SECRETARY'S REPORT

Previous Annual Reports have generally mentioned that there are numerous dedicated (un-named) people who work hard behind the scenes to the benefit of the Guild and to ringing in Suffolk. This year I would like to single out one particular group. This is Michael Rolph, the District Maintenance Officers and their helpers on the Restoration and Maintenance Committee.

At every Management Committee meeting, those of us who attend have listened in amazement to detailed accounts of the work these people have done during the previous months. The 1994 Management Committee minutes, for instance, record visits to, advice given to, work done at, over 60 churches by the Restoration & Maintenance Committee. That's over 1 per week! By giving up their time in this way these volunteers must have saved the parishes in the diocese thousands of pounds over the years, and have helped to ensure that we as ringers continue to have pleasure of ringing on the county's bells. We are indeed grateful to them for this valuable service that they give.

For our 1994 AGM we were the guests of the NW District. Before the business meeting at Gazeley, we were invited to ring on the recently restored and augmented 8 bells at Dalham. Despite the meeting once again being held in one of the more outlying parts of the county, over 70 members attended which appears to be about the norm for AGMs. As always from the NW District the hospitality was warm, the lunch was excellent and the arrangements ran smoothly, with the business being completed in about 3 hours. In a further attempt to boost attendance at AGMs, the meeting decided that, rather then have a fixed format for AGMs, in future the host tower or District will be allowed to choose a format which suits it best. The first tower to put this to the test will be St Margaret's Ipswich, who will be hosting the 1995 AGM on behalf of the SE District.

Adrian Blumfield has been the Report Editor for some eight years, but, as he announced at the AGM, this will be the last Annual Report that he will compile. Each year Adrian has put in a great amount of hard work in order to produce the Report, and we thank him for it. Fitting it in amongst all his other commitments cannot have been easy.

Our Treasurer, Chris Barker, too will be handing over to a someone new at the 1995 AGM. Chris has been in office since 1990. We thank you for having undertaken this valuable and vital job for us.

On a sadder note, we were all deeply distressed when we heard of the sudden death of Simon Girt early in the year. During his short life Simon had served the Guild, the SE District and his own tower in many different ways, both overtly and behind the scenes. He tried hard to improve communications throughout the Guild and not the least amongst his achievements was the production of a thriving Guild Newsletter.

The media are doing their best to draw everyone's attention to the coming of the year 2000 and all the celebrations that that will bring forth. We in the Suffolk Guild can also look towards 2000, as that is the year that we have invited the Central Council to hold their Annual meeting in Suffolk. You will hear more of this in the coming years, but it is never to early to start planning how we are to show to rest of the world that ringing in Suffolk is among the best and that we have a Guild to be proud of.

RINGING MASTERS REPORT

So much has happened in 1994 that it would be quite naive to attempt to list everything here. It was a great honour to be elected Ringing Master at the AGM at Dalham. During the course of the year I hope I have discharged my responsibilities satisfactorily. My thanks are due to my predecessor Amanda, who did sterling work for the Guild and ringing. I hope I can achieve the same high standards she set. It has been most enjoyable touring around the Guild, during the year and Katharine & I thank you all for the warm welcome you have extended to us

Unfortunately 1994 saw the loss of several of our members, memories of whom will be held with affection by us all. The most fitting tribute to all of them, is the continued ringing of the bells they all enjoyed so much. The Guild has benefited greatly from their contributions over the years. The management committee has been very active during the year agreeing to provide Accident Insurance for the members, looking into a capital fund and re-furbishing the Mitson Shield. Hopefully the Mitson shield will be on view at the AGM. Grants have been approved and some have come to fruition. I was particularly please to ring at Falkenham, a great credit to the locals and White's of Appleton, and Haughley, where the locals again should be thanked for their hard work. Both towers provided excellent publicity in the local media.

The first Guild call change competition was held at Great Barton. Stowmarket won the Lester Brett trophy. With six teams taking part this is a most worthwhile event which will be repeated in 1995, and hopefully will continue annually.

Embarrassingly, for me, Grundisburgh, not only won the 6 bell competition but also took the 8 bell. A splendid day was had by all at Otley & Debenham. Paul & Kate Flavell, the judges, were most impressed with the standard of Suffolk ringing, and the facilities of Dove cottage, with refreshments by the Debenham ringers, made the whole event a most social occasion. Obviously we could always do with more entries. The competitions are a benchmark for standards and should be used to help improve striking, something we could all benefit from.

