Guild Officers' Reports

Ringing Master

Stephen Pettman

It was with some trepidation that I embarked on a second term of office with two major events in the next twelve months, namely the Millennium ringing and the Central Council visit next May. However, it has been an enjoyable eight months with the majority of my "official engagements" approving grants at various towers following restorations.

It has been a good year for restorations, with some of our long term unringables getting new life. I suspect that we are now making some inroads into our unacceptably high percentage of unringables. A personal plea to those arranging dedications - please avoid Sunday mornings. I am not prepared to attend if it conflicts with my own service ringing but it is also disappointing to miss out on these wonderful occasions.

1999 saw the conclusion of the rules debate. Hopefully this saga is over for at least a few years. I look forward to a more diverse Management Committee, which will hopefully be more meaningful to the membership.

Looking back at Guild events, there were some disappointments but also some encouraging signs.

Striking Competitions - 15 May 1999.

The six-bell was held on the recently restored ring at Bildeston. Although there were only six teams taking part, an enjoyable afternoon was spent listening to this fine six. Congratulations to St Mary-le-Tower on winning in fine style and my thanks to the other five teams for a spirited challenge - Hopton & Hinderclay, Kersey, Pettistree, Rattlesden & Woolpit and Sproughton. The eight bell was held in the evening at Boxford, again recently restored. St. Mary-le-Tower again collected the trophy beating the three district teams able to enter.

It would be more encouraging to see more teams taking part, particularly in the six bell competition but I question whether a Saturday afternoon in May is really the best time. My own band were unable to enter because of a wedding. I suspect that other towers had similar problems. Perhaps another summer evening would enable more teams to compete. Although striking competitions should be taken seriously, I see the main point is to have a fun time out with as many other ringers as possible. It is a good day out and a chance to hear some good ringing and also to get some sound advice from the tactful judges. The judges this year will be Amanda Richmond and Simon Rudd from Norfolk.

Guild Training Day - 18 September 1999.

A successful day was held in September centred around Kettleburgh. Some 33 students attended on 5 courses - two call changes, one plain hunt, one basic plain bob and one advanced plain bob. My thanks to the tutors and helpers for their tireless efforts. The 2000 event will be held in the same area as previous years because of the number of easy and accessible six bell towers. Proposed courses are: Call changes, Plain Hunt, Plain Bob (Basic), Plain Bob (Advanced) and Stedman. I welcome other suggestions.

Guild Seminar - 16 October 1999 - Modern Teaching Aids.

Unfortunately this had to be cancelled as only two people were interested. It is a pity as we can all learn from new innovations. It might not suit everyone but what's the harm in having a look? My thanks to those who volunteered equipment, programmes, simulators. If you were interested but could not make the date,

Eric Bull at Stutton would be worth contacting to arrange a demonstration of his complete system in place at Stutton.

9.2.19 Day.

A successful day was held at Barking and Offton for our younger ringers, assisted by three older drivers / ringers, namely myself, Brian Whiting and Suzanne Stanford. 14 young people attended from age nine to eighteen. Their names and Email addresses appear on the website. Other young ringers are asked to contact Anne Brechin to build up this data base for future events and to enable them to make contact with each other. Ideas that were put forward over an informal lunchtime discussion were: (i) a Young Ringers' section of the Guild; (ii) Young Ringers' Special District Practices; (iii) a Young Ringers' Outing; (iv) a Young Ringers' section on the website (I have no doubt that this will happen!); (v) Young Ringers' page(s) in the Guild Newsletter. All of these points are valid and need serious consideration by the Guild/Districts.

This event arose out of Brian Whiting's and my concern that we have very few competent young ringers or indeed many under thirty five. Unless we get young keen ringers coming through, ringing will inevitably decline both in numbers and standards when the current membership gets too old. I shall continue this crusade into 2000. I am not convinced, however, that the districts take this as seriously as they might.

Ring In 2000.

