

2000 proved to be a year of mixed fortunes. The Millennium ringing, covered in my last report, got the year off to a wonderful start, so I suppose it was inevitable that the rest of the year would be an anticlimax. I have felt it particularly frustrating that events have not been supported and that it has not been possible to pursue my own crusade of trying to recruit younger ringers. This has not been helped by R&T Committee members not being able to or willing to attend meetings. I agreed to take on the job of Master for a short period in the absence of any other candidates. However, I do not feel able to continue without the support of the membership, coupled with the fact that my own commitments - local ringing and the nature of my work - make it difficult for me to attend as many district events as I would like.

Looking back at Guild events, there were disappointments but some encouraging signs.

Guild Striking Competitions - 20 May 2000

The judges this year were Amanda Richmond and Simon Rudd from Norfolk, who did an excellent job. The results were as follows (faults in brackets):

Mitson Shield: 1st - St Mary-le-Tower (47), 2nd - Offton (98), 3rd - Hopton & Hinderclay (116), 4th - Pettistree (121), 5th - Sproughton (124).

Rose Trophy: 1st - St Mary-le-Tower (139), 2nd SE District (230), 3rd - NE District (239), 4th - SW District (280), 5th - Pettistree (296).

My congratulations to the St Mary-le-Tower band for completing the Grand Slam, having won the SE District competition earlier in the month.

The entry for the six bell competition was very disappointing. Only the SE District entered in significant numbers. District Officers must encourage bands to enter if this event is ever going to achieve the popularity it had in the past. Apart from the social potential, it is an opportunity to learn from listening to the teams and the judges comments.

A representative Guild band also competed in the Ridgman 10-Bell Trophy that morning at Wymondham and finished a very creditable second out of eight teams.

Central Council - Bury St Edmunds - 29 May 2000

The event was generally very good and well organised. David Salter should be congratulated on his efforts, which were the lion's share of the work. The stewards provided by the Guild also did a first class job in their easily identifiable bright shirts. I received numerous letters from Council Officers and members, thanking the Guild for their efforts and hospitality.

It was interesting to note that the Central Council this year echoed our concerns about the lack of young people ringing, particularly post teenage to 35. In some respects this is now almost a lost generation and makes it vitally important that we continue or efforts to recruit and retain younger ringers.

9.2.19 Coach Outing - 2 June 2000

A very good day with 12 of our young ringers making a good job of all the bells visited - Isleham, Fordham, Wicken, Stretham, Haddenham, Landbeach and Bottisham. During the day, the ringing ranged from rounds and call changes to Cambridge Minor and Stedman Triples with lots of Plain Bob in between. My thanks to Daphne Pegg, Brian Whiting and Mary Garner for coming along to assist. Anne Brechin

wrote in her report of the day: "I would like to add once again that it was hoped that there would be rather more young ringers on the outing. It was an excellent opportunity to experience a variety of bells, to improve your ringing ability and to meet with others of your age who enjoy ringing too." It is a shame that more of our young ringers could not come or were not encouraged to come - there are 65 Junior members in the '99 Report.

Guild Outing - 9 September 2000

This event was cancelled due to lack of support, coupled with problems at two towers.

Guild Training Day - 16 September 2000

This event was cancelled due to the uncertainty of the fuel crisis. However, although the R&T Committee would have continued with the event, numbers were down to ten, a substantial reduction compared to previous years. This may be due in part to the increased training activity in districts, particularly at the beginner stage. I see this as the way forward - districts running local based courses as and when required. A Guild event once year is not really enough. It might make more sense for the Guild event to cover more advanced topics.

Fun Striking Competition - 30 September 2000 at Stowmarket

This event did take place and those few who took part had a good time. My thanks to Brian Whiting and Adrian Knights for judging. There were four pieces rung, but many people rung at least twice. Some of the winners were clearly shocked to have been in a winning team, conducted by the least experienced conductor, Anne Brechin.

