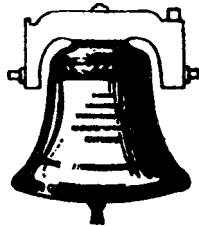

# INDEX AND DIRECTORY OF TOWERS

The following table is used to show the condition of the ring:

- 10 - Excellent, Ball bearings, modern frame and fittings.
- 9 - Excellent, Plain bearings, modern frame and fittings - or ball bearings in an old frame.
- 8 - Good going order.
- 7 - Fair going order.
- 6 - Poor going order.
- 5 - Ringable if cleaned up and odd fittings and ropes provided.
- 4 - Ringable with difficulty and a degree of risk after making odd repairs.
- 3 - Unringable mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2 - Unringable mainly because of frame and/or fittings.
- 1 - Hung dead.
- 0 - Some bells unhung on the ground.

While every effort has been made to ensure that the information given is accurate, the Technical Adviser would be very pleased to hear of any corrections.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

This year has ways again been quite satisfactory from the financial viewpoint. The surplus on the General Fund for the year increased to £210, there being no exceptional items, as a result the accumulated surplus has grown to an adequate balance and we can now contemplate some stability in subscriptions rates in the future.

Membership levels have declined by 11% and 9% in two Districts and increased by 4% and 17% in the other two Districts. Overall, membership numbers were static but we must continue to be vigilant in recruiting new members and retaining existing members.

Donations have been provided as usual to the Friends of the Cathedral, the Friends of St. Peter's Sudbury and the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust. The Guild's insurance policy continues to provide cover for third party liability for all members, the Guild's assets [handbells, shields, master's badge and library], and the personal accident cover for the members of the maintenance committee. The administrative etc expenses this year includes £46 for new receipt books.

This year has seen a record level of grants from the Restoration Fund which reflects the upsurge in interest in restoration in Suffolk. The uncommitted balance on the Fund of £860 is now very low (it has in fact all been committed at the February 1986 Committee Meeting), and if we are to continue to encourage restoration work consideration will need to be given to fund raising for the Restoration Fund.

## Secretary's Report

When I wrote my Report for 1984 I was delighted to be able to write of positive and encouraging events which had taken place and again this year I am able to record further progress which has been achieved, often by hard and dedicated work, in different areas of the Guild.

Aldeburgh was the venue for the Annual Meeting where a good number of members attended the service and later sampled a sumptuous tea. Our thanks are in no small way due to our members there for the success of the meeting. Canon John Rutherford was elected a Life Honorary Member - we wish him well in his retirement - and Maurice Rose was elected a Vice-President. Management Committee Meetings have been held regularly. The clerk of the weather looked favourably upon us (as he always does) for Striking Competitions at Fornham St. Martin and Elveden (what a lovely setting!); the Guild Outing to London when a London Transport bus was hired to ferry us around; the Public Relations Day and the Training Day. All these events were again successfully arranged and provided enjoyable social gatherings for members.

At St. Peter's, Sudbury each District has now successfully completed a peal and the organisation of events at this tower has now been vested in a St. Peter's company with the Management Committee retaining the right to oversee the organisation. Restorations at Sproughton and St. Matthew, Ipswich, have been carried out and two more bells have been added at Kersey to augment that ring to eight.

Last year I wrote of hopes of beginning a joint venture between the Guild and the Parish to restore the bells at Edwardstone. These events have really snowballed with the amazing result that not only has almost all the money required been raised but also the bells will have been (by the time you read my Report, I hope) removed to the foundry. It is probable that they will be ringing by August - well before Christmas 1986 which was the date originally hoped for. After initial problems encountered in 1984 a similar success story appears to be breaking at Pettistree where, in December, a meeting was held to ascertain the feelings of the parishioners concerning a proposal to restore the bells. By the end of the meeting practically all the required funds had been raised or promised! A third joint venture is in the early stages of discussion at Horham where it now seems likely that at some time in the future that unique ring of eight will be ringable again and as I write this Report I have just received an enquiry asking what help and advice is available to assist the parish of Hoxne restore their bells. At long last we are being given the opportunity to help preserve and restore our heritage and to do it in a positive way. If you are asked to help these or maybe some other venture please give the request serious consideration - there must be some way in which you could help. At Edwardstone and Pettistree very valuable teaching assistance is being provided by bands at Kersey, Polstead, Bredfield and Wickham Market under the care of Neville Whittell, Eddie Hynard, Mike Pilgrim and others in their bands. Our thanks are certainly due to them for they are making it possible to have a band of ringers ready to receive the newly restored bells.

