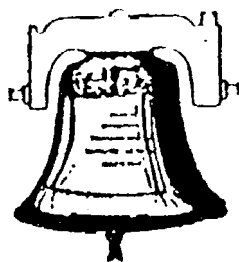

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Management Committee met regularly during the year and despite the long journeys involved for many of the members of the Committee the meetings have always been well-attended.

For its AGM this year, the Guild were invited to St Margaret's, Ipswich and, as one has come to expect from the SE District, the arrangements were impeccable. They even ensured that we had somewhere to park our cars, something that is not normally easy in Ipswich. Was it also part of their plan that the business meeting was to be completed in under two hours? Or perhaps it was the thought of the excellent tea that they had laid on which ensured that we did not get drawn into lengthy discussions. Anyway, thanks to all who had a hand in making the arrangements.

Over 80 members attended the meeting. There was nothing controversial on the agenda. Our Treasurer proposed that subscriptions remain the same next year and the proposal was quickly adopted before anyone could propose an increase! A few new officers were elected: Stephen Pettman was appointed as the Guild's Public Relations Officer, Stephen Young is now the Report Editor and Michelle Chapman has taken over as the Newsletter Editor.

The AGM could not find anyone willing to fill the office of Treasurer. Fortunately, shortly afterwards Paul Stannard indicated that he would be prepared to take on the job, an offer that the Management Committee were only too pleased to accept. The Committee are grateful to Chris Barker who continued acting as Treasurer until Paul's appointment.

It still continues to be a matter of concern to some that Guild and District meetings are not better attended. On the other hand the bells of Suffolk are being rung for church services and that should be our prime objective. What really matters is not how many ringers attend AGM's, etc, but how many regularly ring on Sundays. From what I hear, Sunday service ringing is in a very healthy state. For instance at Woodbridge, my home tower, it is now some years since the bells have not been rung at least once on a Sunday and the attendance is now usually in double figures. There is undoubtedly an enthusiasm for ringing in the county at grass roots level. Those of us who attend the Guild and District functions know what enjoyable and social occasions they can be. If we want more to attend them then perhaps we should personally invite ringers to come along and, if they do, make sure their presence is acknowledged and that they are made welcome. Then maybe they will want to come again.

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

Well 1995 was a very active year for Katharine and I. In the course of visiting District meetings and practices I formed the opinion that ringing in Suffolk is alive and fairly healthy. Whilst practices are well attended, some lack innovation and enthusiasm. We need to improve the usefulness of practices to assist in the retention of ringers. Again the lack of opportunity to conduct at practices is noticeable, more efforts must be made to share out our knowledge and ensure the continued existence of the exercise. It is of concern the marked differences between practice bands and service bands. We must find a way to ensure as many ringers as possible who attend practice also ring on Sundays. It is not sufficient to have ten for practice and only five for service. The depth of method ringing continues to improve, but alas this appears to be to the detriment of striking and good rhythmic ringing. Perhaps we should encourage better ringing of the mundane and routine before moving on to other things. The Guild and its officers are aware of these and many other problems, and are working to educate and hopefully overcome many of them.

On the publicity front, Ralph and I were both successful in getting ringing on to the television. Horham ringers also appeared in a programme about village life on Anglia. Myself and Paul Stannard appeared on Suffolk radio, talking about the insidious imposition of VAT on bell work, and the press carried several good stories about Suffolk ringing, Buxhall and Stowmarket to name but two. The "Ringing World" also carried a large number of articles about Suffolk ringing. Our profile has been high and I can only encourage all members to act as ambassadors with the media, in an attempt to keep it up.

The AGM in Ipswich was very successful. The format of quarter peals worked well, with each District except the SW scoring on the day. The meeting was short, and should have done much to encourage future attendance. Congratulations to Southwold, Grundisburgh and St Mary le Tower, who won the Lester Brett Trophy, Mitson Shield & Rose Trophy respectively. I am currently canvassing views on the striking competitions in an effort to find ways to increase entry. Healthy competition, specially in striking, can only be good for ringing as a whole. Let's not forget the rich history of Striking competitions in Suffolk, with much prize ringing going on in the 18th & 19th centuries.

As a "disliker of" outings, I must confess the Guild Outing to St Albans nearly converted me. Super bells, good company and seething heat provided an excellent day out. St Albans Abbey can optimistically be described as challenging, but we gave a good account of ourselves at every tower visited. So enjoyable was it that I am actually looking forward to the 1996 Outing. As usual Veterans' Day was a pleasure and again thanks are due to Muriel and the Debenham ringers for all their efforts. This year for the first time we held a Guild Carol service at Horham. 59 people braved the bad weather and cold church for a most enjoyable evening. Thanks go to the Rev David Streeter, the Horham Ringers and the Gipping Valley Handbell ringers.

