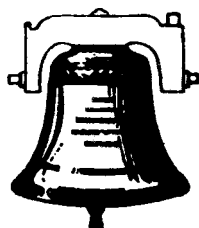

## INDEX AND DIRECTORY OF TOWERS

The following table is used to show the condition of the ring:

- 10 - Excellent, Ball bearings, modern frame and fittings.
- 9 - Excellent, Plain bearings, modern frame and fittings - or ball bearings in an old frame.
- 8 - Good going order.
- 7 - Fair going order.
- 6 - Poor going order.
- 5 - Ringable if cleaned up and odd fittings and ropes provided.
- 4 - Ringable with difficulty and a degree of risk after making odd repairs.
- 3 - Unringable mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2 - Unringable mainly because of frame and/or fittings.
- 1 - Hung dead.
- 0 - Some bells unhung on the ground.

While every effort has been made to ensure that the information given is accurate, the Technical Adviser would be very pleased to hear of any corrections.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

This year has ways again been quite satisfactory from the financial viewpoint. The surplus on the General Fund for the year has been maintained at £100 despite the transfer of £50 to the Tattlingstone Bell Fund; as a result the accumulated surplus continues to grow towards an adequate balance and we can perhaps now contemplate less frequent increases in subscriptions in the future.

Membership levels have declined by 12% and 10% in two Districts and increased by 7% and 16% in the other two Districts. Overall, membership numbers were static but we must continue to be vigilant in recruiting new members and retaining existing members. The uptake of covenants continues to be somewhat disappointing but I am planning a new campaign for later in the year to coincide with the need to renew a number of the initial covenants - more on this at a later date !

Donations have been made as usual to the Friends of the Cathedral, the Friends of St. Peter's Sudbury and the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust. The Guild's insurance policy continues to provide cover for third party liability for all members, the Guild's assets [handbells, shields, master's badge and library], and the personal accident cover for the members of the maintenance committee.

The sound proofing work at St Peter's Sudbury has been carried out this year and this and the fund raising efforts of members, to whom we are most grateful, are recorded in that account. Accounts have been included this year to show the Guild's special contributions to the work at Tattlingstone and Edwardstone. A further new account has also been included this year for the Guild Library, where the librarian has sold a number of spare copies of old reports and the proceeds of these sales are being used to augment the Guild Library - this fund can finance augmentations as well as restorations, but only of the books.

## Secretary's Report

For all of us 1984 must have had its 'ups and downs' but when I look back on the events of the year in an attempt to make a reasonable record of them in my Report I am again delighted to see so many positive things going on. Sadness and disappointments there have been - the losses of Imogen Holst and George Finch to mention but two - and we must not overlook such things but I feel that the most important items to be recorded are those which indicate progress within the Guild.

1984 was the 70th Anniversary of the Diocese and this was marked by special ringing on a number of occasions. The Cathedral was visited by the Archbishop of Canterbury on 23rd June and the Norman Tower bells were rung prior to the Service which was held in the open air. A week earlier Long Melford celebrated the 500th Anniversary of the church there and both the S.W. District and the Guild rang Quarter Peals before the Morning and Evening Services. At the end of the year (Boxing Day) the representative Guild band rang the first peal on the ten bells of St. Peter's, Sudbury after the completion by Charles Ablitt of the soundproofing work there. Incidentally, our thanks and congratulations must go to quite a number of people, especially in the South-West, for the massive fund raising efforts (including a concert by 'The Sound in Brass') which have paid for this work.

A well attended Annual Meeting was held at Hadleigh where the Service was taken by the Dean and an ample tea provided by the local ladies. Sylvia Pipe was accorded the double honour of being elected a Vice President and a Life Honorary Member. Maurice Rose presented the Guild with a magnificent pewter Chalice as an Eight Bell Striking Competition Trophy - a gift from his family in recognition of the happiness and comradeship which they had all received from the Exercise.