Almost at the end of the year - on Friday 13th December - our Chairman changed his allegiance from the North West District to the South West District. We wish him and his family every success in his new parishes.

Lastly, but by no means least, I again offer my sincere thanks to my fellow Officers for their hard work, help and support during the year and in a similar manner I extend my thanks to all the District Officers for their help. Thank you all, too, for your welcome where Shirley and I have been to meetings and events. Success and joyful ringing to you all in 1986.

## Technical Advisers Report

1985 has been a very busy year for your Adviser, with inspections being carried out at Assington, Badwell Ash, Holbrook, Long Melford, Old Newton, Newmarket All Saints, Stoke by Clare, Stonham Aspal and Timworth; and the restoration of the rings at Sproughton, St Mary's Newmarket and St Matthew's Ipswich.

The ring of six at Sproughton have been rehung by Whites in a new wooden frame lower in the tower which has also been strengthened by a reinforced concrete ring beam. The fourth bell has been recast by the Whitechapel Bell Foundry whilst the fifth has been welded in the crown by Soundweld Ltd. The fitting of the clock chimes is outstanding, which when done, will see the completion of a very satisfactory restoration.

At St Mary's Newmarket, the four lighter bells have been rehung on ball bearings, the loose

gudgeon pin on the fifth replaced and the clappers refurbished.

The bells at St Matthews, Ipswich have been rehung in the existing Bowell frame, installed in 1903, with new fittings by Taylors of Loughborough.

The seventh's headstock at Henley developed a hairline crack on the underside near the gudgeon pin and has been replaced with a new one cast by Taylors and installed by the local ringers.

At Kersey the ring of six has been augmented to eight by the addition of two trebles cast by Taylors and installed by the local band together with the additional necessary framework.

The ring of five at Badwell Ash were last rehung in 1899 by Days of Eye. The fittings are generally in quite good condition, but in need of some maintenance work on them and a new set of ropes.

At Assington, movement of the frame means that the bells do not ring as well as they should. The six bells and fittings date from 1890 whilst the frame is older and originally held four bells.

The ring of eight bells at Long Melford was overhauled and rehung with new fittings in 1924 and remain in quite good order. The main cause for concern here is the unsafe clocking of the tenor from the ground floor, which could cause the bell to become cracked. The parish have been advised of the modifications necessary to ensure that the bell is clocked safely.

Work is proceeding on the restoration of the timber top to the tower at Stonham Aspal, but there are at present no plans for any major restoration work to the bells.

The six bells at Holbrook remain an easy peal to ring, but are in need of some maintenance work. The frame and fittings by Alfred Bowell date from 1907, are now badly rusted and in need of painting.

At Old Newton the condition of the bells has not changed substantially since 1961 when an inspection was made by Mr. R. Clouston. Since that time work has been done on the tower structure itself but some work will be necessary before the bells can all be rung full circle on a regular basis, including recasting or welding the cracked treble.

The ring of four at Timworth were rehung by G. Bullock of Ixworth in the late 19th Century. Generally the ring of bells is in quite fair condition but some short term work is required, much of which has been done prior to a recent peal.

There are no serious problems with the ring of six bells at Stoke by Clare. The 15th Century frame is a massive oak structure being some 6'4" tall and has areas of worm infestation which need treating so as not to weaken the overall structure.

Recent repair work to the top of the tower at All Saints Newmarket enabled the bells to be rung and measurements made of any movement across the vertical cracks further down the tower. The parish are keen to get the bells rung on a regular basis and this may be possible following some minor work on the fittings and replacement of four of the worst headstocks which have suffered worm attack.

At Lakenheath all ringing has had to cease due to widening of cracks in the tower.

In my report last year, mention was made of the need to develop a new strategy within the Guild towards bell restoration. With this in mind the Guild has been assisting with the proposed restoration at Edwardstone which should come to a successful conclusion in 1986.

A further proposed restoration is at Pettistree where the ring of six have not been heard since 1945. The parish are aiming to complete the project by Christmas 1986.

From the summary at the end of the Directory of Towers it can be seen that the number of towers in the five and below category has been increased by two. This is reflected partly in the decrease by four in the six/seven category with the restorations at Sproughton, St Matthew's Ipswich and St Mary's Newmarket also contributing to the reduction in this category.

## **Suffolk Guild Maintenance Officer's Report**

The Maintenance Committee held its usual three meetings during the year and matters reported to it included the following:-

*Aldeburgh* - Wire netting over the louvres had been replaced after storm damage.