The R&T Committee goes on from strength to strength and I am eternally grateful for the hard work put in by members. Equipped with our own budget, we have spent the year looking at ways to help the membership achieve and many projects are still in the pipeline. Leaflets on "Complaints" and "How to Double Your Progress" have been well received and are available free from your R & T representative. Each District Ringing Master now has a practical library of ringing books for use at District level on a short term loan basis.

We ran three seminars during the year, two on Bell Maintenance, in the NE & SE and one on "Conducting Not Bob Calling" at Laxfield. All have been well attended and thanks go to the tutors, Martin Thorley, Winston Girling & David Ward. The R & T are only too pleased to run seminars on any bell related subject - Striking, Listening Skills, Method Learning are just a few. If you feel you or your tower could benefit, just ask.

A change of venue and format for the training day was well received. Students' comments have been noted and hopefully improvements will be included this year. However, the Handbell course will not be included this year, but instead we will be having a "Handbell" day in the early summer, watch for details.

Quarter peal week came and went with 12 being rung. This needs looking at and the R & T are seeking views and opinions. One thing the R & T did decide was to offer grants to attenders of Central Council approved training courses. As yet we have received no requests, so why not give it some thought?

My thanks to all members who turned out and supported ringing for VE & VJ days. Suffolk's contribution to both days' celebrations was excellent. Peals, quarters & ringing at local towers resulted in a high profile, which was appreciated both by the public and service organisations alike.

Much the same was true of the "Festival of Faith". The Bishop was greeted by bells throughout his cycle ride. I was also privileged to be asked to ring in and call a peal at the Cathedral, to welcome the new Provost, the Very Rev James Atwell. A representative band of Suffolk & Towcester ringers, assembled by George Pipe, rang a good peal of Cambridge Royal. Since then it has been a pleasure to welcome the Provost to the Guild as a member. Very seldom these days do we witness history in the making, but just that happened at the Cathedral when I attended the dedication of the peal board for the welcome peal. As part of the dedication, we rang rounds & call changes on the back eight, with both the Provost & the Bishop ringing. What a cherished few minutes and quite unique.

On the peal front it has been a very good year. The total of 159 has been achieved without the assistance of touring bands and the vast majority have been rung by the Guild rather than for the Guild. 96 resident members took part, with 11 first-pealers.

On the whole, the standards have been fairly high. However concerns have been expressed to me about certain peals. Conductors must be ever vigilant to ensure the highest possible standards are achieved. Nothing is gained by forcing ringers through methods they are clearly not capable of ringing.

Congratulations are due to Martin Thorley who, with the peal at Helmingham on 18th November 1995, has broken Les Brett's all time Guild peal record. Will he be the first to 1500 for the Guild? It was also good to see George Pipe and John Mayne each returning to Ufford for peals to mark the 50th anniversary of their first. Not many can say they have been peal ringers for 50 years.

Peals of note, in date order, include: 1/1 (St Mary le Quay) 100th anniversary of the first peal of minor in Ipswich; 22/1 (Cathedral) the peal to welcome the new Provost; 23/2 (Cathedral) the 100th anniversary of the first peal on the ten; 28/2 100th anniversary of the first peal at Otley; 26/3 first peal on the restored ring at Pakenham with four first pealers; 1/4 100th anniversary of the first peal at Burgh, 25/6 (Hollesey) all ladies peal of Surprise Major; 16/12 (Stowmarket) 180th anniversary of the first peal.

MAINTENANCE OFFICER'S REPORT

During the last year 39 Churches have joined the Suffolk Guild Affiliation Scheme, an excellent response and grateful thanks are due for their support for this worthwhile scheme, the proceeds of which go to our bell restoration fund. All are listed elsewhere in this report and please do encourage your Church to join if they have not already done so. The proceeds from this minimal subscription have so far raised nearly £400.

May I extend a warm welcome to all new members of the maintenance team and also say thank you on behalf of the Guild for the voluntary work by the team and other ringers and helpers who have worked very hard to keep our bells ringing. It is hoped to extend the team by forming a Belfry Advisory Committee so that more of the available expertise within our Guild is put on a firm footing.

All of the year's work as detailed below has been carried out voluntarily unless stated otherwise and of necessity the record has been kept to a minimum because of available space. Please do make sure that, if any voluntary work on bells is carried out at your Church, it is brought to the attention of either the Guild Maintenance Officer or one of the team so that it can be recorded.