Peal Achievements

It was good to see first peals rung on newly restored or augmented rings -Barsham, Boxford, Little Thurlow, Old Newton, Orford, Pakenham and Tostock -some of the ringers making areturn to the peal columns after a number of years.

My congratulations to the following first pealers - Lindsay Bingham, Beryl Hines and Gosia Hobson. Lindsay and Beryl rang theirs in a peal at Burgh by a Sunday Service Band, of whom four have been ringing for under two years.

There seem to be fewer personal milestones this year but I should like to place the following on record: 25th peal - Anne Brechin (including first of Surprise Maximus), 250th for the Guild - Mary Dunbavin, 800th for the Guild - George Pipe. David Salter called his 700th for the Guild and also during the year completed 700 peals with his wife, Katharine.

It was good to see the Guild ring several peals for the Queen Mother's 100th birthday, including special methods for the occasion. Footnotes to peals and quarters indicate that ringers are progressing in both methods and number of bells.

Young Ringers

The SE District held a young ringers' practice at Sproughton in July. There was also another one at Sweffling (NE) in December. Both were enjoyed by those that were there, but yet again numbers were low. Part of the problem is transport. I urge members to offer transport to youngsters in their area, so that they can attend these events.

Anne Brechin joined the R&T Committee this year and produced two ideas aimed at schools and young Christians. She put posters up at Farlingaye High School, Woodbridge, advertising a free ringing course at Burgh during the summer holiday. She also talked to a local Young Christians group.

Unfortunately neither initiative produced any real result but at least an attempt was made.

I still passionately believe that we all must keep trying to recruit not only youngsters but also the post university age group. Clearly this should not be our only recruitment strategy. We are all grateful to the mature recruits over the last few years that keep our bells ringing on Sundays across the county.

I would like to conclude by thanking all District Officers and members for welcoming me into their towers in the limited time that I have had available.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

SANDRA PEREIRA

This year has seen some changes in the Guild, not least the change to the Guild Management Committee membership which came about as the result of the special meeting to approve rule changes in October 1999. As a result the Committee now comprises representatives of all Deaneries as well as officers. The three meetings held this year have generally been well attended.

The Annual General Meeting was held on April 29th at Boxford. 58 members were present, and it would be good to see more showing an interest in the Guild by taking part this meeting. Two new Officers were elected, the Secretary, and Treasurer. Eric Bull from Stutton agreed to take over the as Treasurer from Paul Stannard whose term of office had ended. Thanks were given to Paul for his excellent work over five years. No volunteer for Newsletter Editor was forthcoming, but Stephen Young nobly stepped into the breech for two issues and Bel Rivers has now assumed the role.

Dr Bruce Wakefield's ten years as secretary were recognised by his election as Honorary Life member. The meeting also agreed the election of David Salter, past master, and Clive Young, Bishop of Dunwich, to be Vice presidents of the Guild.

A highlight of the year was the meeting of the Central Council, held in Bury St Edmunds in May. The local organisation was ably carried out by David Salter and several members spent an interesting day as stewards at the meeting. The Secretary of the Central Council expressed his appreciation for the hospitality from the Guild.

This year has seen the creation of a Guild Web page. Hopefully this will be developed over the coming months. The majority of tower correspondents are happy to have details published, but keeping this type of information up to date is not easy. In order to keep central records I have set up a Guild database from information collected over the past two years. During 2001 I will try to expand this as I think it is essential that central records of members are kept.

Once again the Guild Management Committee has supported bell restoration projects with Grants to Haughley, Elmsett and The Norman Tower, totalling £5015, being agreed. Applications from Wingfield and Felsham await discussion.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

GILLIAN WAKEFIELD

The Suffolk Guild Library continues to be used both by ringers wishing to borrow items and by people asking for information.