This was the highlight of the year. Congratulations to all Guild Members and others who took part in the Ring In 2000. From my replies from Deanery reps, it is clear that this event fired the imagination of virtually everybody. As far as I am aware, all rings that could be rung were rung sometime on 1/1/2000 - some 193 towers, of which 121 were rung at noon. Some of our unringables were also chimed and doubtless many other chiming bells were sounded. This was an incredible performance considering our membership and the number of rings to be covered. Some of our bands in more rural areas must have been ringing all day to cover what they did. The press coverage was a little disappointing but Radio Suffolk showed a keen interest, getting me up at 6.45 a.m. on both the first and second of January!

It has been encouraging to see new bands taught for the Millennium. Hopefully they will survive and continue to progress. It was a source of much pleasure (and at times frustration) to be involved with David Stanford in the teaching of the new Burgh band. Not only did they ring their own bells on New Year's Day but also covered Hasketon at noon.

Suffolk Guild Website.

Anne Brechin from Burgh is looking after the site. This is definitely the way forward for communication. There are currently problems with the inclusion of personal details for the tower directory. I would urge all tower correspondents to agree to their details being included, the advantages of a complete directory far outweigh the possible nuisance of frivolous contact. If you are not convinced, please see if there is another member of the band who will allow their details to be put on the site.

This has been a quiet year for the library with fewer requests for loans and information than last year. However, once again, several people have been very generous in donating material to the library, in particular videos and tapes, and I am very grateful to them.

In addition to donated material, the library receives the Ringing World each week. Up till this year a copy was donated, but currently the library has its own subscription. However, to save the library having to pay for the Ringing World, if there is anyone out there who would be prepared to give their copy of the Ringing World to the library each week I would be very grateful. It is important that the library does have a full set of back copies (currently back to 1952) as ringers do borrow them from time to time, to update their peal records for instance.

Another purchase this year has been Steve Coleman's latest book 'The Bellringer's Early Companion'. The library has copies of his other three books and they have proved very popular with borrowers. This book will appeal particularly to learners and, as Steve puts in the dedication at the front of the book, 'all those ringers who think they are alone in their struggles'. So if you are troubled by belfry knots, slipping sallies and flying ropes, or would like to ring a quarter peal of call changes, do borrow this book.

Belfry Advisory Committee

Winston Girling and Alan Moult

1999 has certainly produced a great deal of activity for the Committee, and much work has been reported and indeed carried out ranging all the way from replacement stays to major restorations. So many requests have been received for help and advice that we have had to regretfully postpone attendance on the odd one or two until after the start of 2000. The flood of Suffolk restorations and subsequent dedications must surely be unprecedented, and says a great deal for the foresight and sheer tenacity of those who have spearheaded the various projects - every one of which requires a superhuman effort to achieve and pull together.

Our Suffolk bells all need a great deal of care and attention to keep them in working order, particularly the older installations, some of which require checking virtually every time they are rung, and a willing person on hand to do this will help to ensure that they keep ringing. One aspect of the Millennium 'push' has been the influx of a great many people who are at various stages of learning to ring. We need to keep these people in the exercise and to continue with the programme of education and encouragement that the Guild already has in place, but if we do not keep the installations themselves in order, there will be fewer and fewer bells to ring on. It is therefore also an opportune time to perhaps look again at the whole aspect of teaching bell maintenance and to include 'hands on' experience, and this is something that the year 2000 should definitely include.

A Suffolk Guild Project over the last few months has been the restoration of the five bells at Old Newton. Here the team started by removing the badly cracked Darbie treble for welding. This was a great success and all the bells have now been re-hung with new modern clappers, new headstocks on the back four, conventional stays and sliders instead of the awful rod and dolly mechanisms, ball bearings on the two tenors and new plain bearings on the front three. The tower has been transformed with a new light and airy ringing floor one stage further up. This floor has been decorated and carpeted. Many people had long ago given up the thought of ever seeing this tower back ringing again, and much credit is due to the present Churchwardens and P.C.C. for seeing the project through, and to the members of the Guild team who virtually had to move in to get it done!

One of the last dedications has been at St Mary le Tower, Ipswich, following the replacement of bells 9, 10 and 11 and some other work including tuning 5 and 8. A glorious peal has resulted and the (not always straightforward) work was assisted by a number of ringers who gave up a lot of their time to do so. Our congratulations go to all who have strived and succeeded to produce a peal of bells which would certainly do justice to any of our Cathedrals.