SOUTH WEST DISTRICT

GLEMSFORD: 5th headstock replaced, work on 3 bells now complete and all 6 ringing, much improved. **MONKS ELEIGH:** guides moved down 5 feet, much improved. **BURES:** treble lifted out and removed from headstock to replace packing between headstock and bell, re-stocked and now tight. **NAYLAND:** all 6 clappers re-bushed. **HITCHAM:** looking at possibility of restoration and repairs to tower roof. **BARNARDISTON:** looking at Ellacombe apparatus being fitted and bells being left as they are.

SOUTH EAST DISTRICT

WOODBIDGE: rusted 5th clapper staple freed and tightened. **CAMPSEA ASHE:** visited, bells worn in soundbow, clappers too long and piece out of 2nd. Can be rung. **ST LAWRENCE, IPSWICH:** visited and bells tried. Debris around frame cemented over, some frame decay, extra bolting and tie rods and treating and cleaning necessary. **IKEN:** recently rung for wedding, maintenance in hand, interested in augmentation. **EASTON:** visited, frame cills move 50 thou, supporting RSJ's recommended. **BRANDESTON:** loose gudgeon on treble headstock repaired by Taylor's, work on removing and replacing bell carried out locally.

NORTH EAST DISTRICT

GISLINGHAM: visited, interest in rehanging, bells taken down to first floor. **REYDON:** single bell removed. To be re-hung in new 6-bell frame and 5 extra bells added. **BENHALL:** new headstock fitted to 2nd, bearings cleaned, Hawkedon type clamps needed on frame. **YAXLEY:** checked and tightened prior to peal. **EYE:** visited, 5th pulley freed, frame movement assessed and leaking clock weight turret reported.

CARLTON: (4) visited, derelict, one bell can be swing chimed. **KELSALE:** visited, showing some interest in rehanging on self-aligning ball bearings. **BARSHAM:** 1893 frame enters tower walls just above window openings and should be rehung lower in tower, possible grant for this. At **WENHASTON** and **WESTHALL** visits are to take place and at **LITTLE GLEMHAM** it is hoped that a long standing badly leaking tower roof may be repaired before too long, having already caused frame decay.

NORTH WEST DISTRICT

STOWMARKET: bells ringing again after major tower restoration, guides and pullies replaced, louvers and intermediate floors soundproofed to reduce sound levels both outside and inside the tower. Extra ring beam and securing frame to RSJ and ring beam has improved 'go' of bells and tower movement at parapet level minimal. **HINDERCLAY:** visited, loose clappers released and tightened, bells checked. Much debris. Frame needs painting. **GREAT BARTON:** tight clapper bush on 2nd reamed and freed off. **HOPTON:** visited, bells checked and tightened including frame. Both trebles hung in rickety wooden construction above other bells and possibility of rehanging them in a small steel frame in same location being looked at. **WATTISFIELD:** Faculty to hand to weld cracked 4th, to be removed from tower, transported and replaced, including refurbishing clapper by team and helpers. **BADWELL ASH:** visited, checked and tightened, hoops on single bolted, recessed and hooped gudgeons on 2nd very loose and working off headstock causing severe knocking. Wedged temporarily and will be repaired in due course. **HAUGHLEY:** following fitting of self-aligning ball bearings by Taylor's clapper swing on some bells not compatible and bells go up wrong. Much local work to resolve but problem continues. **GREAT ASHFIELD:** Faculty being applied for to fit new metal work to tenor headstock and drill bell crown to support cracked canon, work expected to start soon. **COMBS:** push to rehang 4 bells and augment has come to a standstill. **WEST STOW:** much work on these fine bells including stabilising treble which was moving around considerably, and welding and turning down 5th gudgeons to cure severe knock caused by worn gudgeon pins, bells much improved. **BARROW:** old wooden frame reassembled lower in tower and new steel 6 bell frame in place above to house old 5 bells and new treble, work by Eayre and Smith but much local effort. **BUXHALL:** 3rd recast and replaced in tower, bells now restored to former glory. **EXNING:** wooden frame top levelled to realign 5th bearings. **TIMWORTH:** bells checked and donated ropes fitted. **COTTON:** architect has passed frame supports and declared bells safe to ring, much work here by maintenance team including painting all metal work. **MARKET WESTON:** visited to assess possibility of frame being repaired by local builder. **WICKHAM SKEITH:** bells overhauled, 5th gudgeons welded and turned down to cure severe knock and bells pealed and much better to ring. **THELNETHAM:** bells checked and tightened including frame.

TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

The highlight of the year must be the return of **Stowmarket** bells to ringing, after the extensive restoration of the tower. The spire has been restored to its former height, and is now a splendid sight especially when compared to the odd looking stump of latter years. The bells were tried out on Wednesday 7th June, where the tower sway at roof level was very slight indeed and certainly a vast improvement on what it was before. The bells have been in regular use since.

There are two restoration projects in progress at the moment, at Barrow and Reydon near Southwold.

