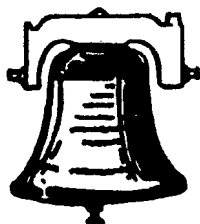

Secretary's Report - Bruce Wakefield

A cause for concern amongst some Guild Members has been the apparent lack of support at functions such as the Annual General Meeting. It is taken to mean in some quarters that this indicates a far from satisfactory state of the Guild. However nothing could be further from the truth. Membership is increasing, new bands are being formed at recently restored towers, as well as at previously silent churches, and most importantly bells are widely rung for Sunday services all over the county and throughout the year. The prime object of the Guild is, after all, to promote the ringing of bells for Divine Service. I believe therefore that the Guild is in a very healthy state, and more than able to meet the challenges of the next millennium.

A glance at the Guild calendar for the past year reveals that barely a week goes by without a Guild or District activity taking place somewhere in the county. Naturally most of the events are of a ringing nature, but barbecues, socials, cricket matches, reunions, also feature strongly. From reports of these events in the Newsletters, and the reports of the various outings that have taken place throughout the year, it is clear that the enjoyment to be obtained from bell ringing in Suffolk is not limited just to the ringing of bells.

This year's AGM was held at Worlingham, in one of the extreme corners of the county. Nevertheless those of us who made the long journey there received a warm welcome, and were able to enjoy the recently restored ring of 6 bells. Thank you to the NE District, and in particular to Worlingham for ensuring that the day ran smoothly. The business was again completed in under 3 hours but there is still concern that we have not yet devised a format for the day that suits the majority of Members. Annual General Meetings are necessary functions under our Constitution, but nevertheless we, the Management Committee, would still like to make them enjoyable social events as well.

I find it hard to believe that I have now been Guild Secretary for over 4 years, having now been in harness at an AGM in each of the 4 Districts. I was at first daunted by the prospect of holding such a prestigious post, but I need not have worried. The Guild is well served by the many dedicated ringers who hold the other Guild and District Offices, and this has substantially eased my task. On your behalf therefore I would thank all those who serve the Guild. In particular I will single out Amanda Whiting, who at the coming AGM will not be seeking re-election as Ringing Master. It has been a pleasure serving with her, and the Guild has benefited greatly from her enthusiasm, dedication and leadership over the past few years. Thank you Amanda. May you, and all Suffolk ringers, have a happy and enjoyable 1994.

The 70th Anniversary of the formation of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers has now passed and a good deal has been achieved. Thank you to everyone who has helped to keep our bells ringing Sunday by Sunday throughout the year.

An early event in the year was the National Twelve Bell Striking Contest. St Mary-le-Tower took part in the eliminator at Stourbridge, narrowly missing a place in the final, being placed 4th.

The Guild Outing was on the verge of cancellation due to lack of numbers for the coach which had been booked, when it was decided to take cars. It was a good decision because an excellent day in and around Leicester was enjoyed by all who participated.

The Ridgman Trophy 10-bell competition was held at St. Neots this year. The band representing Suffolk made up for the disappointment of last year and received a well deserved 1st place with a pleasing course of Cambridge S. Royal.

The Guild Striking Competitions were held at Rougham and Horringer. Stowmarket had practiced hard and were rewarded by retaining the Mitson Shield. St. Mary-le-Tower won the Rose Trophy.

I was disappointed to miss the Veterans' Reunion this year but I understand that it was a much appreciated and happy event.

The Suffolk Guild's display at the Suffolk Show was as successful as usual and wherever Ralph's bell goes, there is tremendous benefit for the promotion of ringing. I understand that the float in the Ipswich Carnival was outstanding and that over 1000 leaflets were distributed on the day. Thank you Ralph for all your hard work.

Dedication services were held at Dalham, Metfield and Pakenham. They were all wonderful events which amply reflected the commitment of the three parishes. I wish other restoration schemes continued success with fund-raising in 1994.

A worthwhile seminar on teaching handling was held at Barking. It is particularly pleasing to see that one of our raw recruits from that day is now a member of the Guild. A very useful by-product! The Training Day was as successful as usual with over 70 course members.