I must admit that the event I most looked forward to was Veterans day. Now a huge success, due in no small part to the efforts of Muriel Page. The chance to ring and talk to the names of the past, serves to help put our own meagre contributions into perspective. It also makes one aware that nothing in ringing is really new. A great social event that suggests the Guild should think about having a Welfare Officer.

The seminar at St Gregory's Sudbury, dealt with Bell Maintenance, and proved very useful to those who attended. It is hoped to re-run this in each District during 95/96 as it is of vital importance that we preserve the ringing stock we have in a first class condition. Local efforts can help increase the life expectancy of installations.

The change of venue for Training Day, to some extent helped reduce the numbers attending. None-the-less those who attended benefited from the vast experience of the tutors. We are currently looking at alternatives. As a pilot a 3 week course was run in one tower for Grandsire triples. This proved most successful and we would like to do more. If your tower is interested please let your R&T representative know.

A large number of quarter peals have been rung in the Diocese in 94. By my own calculation 23 first quarter pealers. This can only be good and it is also interesting to note the wide range of methods rung. Special congratulations to the Barking ringers who rang a quarter in hand 26/8/94.

As to quarter peal week, could do better, is the message only 15 quarters were rung.

On the peal front, 94 was a terrific year. At 186 the third best year ever. With so many peals rung records fell. My wife rang 101 for the Guild, the most ever by a lady and I took the conducting record. Martin Thorley became only the second person to ring 1000 peals for the Guild. Four first ever peals in the methods were rung, of particular note is Penultimate Little Max a creation of Vernon Bedford's. In addition there were 28 'first in the method' for the Guild. Whilst there is a high proportion of five and six bell peals, higher numbers show a healthy performance level. A great number of ringers have progressed and again this can only be good. I was particularly pleased to see the peal at Beccles 30/4/94, rung by an entire NE district band.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Reserves have increased mainly because two towers have withdrawn their applications for Grants. Subscription income is down slightly, partly reflecting a drop in membership and partly the increasing age of members with pensioners now accounting for 17% of the total.

Our overheads have been kept well under control this year and welcome additional help has been forthcoming from the Ipswich Institute who have given us a Grant of £400 towards the increased costs of Training Day.

Restoration commitments remain high at £16400 (all allowed for in arriving at the Reserves figure above) and there are a further number of projects in the pipeline.

There has been a drastic fall in the amount of tax reclaimed under Deeds of Covenant this year as a number of large regular donations have time expired. Please remember that, if you do not already covenant your subscription and you pay basic rate tax, this would produce an extra £2.40 per person at no extra cost to you.

Finally, my continued thanks to the District Secretaries who have the unenviable task of collecting Subscriptions.

Maintenance Officer's Report

Over the last year a great deal of maintenance and general work on bells up and down the County has been reported and it is clear that much has been achieved not only by our maintenance committee members but by many other Guild members as well. A lot of work does I believe go unreported for one reason or another and I am well aware that there is an enormous pool of expertise amongst us which could be better utilised if the present system was modified to run on a similar fashion to that which exists in the N.D.A. -namely a Church affiliation scheme and belfry advisory committee on a Guild level which together with our present maintenance officers would deal with advice and assistance as required by Churches.

The Management committee has agreed that I should look into the viability of such a scheme and I will do this as soon as possible. Work which has been reported to the restoration and maintenance committee is detailed below, much condensed I'm afraid, and I have in general left all mention of restoration to our Guild Technical Adviser to prevent duplication. My apologies if I have missed anything out. May I take this opportunity to thank all those who have supported our committee and to ALL ringers and others who have given up their time to work on our bells. May I also welcome all the new members of our maintenance team.

NORTH EAST

BLAXHALL - new floor installed under bells by ringers. WINGFIELD - tower shored up and frame and headstocks need painting. BRAMPTON - new stays on 4 & 5, all tightened and bells rung but worn soundbows prevent general ringing. CRATFIELD - bells rung for Easter, loose gudgeons dealt with and chiming board removed from tenor (rope passing across it prevented this bell going easily). MIDDLETON - visited, 2 3 4 & 5 not fit to swing but treble can be swing chimed. BLAXHALL - new lead roof and pointing of tower and bells now ringable. WILBY - 3rd investigated and dingler freed and bearing problem attended to. At CHEDISTON the intention is to have 5th welded in memory of Jack Thurlow - bells can be rung for special occasions. At EYE a seized ground pulley on the 5th has been freed and routine maintenance carried out.