At **Barrow**, much of the old frame has been lowered into the intermediate chamber, because English Heritage would not allow the 1846 frame to be removed, and there isn't sufficient height for a new six bell frame in this chamber with the old frame in situ. The new metal frame has been installed at the level previously occupied by the old frame. The existing five bells have been tuned and a new treble cast. They should be installed early in the new year, and the dedication is on March 31st. so all will be complete when you read this.

At **Reydon**, the single Brasyer bell was removed on Tuesday 27th July. That evening a procession led the bell which was pulled from the church to Reydon Corner, where the Rev. Harry Edwards conducted a short service before the bell, "Gabriel", was loaded to continue his journey to Whitechapel the following morning.

Gabriel has now returned and has been hung in a new cast-iron and mild steel frame for six where he will be the fifth bell in the new ring. A new treble, "Michael", was cast and hung at the same time, completing the first stage of this project.

The parish has now raised sufficient to order two more bells, which will remain at the foundry until the remaining bells have been cast and they can complete the final stage of the project, which should be in about two years time, so watch this space!

Other towers visited by your Technical Adviser include Wilby, Campsea Ashe, Gislingham, Easton and Benhall.

Wilby: The bearing races have been replaced on the third.

Campsea Ashe: The main problems are with the treble and second bells, the treble being excessively worn where the clapper strikes, and the second has a large chunk missing from the lip, most likely caused by a combination of a poor casting and too long a clapper. The clapper in the third is also too long, so only the tenor is fit for use at present.

Gislingham: The parish are exploring the possibilities of restoring this fine old ring of six, where the bells are at present unhung in the intermediate chamber. The tower is quite large in plan so there is plenty of room to install a new frame to house the bells on one level lower down, allowing the old frame to be preserved in situ.

Easton: The bells and fittings are all in quite fair order and the Day frame is still good. The problem here is that the frame is not anchored to the supporting beams and moves about when the bells are rung. The supporting timbers below the frame are in poor condition and there is little to anchor the frame down to. A set of rolled steel joists inserted below the frame seems the most likely solution.

Benhall: The headstock on the second had split in two and required urgent replacement. A new one was made to the same pattern in elm and all the existing ironwork re-used. The plain bearings have been cleaned out and fitted with felt pads to retain the oil. The vertical tie-rods were all tightened which much reduced the horizontal movement of the top sills. As at Easton the frame requires anchoring down to the supporting beams which in this case are in good condition. Clamps are to be made for this purpose.

Finally I would like to mention The Suffolk Guild Affiliation Scheme, which Winston has invested much hard work in. Please try and persuade your church to join. It's only £10 per year and will raise valuable funds for your Guild and give your church access to the expertise that the Guild has to offer on bell maintenance and other matters.

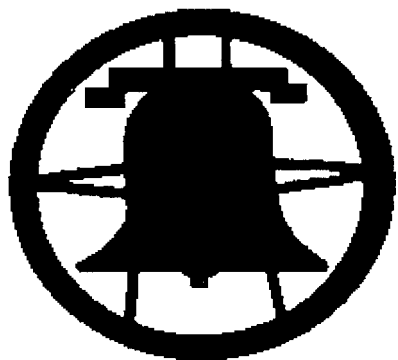

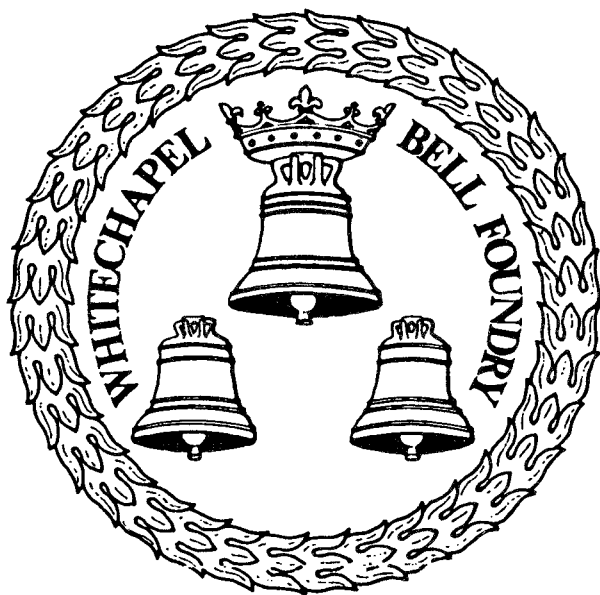

Secretary's Report

Another eventful year passes but it saddens me that 1995 has been eventful for the wrong reasons.

During the year three of our older members sadly passed away: Aubrey Peacock of Stoke by Clare, George Bloomfield of Glemsford and Les Mills of Bures.