The historic six bells at Weybread were rededicated in April and Tattingstone finally obtained and hung their new treble with the dedication held in early December. The work of fund raising at Sproughton continues despite the setbacks experienced. Some early setbacks were also experienced at Edwardstone where it is hoped to launch a joint venture between the parish and the Guild to restore the six bells. Preliminary discussions have produced very encouraging results and Guild Officers are hoping that this new and exciting aspect of our work will eventually lead to the Guild being able to offer more positive help to other parishes anticipating restoration of their bells.

Other well established Annual events took place at their appropriate times. Your Treasurer was, at his first Council Meeting, elected to the Central Council Bell Restorations Funds Committee. The Guild Management Committee held their usual three meetings at Buxhall. The Training Day in October was judged to have been the best so far; Guild Striking Competitions were held at Blythburgh and Halesworth and the Master again organised an Open Towers Day (now to be re-named Public Relations Day) and another Guild Outing to London.

Activity at 'grass roots level' is increasing with quarter peals regularly being attempted by a number of towers while Practice Night activity is worthy of mention at Wilby, Saxmundham, Holbrook, Stratford St. Mary and Polstead. It is good to see the formation of new bands - why not try to offer them some support this year?

In conclusion my sincere thanks are due to my fellow Officers for their help and encouragement during the year and similarly I must also thank District Officers for their help. Special thanks are offered to all members for their welcoming smiles extended to Shirley and me when we have been to their various meetings. Happy ringing to you all in 1985.

## Technical Adviser's Report for 1984

1984 has seen the restoration of the ring at Weybread completed and the augmentation of the bells at Tattingstone and Ringsfield. Work has started on the restoration at Sproughton with the bells currently at the foundry, whilst strengthening is carried out on the tower.

At Weybread the ring of six have been overhauled and rehung with new cast iron headstocks and ball bearings. Because of the unique nature of this ring, cast in 1897 by Moore, Holmes and Mackenzie, as much of the original fittings as possible have been retained.

The augmentation at Tattingstone to six has been achieved by the transfer of the former

treble at St. Mary's, Cricklade, Wilts; cast by Thomas Rudhall in 1779. The work of hanging the bell has been carried out using local voluntary labour.

At Ringsfield, the ring of three has been augmented to four, by the addition of a treble, cast and hung by Whitechapel Foundry.

During the year, your Adviser has carried out inspections at Framsdon, Edwardstone, Ashbocking, Wickham Skeith and Fornham All Saints and visited Saxmundham to advise on weather proofing the bell chamber.

The tenor at Framsdon has been rehung on ball bearings, following the failure of the gudgeon pin. The remaining bells are in quite good order, but are in need of an overhaul. They were last rehung by A. Bowell in 1914, who also recast the fourth bell at the same time.

At Edwardstone, the ring of six have not been rung in living memory and the present frame and fittings can never be used again for ringing in full circle. There is considerable local interest in restoring this ring of bells and a fund for that purpose has started.

The frame and fittings at Ashbocking have been painted by the local ringers and the installation is now generally in a very good condition.

At Wickham Skeith, the treble gudgeon pin has a lump missing, which will restrict ringing to the back five until the pin and deadstock are replaced. These bells were last rehung in 1892 by George Day and Son of Eye, since which time there appears to have been very little work carried out on them.

The ring of five at Fornham All Saints are in quite good order, the main cause for concern here being the tower. There are several major vertical cracks to the base of the tower, which means that it is effectively acting as three separate structures. The situation is not helped by the lack of buttress and the fact that four of the bells swing North/South, which is the weaker direction of the tower.

At Thrandeston, the bells remain in quite good order, though a leaking roof hatch cover has caused the north end of the fifths headstock to become rotten.

There are problems of decay to the frame at Stonham Aspal. The ten bells were rehung in 1884 by George Day and Son of Eye, at which time the northern part of the east side frame was found to be decayed. Remedial work carried out then has not arrested the decay and this has continued, such that some four feet of the bottom sill under the eighth bell has gone completely and three side-frame members dangle with no support at all.