The recent dedication at Orford will certainly remain in our memories for a long while to come, and Stuart Harrison and his team have worked against all odds to produce the new peal of eight there. As this is written we await the restored six at Tostock and also at Hacheston. Work is proceeding at Easton, and Campsea Ashe, Iken and Little Thurlow have been completed. 1999 also saw Stradishall bells ringing again. Pakenham have been augmented to six now and the local ringers can move on to the mysteries of six bell ringing, something which they have wanted to do for some time.

At Haughley, work should commence soon on installing a brick ring beam under the bell frame and other work on the bells to hopefully include new clappers. The possibility of installing a steel 10 or 12 bell frame at Stowmarket and installing the present 8 in that is being looked at and could be another Guild project for the future. If done it will mean that the bells can then be installed in a configuration which will be kinder to the tower and also allow augmentation at a later date.

One other Guild project completed during the year was the complete re-hang of the single bell at Stowupland, near Stowmarket. This bell had been silent for several years because of the poor condition of the frame, headstock and other gear, and much work by Richard Coe and others saw it re-hung with new bearings, new headstock, modified clapper and strengthened frame. The bell, reputed to have been cast by Oliver of Wapping, was found to have had the name of the Whitechapel foundry carefully ground out, and Oliver must therefore have acted as an agent only and the history of the bell was re-written as a result. It is now once again chiming out over Stowupland.

Reports were requested on a number of installations over the year, including Rendham, Nedging (2 belis) Boxford and Bildeston (both over clappering problems), St. Mary at Elms, Ipswich (where the 5 bells are severely worn in the soundbows and the supporting gear is unsafe, prohibiting even chiming) Bramfield, Elmswell and Baylham, where frame problems are severe but there may be moves to re-hang. Bardwell have been re-assessed by Alan Moult and restricted to 45 minutes ringing per month and raising and lowering singly. A report was requested by Shimpling and R Clouston, MBE sent them a copy of his report on the bells. Mendlesham have been rung after an absence caused by tower problems and the architect is now happy for ringing to continue. Alan Moult has reported on thepersistent clappering problems at Palgrave.

During the year general items of work have been carried out at Bedfield, Blythburgh, Westhall, Rougham, Eriswell, Naughton, Brampton, Eye, Long Melford, Ixworth, Stowmarket, Buxhall, Stowlangtoft, St. Clements, Ipswich and Preston.

The Guild's finances have recovered very well in the last year. This is attributable mainly to increased membership and a reduction in administration costs and services. Items such as the newsletter and What's On are provided largely by goodwill. The full cost of these two items would be in the region of £600.

Restoration work was completed at five churches in time for the millennium enabling grants to be paid. A longstanding grant has been withdrawn and the Restoration Fund now stands at £16,421.

There are currently 99 members covenanting their subscriptions, 47 from SE district. The tax refund will be in the region of £319 on subscriptions of £1068. This gives some idea of the potential not being realised. Covenant forms can be obtained from District Treasurers or myself. As you know I have dealt with the covenants alongside my treasurer duties. Having all the information in one place seems sensible to me. It is not then an arduous task. I would suggest that the responsibility for the covenants remains with the treasurer. If someone is able to assist all well and good but the scenario of having to sort out past years should be avoided.

I have now been treasurer for five years - Rule B7 refers! I found out early on what makes people tick - Money! Income cannot be guaranteed and there are several expenses that cannot be predicted. It is not easy to budget when there are so many variables.

Hopefully the general fund now has a good working balance. I would suggest that the current level is used as a basis for future years

I would like to thank the various treasurers/secretaries and officers that collect sums on the Guild's behalf and have provided me with prompt returns and also our auditors Larking Gowen for their service to the Guild. Special thanks to those who have raised funds for the Guild.



Obituaries (1999)

Clifford Bird - Norwich

A notable figure in Norwich and the N.D.A. for 75 years, Clifford nevertheless always reminded us that he came from "The Saints" - South Elmham St Margaret, that delightful area near Bungay.