Ringing-wise, the January district practice at Lavenham surpassed all expectations with an attendance of some 50 district members and visitors. Sadly, this was not to be the trend for the year, indeed the same event and venue repeated in October generated only eight ringers and was, ironically, the worst-attended event of the year.

Probably the most popular event of the year was the district's striking contest, held at Rattlesden, with the home tower capturing the trophy by the narrowest of margins from Lavenham, and this was followed by a barbecue at the local pub.

In contrast, however, the district failed to enter a team in the Guild 8-bell striking competition at Kersey. This was the first time the district had failed to compete in this event and caused some embarrassment, with the event taking place at a tower within our district.

Apart from the poor attendance at district events, the district was badly affected during the year by the controversy over Bellservice. Unfortunately the district lost its secretary/treasurer, maintenance officer, ringing master and representatives on Recruitment & Training, Restoration & Maintenance and FOSB committees, all of whom tendered their resignations during the year. (For those of you who are wondering why I am writing this report and not the secretary who was elected, that is the reason!)

The district's annual meeting, at Clare, saw only 15 district members and five visiting ringers attend what should be THE event of the year. As a result, the district struggled to find sufficient volunteers to fill all offices, with the usual "hardy perennials" rallying to keep the district afloat.

The result of this lack of interest in the district has meant that our calendar of events for 1996 has been cut down quite dramatically and a request has been made to the guild's management committee to consider the re-structuring of the districts within the guild.

I will end on a positive note by saying that ringing in the district at a local level is actually thriving, with regular Sunday service ringing taking place at a good number of towers.

What must the district/guild do to attract/persuade these ringers to attend district/guild events in the future? Why do they readily pay their subscriptions but not seek a return on their investment? I wish I had the answer to these questions!

OBITUARIES 1995

Reginald Abbott - Monk Soham and Winchester

Born in 1903, Reg was the last of the pre First World War Monk & Earl Soham bands. His first peal was at Dennington, conducted by Edward Jenkins before the great man moved to Oldham.

Reg joined the Metropolitan Police and in so doing rang at Croydon in the 40's and 50's, coming under the notice of JGA Prior who also sadly died in 1995.

Henry William Barrett - Loddon

In many ways Bill was as Suffolk as the rest of us - he loved ringing over the border from Norfolk. After some years in Surrey he moved back to Loddon in 1950 and after that rang over 1700 peals on all numbers. In his early days he was a fine tennis player which he reckoned gave him fitness in later life. Office holder in the NDA, teacher, churchman, Bill was a man of many parts and was always supported by his wife Eveline.

Chloe Selina Bedford - Aldeburgh

Wife of Peter and mother of Ruth, Vernon and Stephen, one could say Chloe certainly made her contribution to the Guild. We admired the way she quietly went about her daily life: patience and support personified. We thank God for her.

George Bloomfield - Glemsford

A ringer at St Mary's for over sixty years, George was just about the last of the "Glem Valley Boys" and of course his life connected us with the Slaters, Theodore, Sam and Zechariah, ringers and craftsmen all.

Edward Patrick Duffield - Colchester

Ted Duffield's name will be spoken in the Exercise for all time, for he was one of the greats. We knew him primarily through ringing but his range of activity and skills was prodigious - miller, organist, national croquet player and mayor of Colchester.

EPD was part of a notable ringing family from Buxton in Norfolk and rose to become Master of the Essex and the College Youths.

Before the war he was a member of William Pye's band and afterwards of Wilfred Williams'. Unconventional in style, Ted could ring anywhere in the circle, on any number and any weight, with a special love for twelve-bell ringing and London Surprise Major.

John William Euston - Buxhall and Streatham

Jack became one of the best known faces in Metropolitan London for 70 years and it is fair to say that with the exception of Tom Taffender and Harold and Olive Rogers nobody did more for London ringing overall than he.

Born at Buxhall in 1900 he learnt at Finborough, ringing his first peal at Monks Eleigh in 1922 with his lifelong friends Ted Davey, Keith Whittell and Harry Lister. Jack

never forgot his Suffolk roots and always kept in touch with these ringers, Alf Peters and those in the Stowmarket area.

But it is at St Margaret's Westminster and a host of London rings, many of which he maintained all those years, that we remember him. More, he was a strong Christian and a thoroughly nice man.

Jeffery Gorrod - Lowestoft

Jeff bravely fought six months of illness and we realised how tenacious he was. Ringer, PCC member, churchwarden, a man of talent besides his skill as an engineer.

He was taught to ring by Peter Kindred at Pakefield, a good "nursery", rang at Carlton Colville and around the Diocesan borders, holding office in the NDA, and in later years formed the Britannia Handbell Team. He was a good photographer too.