This year the library has received an unprecedented amount of very interesting material. Peter Allen has compiled a file on Holy Trinity church, Long Melford, The Tower, The Bells, The Ringers. Ranald Clouston has donated another monograph, this titne on The Bells of Berwickshire. Winston

Girling has produced a file on St Peter and St Mary, Stowmarket, 1815 - 2000 The Ringers and the First 200 Peals. Ralph Earey has put together comprehensive information on The Demo Bell. All these works must have taken years of painstaking research and are invaluable records for the Suffolk Guild. George Pipe has very kindly donated his personal papers and records. At the time of writing this report these items are not yet catalogued but again they will be a most interesting and potentially useful resource for the Guild. Sally Munnings has given a file containing "Bell Ringing Scraps" from Agnes and Reg Kersey, while Simon Cottrell, John Hammond, Roger Peters and Martin Thorley have donated books, letters and phoographs that are useful additions. The Guild has reason to be very grateful to all these donors of such valuable material, which contributes to a picture of ringers, ringing and bells in Suffolk.

Although the library has always had reference sections and archive material, it has not stocked ringing fiction. Admittedly, there is not much of this published (could this be a gap in the market for a budding writer?), but I have done some research on the subject and have compiled a list of ringing fiction and the library now possesses three novels in which ringing features considerably. Of course, one book is The Nine Tailors by Dorothy Sayers. Another book is called The Winter Tree, which is set in Cornwall and is about a doomed love affair. Although the ringing theme is not very well developed, nevertheless ringers do feature in this story. The third book is called Death of a Dissenter and is a detective story in which bells, and bell ringers play a large part in the plot. It is hoped to build up this fiction section over the next year or two.

Do consider using the resources of the library if you are updating your own ringing records, want information on any aspect of ringing, or even if you simply want "a good read".

BELFRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

WINSTON GIRLING AND ALAN MOULT

The members of the above Committee have had another busy year and many hours have been spent visiting towers and reporting on bells, carrying out repairs, large and small, and also getting involved with restorations, both ongoing and new. Our Guild Parish Affiliation Scheme, which has a steadily growing membership (78 churches at the present time) provides not only a link between individual churches and the Suffolk Guild itself, but also provides direct contact between members and the maintenance team, and indeed some of our work now comes either with or through members of the scheme. Churches who have had work done on their bells by the team are generally more than pleased subsequently to join. The steady growth and regular donations from member churches helps towards our Restoration Fund and thereby future work to restore our Suffolk bells.

There are however many churches in Suffolk which have not yet joined the Scheme, quite a few of them with bells that are rung regularly. If many more joined we would be able to increase our Restoration Fund which exists to give grants to churches for work on their bells. Over the years many churches have been grant aided by our Guild and it is heartening to have the support of the present Scheme members who are helping us to ensure future grants. If your church has not yet joined then please do urge them to do so - 100 members means around £1000 annually, and we have nearly that many members already.

On 21st October the Guild Seminar at Stowmarket was devoted entirely to maintenance and problems with bells. Attendance was somewhat disappointing but much ground was covered and it was established that future Seminars should be held in each of the Districts separately. As a result the

North East District have invited us to Reydon, near Southwold, on 17th March 2001, and the suggested topics could include basic bell maintenance, to assist those who may not have had much experience in this field, curing bells which do not strike evenly, methods of sound control, problems to look for in towers, frames and installations in general and most importantly an opportunity for any local bell problems to be raised and fully discussed.

The restoration at Hacheston was completed during the year but the bellhangers had to return to cure major problems with the clappers. The three tenors had to be fitted with counterbalanced clappers and the clappers in the front three bells required machining down. Your technical adviser had to make several visits to advise on the problems and all is now in order. Congratulations to Simon and all who have been involved in this restoration which has resulted in one more silent peal of bells coming to life again. On 3rd December 2000, the first peal ever was rung at Little Thurlow, near Haverhill, and celebrated the restoration of these bells. The Norman Tower at Bury St Edmunds has seen ongoing work locally to cure long-standing problems with the frame and bell gear. At Easton the wooden bell frame has now been lowered on to new metal support beams and money is being raised to re-hang the six bells with new fittings.

