

Guild Officers' Reports

Ringing Master

David Salter

Another very busy year in ringing in Suffolk. Once again there has been a huge amount going on and it is very encouraging to see the emergence of new bands, new ringers and new ideas on how we should be doing things.

The Striking competitions were held this year at Tunstall and Hollesley. Good decisive wins were again notched up in both competitions by the St Mary-le-Tower band. If only all the teams entering worked hard at achieving the very best on the day, the results may, indeed could be different, and the result would be more in the balance. Let us not forget, the winners are there to be beaten, and that is what we should be looking at doing. That way we all should learn and improve. There was no "Call Change Competition" this year due to lack of support in the past but the Recruitment & Training committee are looking at some other form of competition to use the Lester Brett Bell for. What about a Knock Out?

As is widely known, I am not an outing fan, but again I really enjoyed the Guild Outing to North Essex. Saffron Walden, Bocking, Coggeshall and Felstead were amongst the towers visited, with some very good ringing and good company. This year's will be to Kings Lynn, so if you are looking for a good day out book the date.

One event that is always a treat is Veterans' Day. A large collection of ringers old and young gathered at Debenham for a most agreeable afternoon. As usual Muriel and her team put on an excellent do. A village local asked me what was going on. When I explained, he said he could tell they must be veteran ringers as the bells sounded better than usual!

Training Day was again held at Kettleburgh. Again we suffered from a lack of helpers and a change of attitude is needed. After all, we need trained ringers and it is not much to ask, giving up one day to help with their tuition. Those who did attend hopefully learnt a great deal, not least that they were not the only ones in this position. Whilst there are no dedicated District training days the Guild event remains the main focus of training and as such must be supported by those who can.

Disappointingly the Carol Service at Coddenham was poorly attended. Nonetheless, those who did attend enjoyed a simple act of worship and the warm welcome of the Coddenham ringers, tea and goodies.

Of course the Guild 75th Anniversary dinner was one of the best ever. A splendid evening was had by 70 members and friends at the Athenaeum, Bury St Edmunds. The food, hot and plentiful, was supplied by Daisy Catering and the entertainment by Jane Wilkinson, Andrew Wilby and Phil Gay. It was a great honour to have the sitting President of the Central Council attend, and she spoke forcefully of the role we as ringers have to play in the church. Andrew Wilby was, it turned out, much more controversial and his thought provoking comments spilled into the Ringing World, giving us great publicity. Phil Gay spoke fondly of his associations with Suffolk and of the many friends Suffolk Ringers have throughout the country. From the home side, Lawrence Pizzey, Stephen Young and myself responded. Lawrence replied on behalf of the church, Stephen eloquently welcomed the guests and I spoke of the history and achievements of the Guild. All in all a wonderful evening full of occasion.

The following day five past masters and myself assembled at Ashbocking and rang a peal for the 75th anniversary. As with the night before, a true occasion. A peal board marking this historic occasion and paid for by the Masters now hangs in the tower.

In May, I assembled a band for a quarter at the Norman Tower. The band represented the four Districts of the Guild and rang a very good quarter of Yorkshire Surprise Royal, prior to the moving service at which George Pipe was installed as an honorary Canon of the cathedral. I said at the time that we had every reason to be very proud of George and I repeat that here. George was honoured for what he has done for the church and ringing and for what the church believes he still has to offer. His lifelong example and tireless efforts to ensure that ringing is recognised as part of the church and that the church recognises ringers is an example we should all follow. It is not that many years ago that our objects included the promotion of the Christian faith and values and maybe we should reinstate it.

On the Recruitment & Training front, we now have two simulators for Guild members' use. If you get the chance to try one, then jump at it. They are not panaceas but a modern tool to help us all improve. We held seminars on "Teaching Safely" and "Teaching Teachers", but perhaps the best event was the "Handling" evening we had at Halesworth. Within a few minutes the ringing improved, just as a result of a few simple corrections. We also published notes on good striking, handling, progressing and method learning, all of which should be of assistance to all, not just the beginner.

Ringing at Frank Price's continues apace, but now with 10 bells, the two new trebles being added last autumn. If you have not yet rung here then you are missing a treat. I have learnt so much about striking, rhythm and compass since I have been going there which of course carries through to bigger bells and is invaluable education. That coupled with the warmth of the welcome from Frank & Sheila makes ringing at Mindinho a real treat.