We remember his wife Pauline and children Philip and Christine in their sad loss.

George Hill - Worlingworth

Another of the village call-change band, George passed away at 82. These unsung ringers kept the Hoxne Deanery bells going year after year and the Guild acknowledges their service. There is always a nice welcome around Worlingworth and one is glad the newer generation keeps up the tradition whilst always pleased to see change ringers.

James W Jennings - Ipswich, Stutton and Staffordshire

Brother of Grace and John, Jimmy was a ringer of some ability before the Second World War. Taught at Rushmere, he soon came under the influence of the Tower and in quite a short time he was ringing Superlative Maximus, with the only band in the country capable of it at Sunday service.

Jim was a musician - piano, organ and a member of the Bach choir. We remember his achievements and personality with affection.

Charles H Kippin - Southampton

The enigmatic Charlie Kippin - what would he do next? Such was his skill at the end of a rope and in the field of progressive composition that there were always surprises! Technically with Frank Darby he advanced the development of Surprise Royal centred around Beddington and physically any bell of any weight came within his compass.

Charles joined as a Life Member in the 1920's.

Leslie D Mills - Long Melford and Bures

Leslie was a Melford man and it is in the Stour Valley from Sudbury to Bures we especially remember him. Les was his own man, of strong opinion and tireless energy, craftsman in wood and metal, teacher, organiser and fund raiser. One didn't always agree with him but, my goodness, one respected his efforts.

Teaching his wife and son Donald, restoring and augmenting Bures and Sudbury St Peter are some of his legacies to us and he was recognised with Vice Presidency of the Guild.

Richard Sulley Payne - Southwold

Dick Payne "hailed" from Lincolnshire as we used to say, friend of Arthur Haynes and Ted Chapman who in their turn came to Suffolk. He became Tower Captain of Southwold in 1936, holding the post for almost fifty years. After the war he teamed up with John Blythe and gave valuable service in the North East district especially.

Dick was a committed Christian, Vicar's Warden, PCC Treasurer and like all good stewards handed on his knowledge to his children and grandchildren and many another young ringer.

Aubrey Peacock - Stoke by Clare

Another of the loyal local folk who don't make the headlines but nevertheless play their part Sunday by Sunday in the village community. Aubrey was such a man. The Suffolk Guild's structure and endeavour needs an abundance of people like this.

Felix Potter - Horringer

Felix was the sort of man Thomas Gray immortalised in his Elegy. A villager through and through, indefatigable church worker, ringer, family man, serving God and his fellows throughout his life. How pleased we were when he received the Good Neighbourhood award.

Horringer belfry, church and village will miss him keenly.

James G A Prior - Croydon

Jim joined as a Life Member between the Wars but it is principally through his long Secretaryship of the College Youths he was best known - internationally in fact. And his interest was not polarised in London - he eagerly followed the doings of all the Guilds.

Certainly Jim was one of the most popular figures in the City and no mean heavy bell ringer either, listing Bow, Cornhill and Cripplegate tenors amongst his achievements.

Arthur Smith - Coddendam

Coddendam's vintage years were really pre-1914, historic bells in a contemporary belfry, but how pleased Arthur was to see them restored a few years back. He started his ringing in the days of the brothers Mee who rang there, Hawkins English, Tom Sadler and the Rev William Carter Pearson.

He was a good listener of change ringing and no mean judge either.

Dr Patrick Spencer-Phillips - Bildeston

Patrick was another Life Member, in his early days a well-known ringer in the Chelmsford area. Sadly he has not lived to see the completion of Bildeston tower and bells project which he did so much to support but we shall remember him when that happy day comes.

PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

During 1995 a total of 159 peals were rung for the Guild with a good spread over all numbers from Doubles to Maximus. Worthy of particular mention are the ladies' band that rang a peal of Yorkshire Surprise Major at Hollesley and the peals rung to commemorate 50 years since VE and VJ Days.

The peals were rung at 52 Suffolk towers and six towers outside the county, these being Beverley Minster, Birmingham (St Martin), Clive, Solihull, Thorington and Tolleshunt D'Arcy.

The first peal since 1957 was rung on the five at Pakenham. Stowmarket has returned to the peal columns now that the spire has been replaced, the last previous peal being rung there in 1990. The first peal has also been rung on the recast 3rd at Buxhall.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

Objects, Constitution & Rules

Objects

The Guild shall be established for the promotion of ringing for Divine Service and in furtherance of this object:

1. To promote and encourage the practice of bellringing.
2. To recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art.
3. To cultivate the art of scientific ringing.
4. To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof, as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of the bells and their fittings.