*Coddenham* - Bells checked over prior to a peal attempt.

*Clopton* - Bells were checked over after a request for a peal attempt but it was found that the top of the frame moved and hit the tower walls when the bells were being rung.

*Debenham* - Seventh clapper retaining bolt had been replaced.

*Little Glemham* - General maintenance carried out.

*Harkstead* - Wire over louvres checked.

*Hintlesham* - Some work done to prevent treble slider jumping out and advice given to cure the problem permanently.

*Holbrook* - New stays fitted and frame to be painted.

*Hollesley* - Stays loose and difficult to tighten due to design of headstocks.

*Huntingfield* - New slider fitted.

*Iken* - New rope fitted and general maintenance carried out.

*Ipswich - St. Lawrence* - Straps on the fourth headstock replaced and the third wheel repaired and the tower generally cleaned out.

*Ipswich - St. Mary at Quay* - Tower cleaned up.

*Leiston* - The front six bells have been fitted with new ropes.

*Long Melford* - One of the bells was being unsafely clocked and the Technical Adviser had suggested an alternative arrangement. The stay on the second bell was far too large.

*Polstead* - Frame had been painted by the local ringers.

*Rumburgh* - Ropes checked and a replacement wheel (ex Sproughton) fitted.

*Stratford St. Mary* - During a quarter peal attempt one of the treble gudgeon pins broke causing extensive damage to the wheel (the remaining one was subsequently found to have been cracked for some time). Both were replaced with metal of a higher specification. Charles Ablitt repaired the broken wheel and the bell was rehung by the local ringers.

*Stoke by Nayland* - The Kersey ringers assisted by members of the Essex Association refitted the tenor clapper. A new set of ropes had been ordered. Pigeons have now been excluded from the tower and the steps up to the bellchamber and tower roof have been cleared of debris.

*Winston* - Headstocks tightened up and a clapper had been repaired.

## **Ringling Master's Report for 1985**

1985 was the year in which we saw the Guild taking a more active part in bell restorations. There have been several meetings at Edwardstone involving the local people and your Guild and District Officers, culminating, shortly before Christmas, with the news that all the money has now been raised. A splendid effort by all the locals, spearheaded by Sarah Titford and Maureen Palmer. However I am pleased to report that the Guild has also played a significant part in this venture, particularly with regard to training a band of ringers for Edwardstone. There are now enough Edwardstone ringers to ring the bells when they are returned and rededicated. We should be grateful to Eddie Hynard, Neville Whittell, Nick Wade and other members of the S.W. district for making this possible.

The Guild Officers have also been to meetings at Pettistree and Horham to offer our services. In the case of the former, it would appear that finance is not a problem but there is more concern about who is going to ring the bells. Hopefully the Guild will be able to assist. At Horham it is too early to give any definite news, but it looks possible that this historic ring may soon be restored.

Although 1985 may turn out to be a freak year in terms of new restorations being launched, perhaps now is the time to consider schemes for increasing the size of the bell restoration fund, so that we can continue to offer realistic grants. It is all very well the Guild trying to stimulate interest in some of our 'unringables' but we must also be financially viable. I have some ideas on this point which I hope to sound out with other members before the A.G.M.

Guild events during 1985 were reasonably well supported. In April approximately 70 members participated in the Guild outing to London. Ringing took place at the following towers (all rings of 8):- Holy Trinity, Wandsworth; Wimbledon; Putney; Clapham Common and St. George, Southwark. Another Guild outing is planned for 19th April 1986, again in London.

The Guild Striking Competitions were finally held at Fornham, St. Martin and Elveden following unprecedented problems with the towers originally selected by the district. St. Mary-le-Tower this year won both competitions. It is hoped that the proposed certificates will be available for presentation to the first six teams in the six bell competition in 1986. Again I would urge more towers to compete in what should be a very enjoyable and educational day.

The Guild Public Relations Day was held at the end of June. The format was similar to 1984 and was successful. It is proposed to limit 1986's activities to two centres:- Bury St. Edmunds and Ipswich during August. A rather different type of event is planned this year with the emphasis on exhibitions rather than practical displays.

The Training Day again proved to be highly successful. Eight courses were offered but only six

were actually run on the day due to lack of applications for the other two. In the evening many members enjoyed playing with the computer programmes available. The 1986 Training Day will again be held in October but I would be pleased to hear of any possible alternative venues in Mid Suffolk as it is unlikely that we shall be able to go to Stowupland again.