On the peal front it has again been a quiet year, but nowhere near as bad as Essex or Norfolk. The total of 98 shows hope, for, after all, peal ringing is the goal for all ringers and is the accepted summit of the art of change ringing. On the down side, there are still the same few conductors and again I would plead with you all to encourage new blood in this most important branch of our art. Special mention of the efforts of George Pipe, for the series of 12-bell peals at St Mary-le-Tower, to have rung the seven "Ipswich" methods in the course of the year is exceptional. Of course we all would have liked to have been included in all of them, but the bands were well spread across the Guild, showing that we do have a depth of 12-bell ringers in the county. Brian Whiting's Little methods attempts have also been very successful, and to my surprise quite enjoyable. It would be a shame if these methods get lost in the depths of the method library, so if you have not rung them, look them up and give them a go.

Needless to say the Aldeburgh band again scored heavily, notching up 10 peals in 8 different Major methods forwardly extending the challengers of methods to be rung.

There were 15 methods new to the Guild, which again shows a good variety of interest.

So where do we stand now at the end of five years? Well, I believe that the Guild is in good shape. There are lots of good people doing invaluable work progressing our art and, if we persist, then the art will have a secure future. We must however continue to try to improve standards. What is rung in the county is often far removed from what it should sound and be like. The view that "if at first you do not succeed, redefine success" must be firmly displaced and we must do more to encourage the young, particularly in conducting and composing. We must try to give opportunities to all, not just the select few friends, so as to try to improve the overall scene. As I said at the dinner, we must encourage those who can to impart their knowledge to improvers before those who can not do. That way we will pass on the correct information or ideals.

In the course of five years I have visited many practices within the Guild, and attended 80% of district meetings. The welcomes I have received have been tremendous and I thank everybody for that. I have listened to what the average member has had to say and tried in my own way to action their views. There is a divergence of what the average member believes and what Guild Management thinks. This gap is narrowing and must I believe be eradicated for the good of the Guild. It is wrong to impose the views of the densest ringers on the whole Guild and hopefully more account of the average member will in future be taken.


On the training front we must stop accepting mediocrity and mediocre performance. This may not be popular, but it is better to be unpopular than wrong and I hope that in the past five years I have gone some way towards that ideal.

Personally, I have enjoyed being the ninth Guild Master and only the fourth to have been born and bred in the county. There have been some wonderful times and some not so good ones. I hope I have been of some use to all the members I have come across, I hope that some of my enthusiasm for ringing has rubbed off. I know my life has been enriched by the experience. I accept that some things I have done may not have been popular, but the job has to be done as the holder sees it and until you have experienced it, it is very difficult to understand the day to day problems.

I feel, as Roy Jenkins, that I am going to enjoy being an ex-master, just as much as doing the job.

I cannot conclude without thanks, firstly to all members who over the last few years, have supported the Guild and Guild events. I must thank those few ringers (they know who they are) who at the mention of a training event offer to help. I must thank all Guild Officers and District officials who have helped out in many many ways and I must thank my close ringing friends for support, help and advice, even when not requested. In many ways their support has been crucial.

And finally, I must record my very grateful thanks to Katharine, whose assistance over the last five years, has vastly exceeded what I could reasonably expect from wifely duties and has been invaluable in helping me function as Master.



Meetings of the Management Committee this year have been dominated with matters concerning the organisation of the Guild and its finances. Besides the normal triannual meetings there have been several more called by the Management Committee and others to discuss the future, brainstorm the way forward, review the options and devise action plans. The first stage of a possible plan was put to the AGM in the form of propositions for some revolutionary changes to the Guild Rules and Constitution. Some were agreed, but others were referred to the Management Committee for further consideration.

The AGM was held this year at Stowmarket as guests of the NW District. The attendance was again disappointing, with only 66 Members attending. Considering the alleged discontent over the state of the Guild one would have thought that Members would have turned out in droves to rectify the situation. Perhaps the rank and file are indeed satisfied with the status quo! Significant motions passed at this AGM included one to require subscription to be paid by 31st March of the year in which they become due and one to permit the Chairman, Master, Secretary and Treasurer to remain in office for a maximum of five years. This latter motion could produce some interesting elections in 1999. However a motion to drastically reduce the size of the Management Committee did not get overwhelming support and was sent back to the Committee for further consideration.

A happy event at the AGM was the presentation of two glass tumblers and a book of "Pub Walks" made to Rev Lawrence Pizzey by the Ringing Master on behalf of the Guild, thanking him for his sixteen years of service as Chairman of the Guild, following on from five years as Secretary and seven years as Ringing Master. Rev Pizzey had earlier announced that, due to an increase in his work for the Church, he would not be seeking re-election as Chairman. His input to the Guild Management Committee will be greatly missed, but fortunately he agreed to continue as one of its representatives on the Central Council. The new Chairman, elected by the AGM, is Mr Brian Whiting.