Improvements have been made at Chevington by cleaning out all the debris in the bell chamber, replacing the thirds worm eaten slider and greasing the bearings. These improvements have allowed local people to be trained in order that the bells may be rung for Sunday Services.

Measurements of the horizontal rock at Mildenhall are verging on being unacceptably large and not good for the tower. The main cause of the problem is that both the ninth and tenor swing North/South, the weaker direction of the tower. In the short term the ninth bell can be rehung to swing East/West in order to reduce the movements. The longer term solution will require a reinforced concrete ring beam to be cast round and into the four walls with the bells rehung in a new properly designed frame, lower in the tower.

The need for a new strategy within the Guild towards bell restoration is again emphasised by the Summary at the end of the Directory of Towers. Whilst there are three less towers graded at or below five, there is an increase of five towers in the six/seven category. These are the vulnerable rings which will soon slip into the unringable range.

If we are to go any way towards arresting the problem, we have to be far more positive as a Guild in our outlook and thinking; be prepared to offer help to parishes as a package and be flexible in our approach.

## **Suffolk Guild Maintenance Officer's Report for 1984**

During 1984 members of the maintenance committee carried out work at the following towers with local assistance in some cases:-

*Ashbocking* - Frame painted. Pulleys and tenor stay attended to.

*Badingham* - Ropes checked.

*Barking* - Bells oiled and checked. Ropes sleeved in the garter hole. Some ropes spliced.

*Barrow* - Clappers needed rebushing.

*Baylham* - Bells oiled and ropes checked. Some frame movement.

*Chevington* - Rubbish cleared out of bellchamber. A stay and slider have been replaced. Set of

second-hand ropes are to be fitted. Frame tightened up.

*Helmingham* - Missing step on ladder replaced.

*Lavenham* - Tenor clapper replaced.

*Peasenhall* - Tenor headstock replaced, but gudgeons out of alignment.

*Polstead* - Some work carried out on clappers.

*Sudbury St. Peter* - Sound-proofing work completed.

*Theberton* - Clappers tightened and new ropes fitted.

*Wenhaston* - Broken clapper staple replaced.

*Winston* - Rope maintenance carried out.

*Yoxford* - New ropes fitted and routine checks carried out.

## Ringling Master's Report for 1984

1984 was a comparatively quiet year after the excitement of the Diamond Jubilee Year. However we had plenty of opportunity to celebrate the 70th Anniversary of the Diocese. There were many peals rung for this, including some rare or first visitors to the peal lists.

The Guild outing in April was very well supported with ringing taking place at Stepney (10), Cubitt Town (8), Greenwich (10), Lewisham (8), Deptford (8) and Southwark Cathedral (12). Some 70 members and friends enjoyed a rather warm day. Another outing is planned for 20th April 1985, also to London.

The Guild striking competitions were as usual held in May, at Blythburgh and Halesworth. As in 1983, St. Mary-le-Tower won the 6 bell competition and The South East District won the 8 bell competition. It was good to see all four Districts and also an individual tower band enter the 8 bell competition.

This event seems now to be established following the donation of the excellent trophy by Maurice and Anita Rose. However I am still disappointed by the entry in the 6 bell competition. Gone are the days of 15+ tower teams. I hope bands are not being put off by St. Mary-le-Tower's recent good run in this competition, because it should be remembered that this band did not win at all during the first 15 years of the competition. So come on let us have a bumper entry at Gt. Barton.

June was the month of the Guild 'Open Day' with four towers being opened to the public in each district. Overall this event was a success although some towers had few visitors. I feel it is important that such events are well publicised locally - church magazine, parish notice boards etc. Another public relations exercise is planned for 29th June, 1985, but at the time of writing the exact towers have not been decided.

The training day in October was the success story of the year. Over 70 people attended at some stage during the day. Seven of the eight courses advertised were run. A good day was had by all. My sincere thanks to everybody who helped in any way but particularly to Amanda Whiting. Hopefully 1985 will be even bigger and better.