The 70th Anniversary Dinner was a very happy occasion and was enjoyed by 90 members and friends from all corners of the Guild.

The year finished with a series of programmes about bells and ringing, on Suffolk Group Radio. This was an excellent P.R. opportunity and I am grateful to John Eley and all who were involved in the 6 broadcasts from Horham, Dalham, Coddensham, Kettleburgh, Metfield and Pakenham.

Treasurer's Report for 1993 - Chris Barker

1993 has been a good year in that we have been able to pay out what I am sure will be a record sum of £11500 for Restoration work at Coddensham, Dalham, Metfield and Pakenham and four more communities in the county are now able to enjoy their bells again. We have also committed ourselves to helping Barrow, Chediston, Haughley, Stowmarket and Westhorpe during the year to the extent of another £11700 and we have existing commitments to Falkenham, Reydon and Troston brought forward.

As a result our resources have been depleted to the point where we may be able to contemplate one more restoration project through 1994, but that is likely to be the limit.

On the general income front we have seen 1992 Membership levels maintained, but only just and other income has fallen sharply. Some of this is due, I am sure, to the continuing hard economic climate, some covenants have expired and not been renewed, our interest income has reduced with the drop in rates and because we have paid out so much for restoration work. Total income from the Friends of Suffolk Bells has reduced from £4104 to 2507 and I am sure that the hard-working committee would appreciate both some ideas for 1994 as well as some practical help.

General administration costs have increased by some £500 the main problem being insurance where the premium virtually doubled in line with much other cover. We are now at a position where income is only just covering costs and I fear that we are going to have to look at an increase in Subscription levels for 1995. We have managed to contain the Subscription at £6 for four years, but I shall be recommending to the Management Committee that this should increase to £7 from next year. If accepted, this proposal will then have to be placed before the Annual General Meeting and will, I am confident, ensure a good attendance.

In conclusion, may I again thank the District Secretaries for all their hard work during the year.

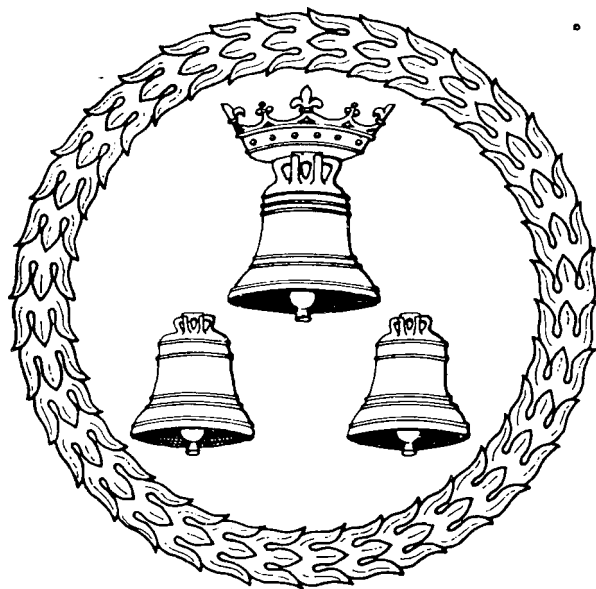
Public Relations Report - Rob Rixon.

I was again heavily involved with the Falkenham Appeal Committee and the teaching of parishioners during the year. I am sorry that local problems have delayed the installation of the bells, but the Appeal now seems to be back on track and the new treble bells have been cast by Whitechapel. The installation of the bells in the tower at Falkenham should be completed during the next year.

A series of radio programmes on Suffolk Bells was broadcast by Radio Suffolk during the Autumn. They were well received and enjoyable. I hope and trust that the Public Relations activities within the Guild will continue throughout the coming year. I will not be seeking re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Peter Atkins - Offton

We were shocked to hear of Peter's death and one recalled his being taught at Offton by Gilbert Goodship, ringing in company with the Lockwoods and playing his full part in the ringing of that area. He had not enjoyed good heath for some years.

James Bennett Jnr - Otley

Jimmy (or Jigger as we called him) was the last of the famous Helmingham band - in its prime in the 1920's and 30's. With his father, George, the Whitings, Bill Last, the Leslie's Brett and Wightman and others, farm workers and artisans all, he was part of one of the leading Surprise Major bands in the country and rang 'anywhere in the circle'. Jimmy was a real character, wag, leg-puller, mimic and singer - many a coach outing entertained by him. He rang around 250 peals mostly for our Guild.