At the AGM two Members were awarded Honorary Life Membership by the Guild in gratitude of many years of service given by them in promoting the work of the Guild. They were Rev Lawrence Pizzey and Mr George Pipe.

The Guild has continued to support bell restoration projects, with grants being offered to Little Thurlow, Carnpsea Ashe and Old Newton, and it awaits the completion of the major restoration projects at Orford and Hacheston. Unfortunately it has proved necessary to close down "Friends of Suffolk Bells" (FOSB). During its time FOSB has raised a significant amount of money for bell restoration in Suffolk, but in recent years support for it has dwindled, with few people feeling willing or able to operate the scheme. With the main source of income for the Bell Restoration Fund now being from members' subscriptions it is all the more important that membership be maintained, or better still increased, if the Guild is to remain able to support restoration projects in the future.

Now that the Guild has passed its 75th anniversary, the next major event that it can look forward to will be in 2000 when we will be hosting the annual general meeting of the Central Council of Church Bellringers. Already a small, dedicated group of our members have got together to plan for the event, which will take place over the weekend of the Spring Bank Holiday in that year. Please give them your support so that we in Suffolk can give our ringing colleagues from the rest of the world a really warm welcome.

This will be my last report as secretary as, under the new Rules, because I have now served in this office

for ten years, I have passed my sell-by date twice over. It has been an interesting ten years and I am pleased to have had the opportunity to serve the Guild in this way. I have witnessed quite a few changes, and I am sure there are more to come. I hope my successor, whoever he or she may be, will have an equally enjoyable term of office.

1998 has seen another increase in the use of the library and borrowers have included those wanting to update their peal records by perusing past copies of The Ringing World (the library has copies going back to 1952), people who want 'a good read' and those keen to improve their ringing or conducting skills. The videos of ringing in Northern Italy have also been very popular, and two students of the Italian language have found the booklets on Italian bells and bellringing in the library of use in their studies. In addition to borrowers, the library has also been used as a source of information and enquiries have included those from ringers researching the history of ringing in their towers.

It is good, therefore, that the library continues to grow due to the generosity of ringers in donating items of interest. In addition to a growing collection of videos and audio-tapes, the library now has its first CD, 'Campane a testa', which is a recording of ringing in the Province of Bologna and Modena in Italy.

Each year I like to recommend a book newly acquired by the library, and this year it is 'Suffolk's Churches Great and Small'. While not strictly a ringing book, it is a most attractive publication with beautiful photographs by Richard Tilbrook and excellent descriptions of the churches, by Roy Tricker and George Pipe. George has also included some information about towers and bells. This is a book to browse through, to admire the architecture, exquisite woodwork, and fascinating historical detail of our most lovely Suffolk Churches.

So please do use the library, whether for information for a project for school or university, or for a tape to listen to in the car as you drive to work, or to borrow Dove to find information on practice nights when planning your next holiday. The library is here and you are welcome to use it.

The new Belfry Advisory Committee, which replaced the former Restoration and Maintenance Committee, first met during January 1998 and the increased membership has already proved to be of great benefit and is providing a wider range of abilities, contacts and experience. The approach of the year 2000 has produced an upsurge of restoration and maintenance and it is stretching our resources to the limit. I am grateful for the support and interest shown, not only by the Committee but by many other ringers (and non-ringers as well) to keep our bells in order and to work towards the glorious prospect of bells again sounding from previously silent towers.

It is vitally important, however, that a close eye is kept on the various working parts of all installations, particularly now that those peals of bells which have been silent for some time or are only used infrequently may well be suddenly pressed into action. It concerns me also that peals may be attempted on such bells. Some of our time-expired installations must not under any circumstances be rung full circle and even chiming may be too risky, but there are others which can be rung and perhaps even pealed if they are carefully checked and any problems resolved. However, the organiser of such ringing must be responsible enough to ensure that sufficient work is carried out on the bells beforehand to ensure that they will stand up to the ringing. All that has to be done is to ask if you are not sure. Even with bells which are rung regularly it is quite common to visit a tower where the bells are on plain bearings, only to find that those bearings are bone dry, and the 'go' of the bells is suffering as a result. Often the bells do not 'feel' right and are patently loose, frequently on the headstock or else the single bolted and hooped gudgeons have developed some movement. We are told that they do 'lump a bit' or one or more are difficult to ring!

Even new installations (contrary to what I have sometimes heard) are not 'maintenance free' but require regular checking and attention and it is always best to appoint one of the ringers to be a steeple keeper, with the responsibility of making regular visits to the bell chamber to locate and identify potential problems. Often it happens that knowledge of bells and their gear is limited at a particular tower. If so, then members of the Committee will be more than pleased to come along and advise, and it is surprising how soon the mechanics become second knowledge and, believe me, when something untoward is identified, it is very satisfying to know that it has been sorted out and that the bells are safe and working properly. If there is enough interest I will be more than pleased to arrange workshops and seminars for people to learn about routine bell maintenance.