NORTH WEST

STOWLANGTOFT - major overhaul and repair by ringers and local craftsmen, including rebuilding upper halves of wheels, new wheel stays, ground pulleys and guides now fitted in clock chamber. A quarter-peal has been rung on the bells which are much easier to ring. OLD NEWTON have been tightened and checked and the back 4 rung for 2 weddings. It is hoped the cracked treble may be dealt with at some time in the future. At COTTON a new peal board, paid for by donations from ringers, has been dedicated. It records the first peal on the 8 bells and is the only peal board at the Church, the original having become badly decayed.

Routine maintenance has been carried out at GT. BARTON, BADWELL, ASH, GT. FINBOROUGH AND BUXHALL, and at STOWMARKET ringing could commence by late summer 1995. In the meantime, much has to be moved back into the tower and refitted. Another major project has been at WEST STOW, where the bells have been made ringable again after tower repairs and an absence of ringing for several years. Inspections have been carried out at WATTISFIELD, HEPWORTH, HINDERCLAY and MARKET WESTON, where major frame repairs are necessary before the bells can be rung. At BARROW efforts continue to find a solution to English Heritage objections over frame replacement. At INGHAM the tower is not good and a vestibule has been put in at the bottom. One bell can be chimed. At HAUGHLEY the bells are ringing again following replacement of the old worn plain bearings. New self-aligning ball bearings fitted to all 5 bells, a major effort here by a relatively new local band.

SOUTH EAST

WOODBRIDGE - request for help regarding loose clappers and also broken clapper. Inspection carried out at BRANDESTON. At BAYLHAM clapper fell out of 3rd and following complete overhaul and some new parts being made was replaced and the bell made serviceable. At FALKENHAM following tremendous local effort, which came up against all sorts of problems, 3 new bells were added to make 6 and the bells have been Dedicated. Imention this restoration because it is another example of what can be achieved with congratulations to you all.

SOUTH WEST

GLEMSFORD - new headstock awaited for 5th. BOXFORD requires ring beams in the tower which is cracked and these are being monitored. Much work on bells is being done and the back 5 have been rung, but although the bells could be restored, the tower problems are a major drawback. MONKS ELEIGH are rung once a month following tower restoration and work on the bells, including pulley re-furbishment. BRADFIELD ST. CLARE are being re-hung for swing chiming. DRINKSTONE treble requires new bearings, and an oak stay fitted to HARTEST treble has broken the headstock. This has now been clamped up and should be O.K. At BARNARDISTON an inspection was carried out. Not suitable for ringing but a chiming apparatus could be installed..

Technical Adviser's Report

1994 has been a bit quieter than the previous two years with only one full restoration being completed with the bells at Falkenham being dedicated on Saturday 17 December.

The back three bells of the old ring of four have been retuned and re hung together with three new bells from the Whitechapel Bell foundry, in a new cast iron & mild steel frame by Whites' of Appleton. The new frame is set lower in the tower below the old timber frame which is being preserved in situ. The bells are at present rung from the ground floor, but as this is the main entrance to the church, a gallery is to be installed later on, which the parish are at present raising funds towards.

At Haughley the headstocks of this ring of five have been overhauled by Taylor's, and fitted with new gudgeon pins and ball bearings, which should make these bells somewhat easier to ring.

The parish at Boxford have had a revised quote from Taylor's' for re hanging this heavy octave. The Guild has offered a grant of £59500 towards the cost of this work.

At Reydon where it is planned to augment from one to six all funds have been raised and the faculty has finally been granted after several delays Work should start sometime in 1995.

At Blaxhall a new lead tower roof has been installed and local ringers have installed a new floor below the belis to replace the rotten one which was removed in the early seventies. There is some loose masonry in the bellchamber which requires pointing, so the bells remain unringable at present.

At Exning the stay side bearing of the 5th bell was found to be leaning outwards by about $10 \, \text{degrees}$, the repair work was carried out by Guild members. A quote for this work was obtained from Eayre & Smith at £1,621 + VAT so the Guild saved the parish quite a bit of money on this occasion. It is worth noting that it is a good idea to consult the Guild about queries and problems concerning bells before going to the professionals. It could save you money!