Constitution

A. Name:

1. The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - (a) It shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and registered as a Charity at Law.(Ref.266869)
 - (b) The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there shall be Patrons. Vice-Presidents shall be elected at the A.G.M. of the Guild.

B. Membership:

2. Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - (a) Ringing Member. A person who can ring rounds efficiently on a tower bell.
 - (b) Associate Member. A person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - (c) Life Honorary Member. A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
 - (d) Non-Resident Life Member. A person who is qualified to be a Ringing Member, or Associate Member, but who resides outside the territory of the Guild and who is not a member under either 2(a), (b) or (c).
3. Ringing and Life Honorary Members only shall have voting rights and be permitted to hold office in the Guild.
4. Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. Districts.

5. There shall be four Districts:
 - 1 North East District consisting of the deaneries of Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
 2. North West District consisting of the deaneries of Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.

3. South East District consisting of the deaneries of Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
4. South West District consisting of the deaneries of Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. Government

6. The Annual General Meeting of the Guild shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as shall be decided by the Guild Management Committee and shall be the ultimate decision making body of the Guild. It shall elect Guild Officers and set subscriptions and fees for the following year.
7. Members shall be elected to fill the following Offices: Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, Maintenance Officer, Report Editor, Newsletter Editor, Central Council Representatives, Technical Adviser, Librarian, Handbell Trustees, Peal Secretary, and any other such Officers as the Guild Management Committee shall see fit to approve.
8. In order that the Guild be run efficiently and its objects implemented there shall be three Committees established with the following responsibilities:
 - (a) The Guild Management Committee which shall co-ordinate all Guild activities; publish a printed Annual Report and audited Accounts and convene Sub-Committees as may from time to time be required, and shall recommend the levels of subscriptions and peal fees and other methods of raising money and shall organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.
 - (b) Recruitment and Training Committee which shall prepare training programmes for use in the Districts; provide courses for the training of teachers of ringing and assist Districts in the recruitment of Ringers.
 - (c) Restoration and Maintenance Committee which shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese; which shall make recommendations concerning the preservation and use of bells from redundant churches; which shall advise incumbents and arrange such local restoration and maintenance work as may be necessary.

E. Finance

- 9a. All money in any of the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the Guild Management Committee.
- 9b. All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman or the Secretary or the Treasurer and any cheque greater than the value of the limit set by the Guild Management Committee shall bear the signatures of two of the three signatories.
- 10a. The expenses listed in Rule D14 shall be paid out of the General Fund together with other payments in furtherance of the Guild's objectives as shall be specifically authorised by the Guild Management Committee.
- 10b. The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells, etc and the capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 10c. Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the Guild Management Committee but shall only be paid following the approval of the work by the Guild Ringing Master and a technical adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full circle ringing, but may in addition include other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 10d. The excess of income over expenditure on the Friends of Suffolk Bells account, or such proportion of it as the Guild Management Committee may determine, shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund.
- 10e. The monies in the St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used, as required, for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to the St Peter's bells and fittings as

authorised by the Guild Management Committee.

- 10f. The monies in the Library Fund shall be used, as required, for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 10g. The monies in the Handbell Fund shall be used as required for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells, as authorised by the Guild Management Committee.
- 10h. The Guild Management Committee may, from time to time, establish further funds and shall at that time specify the aims and objectives of the new funds.
- 10i. The Guild Management Committee may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 11. At least half of all peal fees and subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members, together with all the Non-Resident Life Membership fees, shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. Records and Handbells

- 12. The Report Editor shall record all peals rung for the Guild and Quarter Peals rung in the Diocese and publish them in the Annual Report.
- 13. The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
- 14. The Handbell Trustees shall maintain the Handbells in good condition and shall make such recommendations as may be necessary for the repair of the handbells to the Guild Management Committee.

G. General

- 15. The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.
- 16. The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of the members present at an Annual or Special General Meeting provided that 14 days notice of the proposed amendment has been sent to all members and provided that nothing herein contained shall authorise any amendment which shall have the effect of the Society ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 17. In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

Rules

Guild Rules.

A. Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1. Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded. Membership shall be exercised through only one District at a time, normally being the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report. Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter in advance on the first day of January each year. Membership shall cease if such subscriptions are not paid by 31st December of the year in which they fall due. The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the next year.
- 2. The subscription rates for members shall be fixed at the Annual General Meeting and unless a change is agreed the existing rate shall continue. Persons in full time education shall pay a reduced rate of subscription and subscription shall be waived for members over the age of 65.
- 3. Life Honorary Members shall only be elected at an Annual General Meeting and nominations may only be made by the Guild Management Committee or District. No further subscription is payable after election.