The above is designed to serve as a warning, and is not in any way directed at the towers where a great deal of care is taken and it is such a pleasure to be allowed to ring on bells which are well looked after and lovingly cared for. Unfortunately, this is often the exception.

It is a great pleasure to report that the number of Affiliation Scheme member Churches continues to grow steadily all the time, standing at around 60 at the moment. The Guild is extremely grateful for their collective support for the Restoration Fund and it would be great if we could reach the milestone of 100 members before too much longer. Perhaps the 100th member could be given free membership for the first year. If your Church/tower does not belong, please do consider joining this worthwhile scheme (there are some notable towers in Suffolk who still do not appear in the list!)

Maintenance Report

North-East District

At **MENDHAM** (6, 12 cwt) it was reported that things are generally in poor order. Work on the tower and frame at **STRADBROKE** (10, 20cwt) is now complete and the bells have been pealed. The frame at **WILBY** (8, 15cwt) has been painted and everything looks really clean. The tenor at **BRUNDISH** is cracked and needs to be removed and welded. A peal was rung at **THORNHAM MAGNA** (6, 9 cwt) to mark the 75th anniversary of the first peal for the Suffolk Guild which took place at this tower and was only possible following much work on the bells by the Guild maintenance team. **BEDFIELD** (6, 9cwt) have received attention including tightening and general overhaul.

North-West District

Interest has been shown at MARKET WESTON (5, 16cwt) in repairing the wooden frame which has rotted badly in one corner due to water entering the tower via a faulty drainage system. The bells are not safe to ring whilst the frame remains in this condition. Work at HOPTON-BY-THETFORD (6, 10cwt) to re-hang the two trebles in a new steel frame was finished in late 1998. A possibility of ringing the bells at HEPWORTH (5, 7cwt) depends on the integrity of the tower which has to be determined first. At GREAT ASHFIELD (5, 7cwt), following the installation of a new ringing gallery, new guides and pullies were fitted by the maintenance team. Following earlier drilling of the tenor crown and adding new metalwork to support a cracked canon the bells have been pealed and are now easy to ring. The two trebles at ERISWELL (5, 3cwt) which were loose on their respective headstocks have been re-packed and tightened and new terylene top ends spliced on to all five ropes. A new bearing has been fitted to the north side of the treble at STOWMARKET (8, 20cwt) and sound flaps installed on the south and east louvres to allow the bells to be heard more clearly when needed.

Work has been carried out on the bells at **BARDWELL** (6, 11cwt) where the bells can be rung for short periods of time on special occasions only. The tower and turret have been repaired but the way that the bells are hung, their condition and their sheer height in the tower unfortunately means that ringing must be restricted. At the request of the Parish **GREAT LIVERMERE** (5, 5cwt) has been visited to look at the possibility of ringing from the ground floor. It has been suggested that a ringing gallery would be a possible way forward. At **FINNINGHAM** (3, 7cwt) new stays have been fitted, replacement ropes and new rope bosses installed and following tightening and overhauling the bells have been rung full circle. **HESSETT** (5, 14cwt) were tightened and checked and at **COTTON** (8, 10cwt) the two-tier metal rope guide assemblies were de-rusted and painted with Hammerite. Various oak bosses were also replaced at the same time. Work has commenced by the maintenance team at **OLD NEWTON** (8cwt 5) where the cracked treble has now been welded and drilled for a new independent clapper. This bell, a Derby, has proved to be of really good tone and work on the other 4 bells will start during 1999 to improve the peal so that they can be rung full circle after nearly a century of chiming.

THURSTON (5, 11cwt) have shown an interest in restoring the ring (advanced soundbow wear and many other problems exist) and it has been agreed to carry out the necessary work on the single 2 cwt 'Oliver' bell hung for chiming at **STOWUPLAND** where a new headstock, clapper, bearings and associated items will have to fitted once the crown staple has been drilled out. Bells by this founder are extremely rare and this is the only example in Suffolk. A request has been made for **WETHERINGSETT** (5, 16cwt) to be checked and tightened.