Other towers visited by your Technical adviser during the year include, Middleton; treble now ok. for swing chiming.

Wilby; 3rd bell drops at hand stroke, suspect bearings require attention.

Brampton; gudgeons tightened, new stays fitted to 3rd & 4th Bells ringable, but condition 4, due to excessive clapper wear.

Cratfield; general tightening up and oiling prior to brief ring, with architect's consent for Easter Day service. Tie rod problem still not resolved.

Wingfield; full inspection carried out by R Clouston frame and headstocks rusty and require painting. Tower in poor state although not unsafe at present.

Kelsale; stonework in belfry windows requires repair, the parish has this in hand and the work should be done soon. The parish also has a fair amount money in the bell fund and are considering re hanging in a few years' time

Carlton; the four bells here are in a very poor state an are only just about fit for swing chiming through a small arc

Eye; bells in quite good order, although there is a fair amount of decay in the top cills of the frame, caused by leaking roof at sometime. Frame still fairly rigid with maximum horizontal movement of 0-05011 by tenor.

Woodbridge; 5th bells clapper staple bolt was rusted into the headstock and couldn't be

tightened. It was dismantled, cleaned and fitted with new nut.

Whilst we are making progress in reducing the number of unringables, and in some instances creating new rings, we must not forget that we already have many perfectly ringable bells which for most of the time remain silent.

We all must encourage people to come and learn to ring, so that perhaps a few more of these bells will be heard ringing out on Sundays.



Obituaries 1994

Ernest Blomfield - Ipswich St. Margaret

Ernest died at the fine age of 81 in February, the last of the pre-war band. Born within earshot of the bells in 1913 he was always loyal to St. Margarets`, ringing there for well over 60 years. An excellent conductor, in East Anglian style, his favourites were Double Norwich and Superlative.

Ernie served in the Artillery in World War II and was at the D-Day landings. We remember him as one who, in whatever he did, he did well.

The Reverend John Alfred Burness - Helmingham

A one time Honorary member John Burness lived to the remarkable age of 103. For thirty one years he was Rector of Helmingham and Framsden from 1929 to 1960, the 'Golden Years' one might say. Fr. Burness loved ringers and they him, and he liked nothing more than the Annual Hemlun'am outing, reckoning he saw and heard more of life in that one day than in the rest of the year!

William Brooks - East Bergholt

Bill was a long time member of the famous bell cage company, taught by the late Walter Crisp and taking over from him in the later years. The key bell of course is the treble and that is where Bill then rang and conducted the unique ringing on the great five there.

One is glad the tradition of sounding these bells lives on.

Garson Alfred Chapman - Monk Soham.

Bill Chapman was 67, from an old village family and like his father and brothers, call change ringers at Bedfield. Monk Soham and Worlingworth. In better times they would ring their 'four and twenties' (Extents of Minimus with the tenor covering) - from such humble beginnings came the great Edward Jenkins and fine ringers like Bill Crickmer & Walter Ruffles. We shall miss Bill.

Robert George Crooks - Tuddenham St Martin.

Bob Crooks was one of those quiet people who just got on with things - with no fuss. Son of Jack Crooks, himself a life long ringer at Tuddenham, Bob was also Churchwarden there for nearly forty years.

During the war he served with the Suffolks in India & Burma - a regiment very much in the front line.

One happy memory - Bob laid our new carpet at the Tower in 1976 & said somewhat wistfully but with a broad grin, 'I shall never ring on twelve but at least I can lay your carpet'. And jolly well he did it.

Simon Leon Girt - Ipswich St Margaret.

Simon tragically died in February at the age of 29 and our hearts went out to John and Shirley his parents and to Ann in their great loss.

Simon was a competent ringer and had held District & Guild Office, including tower captain at St Margarets. He had wide interests but in ringing especially, teaching bands and the maintenance of our bells.

Benson Hollis - Ipswich St Mary-le-Tower.

'Plum' Hollis was an Associate member at the Tower and immensely keen on the bells. Indeed he and his wife Sylvia gave one of the new bells in the 1976 Restoration. And he learned to handle it, in the firm and devout belief that he would always hear it in the Heavenly Belfry.

Alfred Lockwood - Mendlesham

Alf joined our Guild in 1929 in the days when there were strong bands not only at Stowmarket but at Finborough, Cotton and Haughley too. And in the Mendlesham area Lockwoods & Locks were much in evidence ringing alongside such worthies as Garnham Blaxcell, Bill Forster, Arthur Grimwood and a host of others. These towers will have their day again no doubt and we shall remember these ringers.