St Peter Mancroft became his home and the year before he died he gave a new treble to create a light 10 there. Clifford was competent from Doubles to Maximus and liked nothing more than good striking, especially Grandsire Caters. In later years he much enjoyed coming with Madge to the July day at Debenham for veterans and friends.

The Rt Rev Leslie Wilfred Brown, MA

Bishop Leslie came to us in 1966, having been Archbishop of Uganda and before that Bishop of South India. The contrast one can imagine in "Eds and Ips" was amazing, but he came to love Suffolk, especially its coastline, bird life, churches and people. Leslie Brown was proud of his Presidency of the Guild and for me, as Master at the time, it was a joy to work with him.

He often told the story against himself that having been used to ringing a single bell (perhaps fitted with a chain) in bush churches, he came here and the very first church in Suffolk - no names! - where he was asked to ring himself in, the rope broke and he was surrounded by thirty feet of it.

Norman Chaddock - Rotherham and Inveraray

Norman was a Life Member and one of the best-known ringing teachers in the Exercise. After the Washington trip of 1964, he and his great friend Wilfred Moreton, both participants in that, were invited to Suffolk to run a seminar, the forerunner of our training days today.

Norman set great store by handling and striking.

Richard Chambers - Preston St Mary

Dear "Mac", as we called him, a loveable countryman, close to the land and nature in all its moods, bright of eye and steady of hand. His great pal Freddie Hunt and he were familiar faces at West Suffolk towers and had both participated in Lavenham's winning of the Guild Striking Competition.

Mac had an extensive repertoire of Minor methods (and indeed of country anecdotes) but his real treat was hearing Double Norwich well struck on Lavenham's noble ring.

Nicholas (Mike) Cresswell - Iken

Iken, the seat and site of St Botolph's missionary work in the 7th century, is surely one of the most evocative places in Suffolk. How good that the pre Reformation ring has been restored and augmented hopefully six one day! Nicholas was so hoping to be part of the ringing there and at Orford but alas that was not to be. We give thanks for his contribution and his life.

Canon Eric Hamlyn - Boxford

I think we can say that Fr. Hamlyn was a "late convert" - not especially keen on bells, until he was appointed to Boxford, that is. There he became a much loved priest, enthusiastic to see the completion of the extensive restoration work to church, tower and bells. He rejoiced at the sound of the bells at their dedication and we rejoice with him.

Daphne Hammond - Ipswich

The elder daughter of George and Eva Symonds - who will ever forget George, ringing at 99 - Daphne, like her sister Alma, was taught to ring but found expression in handbells which they rang as a family.

Albert Sidney Hawes - Blo Norton and Framlingham

A real country boy, Sid was proud of his Norfolk roots in the Garboldisham area and his home in Framlingham's lovely market town. One cannot but admire a man who, not having the advantage of reading and writing, managed to ring and be such an enthusiast. Sid served the community and his God in all sorts of ways and we shall miss him.

Kenneth J Hesketh - Liverpool, Cambridge and Pinchbeck

Ken was a Life Member and one of the best-known ringers in the Exercise, very proud of his membership of our Guild. A first-rate ringer and organiser, he loved coming to Suffolk and rang many fine peals here, amongst his total of over 1500. He was a wonderful travelling companion too, the ideal person for outings and tours. Ken delighted in getting someone through their first peal but was equally at home in Bristol Maximus at St Paul's.

A staunch College Youth, for whom he rang over 200 peals, he also did his bit locally wherever his business moves took him. It was a great tragedy when he died at the early age of 55.

Agnes Kersey (née Bailey) - Leiston, London and Sproughton

Agnes was the daughter of Charles F Bailey, not only one of the famous Bailey brothers of Leiston but without doubt one of the finest conductors of Surprise Major of all time.

It must have been pretty daunting to be born into such a family band for there was little in ringing they couldn't do. Agnes was inevitably taught to ring, advancing to Bob Major, and then married Reginald Kersey, one of St Margaret's band. Due to many moves in Reg's work, she concentrated on supporting his ringing activities.

Agnes was a lady of great fortitude. Even as a double amputee she nevertheless retained her resolve in house and garden and always her interest in the Art.