South-Fast District

At EASTON (6, 12cwt) it was decided to go ahead with re-furbishing the support beams and headstocks and other work but the hoped-for Millenium grant has failed. The bells have all been lifted and the bearings cleaned at STUTTON (6, 11cwt) and at ST CLEMENT'S, IPSWICH (6, 15cwt) there has been liaison to try and prevent future problems over the proximity of some 90 flats which have been built near the Church. Advice has been given at HARKSTEAD (6, 9cwt) and at RUSHMERE ST ANDREW (6, 8cwt), following a complaint, advice was sought on sound proofing and plans were drawn up by the maintenance team, but this is not going ahead. It has been reported that there are tower problems at WICKHAM MARKET (6, 12cwt) and a request to chime the bells at ST MARY AT ELMS, IPSWICH (5, 9cwt) has met with the response that these bells are in poor order and this might not be wise. Terylene top ends have been fitted at TUNSTALL (6, 7cwt) but the guides are grooved and need attention. A request for advice at BADINGHAM (5, 8cwt) has been received, and MARTLESHAM (1631 Miles Graye 3 - swing chimed) has been visited.

South-West District

At **BILDESTON** (6, 16cwt) the incomplete roof resulted in water ingress. The 4th tended to slip wheel as a result. A loose collar on the independent staple on the 5th has been cured and negotiations are taking place to provide a permanent ladder to gain access to the bells. The ringers at **MONKS ELEIGH** (6, 16cwt) are concerned about the central void in the ringing chamber and a floor has now been installed under the bells. Badly worn ground pullies and a problem with the tenor clapper have been resolved at **POLSTEAD** (6, 9cwt) and an approach has been made to the PCC at **WOOLPIT** (6, 8cwt) to agree to soundproofing the louvres. At **DRINKSTONE** (6, 10cwt) the bells are reported as not in good order and bearings are believed loose on two of the bells.

Guild Technical Adviser

Michael Rolph

1998 has been a fairly quiet year on my part, with only the augmentation of Metfield's recently restored ring of four to six requiring David's and my attention for grant approval.

However there are several projects which are due for completion in 1999, namely Campsea Ashe, Hacheston, Iken and Orford.

Campsea Ashe: The cracked 2nd has been welded and the frame strengthened. Work should be complete early in the new year.

Hacheston: Work is to start early in the new year with the removal of the bells to Soundweld, etc. Completion is set for later in the year. I understand that Hayward Mills & Associates are to do the work.

Iken: The bells are to be augmented from four to five.

Orford: A light ring of eight is being installed in the existing clock chamber using the front four of the existing five plus four new bells from Eijsbouts in Holland. The existing tenor is to be hung for chiming. Work here is also due to be completed this coming year.

Other work carried out during the year in which I was personally involved includes:

Bardwell: Here a test ring was carried out after some work had recently been done. Although the bells were reasonably easy to ring, it was felt that the state of the tower was not good enough to allow ringing

on a regular basis. However, with the guidance of the church architect and Diocesan Bell Adviser it was agreed to allow limited ringing for special occasions only.

Finningham: A new floor has been installed under the bellframe, together with new louvres in the tower. New rope bosses, new stays and secondhand ropes have been fitted. The three bells are now in ringable order and go guite well.

Blythburgh: The tenor clapper was replaced after its crownstaple nuts came adrift. All the other clappers were checked and tightened. The bells remain in excellent order.

This is probably my last year as your Technical Adviser, due to family and other commitments I am finding it increasingly difficult to devote as much time as I would like. I have enjoyed serving the Guild in this post for the past seven years and subject to the membership's approval I would like to hand over the reins to Alan Moult. Alan lives in Woolpit and prior to moving to Suffolk he used to work for Eayre and Smith. He has considerable knowledge of bells and fittings etc. and I am sure he will be a worthy successor. I shall continue my post as North East District Maintenance Officer and continue to serve on the Belfry Advisory Committee

The number of peals rung by the Guild was 98, the second year in succession that we have just failed to reach the 100 mark. However it is encouraging to see the extent of new methods rung for the Guild and the count of peals of Surprise on all numbers. It is good to see the new efforts being made in the Little Surprise Major field and in the peals of Maximus at Ipswich. Let's hope the enthusiasm of certain individuals will continue as this is essential to the furtherance of our art.

Peals were rung in 50 Suffolk towers (and 4 towers outside the county, although not all by substantially Suffolk bands). The first peal on the bells was rung at Falkenham, and the centenary of the first peals were commemorated at Hawkedon and Stradishall by repeating the peals rung in 1898. Rare visitors to the peal columns include Eye, Thurston and Stradishall, the latter having last been pealed 23 years ago.

Obituaries (1998)

George P Adams - East Dereham & Harleston

George was a life member of our Guild and of course a life long member of the Norwich Diocesan Association. What a lovely man he was, gentle in manner, meticulous in his ringing and rightly proud of Dereham bells. Like a true East Anglian he loved his Superlative and Double Norwich. We shall miss him at the Debenham Veterans!