James Needham - Monewden.

If anyone ever required proof that ringing has no age barrier then Jim was your man! With great resolution he started at 81 and his delight at ringing call changes or the tenor behind to Doubles was a joy to behold.

He greatly supported the restoration at Monewden and was very proud of the excellent six and their sound over 'Akenfield'.

Jim gave other service too - in wretched circumstances on the Burma Rail and in other theatres of war. The community will miss him greatly.

Richard Rice - Woodbridge.

Dick gave faithful service to St Mary's for many years; the sort of man that Sunday bands are built on. He was a man too of many talents not least as a water colourist and sketcher, bringing great pleasure to many people.

David Southcott - Framlingham

David died after a protracted illness and he will certainly be missed in Framlingham, both in the Farming community and in St Michaels Church where he rang for a number of years.

Harold Edward Symonds - St Mary-le-Tower.

Son of the famous George, Harold himself was a fine ringer on all numbers especially on twelve. Unbeknown to his father he learnt at St Matthews in the early twenties. His first peal - Fathers & Sons at St Margarets in 1928 was quickly followed by Oxford Royal, Stedman Cinques and Yorkshire Maximus. His last was Rochester Maximus in 1938 and then after the war he emigrated to Canada returning to retire here in the 1970's.

Edward John Thurlow - Chediston.

What a lovely chap Jack Thurlow was - so well known in the Halesworth area. A staunch Christian and ringer he loved to reminisce of prewar days, taught as so many were around 'Holzer' by Frederick C.Lambert. But Jack wasn't just a ringer of the past - nothing pleased him more than seeing beginners in the Art.

Chediston won't be quite the same.

Owen Ballard - Cavendish

Slaters and Ballards, Twitchetts and Ambroses, names well known in the Stour and Glem valleys. Arthur Ballard was ringing at Cavendish in the twenties and thirties, Owen first appearing in the Guild report in 1947. And how proud he was of the excellent ring of six there and the belfry with its unique fire place!

Robert John Truin - Hartest

Bob Truin died on September 1st, the last survivor of the 1956 peal at Hartest when they were a ring of five.

Another constant Sunday Service ringer, we are grateful for the contribution he made in the Glem Valley area.

The Very Reverend John Albert Henry Waddington M.A., M.B.E., T.D.

John Waddington was a great friend of ringers and loved bells; but then look at his pedigree! He came to be our Provost at the Cathedral in 1958 until 1976 from St Peter Mancroft so he knew not only a lot about ringing but the history of the Art too.

Provost John enthusiastically supported the restoration of the fine ring at the Norman Tower. He was in great demand too as a preacher and speaker worldwide. We remember him with great affection.

Peal Secretary's Report

During 1994 a total of 187 peals were rung for the guild in 84 different towers. This is the 3rd highest total in the guild's history following 1973 and 1988. However this number was boosted by John Pladdys who arranged his peal tour in Suffolk and Norfolk and rang 18 peals of Stedman!

It is a matter of some concern that the conducting of the peals was carried out by just 26 people, I believe that we have to encourage more ringers to conduct touches and peals, and not leave it to the same few people all the time.

Peals were rung in 75 Suffolk towers, 9 towers outside the county and 2 peals on handbells.

Centenaries of first peals on the bells of Benhall and Tannington were commemorated at the end of the year.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES.

Objects

The Guild shall be established for the promotion of ringing for Divine Service and in furtherance of this object:

- To promote and encourage the practice of bellringing.
- 2. To recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art.
- 3. To cultivate the art of scientific ringing.
- 4. To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof, as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of the bells and their fittings.

Constitution.

A.Name

- 1. The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St.Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- (a) It shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and registered as a Charity at Law. (Ref. 266869)
- (b) The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there shall be Patrons. Vice-Presidents shall be elected at the A.G.M. of the Guild.

B.Membership.

- Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - (a) Ringing Members. A person who can ring rounds efficiently on a tower bell.
 - (b) Associate Members. A person who wishes to support the Guild.
- (c) Life Honorary Member. A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
- (d) Non-Resident Life Members. A person who is qualified to be a Ringing Member, or Associate Member, but who resides outside the territory of the Guild and who is not a member under either 2(a), (b)or (c).
- 3. Ringing and Life Honorary Members only shall have voting rights and be permitted to hold office in the Guild.
- 4. Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C.Districts.