The five bells at Haughley have been out of action whilst major repairs to the tower have taken place. As part of this work a new brick ring beam has been fitted under the bell frame which has itself been stabilised, and the opportunity has been taken to lower all 5 bells for removal of crown staples and the fitting of new cast iron canon retaining headstocks and new clappers. The bells have now been tried out for the first time and are a pleasure to ring. Much credit must go to Richard Coe who has provided the drive, determination and hard work to see this project through. The four glorious Bury bells and their treble should now be ringable for many years to come. Rendham have launched an appeal to re-hang their bells and at Stonham Aspal (where a tower crack was preventing the use of the back four bells) repairs have been carried out and all 10 are now ringing again. A report has been completed on the bells at Haverhill. Repairs have been proposed on the tower at Sudbury All Saints and at Wingfield work is to include welding of the cracked treble and sand blasting and painting the rusty headstocks and frame. Some work is also necessary on the bearings and clappers. The bells at Pakenham with their new treble have now had two peals rung on them and the addition of this new bell has been a great success.

St Mary le Tower Ipswich, following on from the major work to replace 9, 10 and 11, have now installed a viewing platform which will allow safe viewing of the bells in action and two annual public open days are planned for the future.

From time to time the members of our team are asked to work at churches with one, two or three bells. Without exception these churches have then gone on to join our Affiliation Scheme and their number are increasing all the time. They are indeed most welcome.

Much work has been carried out all over Suffolk and space will not allow for the mention of all the smaller jobs, but they all are helping to keep our bells ringing - thank you to all who have helped in whatever way.

Daisy Andrews - Thorrington, Essex

Daisy, along with Hilda Snowdon, Sylvia Bowyer (Pipe) and the Reeve sisters, Bertha and Eleanor, Lilian Wright and others in the mid 30's, made a name for themselves on the Suffolk and Essex border as a competent ladies six bell band.

Later she became the devoted wife of Alan - the unusual case of an Andrews marrying an Andrews. Alan was a top class ringer and together they enjoyed seeing their ringing family flourish.

Daisy was a staunch member of the Essex Association who enjoyed her Suffolk ringing.

Donald C Andrews - Lawford

Donald was Daisy's nephew, the son of Charles Andrews and like his brother Alan a good ringer on all numbers. For Don it was 'in the blood' and for only his fourth or fifth peal he rang Kent Maximus at Ipswich. We are sad he was taken at a relatively young age.

Sidney W Arbon - Mendlesham and Ipswich

Sidney learned to ring in a pretty good school - around Stowmarket in the 1920's on the heavy five at Mendlesham, later going to Cotton and surrounding towers. Those were the days of Harry Lister, Garnham Blaxcell, Docker Grimwood, Leslie (Titch) Forster and the brothers Sparrow and Lockwood, with Treble Bob and Double Norwich their speciality.

After the war his work as a motor mechanic took him to Ipswich where he joined St. Margaret's band and latterly the Tower. Sid was a very good striker and rang 39 peals for the Guild.

Peter Barrett - Wenhaston

Peter had the courage to take up ringing when past sixty - good for him! A loyal member at Wenhaston he also used his skills in carpentry for church and belfry. Our country towers badly need the Peters of this world with their Sunday-by-Sunday support.

Peter Border - Trumpington and Coventry

A Non-Resident Life Member, Peter was a world-wide figure, big in stature and heart and huge in skill and ability. Composer, conductor and heavy bell ringer, a 3000-pealer. Who could have predicted the future of this country boy from Trumpington, taught just after the war by Miss Kitty Willers - much admired by the Leiston men.

Amongst his countless achievements was the ringing to peals on every bell over 40 cwt except Adelaide and the first to ring the Big Six tenors single handed - Liverpool, Exeter, St Paul's, York, Wells and Redcliffe. But Peter's great attribute was his utter humility and willingness to help. And it wasn't just ringing - he was a fantastic knitter and the maker of some of the best marmalade known to man; one hundred pots a year for the Coventry Guild Bell Restoration Fund.