Walter Cady - Framlingham

Taught by Sidney Moore when in his late 50's Walter was a faithful call change ringer at St Michael's. He lived in Framlingham all his life and knew well Willoughby Maulden, the brothers Hall, Hobart Smith and other fine ringers there.

Helen and Richard Collett - Blythburgh

Blythburgh bells in their magnificent setting were augmented and dedicated in 1950. Helen and Dick Collett in the early 60's extended their support there in the Church to the belfry and learnt to ring. The Colletts died within a month of each other, both nonagenarians. Their devotion and utterly Christian service will not be forgotten and we shall miss their cheery faces at Holy Trinity.

Robert Frederick Downing - Bredfield and Grundisburgh

Bob Downing with his wife Brenda formed part of the inaugural band at Bredfield in 1949. He coupled that with ringing at Grundisburgh and was a safe performer up to Cambridge Royal and Stedman Caters. Ill health forced him to give up something he so enjoyed.

Alfred W. Foreman - Garboldisham.

Alf died in April at the grand old age of 83. Although he didn't take up the art until he was nearly 50 he somehow retained the enthusiasm of a teenager all his life. Like many other ringers along the Waveney Valley Alfred did valuable work in both our counties. One of his great loves was the Norfolk and Suffolk Border Ringers' Outings and the friendships it forms.

Albert Gillings - Horringer, Egham & Bury St. Edmunds

The Second World War, as did the First, decimated our membership. In 1945 a rebuilding was necessary and Albert Gillings was someone who offered his services as District Secretary for Bury. And what a splendid secretary he was, meticulous in collecting subscriptions, organising meetings and his paper work, and so affable with it. Guilds can be built on people like that.

Robert Hartley - Wepstead

Bob's passing is a great loss to the Wepstead area but his funeral Service in January said everything - an occasion of unashamed thanksgiving and joy for his life, sadly cut short at 61. He learnt to ring at Stoke Poges, the church of Thomas Gray's 'Elegy' - under the eagle eye (and it was an eagle eye) of Arthur D Barker. Moving to Suffolk in 1966 Bob lost no time in teaching and encouraging, ever willing to pass on all that he knew.

George Lines - Bramfield

A packed church at Walpole paid tribute to George's life as a ringer and a good friend. Like many another in the Halesworth area he was taught by the redoubtable Fred Lambert and enjoyed his ringing alongside Jack Thurlow, Herbert Jillings, Harold Rogers, John Blythe and many more. Super chap, George, and we shall miss him.

Ivan Ludbrooke - Kelsale and Trumpington

Ivan was something of an enigma, intensely disciplined with his ringing, enormously keen and a creator of projects interspersed with long bouts of loneliness. He was a most competent ringer on all numbers and we are sad that he was taken in the prime of life. Our sympathy goes out to his family.

Kenneth Nunn - Rushmere St Andrew

For over a century now Rushmere St Andrew has had a Sunday Service band, loyal to its Church and to our Guild. One of its many members down the years was Ken, younger brother of Claude and being taught by him immediately after the War. Ken served in the RAF in Burma hence his special friendship with Dudley Buxton, both of whom were devoted to Rushmere Tower.

Jack Parker - Tuddenham St Martin

Jack had ringing in his blood; his father, Percy, and grandfather, Charles, ringers at Tuddenham way back into the last century. Theirs was always open house for ringers - 'owd Charlie' renowned as a generous host and raconteur.

George Frederick Southgate - Gosbeck and Adelaide

It only took a small headline in the Adelaide Advertiser in 1987 that two Suffolk ringers were visiting the city on a lecture tour for Fred to turn up and meet them! How good it was to see him and renew a link with Helmingham and district. -That link went back to 1928 when he rang his first peal there - Kent Treble Bob Major and of course he recalled all the great names of the day.