Cecil Ainger - Bramfield

Like many another in the Halesworth area, Cecil was taught by Fred Lambert and never forgot the Recruiting Sergeant. Farming at Spexhall (a "Northern Farmer") he moved south to Bramfield and served that community, strong Christian as he was, for many years. A keen teacher, he spent many an hour explaining the mysteries of Doubles and Minor. The Deanery will miss him especially.

Alan R Andrews - Thorrington, Essex

It would be very easy to overlook the quiet and modest Alan in a crowd, his deafness an awful handicap. But here was an exceptionally gifted ringer, beautiful striker and handler on any number of bells, Doubles to Surprise Maximus. And one of those ringers who could just take up where they left off after any length of time.

Alan served North-East Essex well and loved Suffolk where he was a member too. Fortunately for us he leaves a ringing family and we remember him with enormous affection.

Thomas Cornish

Tom was a call-change ringer at Saxmundham and Kelsale from the 1950's, originally taught by the Leiston men before the war. A bricklayer by trade he also combined his ringing with bowls, perhaps remembering that the great Charles F Bailey was a Suffolk champion.

Edwin A Cracknell - Buxhall

Ted was a well known and greatly respected ringer in our Guild and, especially before the war prior to his illness, a fine heavy bell ringer too, turning in Stonham Aspal and Stowmarket tenors. He was a member of Harry Lister's band, no mean performers, with names like Garnham Blaxcell, Arthur Grimwood and Shelford Sparrow coming to mind.

But Ted's first love was fine striking, whether it was Bob Minor or Treble Ten and everything in between. No matter what the occasion, there would be 110% effort at the end of his rope! He will be greatly missed especially in West Suffolk and it is good that a peal board honours his memory in Stowmarket belfry.

Beatrice Eleanor Farrow - Clacton on Sea

Eleanor Reeve, as we knew her, was a member of that gallant "band of ladies from St. Matthew's'" (Ipswich). Coming up from Buckinghamshire in 1930, she, with sister Bertha - we seem to just remember Christian names - Mollie, Sylvia, Mary and others, were a popular group between 1934 and 1939 under the patient tutelage of Fred Bowell, Cecil Aldous and others from the six bell trio of St Clement's, St. Matthew's and Rushmere. They did much to establish, with Daisy Andrews, Hilda Snowdon and Mrs Leslie Wright, ladies' ringing in the Suffolk Guild.

Leslie N Melton - Pakenham, Ipswich and London

If Les had lived in Australia he might have been dubbed The Wild Colonial Boy! This loveable man combined skill and ability in his ringing and conducting with a somewhat enigmatic style and a dash of the outrageous.

He started ringing in the middle fifties and up to 1965 was a prolific peal ringer and conductor, a go-anywhere enthusiast. Things were never dull when Leslie was around. One peal stands out in my mind when he rang Woodbridge tenor immaculately to Double Norwich in 1963, with an untucked rope.

Mabel Parker - Stonham Aspal

Dear Mabel, wife and supporter of Russell her husband, who suffered badly at Japanese hands. In later years she was always cheerfully helping, serving teas at Stonham Aspal, Debenham and elsewhere. We miss her as we do Russell and his brother Herbie.

Robert Southgate - Bramford and USA

One of the success stories of post-war Guild activities was the Bramford band of the sixties and early seventies. A whole ruck (as Bill Kinsey would say) of talented boys and girls of whom Robert was outstanding. They were keen, my word they were. Winners, too, of the striking competition, they combined tower bells with hand bell ringing, outings, events and all with a lot of fun.

We are so sad that Robert was taken from us at 52 but the packed church at his funeral was testimony enough.

Norman Summerhayes - Egham, Surrey

Norman was one of nature's gentlemen, a fine ringer, family man, and Guild officer, staunch Cumberland and many things besides. Perhaps his biggest contribution was his tireless efforts to bring together the London County, the College Youths and the Society of Royal Cumberland Youths.

Norman was a life member and his love of Suffolk went back to the time when he worked down at Dartford with James E Bailey of Leiston. Theirs was a lifetime friendship and he never forgot it. In later years with Joan (neé Beresford) his wife, he did much for Surrey ringing. To see Norman on the 9th in a piece of twelve bell ringing one knew the roll-ups would be good.

Dinah, Lady Tollemache - Helmingham

The Dowager Lady always took an interest in bells and loved to hear Helmingham on a Sunday morning or to a peal. Perhaps her late husband had told her that his kinsman had paid for Helmingham's new ring in 1815

Arthur Woods - Bredfield

There are hundreds of ringers like Arthur up and down the land, loyal, local, willing to give a hand, part of the 'warp and weft' of parish life. Not headline makers but 'there', sounding out God's message Sunday by Sunday. We are thankful for them.