4. Persons who have been Ringing Members or Associate Members for at least two years may, upon leaving the Diocese, inform their District Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence. A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Member as an alternative to Ringing or Associate Membership.
5. For the purposes of peal ringing new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry to the appropriate category of membership subject to the confirmation at a business meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the Guild Management Committee in the case of a Non-Resident Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
6. Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the Guild Management Committee which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

B. Election of Officers.

7. All Officers shall retire at the Guild's Annual General Meeting but shall be eligible for re-election. Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the Annual General Meeting provided always that they are proposed and seconded. If more than one nomination for any office is received then election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote. Central Council Representatives shall be elected in accordance with the rules of the Central Council during the second year of the triennium at the A.G.M. of the Guild.
8. The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Auditor who is not a member of the Guild Management Committee and need not be a member of the Guild.

C. Committee Structure.

9. The Guild Management Committee shall consist of: Vice Presidents, The Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, Technical Adviser, Public Relations Officer, Maintenance Officer, two elected representatives from each district & such Guild Officers as may be from time to time required or invited to attend. Six members shall constitute a quorum. The Committee shall meet at least three times per year. The Chairman shall take the chair at all meetings of the Guild and Guild Management Committee. In his absence the Chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his absence by a person elected by the meeting.
10. The Recruitment and Training Committee shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two Representatives from each District.
11. The Restoration and Maintenance Committee shall consist of the Guild Maintenance Officer as Convenor, Guild Technical Adviser and two Representatives from each District.
12. Each of the above two Committees shall meet at least three times a year.
13. (a) The Chairman, Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Maintenance Officer shall form the Guild Executive. In the event of a Guild Office being vacated between A.G.M's they shall make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened.
(b) The Guild Management Committee may convene such sub-committees as it deems necessary from time to time and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committee shall be reported back to the Guild Management Committee as soon as possible.

D. Expenses

14. The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - (a) The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the Guild Management Committee.
 - (b) The expenses of Guild Meetings.

- (c) Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
- (d) Insurance of Guild property.
- (e) Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the Guild Management Committee.
- (f) Such other expenses as the Guild Management Committee may determine.

E. Peal Records.

- 15. All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 16. Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and compositions of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

F. Alteration of Rules.

- 17. No alteration or addition shall be made to the Rules of the Guild except as specified in paragraphs 16 and 17 of the Constitution.

District Rules.

- 18. Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the previous year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the coming year. Members shall be eligible to vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 19. The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/ Treasurer; District Maintenance Officer; Newsletter Correspondent. The Chairman, Ringing Master and District Maintenance Officer shall normally represent the District on the Guild Management, Recruitment and Training, and Restoration and Maintenance Committees respectively but substitutes may be permitted. One other representative to each of the Guild Committees shall be elected. The District Officers and one elected member from each deanery shall form the District Committee. A District may elect additional working Officers at its discretion to assist the running of the District.
- 20. The District Secretary/Treasurer shall collect all subscriptions and other monies due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer. A statement of accounts shall be submitted to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January. A Directory of tower correspondants, lists of members and ringing times shall be submitted to the Secretary by 15th January.
- 21. The District Maintenance Officer shall endeavour to arrange for the inspection of every belfry in the district at least once a year and shall report his findings to the Restoration and Maintenance Committee at their January meeting. He shall be available to advise incumbents and shall provide leadership at local working parties where necessary.
- 22. The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.
- 23. The District Committee shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.

Regulations relating to the Pearson's Handbells.

- 1. The Pearson Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustees. They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

2. The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustees by the borrower, and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustees if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the proceeding borrower.
3. The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustees by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of both of the Trustees.
4. The bells must be returned to the Trustees upon request. The Trustees should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
5. If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
6. The Trustees are responsible to the Committee of the Guild for the administration of the bells, and their decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by the committee.
7. The Trustees and the Committee of the Guild would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy Striking Competitions Rules.

1. The competitions shall take place on the third Saturday in May or on any other date decided by the Guild Management Committee.
2. All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
3. No Member may ring more than once in the Rose competition, except as specified in Rule 10.
4. Representative bands shall consist of:
 - (a) The Mitson Shield. Six ringers of which at least four are shown in the Annual Report as members of that tower. All six ringers are to be bona fide Ringers at that tower.
 - (b) The Rose Trophy. Eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of which at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
5. Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by any band not complying with the previous Rule.
6. Each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw. The times of the draws to be advertised in the 'Ringing World'.
7. A total of two minutes practice ringing and stand will be allowed before each test piece.
8. The test piece will be:
 - (a) The Mitson Shield. 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor Method(s).
 - (b) The Rose Trophy. At least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s). In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used. For the Rose Trophy only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
9. The length of either test piece may be shortened at the discretion of the Ringing Master in the event of a large entry.
10. A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available to bands meeting short, at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
11. A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
12. The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
13. Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