James George Stannard - Barrow

For nearly 100 years the Stannards have been a name synonymous with ringing in West Suffolk especially around Bury St Edmunds. Jim with his brothers Charles and Dick were in turn taught by their father, William, a strict and stern tutor but he taught them well. Like his father, Jim was a skilled blacksmith and farrier and he brought the same precision and care into his ringing and Church life. Through Janet, his wife, and their son Paul, the tradition lives on and we remember Jim with gratitude

Cyril Baxter Williamson - Wendover and Ipswich

How fortunate we are to have known Cyril - albeit for relatively few years. Here was a man who exuded loyalty and Christian charity as well as cheerfulness in what proved to be a terminal illness.

Cyril came to love Suffolk and the ringing here and we rejoice in that and that he lived to see the engagement of his son, Jonathan to Sue.

Peal Secretary's Report - Alan P Mayle

I must start this report on a disappointing note since the publication of the 1992 report two peals rung at Bury St. Edmunds (No.6635 & 6743) have been found to be false, and cannot therefore be included in the Guild records. It is particular unfortunate that both these peals were rung for very special reasons.

There was a slight increase in the number of peals rung in 1993 on the previous year. Peals were rung in 59 Suffolk towers and at the following towers outside the county, Ely (Cambs), Kings Norton (Leics), North Lopham (Norfolk) and Tolleshunt D'Arcy (Essex).

The first peal since restoration was rung at Coddensham and the first peal since restoration and augmentation at Dalham. Rare visitors to the peal columns include Little Glenham, Poslingford and Winston.

The following methods were rung to peals for the Guild for the first time.

Much has been said around the county about peals rung for the Guild outside the County by mainly non-resident members, although the money is very welcome we should, I believe, consider whether we want those peals to be part of our Guilds records.

Maintenance Officer's Report - Winston Girling

At the 1993 Guild A.G.M. Ralph Earey, our maintenance officer for 6 years, stood down. The meeting decided that I should take over from him and I am sure everyone would wish to join me in thanking Ralph for his hard work and for the sheer dedication and enthusiasm which he brought to the office. It is a daunting prospect indeed to follow that! 1993 has proved to be a very active year as far as restoration and maintenance are concerned, and the list below will indicate just how much has been done, work that is always very dirty, extremely hard, verytiring and invariably complicated and exasperating. All those who devote so much time to keeping our bells and equipment in order perform an enormous service to our Church and Guild. May I thank all those who have taken the trouble to regularly attend the Restoration and Maintenance Committee meetings and urge that all work is reported back so that we can have an up to date record for reporting to the Management Committee and publication.

North East

BLAXHALL - Hope to raise £70,000 to repair tower and bells.

CHEDISTON - Have applied for grant to re-hang bells in steel frame lower in tower.

LAXFIELD - New pullies being fitted.

METFIELD - Bells restored and re-hung in steel frame existing fittings preserved - Dedication 1993.

PEASENHALL - General tighten - inspection. Netting required and some slates missing from tower roof.

STRADBROKE -Turret giving cause for concern and ringing restricted.

THORNHAM MAGNA - Bearings secured by bolting through frame. Treble bearings and 5th headstock checked and in order.

WENHASTON-Architect's advice sought over tower state. He is happy with condition and bells can be rung.

WISSETT - Following report from architect bells can be chimed only.

North West

BACTON -Bells checked and tightened.

BARROW - Grant agreed to re-hang and augment to 6.

COMBS -Tower cleaned out. Fund raising continues to restore and augment to 6.

COTTON - Inspected, bells and frame tightened. 2 ropes replaced. Guides repaired and 5th rope boss turned. Tower cleaned and steel framework painted. Architect's advice sought on mediaeval beams supporting bell frame.

DALHAM - Augmentation, 5 to 8 bells in 12 months and completely restored. An outstanding local effort. Dedication 1993.

FINNINGHAM - Inspection following interest in possible ringing. Much work needed. Tenor swung and debris removed.

FORNHAM ST. MARTIN - Clappers re-leathered. Wheels and headstocks treated. Work on bearings and guides. Frame weak on one side.

GREAT BARTON - Ellacombe apparatus re-roped. Bells tightened.

GREAT FINBOROUGH - Tenor removed from headstock and broken 'U' bolt replaced sound proofing of bell chamber floor to make bells quieter in ringing chamber.