- 5. There shall be four Districts:
- North East District consisting of the deaneries of Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
- 2. North West District consisting of the deaneries of Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe,
- South East District consisting of the deaneries of Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
- 4. South West District consisting of the deaneries of Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D.Government

- 6. The Annual General Meeting of the Guild shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as shall be decided by the Guild Management Committee and shall be the ultimate decision making body of the Guild. It shall elect Guild Officers and set subscriptions and fees for the following year.
- 7. Members shall be elected to fill the following Offices: Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, Maintenance Officer, Report Editor, Newsletter Editor, Central Council Representatives, Technical Adviser, Librarian, Handbell Trustees, Peal Secretary, and any other such Officers as the Guild Management Committee shall see fit to approve.
- 8. In order that the Guild be run efficiently and its objects implemented there shall be three Committees established with the following responsibilities:
- (a) The Guild Management Committee which shall co-ordinate all Guild activities; publish a printed Annual Report and audited Accounts and convene Sub-Committees as may from time to time be required, and shall recommend the levels of subscriptions and peal fees and other methods of raising money and shall organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.
- (b) Recruitment and Training Committee which shall prepare training programmes for use in the Districts; provide courses for the training of teachers of ringing and assist Districts in the recruitment of Ringers.
- (c) Restoration and Maintenance Committee which shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese; which shall make recommendations concerning the preservation and use of bells from redundant churches; which shall advise incumbents and arrange such local restoration and maintenance work as may be necessary.

E.Finance

- 9. All money in the Guild's General Fund not required for normal working purposes shall be invested by the Treasurer as may be directed by the Guild Management Committee.
- 10. All money in the Restoration Fund and Jubilee Fund and such other funds as the Guild Management Committee may establish shall be invested by the Treasurer as may be directed by the Guild Management Committee. Grants for restoration work shall be made by the GuildManagement Committee. Such grants shall only finally be made following the approval of the Guild Ringing Master and a Technical Adviser.
- 10a. Not less than one half of the subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members together with not less than one half of all peal fees shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.
- 11. All cheques shall bear the signature of the Secretary or the Treasurer or the Chairman but any cheque greater in value than the limit set annually by the Guild Management Committee shall bear the signature of two of these Officers.

F.Records and Handbells

- 12. The Report Editor shall record all peals rung for the Guild and Quarter Peals rung in the Diocese and publish them in the Annual Report.
- 13. The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
- 14. The Handbell Trustees shall maintain the Handbells in good condition and shall make such recommendations as may be necessary for the repair of the handbells to the Guild Management Committee.

G.General

15. The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

- 16. The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of the members present at an Annual or Special General Meeting provided that 14 days notice of the proposed amendment has been sent to all members and provided that nothing herein contained shall authorise any amendment which shall have the effect of the Society ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 17. In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfactiom of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

Rules

Guild Rules.

A.Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1. Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded. Membership shall be exercised through only one District at a time, being the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report. Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter in advance on the first day of January each year. Membership shall cease if such subscriptions are not paid by 31st.December of the year in which they become due. The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the next year.
- The subscription rates for members shall be fixed at the Annual General Meeting and
 unless a change is agreed the existing rate shall continue. Persons in full time education shall pay
 a reduced rate of subscription and subscription shall be waived for members over the age
 of 65.
- 3. Life Honorary Members shall only be elected at an Annual General Meeting and nominations may only be made by the Guild Management Committee or District. No further subscription is payable after election.
- Persons who have been Ringing Members or Associate Members for at least two years may, upon leaving the Diocese, inform their District Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence. A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Member as an alternative to Ringing or Associate Membership.
- 5. For the purposes of peal ringing new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry to the appropriate category of membership subject to the confirmation at a business meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the Guild Management Committee in the case of a Non-Resident Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 6. Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the Guild Management Committee which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

B.Election of Officers.

- 7. All Officers shall retire at the Guild's Annual General Meeting but shall be eligible for re-election. Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the Annual General Meeting provided always that they are proposed and seconded. If more than one nomination for any office is received then election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote. Central Council Representatives shall be elected in accordance with the rules of the Central Council during the second year of the triennium at the A.G.M. of the Guild.
- 8. The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Auditor who is not a member of the Guild Management Committee and need not be a member of the Guild.