John William Smith - Hintlesham

John died suddenly at the end of last year. He was taught to ring by Winnie and Tinker Lockwood and then joined the Kersey band in the early eighties when he was Treasurer. He rang three quarter peals and helped out at Hintlesham too.

Dennis Knox - Totternoe, London and Felixstowe

When Post Office Research, as it was known in the sixties, moved down from Dollis Hill to Martlesham, Dennis was in the vanguard of their operation to become British Telecom.

A Bedfordshire man, he came from that first class band of Surprise Major ringers under the leadership of C Edward Jefferies. After a few years centred on Willesden he then moved to Felixstowe, bringing his composing and conducting skills here.

The Guild greatly benefited from his move, especially in the years 1969 to 1975, whilst Dennis in turn came to love Suffolk and the East Coast deeply.

Ernest Steward - Wickham Market



The number of peals rung by the Guild during 1999 was 148, a healthy increase on the last few years. A good spread of methods on all numbers of bells with many first performances for the Guild listed below, including the continuation of the Little Surprise Major series to mark the Guild's 75th anniversary year. However with the formation of the Iceni Society, mainly for peals rung at the campanile at Newmarket, we are unlikely to see such a position at the end of 2000. The resulting reduction in peal fee income should be considered.

Peals were rung in 42 Suffolk towers and 12 towers outside the county (mostly by Suffolk bands arranged by George Pipe and Andrew Stone). Suffolk has been visited this year by peal bands from the Lancashire Association and on several occasions by the Oxford Guild. The first peal on the bells since 1841 was rung at Bildeston, I for one did not believe that this was ever going to be possible. Rare visitors to the peal columns include Stowlangtoft and Covehithe, the latter becoming ever closer to the eroding coastline.


Venue for 2000 AGM

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers Objects, Constitution and Rules - 1999 Revision

Овјестѕ

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
- Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
- Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
- Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
- 6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

Constitution

A. Name

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and lpswich.
 - 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
 - 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).

B. Membership

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild

2.4 Non-Resident Life Member:

A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.

- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. Districts

5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:

1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.

2 North West: Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.

3 South East: Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.

4 South West Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. Government

6 The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there can be Patrons and Vice-Presidents.

7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Vice-Presidents may be elected. Subscriptions and fees for the year beginning the following January shall be set at the AGM or a SGM.

8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Chairman

Technical Adviser

Ringing Master

Librarian

Secretary

Handbells Trustee

Treasurer

Peal Secretary

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

Public Relations Officer

Report Editor

Newsletter Editor

Central Council Representatives

- 9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to certify the accounts.
- 10 The following Committees shall be formed:
 - (a) The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Certified Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.
 - (b) The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.
 - (c) The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. Finance

- 11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
 - 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.

- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- 19 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 20 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 21 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. Records and Handbells

- 22 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 23 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
- 24 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. General

- 25 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 25.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 25.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from 1 January following.
 - 25.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 26 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.

- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription
 - 2.4 Members over the age of 65 who have been ringing members for at least ten years shall pay no subscription
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of nonresidence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members.
- For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. Election of Officers

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
 - 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
 - 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
 - 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. Committee Structure

9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

Guild Chairman

Treasurer

Ringing Master Secretary Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee
One Elected Representative from each Deanery

- 9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a guorum.
- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.

- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Chairman Treasurer Secretary

Ringing Master Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGM's.

- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
- 15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. Expenses

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings.
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council
 meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may
 be determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. Peal Records

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.

- 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
- 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS:

1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)

13 bells by various founders size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

- 2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.
- 8 The Trustee and the Guild Management Committee would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

THE MITSON SHIELD AND THE ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 No Member may ring more than once in the Rose competition, except as specified in Rule 11.
- 4 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy shall be competed for as follows:

Mitson Shield

- 4.1 Bands shall comprise six bona fide ringers from a tower, of whom at least four are shown in the Annual Report as members of that tower.
- 4.2 The test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s).

Rose Trophy

- 4.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 4.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 5 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 4.
- 6 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 7 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 8 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 9 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 10 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 11 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 12 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 13 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 14 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