HAUGHLEY - Bracing and tie rods added to frame to stabilise it. Broken gudgeon replaced on treble. Faculty received and funds being raised to have ball bearings fitted.

MARKET WESTON - Incumbent has enquired about ringing bells. Inspection has revealed frame poor and requires support.

MENDLESHAM - New ropes purchased and fitted.

PAKENHAM - Bells restored and rehung in old frame which has been strengthened. Dedication 1993.

STOWMARKET - Major work nearing completion - spire to go on early 1994. Bells cannot be rung until approximately end of 1994 to allow tower to dry out first.

WESTHORPE - Grant applied for to rehang bells.

South East

BADINGHAM - Ropes spliced.

Inspection arranged to look at treble.

BRANDESTON - Inspection requested

CODDENHAM - Bells restored and rehung in steel frame and Dedicated.

FALKENHAM - New trebles cast as part of restoration and augmentation

HASKETON - Inspected and tower sway acceptable,

HELMINGHAM - Advice has been given for installing platform to ease access to roof.

HEMINGSTONE - Visited. Frame and fittings poor and bells being clocked at time of visit.

IPSWICH (St. Matthews) - Some spiral staircase steps repaired. Bells tightened and checked.

IPSWICH (St Mary at Quay) - Cupola clock bell which had beam missing is now back in fabric of Church.

IPSWICH (S.M.L.T.) - Tenor clapper replaced following original shearing off. Clappers greased on 1, 3 and 6.

SPROUGHTON - Bells tightened and checked.

STONHAM ASPAL - Weak gudgeon pins replaced on 2 and 3. Only four bells now remain to have this done as funds allow.

WINSTON - Severely decayed tops of the wooden headstocks on 2 and 3 have been replaced. Bearings cleaned out and relubricated. New ground pulley needed on 3rd in due course.

South West

BOXFORD - Lower tier of 5 bells recently raised and rung in presence of architect and structural engineers and Ranald Clouston. Tower behaved well, and 120 of Grandsire Doubles was achieved.

GLEMSFORD - New headstock constructed for treble and tie rods being added to frame. Much work being done at this tower.

MONKS ELEIGH - Following tower repairs bells tried out and rang well and are being rung regularly.

POLSTEAD - Repairs to tower preventing ringing until Christmas 1993.

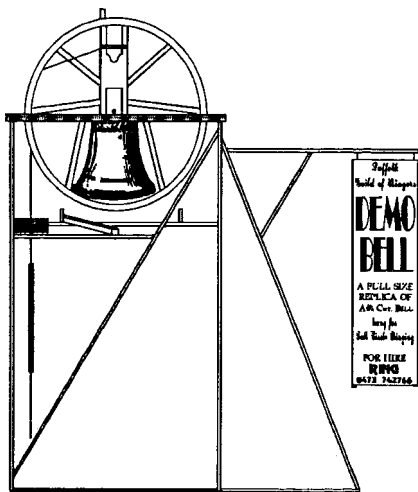
RATTLES DEN - Ellacombe hammers renovated and re-bushed. Rope guide realigned and bolts tightened.

STRADISHALL - Reported at Management meeting an 16 Oct that severe, tower problems are preventing ringing.

WOOLPIT - Lighting installed in belfry. Clock weights require something beneath them to break their fall should this occur.

THE DEMO BELL - OUTINGS

1993 has seen several new destinations for the Demo-Bell together with the annual shows and carnival. This year approx. 1000 people 'had a go' (904 bright yellow advertising stickers given out) at the Suffolk Show. As well as the stickers, Stephen Pettman produced an excellent P.R. leaflet, 500 copies of which we were able to hand out at the Show and 1000 during the Carnival - many thanks to Stephen. The 'crew' for the Carnival really entered into the spirit and a well-deserved 2nd prize (in class) was gained. The Demo-Bell didn't stand still technically either, as Tony Warren made an LCD display that gives details of the Demo-Bell and the various different bell-recordings - thanks Tony.

1993 has been another fruitful year, with restorations being: completed at Dalham, Metfield and Pakenham.