The Suffolk Guild of Ringers

Objects, Constitution and Rules

Apr 20 Guild Annual General Meeting

Objects

The Guild shall be established for the promotion of ringing for Divine Service and in furtherance of this object:

South West District

- 1 To promote and encourage the practice of bellringing.
- 2 To recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art.
- 3 To cultivate the art of scientific ringing.
- 4 To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof, as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of the bells and their fittings.

Constitution

A Name

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - a It shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and registered as a Charity at Law. (Ref.266869)
 - b The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there shall be Patrons. Vice-Presidents shall be elected at the AGM of the Guild.

B Membership

2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:

- a Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds efficiently on a tower bell.
- b Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
- c Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
- d Non-Resident Life Member: A person who is qualified to be a Ringing Member or Associate Member, but who resides outside the territory of the Guild and who is not a member under either 2a. 2b or 2c.
- 3 Ringing and Life Honorary Members only shall have voting rights and be permitted to hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C Districts

- 5 There shall be four Districts:
 - 1 North East District consisting of the deaneries of Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
 - 2 North West District consisting of the deaneries of Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
 - 3 South East District consisting of the deaneries of Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
 - 4 South West District consisting of the deaneries of Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. Government

- The Annual General Meeting of the Guild shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as shall be decided by the Guild Management Committee and shall be the ultimate decision-making body of the Guild. It shall elect Guild Officers and set subscriptions and fees for the following year.
- Members shall be elected to fill the following Offices: Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, Maintenance Officer, Report Editor, Newsletter Editor, Central Council Representatives, Technical Adviser, Librarian, Handbell Trustees, Peal Secretary and any other such Officers as the Guild Management Committee shall see fit to approve.
- 8 In order that the Guild be run efficiently and its objects implemented there shall be three Committees established with the following responsibilities:
 - a The Guild Management Committee which shall co-ordinate all Guild activities; publish a printed Annual Report and audited Accounts and convene Sub-Committees as may from time to time be required, and shall recommend the levels of subscriptions and peal fees and other methods of raising money and shall organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.
 - b Recruitment and Training Committee which shall prepare training programmes for use in the Districts, provide courses for the training of teachers of ringing and assist Districts in the recruitment of Ringers.
 - c Belfry Advisory Committee which shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese, which shall make recommendations concerning the preservation and use of bells from redundant churches, which shall advise incumbents and arrange such local restoration and maintenance work as may be necessary.

E. Finance

- 9a All money in any of the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the Guild Management Committee.
- 9b All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, the Secretary or the Treasurer and any cheque greater than the value of the limit set by the Guild Management Committee shall bear the signatures of two of the three signatories.

- 10a The expenses listed in Rule D14 shall be paid out of the General Fund together with other payments in furtherance of the Guild's objectives as shall be specifically authorised by the Guild Management Committee.
- 10b The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells, etc and the capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 10c Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the Guild Management Committee but shall only be paid following the approval of the work by the Guild Ringing Master and a technical adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full circle ringing, but may in addition include other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 10d The monies in the St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used, as required, for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to the St Peter's bells and fittings as authorised by the Guild Management Committee.
- 10e The monies in the Library Fund shall be used, as required, for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 10f The monies in the Handbell Fund shall be used, as required, for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells, as authorised by the Guild Management Committee.
- 10g The Guild Management Committee may, from time to time, establish further funds and shall at that time specify the aims and objectives of the new funds.
- 10h The Guild Management Committee may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 11 At least half of all peal fees and subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members, together with all the Non-Resident Life Membership fees, shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F Records and Handbells

- 12 The Report Editor shall record all peals rung for the Guild and Quarter Peals rung in the Diocese and publish them in the Annual Report.
- 13 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
- 14 The Handbell Trustees shall maintain the Handbells in good condition and shall make such recommendations as may be necessary for the repair of the handbells to the Guild Management Committee.