We miss this gentle giant.

Donald G Clift - Usk, Wales

Don was another Life Member, a distinguished ringer from Wales. He had a most interesting life as a newspaper correspondent with the Manchester Guardian, covering events as diverse as the Hungarian uprising and several Olympics.

His contribution to ringing in Wales was immense and he was in the first peal of Surprise Maximus in the Principality, conducted by his old friend, another NRLM, Wilfred Williams. Don also took part in the

first silent peal of Holt's Original in hand, a composition he made a speciality.

A good teacher of ringing, not surprisingly a fanatical Welsh Rugby supporter - he could sing tool

John H Crampion - Chadwell Heath and St Paul's

Yet another NRLM. of our Guild and a man much admired by Suffolk ringers, 'Crampy' was a ringer of the highest quality and a thorough gentleman. Like all good ringers he could ring anywhere in the circle but he was, I guess, best known for his ringing the 11th to twelve bell peals and for many years, week-by-week he rang St Paul's Cathedral 11th, no mean feat.

This unassuming man will be greatly missed especially in London and Essex.

David T Hughes - Aldeburgh

Cruelly taken from us at the early age of 28, David nevertheless made his mark especially in the Aldeburgh area. Our hearts go out to his parents, Trevor and Hilary and the whole family.

Taught by Trevor, he enjoyed his ringing and a very wide range of interests especially his beloved cricket. A packed church at his funeral in January last year testified to this young man's popularity.

Peter Kindred - Pakefield

The Kindred's were not only a large ringing family who kept the flag flying in the NE corner of Suffolk and for the Eastern branch of the Norwich Diocesan Association but they had an impressive record of teaching and many fine performers today went through their hands.

Peter rang several peals for the Guild and a good number for the NDA and we remember his cheery welcome at Pakefield.

We miss his family business too, the Glendower bakery. On the way home from Yarmouth we used to say 'Pakefield for bread, Kessingland for sausages and Kelsale for taters!'

Alan Knight - Surrey, Lavenham and Sudbury

Father of Richard, Alan learned to ring at Betchworth in Surrey, home of that well known identity, A Patrick Cannon. Alas his ringing career was cut short through acute back problems over many years and thus the Sudbury area was deprived of a good ringer and a very nice man who always maintained a keen interest in the Guild.

Wilfred Lankester - Grundisburgh

Wilfred died in the summer aged 92. Like many village lads he learned to ring between the wars - at Clopton and then at Grundisburgh and Burgh after marrying my cousin Barbara. Wilfred rang up to Bob Triples and my lasting memory of him was ringing a 720 of Bob Minor on the evening of the day he was demobbed in 1946 - still in his army uniform!

Sadly, like Alan Knight, he had to give up ringing due to chronic lower back pain but he loved to hear the village bells.

David Lay - Coddenham

David found inspiration in the restoration of Coddenham bells in that historic tower and helped with it. He then learned to ring there and continued to provide practical work in the tower. We are thankful for people such as he.

Frank D Mack - Exeter Cathedral

A Non-Resident Life Member of our Guild and a 1000-pealer, Frank was fond of Suffolk; quite a contrast to his native Devon.

His long association with the mighty ring at Exeter enabled him to become one of the very few people to circle the tower there.

The Reverend Malcolm CC Melville - Leicester and Bedford

Malcolm Melville's first acquaintance with Suffolk was his ringing his first peal of Maximus, as did many others, at St Mary le Tower before the war.

An enthusiastic traveller (!) he enjoyed towers and peals and had rung all over the world.

Ronald Marshall - Debenham

A call-change ringer, in his eighties Ron was another of those Sunday-by-Sunday faithful attenders. Handyman too and his example was so helpful to the young ringers taught on those fine bells.

Donald C Murfit - Sutton in the Isle

Don, with the colourful nickname of 'Dumps' was a fenman through and through, living close by the glorious tower of Sutton, one of several on which Dorothy L Sayers could have based Fenchurch St Paul. Was it there or Mildenhall or Lavenham - who can tell?