At Dalham the ring of five bells have been overhauled and augmented to eight by Eyre & Smith of Melbourne Derby, The three new trebles were cast by Royal Eijsbouts of Astén in Holland, and are the first Low Country bells to be cast for a Suffolk church in over 450 years. The last being the treble of two at Bromeswell, cast by Cornelis Waghevens of Mechlin (Malines) in 1530. The bells now hang in a new mild steel and cast iron frame set below the ancient and important timber bell frame, which is preserved in situ. All the on-site work was carried out by the local ringers, who have done a first class job and have no doubt saved the parish much expense.

At Metfield the ring of three bells have been overhauled and augmented to four by the Whitechapel Bellfoundry, and now hang in a new mild steel and cast iron two tier frame for six bells, which is set below the old timber bell frame which has been preserved in situ. A new ringing gallery has been constructed, leaving the ground floor free to house the ancient clock mechanism and for use as a vestry, the parish are still raising funds for a further two bells to complete what promises to be a very pleasant and useful six.

At Pakenham, Whites of Appleton have overhauled the ring; of five bells and re hung them on new timber headstocks, with all new fittings in the important pre-reformation bellframe, which has been successfully restored. A new ringing chamber ceiling has been installed to create a silence chamber and also serves to hide the new steelwork that now supports the ancient bellframe

Tower repairs have been carried out at Burgate and also at Monks Eleigh at Burgate the bells remain unringable for the time being, whilst at Monks Eleigh the bells are now back in action with regular service ringing (1st, Sundays at 10am).

A test ring was arranged at Boxford, with the five bells in the lower tier being rung whilst the tower was under the close supervision of the architect, structural engineers and assistants. The tower behaved well, so much so that stage 13 of the exercise, 120 changes of Grandsire Doubles was rung.. It is hoped that the back five may be available for service ringing: on special occasions, subject to parapet problems and a stone being moved by the frame

Looking forward to 1994 Stowmarket bells should be ringing again, work on the tower is progressing well although the cost is still rising, but it is hoped the ringing will commence in June/July.

Also work is expected to start at Reydon, where it is intended to re hang the existing single bell in a new frame for six, where it will eventually become the fifth in the new ring..

At Haughley the headstocks are to be over hauled by Taylor's and fitted with new gudgeons and ball bearings.

Work at Falkenham where the present four bells are to be overhauled and augmented to six may commence later in the year, meanwhile fund-raising continues.

Looking even further into the future, the parishes at both Chediston and Westhorpe have had quotes for restoring their bells, and have both applied for grants from the Guild. So we must keep our fingers crossed and hope that we will hear these bells ring out again in the not too distant future.

Thanks again this year to the district maintenance teams who complete a whole catalogue of tasks throughout the year keeping; many of our towers ringable.

Librarians Report

Another quiet year for the Guild Library with a few loans and donations. As I indicated at the 1993 AGM I will not be seeking re-election to the post of Librarian in 1994 but I am pleased to report that Gill Wakefield has expressed a keen interest in taking on the position.

I have greatly enjoyed the four years that I have spent as Librarian and have learnt a tremendous amount during that time. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Guild members for the privilege of allowing me to serve them in this way.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES.

Objects

The Guild shall be established for the promotion of ringing for Divine Service and in furtherance of this object:

1. To promote and encourage the practice of bellringing.
2. To recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art.
3. To cultivate the art of scientific ringing.
4. To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof, as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of the bells and their fittings.

Constitution.

A. Name

1. The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

(a) It shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and registered as a Charity at Law. (Ref. 266869)

(b) The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there shall be Patrons. Vice-Presidents shall be elected at the A.G.M. of the Guild.

B. Membership.

2. Membership shall consist of the following categories:

(a) Ringing Members. A person who can ring rounds efficiently on a tower bell.

(b) Associate Members. A person who wishes to support the Guild.

(c) Life Honorary Member. A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.

(d) Non-Resident Life Members. A person who is qualified to be a Ringing Member, or Associate Member, but who resides outside the territory of the Guild and who is not a member under either 2(a), (b) or (c).

3. Ringing and Life Honorary Members only shall have voting rights and be permitted to hold office in the Guild.

4. Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. Districts.