C.Committee Structure.

- 9. The Guild Management Committee shall consist of: Vice Presidents, The Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, Technical Adviser, Public Relations Officer, Maintenance Officer, two elected representatives from each district, & such Guild Officers as may be from time to time required or invited to attend. Six members shall constitute a quorum. The Committee shall meet at least three times per year. The Chairman shall take the chair at all meetings of the Guild and Guild Management Committee. In his absence the Chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 .The Recruitment and Training Committee shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two Representatives from each District.
- 11. The Restoration and Maintenance Committee shall consist of the Guild Maintenance Officer as Convenor, Guild Technical Adviser and two Representatives from each District.
- 12. Each of the above two Committees shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13. (a) The Chairman, Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Maintenance Officer shall form the Guild Executive. In the event of a Guild Office being vacated between A.G.M's they shall make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened.
- (b) The Guild Management Committee may convene such sub-committees as it deems necessary from time to time and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committee shall be reported back to the Guild Management Committee as soon as possible.

D.Expenses

- 14. The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
- (a) The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the Guild Management Committee.
 - (b) The expenses of Guild Meetings.
- (c) Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - (d) Insurance of Guild property.
- (e) Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the Guild Management Committee.
 - (f) Such other expenses as the Guild Management Committee may determine.

E.Peal Records.

- 15. All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 16. Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
- (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
- (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and compositions of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

F.Alteration of Rules.

17. No alteration or addition shall be made to the Rules of the Guild except as specified in paragraphs 16 and 17 of the Constitution.

District Rules.

18. Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year

for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the previous year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the coming year. Members shall be eligible to vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.

- 19. The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master, Secretary/Treasurer; District Maintenance Officer; Newsletter Correspondant. The Chairman, Ringing Master and District Maintenance Officer shall normally represent the District on the Guild Management, Recruitment and Training, and Restoration and Maintenance Committees respectively but substitutes may be permitted. One other representative to each of the Guild Committees shall be elected. The District Officers and one elected member from each deanery shall form the District Committee. A District may elect additional working Officers at its discretion to assist the running of the District.
- 20. The District Secretary/Treasurer shall collect all subscriptions and other monies due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer. A statement of accounts shall be submitted to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January. A Directory of tower correspondents, lists of members and ringing times shall be submitted to the Secretary by 15th January.
- 21. The District Maintenance Officer shall endeavour to arrange for the inspection of every belfry in the district at least once a year and shall report his findings to the Restoration and Maintenance Committee at their January meeting. He shall be available to advise incumbents and shall provide leadership at local working parties where necessary.
- 22. The District Newsletter Correspondant shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspaper.
- 23. The District Committee shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.

Regulations relating to the Pearson's Handbells.

- 1. The Pearson Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustees. They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
- 2. The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustees by the borrower, and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustees if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the proceeding borrower.
- 3. The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustees by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of both of the Trustees.
- 4. The bells must be returned to the Trustees upon request. The Trustees should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as posible.
- 5. If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6. The Trustees are responsible to the Committee of the Guild for the administration of the bells, and their decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by the committee.
- 7. The Trustees and the Committee of the Guild would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy Striking Competitions Rules.

1. The competitions shall take place on the third Saturday in May or on any other date decided by the Guild Management Committee.

- 2. All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- No Member may ring more than once in the Rose competition, except as specified in Rule 10.
- Representative bands shall consist of:
- (a) The Mitson Shield. Six ringers of which at least four are shown in the Annual Report as members of that tower. All six ringers are to be bona fide Ringers at that tower.
- (b) The Rose Trophy. Eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of which at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 5. Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by any band not complying with the previous Rule.
- 6. Each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw. The times of the draws to be advertised in the 'Ringing World'.
- A total of two minutes practice ringing and stand will be allowed before each test piece.
- 8. The test piece will be:
- (a) The Mitson Shield. 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor Method(s).
- (b) The Rose Trophy. At least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s). In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used. For the Rose Trophy only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 9. The length of either test piece may be shortened at the discretion of the Ringing Master in the event of a large entry.
- 10. A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available to bands meeting short, at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
- 11. A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12. The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13. Interpretation of all rules are at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

HANDBELL TRUSTEES' REPORT

There is little to report this year. The four sets of handbells remain in good order but demand for their use has been limited during the last twelve months. The Mendlesham handbells remain in the custody of the Guild for safe keeping.