G General

- 15 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.
- 16 The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of the members present at an Annual or Special General Meeting provided that 14 days notice of the proposed amendment has been published in The Ringing World or in the Guild Newsletter and provided that nothing herein contained shall authorise any amendment which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 17 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

Rules

Guild Rules

A Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded. Membership shall be exercised through only one District at a time, normally being the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report. Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter in advance on the first day of January each year. Membership shall cease if they are not paid by 31st March of the year in which they become due.
- 2 The subscription rates for members shall be fixed at the Annual General Meeting and unless a change is agreed the existing rate shall continue. Persons in full time education and members over the age of 65 shall pay a reduced rate of subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members shall only be elected at an Annual General Meeting and nominations may only be made by the Guild Management Committee or District. No further subscription is payable after election.
- Persons who have been Ringing Members or Associate Members for at least two years may, upon leaving the Diocese, inform their District Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence. A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Member as an alternative to Ringing or Associate Membership.
- For the purposes of peal ringing new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry to the appropriate category of membership subject to the confirmation at a business meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the Guild Management Committee in the case of a Non-Resident Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 6 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the Guild Management Committee which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

B Election of Officers

- 7 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's Annual General Meeting but shall be eligible for re-election but the Chairman, Ringing Master, General Secretary and Treasurer may not hold a given office for more than five consecutive years. However they will become eligible to hold that office again after one year out of that office.
 - Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the Annual General Meeting provided always that they are proposed and seconded. If more than one nomination for any office is received then election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote. Central Council Representatives shall be elected in accordance with the rules of the Central Council during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.
- 8 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Auditor who is not a member of the Guild Management Committee and need not be a member of the Guild.

C Committee Structure

- The Guild Management Committee shall consist of: Vice Presidents, Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer, Technical Adviser, Public Relations Officer, Maintenance Officer, two elected representatives from each district and such Guild Officers as may be from time to time required or invited to attend. Six members shall constitute a quorum. The Committee shall meet at least three times per year. The Chairman shall take the chair at all meetings of the Guild and Guild Management Committee. In his absence the Chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two Representatives from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee shall consist of the Guild Maintenance Officer as Convenor, Guild Technical Adviser and the members of this committee.
- 12 Each of the above two Committees shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 a The Chairman, Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Maintenance Officer shall form the Guild Executive. In the event of a Guild Office being vacated between AGMs they shall make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened.
 - b The Guild Management Committee may convene such sub-committees as it deems necessary from time to time and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committee shall be reported back to the Guild Management Committee as soon as possible.

D Expenses

- 14 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - a The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the Guild Management Committee.
 - b The expenses of Guild Meetings.
 - c Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - d Insurance of Guild property.
 - e Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the Guild Management Committee.
 - f Such other expenses as the Guild Management Committee may determine.

F Peal Records

- 15 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 16 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - a The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Members elected in the belfry.
 - b The appropriate peal fees.
 - c Compositions for peals of Triples and above and compositions of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items 16a and 16b shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

F Alteration of Rules

17 No alteration or addition shall be made to the Rules of the Guild except as specified in paragraphs 16

and 17 of the Constitution.

District Rules:

- 18 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purposes of receiving a report from the District Committee for the previous year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the coming year. Members shall be eligible to vote or stand for office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 19 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer; District Belfry Advisor; Newsletter Correspondent. The Chairman, Ringing Master and District Belfry Advisor shall normally represent the District on the Guild Management, Recruitment and Training, and Belfry Advisory Committees respectively but substitutes may be permitted. One other representative to each of the Guild Committees shall be elected. The District Officers and one elected member from each deanery shall form the District Committee. A District may elect additional working Officers at its discretion to assist the running of the District.
- 20 The District Secretary/Treasurer shall collect all subscriptions and other monies due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer. A statement of accounts shall be submitted to the Guild Treasurer by 15th.January. A Directory of tower correspondents, lists of members and ringing times shall be submitted to the Secretary by 15th January.
- 21 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.
- 22 The District Committee shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.

Regulations relating to the Pearson's Handbells:

- 1 The Pearson Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustees. They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
- 2. The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustees by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustees if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceeding borrower.
- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustees by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of both of the Trustees.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustees upon request. The Trustees should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- The Trustees are responsible to the Committee of the Guild for the administration of the bells and their decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by the committee.
- 7 The Trustees and the Committee of the Guild would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy Striking Competitions Rules:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on the third Saturday in May or on any other date decided by the Guild Management Committee.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 No Member may ring more than once in the Rose competition, except as specified in Rule 10.
- 4 Representative bands shall consist of:
 - a The Mitson Shield. Six ringers of which at least four are shown in the Annual Report as members of that tower. All six ringers are to be bona fide Ringers at that tower.
 - b The Rose Trophy. Eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of which at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 5 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by any band not complying with the previous Rule.
- 6 Each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw. The times of the draws to be advertised in the 'Ringing World'.
- 7 A total of two minutes practice ringing and stand will be allowed before each test piece.
- 8 The test piece will be:
 - a The Mitson Shield. 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor Method(s).
 - b The Rose Trophy. At least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s). In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used. For the Rose Trophy only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 9 The length of either test piece may be shortened at the discretion of the Ringing Master in the event of a large entry.
- 10 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available to bands meeting short, at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
- 11 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.