5. There shall be four Districts:

1. North East District consisting of the deaneries of Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.

2. North West District consisting of the deaneries of Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.

3. South East District consisting of the deaneries of Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.

4. South West District consisting of the deaneries of Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. Government

6. The Annual General Meeting of the Guild shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as shall be decided by the Guild Management Committee and shall be the ultimate decision making body of the Guild. It shall elect Guild Officers and set subscriptions and fees for the following year.

7. Members shall be elected to fill the following Offices: Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, Maintenance Officer, Report Editor, Newsletter Editor, Central Council Representatives, Technical Adviser, Librarian, Handbell Trustees, Peal Secretary, and any other such Officers as the Guild Management Committee shall see fit to approve.

8. In order that the Guild be run efficiently and its objects implemented there shall be three Committees established with the following responsibilities:

(a) The Guild Management Committee which shall co-ordinate all Guild activities; publish a printed Annual Report and audited Accounts and convene Sub-Committees as may from time to time be required, and shall recommend the levels of subscriptions and peal fees and other methods of raising money and shall organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

(b) Recruitment and Training Committee which shall prepare training programmes for use in the Districts; provide courses for the training of teachers of ringing and assist Districts in the recruitment of Ringers.

(c) Restoration and Maintenance Committee which shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese; which shall make recommendations concerning the preservation and use of bells from redundant churches; which shall advise incumbents and arrange such local restoration and maintenance work as may be necessary.

E. Finance

9. All money in the Guild's General Fund not required for normal working purposes shall be invested by the Treasurer as may be directed by the Guild Management Committee.

10. All money in the Restoration Fund and Jubilee Fund and such other funds as the Guild Management Committee may establish shall be invested by the Treasurer as may be directed by the Guild Management Committee. Grants for restoration work shall be made by the Guild Management Committee. Such grants shall only finally be made following the approval of the Guild Ringing Master and a Technical Adviser.

10a. Not less than one half of the subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members together with not less than one half of all peal fees shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

11. All cheques shall bear the signature of the Secretary or the Treasurer or the Chairman but any cheque greater in value than the limit set annually by the Guild Management Committee shall bear the signature of two of these Officers.

F. Records and Handbells

12. The Report Editor shall record all peals rung for the Guild and Quarter Peals rung in the Diocese and publish them in the Annual Report.

13. The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.

14. The Handbell Trustees shall maintain the Handbells in good condition and shall make such recommendations as may be necessary for the repair of the handbells to the Guild Management Committee.

G. General

15. The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

16. The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of the members present at an Annual or Special General Meeting provided that 14 days notice of the proposed amendment has been sent to all members and provided that nothing herein contained shall authorise any amendment which shall have the effect of the Society ceasing to be a Charity in Law.

17. In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

Rules

Guild Rules.

A. Election of Members and Subscriptions

1. Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded. Membership shall be exercised through only one District at a time, being the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report. Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter in advance on the first day of January each year. Membership shall cease if such subscriptions are not paid by 31st. December of the year in which they become due. The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the next year.

2. The subscription rates for members shall be fixed at the Annual General Meeting and unless a change is agreed the existing rate shall continue. Persons in full time education shall pay a reduced rate of subscription and subscription shall be waived for members over the age of 65.

3. Life Honorary Members shall only be elected at an Annual General Meeting and nominations may only be made by the Guild Management Committee or District. No further subscription is payable after election.

4. Persons who have been Ringing Members or Associate Members for at least two years may, upon leaving the Diocese, inform their District Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence. A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Member as an alternative to Ringing or Associate Membership.

5. For the purposes of peal ringing new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry to the appropriate category of membership subject to the confirmation at a business meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the Guild Management Committee in the case of a Non-Resident Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.

6. Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the Guild Management Committee which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

B. Election of Officers.

7. All Officers shall retire at the Guild's Annual General Meeting but shall be eligible for re-election. Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the Annual General Meeting provided always that they are proposed and seconded. If more than one nomination for any office is received then election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote. Central Council Representatives shall be elected in accordance with the rules of the Central Council during the second year of the triennium at the A.G.M. of the Guild.