An engineer in Ely, Don was delightful company in the belfry and for the traditional drink, never minding where he rang, always obliging, always dependable. As well as his teaching and Sunday service ringing he rang over 1000 peals many of which came on the Annual Tour of 'Peals Around'. A good man: we shall miss his quiet wit.

Charles Stannard - Bury St Edmunds

The Stannards have been connected with our Cathedral's Norman Tower for over a century. First William (Bill) his father, then Charles's brothers Dick and Jim, on to Paul - a long service in the Bury area - Ingham, Fornham and elsewhere and connections too with the Earl of Cadogan's estates at Culford and beyond.

Charles rang 35 peals for the Guild, enjoyed the fine ten at Bury and of course the heavy eight at St. Mary's (sadly re hung dead, a great loss to our ringing towers).

Life membership of the Guild was conferred on him in 1991.

Patricia May (Paddy) Thorley - York Minster and Wilby

We lost Paddy last year, brave after several illnesses, who devoted her life to ringing. She will be remembered for many things - the support of her indefatigable husband Martin, bringing up three daughters, all fine ringers, strong on Sunday service and always cheerful despite her setbacks.

Pad was the first lady member of the York Minster Society, not so keen on peals but she rang many quarters and not far short of 3000 towers. Thankfully, she lived to see her three grandchildren learn to ring and she rang for the new Millennium - her last 'pull' - what a nice finish for a very nice lady.

And what a compliment to Suffolk - her request was that her ashes be buried in Wilby churchyard.

S Norman Whiting - Rushmere St Andrew

A late learner, Norman was, as is often the case, an enthusiast and took his early ringing seriously. He enjoyed Sunday service, practice nights and meetings, rang six peals for the Guild and several quarters.



PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

The number of peals rung by the Guild during 2000 was 95, a decline of 53 on 1999 but as predicted in the last annual report. The resulting reduction in peal fee income is clearly evident in the accounts. This does not mean that fewer peals are being rung in Suffolk as most copies of the Ringing World include peals rung in the county for other associations, guilds and societies. The visit of the Central Council to Suffolk in May 2000 included several peals and the election of a number of non-resident life members.

Peals were rung in 50 Suffolk towers and 6 towers outside the county. The first peal on the bells was rung at Little Thurlow, Orford and Tostock. Rare visitors to the peal columns include Barsham, Boxford (the first peal since 1896), Felsham and Old Newton.

Despite the reduction in the number of peals, the methods rung included many first performances for the Guild which are listed below. It seems that controversy is growing over the naming of the Penultimus peals, and the Central Council may decide to rename these methods at the 2001 meeting in Liverpool.





The Chairman, Mr Brian Whiting, opened the meeting and welcomed the 58 members who were present. He proposed a vote of thanks to Mr Rolie Whiting and Mrs Ann Jessop for organising the day, to Revd Lawrence Pizzey for taking the service and to the organist.

Minutes of the 1999 AGM: These had been previously published in the Annual Report. It was proposed by Mr George Pipe, seconded by Revd Lawrence Pizzey and agreed that these be accepted.

Matters arising: Mrs Shirley Girt asked for clarification of the situation re over 65's free membership after ten years. She was assured that this only came into effect on 1st January this year, following the special meeting in October 1999.

Officers' reports:

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 1999 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- 1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
- 2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
- 3. Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
- Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
- 6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. Name

- The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
 - 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref. 266869).

B. Membership

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service
 - to the Guild.
 - 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who

resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1,

- 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. Districts

- 5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:
 - 1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
 - 2 North West: Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
 - 3 South East: Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
 - 4 South West Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. Government

- 6 The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there can be Patrons and Vice-Presidents.
- 7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Vice-Presidents may be elected. Subscriptions and fees for the year beginning the following January shall be set at the AGM or a SGM.

