizontally when the bells are rung. This decayed support structure needs to be replaced and, at the same time, the bells need to be overhauled.

Movement within the spiral staircase leading to the ringing chamber at Bardwell, has resulted, as a precaution, in ringing being restricted. Some strengthening work on the staircase may be necessary.

At Dalham only the three larger bells are capable of being rung for special occasions but with increased local interest in the bells it is hoped that some of the much needed short term restoration work will be done in the not too distant future thus enabling all five bells to be rung.

The bells at Felsham, are in need of an overhaul. The main cause for concern here is the state of the main bearings on the second, fourth and fifth bells to the extent that there is a risk that a gudgeon pin may shear and a bell may fall into the pit.

A gradual deterioration of the bells and frame can be seen at Chevington. The strengthening work done in 1970 has done little to prevent general movement of the frame and the associated bad going of the bells. There is a considerable amount of short term work that could be done to improve the situation here.

At Tattingstone the main cause for concern is the tower which is badly cracked to its full height so that when the bells are rung it tends to act as two separate sections. The installation of a reinforced concrete ring beam below the bell frame level may well be necessary before the situation can be stabilised.

The bells at Great Waldingfield are rung from a manual at ground level and a complete restoration with a new frame and fittings will be necessary, including the quarter turning of each bell because of the bad wear caused by the clappers. It would seem that the last time any work was done on these bells was in 1895.

Ringling at Ufford has been stopped because of the failure of one of the buttresses whilst at Framsdén a gudgeon pin on the tenor has cracked and ringing is restricted to the front six bells for the present.

New rope guides have been fitted at Cretingham to improve the handling of the ropes but at Burgate frame movements make for difficulties when the bells are rung in changes.

The future looks bright for Euston and Harkstead where restoration and augmentation to six bells is planned for both towers. Let us hope that the enthusiasm and courage shown by these parishes will encourage others to do the same.

MAINTENANCE OFFICER'S REPORT

I began my 1981 Report with the observation that your Maintenance Officers had received very few requests for assistance during the year and the same must be said about 1982 which has turned out to be very similar in this respect. Please do not take this as a complaint - in some ways it is a relief since we all have quite a number of private commitments anyway.

According to Guild Rules each District Maintenance Officer should endeavour to inspect every belfry in his District at least once a year but I am sure you will agree that this is a very daunting task and a very expensive one in view of the high cost of transport these days. However we each have a genuine desire to do what we can to help maintain as many peals of bells in Suffolk as possible in a ringable condition so we gladly offer such help and advice as we are able to when the need arises.

Although our services have not been required for any major restoration projects during 1982, minor repairs and check-ups have been executed in a number of belfries in the Diocese. Blythburgh, Covehithe, Wenhaston and Wrentham have been inspected and general maintenance work has been carried out where it was found necessary. Blythburgh bell ropes have been extensively spliced with new top ends and bell rope repairs and renewals are currently in hand at Saxmundham and Theberton. Repairs and general maintenance have also been carried out to chiming apparatus installed at Great Glemham, Great Waldingfield and Groton churches by Maintenance Committee members. Sadly, none of these bells can be rung full circle but it was felt to be a useful publicity exercise on behalf of the Guild. This is the kind of work which we hope could be carried out by local people as the need arises and so spare your District Maintenance Officer for other, perhaps more formidable, projects. Please do not hesitate to ask his advice, however, as he has access to a certain amount of specialised information concerning bell maintenance and will also carry a small stock of lubricant and wood preservative for emergency use.

I would like to conclude my Report by thanking the various District Maintenance Officers and their assistants for the good work which they have undertaken on behalf of the Guild during 1982. To David Noy, Tony Petter and Robert Scase, none of whom are seeking re-election to the 1983 Committee, we offer a big "thank you" for the work which they have done.

A.A. Ling - Benhall

The Lings, Smys, Henry Puttock and others were immortalised in George Ewart Evans' book, "Ask the fellows who cut the hay" in that lovely chapter on Bell Ringing. Arthur, like them all, was a six-bell ringer, loyal to his Guild and his towers at Benhall and Blaxhall.

J.W. Paul - Elveden

Elveden ringing was Jim Paul - keen member for over fifty years in an area which has always had to struggle. He was a man of several talents, not least a noted local cricketer, but we shall remember most of all his welcome to his beloved tower of SS Andrew & Patrick. Let us hope these fine bells continue to ring in his memory.

Other ringers who have passed on to that higher belfry in 1982 but were not Guild members were A. Mumford from Redgrave and Arthur Mason, Newmarket. Especially we rememeber Stephen Oxford, a ringer at Polstead for sixty-two years. A staunch churchman, he was the epitome of dedication for which we give thanks. He took up method ringing late in life, ringing all his forty Quarters on his own bells.

We also remember any ringers' relatives who may have died during the past year and the families of the above.

May they rest in peace.

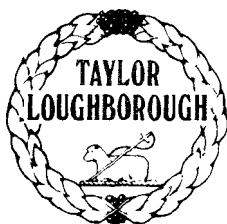

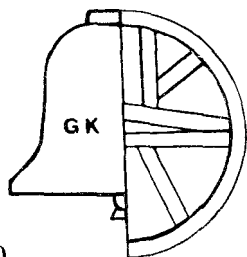

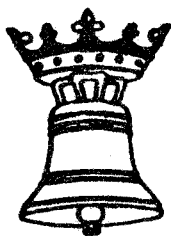