1985 seems again to have been a good year for peals, although at the time of writing I do not know the exact number rung, as they have not all yet been published.

My congratulations go to the following who rang their first peals during 1985:- David Barnard, Graham Bowles, Annie Clark, Rorie Dempster, Samantha Hacker, Elizabeth LeGrove, Kenneth Odam, Robert Orriss, Anna Simpson, Hilary Talbot, Elizabeth Tomkin, Andrew Thompson, James Watts and Hazel White.

During 1985 Maria Hacker conducted her first peal. Well done to her but it is a shame more people did not have a go. Another conductors course looks a must at the next Training Day.

Personal peal milestones reached include:-

Robin Allum (150) Trevor Hughes (150) Michael Whitby (250) Michael Baldry (350) Alan Mayle (400) Simon Rudd (450) Patricia Bailey (500) and John Loveless (1000).

During the year Harry Archer rang his 250th peal for the Guild and George Pipe his 500th.

Three husbands and wives achieved milestones together: Robin and Mary Allum (150), Michael and Janice Baldry (200) and Trevor and Pat Bailey (300). The latter being particularly interesting as they jointly conducted the peal.

Sylvia Pipe scored her 100th on Grundisburgh bells which also commemorated her 50 years as a ringer.

Martin Thorley achieved two interesting personal performances 300th as conductor for the Guild and also having rung peals on the 366 calendar days of the year.

I cannot leave this section on peals of note without mentioning the peal at Polstead which included five first pealers and Eddie Hynard. Well done all.

Footnotes to other peals indicate that a considerable number of ringers have progressed to peals on higher numbers and to methods of greater intricacy.

I am pleased to report that all four districts were successful with peals at St. Peters, Sudbury during 1985. I am arranging for six peals in 1986 to include two bands from other associations/guilds. After that it is hoped that the local band will deal with all future arrangements.

Quarter peal ringing has again been popular and the Guild week was again successful.

This year for the first time, St Mary-le-Tower entered a band in the national twelve bell striking competition. Although not qualifying for the final, I am relieved to report that the band finished higher than Norwich.

I would like to take this opportunity of thanking all district officers for their work during 1985, and I wish them and any new officers a successful 1986. I would also like to thank all members for their hospitality and welcome during my visits around the county.

## **OBITUARIES FOR 1985**

### **Leonard P Bailey - Leiston**

Len was the last survivor of that truly remarkable family, the Bailey Brothers. There were eleven of them, ten of whom were ringers and he was the third youngest. At the great age of 95 he was a link with the last century and fascinating were his accounts of the Leiston scene, both in ringing and of course of Garretts, the engineering company where the brothers worked. Despite the fact that the height of their performances was in the days of the N.D.A., the Baileys strongly supported the formation of the Suffolk Guild.

### **Mrs N.V.A.M. Bittleston - St Mary le Tower**

This gracious lady was an Associate member of the Tower and very proud of her membership. Avril Bittleston gave the third when the bells were recast in 1975 and always vowed she could hear it on Sunday mornings. Despite a long illness she nevertheless always enquired after belfry matters.

### **F. Charles Goodman - Norfolk**

Charlie Goodman died at the age of 83 at Aylsham. A lovely person with a dry Norfolk wit, as a life member he used to enjoy Suffolk ringing and meetings and we, his company. Charles was happy ringing on any number with the beginner or the proficient; a sad loss indeed.

### **Roland C. Peck - Benhall**

The Guild was sad at Roly's passing in middle age and a packed church at his funeral was testimony to his popularity. He was mainly a six bell ringer - always happy to help teach the Art. The Royal Humane Society gave him a Rescue Award for an unsung act of bravery.

### **Leonard Stillwell - Sussex**

A gentleman of the exercise, Len was a life member of our Guild and died at the age of 95. What a ringing life he had; over 1000 peals but always in the service of others. He toured Suffolk in 1954 and became fond of our county. Of his many achievements one of which he was very proud was membership of the band that rings for royal events at the Windsor Castle campanile.

### **Samuel J. Twitchett - Clare**

A large congregation in the great Parish Church at his funeral, and tributes in the Ringing World, emphasised the esteem in which Sam was held. His sometimes blunt and forthright manner hid a generous heart and a warm demeanour. Sam's priorities were his God, his family, Clare and other ringers in that order! A great character, supporter and striker of bells, his place will be hard to fill. He was a teacher of ringing, chorister too, but above all he was 'Sam'.