8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Chairman Technical Adviser

Ringing Master Librarian

Secretary Handbells Trustee

Treasurer Peal Secretary
Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee Public Relations Officer

Report Editor Newsletter Editor

Central Council Representatives

9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to certify the accounts.

10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Certified Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.

The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. Finance

- 11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.

 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- 19 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 20 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 21 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. Records and Handbells

- 22 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 23 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.

24 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. General

- 25 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 25.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 25.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from 1 January following.
 - 25.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in law.
- 26 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription.
 - 2.4 Members over the age of 65 who have been ringing members for at least ten years shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. Election of Officers

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
 - 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
 - 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
 - 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. Committee Structure

The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

Guild Chairman

Treasurer

Ringing Master

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

Secretary

One Elected Representative from each Deanery

- 9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a guorum.
- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Chairman Treasurer

Secretary

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee Ringing Master

The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGM's.

- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
- 15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. Expenses

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings.
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. Peal Records

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request.

 Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
 - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
 - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)

16 bells generally by Shaw size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones) 13 bells by Warner size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)

13 bells by various founders size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.

- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.
- 8 The Trustee and the Guild Management Committee would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

THE MITSON SHIELD AND THE ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

Rules:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 No Member may ring more than once in the Rose competition, except as specified in Rule 11.
- 4 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy shall be competed for as follows:

Mitson Shield

- 4.1 Bands shall comprise six bona fide ringers from a tower, of whom at least four are shown in the Annual Report as members of that tower.
- 4.2 The test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s).

Rose Trophy

- 4.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 4.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 5 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 4.
- The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 7 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 8 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 9 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 10 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 11 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 12 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 13 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 14 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

This year income has diminished somewhat from last year but fortunately so has expenditure, so we end the year still in a very satisfactory position.

Restoration work has been completed at four churches and the grants paid. A further two grants totalling £4175.00 have been promised but this still leaves £19,640.70 in the Restoration Fund. I hope that you will find that the introduction of the new category "Restoration Allocated Grants" in place of "liabilities" gives you a clearer picture of what funds have been paid out, promised or are still available.

Badges are issued free of charge to new members. The stock was shown as an asset and part was written off each year. However they have no commercial realisable value so this method unrealistically raised the total asset value. Occasionally a badge is sold and if that happens it will be treated as a "sundry sale". The small remaining stock has been written off and a new supply purchased.

The rope pool had in fact been diminishing over the years with various towers being helped. It now stands at nil and has been written off. It has been decided that, in future, any purchase of rope will be treated as a simple consumable and that any money received from a tower for the supply of rope be treated as income from a "sundry sale".

By now we must all be aware of the "Gift Aid" scheme. It differs from the old covenants in that no commitment over a period is required. All that is needed is a simple declaration signed by each member declaring that he or she is a taxpayer and that the amount of tax paid is greater than the amount of tax to be reclaimed in respect of the membership fee. Forms will be available for this purpose. Not at all as scary as having to commit oneself for four years in these perilous times. If all taxpaying members signed then we could be reclaiming in the region of £1,500 per year instead of the £310 shown in the accounts this year.

Notes to the Accounts

- 1. The interest received from the CBF account and shown in the Jubilee and Restoration funds has been apportioned in the ratio of their respective capital sums.

- 3. An expenditure item of £307.00 has been entered in the general fund to write off the stock of rope which no longer exists.
- 4. As is customary 50% of the sum of subscriptions plus peal fees is transfered to the Restoration fund
- 5. In the past allocated grants if unpaid during the year were shown as liabilities. This year a separate category which has been called "Restoration Grants Allocated" has been introduced which is hoped will clarify the grant position especially to those not familiar with accounting practices. This is the reason why no entry has been made for last year in this category and no entry made for this year under liabilities on the balance sheet. No goods or services have been supplied only a promise made in good faith which we consider need not formally be treated as a liability.
- 6. "Sum to balance" we did not have the time to discover the reason for this small error before going to press.