8. The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Auditor who is not a member of the Guild Management Committee and need not be a member of the Guild.

C. Committee Structure.

9. The Guild Management Committee shall consist of: Vice Presidents, The Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, Technical Adviser, Public Relations Officer, Maintenance Officer, two elected representatives from each district, & such Guild Officers as may be from time to time required or invited to attend. Six members shall constitute a quorum. The Committee shall meet at least three times per year. The Chairman shall take the chair at all meetings of the Guild and Guild Management Committee. In his absence the Chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his absence by a person elected by the meeting.

10. The Recruitment and Training Committee shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two Representatives from each District.

11. The Restoration and Maintenance Committee shall consist of the Guild Maintenance Officer as Convenor, Guild Technical Adviser and two Representatives from each District.

12. Each of the above two Committees shall meet at least three times a year.

13. (a) The Chairman, Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Maintenance Officer shall form the Guild Executive. In the event of a Guild Office being vacated between A.G.M.'s they shall make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened.

(b) The Guild Management Committee may convene such sub-committees as it deems necessary from time to time and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committee shall be reported back to the Guild Management Committee as soon as possible.

D. Expenses

14. The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:

(a) The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the Guild Management Committee.

(b) The expenses of Guild Meetings.

(c) Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.

(d) Insurance of Guild property.

(e) Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the Guild Management Committee.

(f) Such other expenses as the Guild Management Committee may determine.

E. Peal Records.

15. All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.

16. Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:

(a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Members elected in the belfry.

(b) The appropriate peal fees.

(c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and compositions of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

F. Alteration of Rules.

17. No alteration or addition shall be made to the Rules of the Guild except as specified in paragraphs 16 and 17 of the Constitution.

District Rules.

18. Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the previous year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the coming year. Members shall be eligible to vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.

19. The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer; District Maintenance Officer; Newsletter Correspondant. The Chairman, Ringing Master and District Maintenance Officer shall normally represent the District on the Guild Management, Recruitment and Training, and Restoration and Maintenance Committees respectively but substitutes may be permitted. One other representative to each of the Guild Committees shall be elected. The District Officers and one elected member from each deanery shall form the District Committee. A District may elect additional working Officers at its discretion to assist the running of the District.

20. The District Secretary/Treasurer shall collect all subscriptions and other monies due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer. A statement of accounts shall be submitted to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January. A Directory of tower correspondants, lists of members and ringing times shall be submitted to the Secretary by 15th January.

21. The District Maintenance Officer shall endeavour to arrange for the inspection of every belfry in the district at least once a year and shall report his findings to the Restoration and Maintenance Committee at their January meeting. He shall be available to advise incumbents and shall provide leadership at local working parties where necessary.

22. The District Newsletter Correspondant shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspaper.

23. The District Committee shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.

Regulations relating to the Pearson's Handbells.

1. The Pearson Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustees. They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

2. The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustees by the borrower, and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustees if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the proceeding borrower.

3. The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustees by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of both of the Trustees.

4. The bells must be returned to the Trustees upon request. The Trustees should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.

5. If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.

6. The Trustees are responsible to the Committee of the Guild for the administration of the bells, and their decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by the committee.

7. The Trustees and the Committee of the Guild would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy Striking Competitions Rules.

1. The competitions shall take place on the third Saturday in May or on any other date decided by the Guild Management Committee.
2. All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
3. No Member may ring more than once in each competition, except as specified in Rule 10.
4. Representative bands shall consist of:
 - (a) The Mitson Shield. Six ringers of which at least four are shown in the Annual Report as members of that tower, or who are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers at that tower.
 - (b) The Rose Trophy. Eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of which at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
5. Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by any band not complying with the previous Rule.
6. Each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw. The times of the draws to be advertised in the 'Ringing World'.
7. A total of two minutes practice ringing and stand will be allowed before each test piece.
8. The test piece will be:
 - (a) The Mitson Shield. 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor Method(s).
 - (b) The Rose Trophy. At least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s). In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used. For the Rose Trophy only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
9. The length of either test piece may be shortened at the discretion of the Ringing Master in the event of a large entry.
10. A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available to bands meeting short, at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
11. Three judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
12. The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