165 peals were rung in 1984, another good year in terms of numbers. My congratulations to first pealers:- Janet Bailey, John Bonney, Richard, Bufton, Janet Butlin, Marie Eaton, Sarah England, Celia and Marie Hacker, Mary Halsall, Michael Rolf and Gordon Slack. First conductors were Andrew Fisk, Linda Tovell and Stephen Young. I cannot pass without mentioning Linda's peal at Rushmere in July, it was sponsored in aid of the Special Care Baby unit at Ipswich Hospital and demonstrates Linda's tremendous courage following her personal tragedies.

Personal achievements worthy of mention were:-

100th peal - Robin and Mary Allum, David Noy; 200th peal - Janice Baldry, Michael Whitby; 250th peal - Harry Archer, Roger Peters; 300th peal - Peter Archer; 350th peal - Alan Mayle; 400th peal - Simon Rudd; 450th peal - Peter Mayle; 600th peal - Trevor Bailey; 700th peal - George Pipe.

Peals for the Guild: 100th - Robin and Mary Allum, David Noy; 150th - John Girt; 200th - Alan Mayle; 300th - Peter Archer, Michael Baldry; 500th - Martin Thorley.

150th Suffolk Tower - Trevor Bailey; 200th Tower for a peal - Pat Bailey; 400th Suffolk Tower for a peal - Martin Thorley.

I cannot leave this section without mentioning Alan and Peter Mayles' 300th peal together, possibly the most father and son have rung together. No doubt I shall be corrected if this is not the case.

It is also pleasing to note that the first peal has been rung at St. Peter's Sudbury, following augmentation. Hopefully all districts will have the opportunity to ring peals there during 1985.

Peal footnotes also indicate that a number of ringers have progressed to peals on higher numbers and to methods of great intricacy.

Quarter peal ringing continues to be very popular and numerous firsts were scored during 1984. The Diocesan celebrations in June and the Guild Quarter Peal Week were significant in helping people to improve their ringing.

Our oldest surviving past Master, Leslie Brett, celebrated his 80th birthday this year. My congratulations and best wishes to him.

Finally I would like to thank all the district officers and Guild members for the hospitality I have been shown whilst travelling round the county to meetings and events. I hope they all continue their good work in 1985.

## Peal Secretary's Report 1984

During the year 163 peals were recorded, the highest number since 1973. It is appropriate that such a figure should include 17 peals organised especially to mark the 70th anniversary of the Diocese, including a few rare towers to the peal columns.

First peals on the bells were rung at Dalham, Old Newton and Ringsfield, and the first peal since augmentation was rung at Harkstead and St. Peter's, Sudbury.

Welcome towers to the peal lists after a number of years absence include Haughley (56 yrs), Sudbury St. Peter (51 yrs), Hunston (31 yrs), Freckenham (25 yrs) and Long Melford (20+ yrs). At Newmarket All Saints, the first peal for the Guild was rung, this being only the second peal in over 70 years on the bells.

Peals worthy of individual mention are:-

Yorkshire Maximus at Ipswich, 5th May - first of Maximus by a regular Sunday Service and practice night band since 1939.

Plain Bob Royal at Beccles, 9th June - by members of the Sunday service band.

Rochester Maximus at Ipswich, 4th February - to mark the 50th anniversary of the first peal of Maximus in the method, (Ipswich 3rd February 1934).

Hasketon S. Major at Ipswich, 27th June - the first peal in the method.

Four peals of Stedman Doubles - a record number for the Guild. The peals included the first in the method on 5 bells for the Guild, and the first to be conducted by a lady ringer for the Guild.

Antelope Doubles at Benhall, 6th June - the first peal in the method for the Guild.

## OBITUARIES

### **The Right Reverend David Maddock M.A.**

As a greatly loved Bishop of Dunwich, David Maddock served this Diocese from 1967-1976 and from 1976-1980 as Provost of the Cathedral. An enthusiastic supporter of our Guild he loved bells and had been involved in restorations in his native Dorset. Peals in his memory were rung at Dalham and Old Newton.

### **Arthur F. Ballam - West Stow**

Arthur who would have been eighty in January was a founder member of our Guild. A loyal Sunday Service ringer he also served as a District Secretary. At home on Tower or Handbells Arthur loved good striking and was especially fond of his Grandsire Caters.

### **Thomas J. Brock - Kessingland**

Lovable character was Tom, so much part of the North East scene and a keen ringer for both the N.D.A. and the Suffolk Guild. Many ringers from both counties attended his funeral at Kessingland, a tribute to his popularity. Tom rang 88 peals for the Guild.

### **John W. Crapnell - St. Margarets, Ipswich**

Although not active for some years Jack was a regular ringer at both St. Margarets and Rushmere, following his father Charles and in turn teaching his son Dennis.

### **George Finch - Marlesford**

Another Guild founder in 1923 and for twenty years before that an N.D.A. member, this wonderful Christian gentleman provided just about our last link with the 19th Century. How we miss George - his humour, generosity and humility - his presence at our meetings resplendent with red buttonhole; his fine bass voice; loved by young and old alike. Rejoicing with the Communion of Saints we rang and 'open' peal for him in his favourite methods, Double Court and Oxford, on his bells at Marlesford.

### **Imogen Holst - Aldeburgh**

This great musician was not only a welcome Associate Member of our Guild but a great ambassador for ringing too. When interviewed for Desert Island Discs some years ago one of her eight records was Debenham Bells being rung to Bristol Surprise Major, a recording we made for the B.B.C. in the sixties.

### **Joseph Y. Parker - Mildenhall**

Yorke Parker was an enthusiast, the sort of man it's always good to know! A quite remarkable pioneering engineer his name was legendary in the Fens.

He was not an advanced ringer but loved bells and the company of ringers. So keen was he in fact that he used to write to us in Australia in the fifties to learn what was happening in the art overseas. The Mildenhall and District ringers will greatly miss him.

### **Charles W. Roberts - Waltham Abbey**

A Life Member, Charlie Roberts was one of the greatest ringers of all time. Composer and conductor, a thousand-pealer, at home anywhere in the circle on all numbers of bells, he was a member of William Pye's band with whom he rang many notable peals. He was also a fine musician and great listener of ringing too. A giant of the exercise.

### **Miss Ulla Simpson - Polstead**

Ulla, sadly taken from us at the tender age of 21 lived her life to the full; involved in Guides, Community work, the local Youth Club as well as her ringing. Throughout her long illness her Christian faith never wavered - an inspiration and example to us. The local band at Polstead will miss her very much indeed.

### **Mrs. Madge Snowling and W. Muttitt - Blythburgh**

These two good people were keen call change ringers at Holy Trinity in a church and area that needed their sort of support. One remembers the welcome and fine teas that were a feature of District meetings at Blythburgh.

**Bert Smith - Hasketon**

Bert belonged to the pre-war and immediate post-war Hasketon band whose conductor was Bill Sawyer. He and his brother Jim only rang on six but were fond of their College Exercise, Oxford and Woodbine.

**Richard Thorpe - Stoke by Nayland**

One of those quiet unassuming men; often the backbone of village and church life. Dick died in October at the age of 70. He had been a ringer at Stoke for many years and loved to hear his and other bells rung well - whether in call changes or in methods. Ringers in the area have lost a dear friend.

**Norman Watson (N.R.L.M.) - Thetford**

A tragic road accident has robbed the N.W. of our county of a fine man in only his middle years. Norman helped with ringing in towers like Elveden that so badly need support and we are grateful for his ringing amongst us.

We also remember Mrs. J. Bailey of Stratford St. Mary, Mrs. Violet (Dot) Button of Stonham Aspal and Mrs. C. Rodgers of Woolpit and any other relatives of our members.
