In many respects 2001 was a very frustrating year. The cooling off after the Millennium recruitment and ringing seems to have continued. Hopefully the Queen's Golden Jubilee will see more enthusiasm amongst our members. It was also marred by some malicious correspondence in the Ringing World which then spilled into our own Guild Newsletter. On a more positive note, two out of the three R&T Committee meetings were supported and initiatives are now being considered.

Guild events were thin on the ground due to a variety of reasons but the Striking Competitions were held. This year they were split over two evenings - 19th May, 8-bell at Cotton and 9th June, 6-bell at Bacton. St Mary-le-Tower, Ipswich again won both competitions. My thanks to the local ringers, particularly Peter and Sheila Franks, for arranging both events. The entries in the 6-bell were virtually identical to 2000, which negates the argument the Saturday afternoons in May are difficult for teams. The next experiment is to change the rules to make it easier for bands to qualify.

Peal ringing has not been prolific but there has been some variety among methods rung. It was particularly disappointing to note that there were no first pealers and only one first as conductor. However, footnotes show that many people rang their first in methods or on numbers of bells. The following milestones were achieved:

1,000th peal - Alan Mayle

800th peal - Mary Allum

300th peal for the Guild - Winston Girling

75th peal - Mary Garner

50th peal - Jonathan Stevens (who also conducted his first peal), Anne Brechin (who also completed the standard 8 Surprise Major) and Christopher Munnings

25th peal - Glenys Fear and Alan Rogers

It is also interesting to note that the late Martin Thorley, a past Master, rung his 1,500th different bell to a peal whilst visiting during the year.

It is with some regret that I feel I have to return to the subject of Guild Fees and Rope Fees. It is a pointless exercise comparing the Suffolk Guild with other Guilds/Associations. Our problems are different. We need to generate income to offer realistic grants to bell restorations. Although the number of ringables has risen in recent years, there are lots of rings, although still ringable, that are unsatisfactory. Unlike most Guilds/Associations, at least 50% of our income goes directly to restoration. The main protagonists in the peal fee debate must spend a huge amount in petrol getting to attempts, so is an extra 25 pence really a big deal? It will be interesting to see who the peals are rung for this year as one of the traditional bastions of cheap peals, the NDA, has also increased its peal fee to £1.00.

Following David Salter's Newsletter article, Brian Whiting spoke at all the ADMs and it was clear that the general membership do not feel that subscriptions are too high. We must move away from these petty squabbles and concentrate on improving our service to members and improving the quality of our ringing. We must also look at our objectives, particularly Sunday service ringing. I would challenge the commitment to this of some of these complainants.

With regard to rope fees for peals, although I would not wish to be prescriptive, it is clear that £2

to £3 is the normal going rate. Many places, including my own tower, charge more for outside bands. However, I do feel it is unreasonable for Guild Members to pay £10.00 (or even £4.25) a rope for a Guild peal, bearing in mind the grants and help received. I urge those in charge to be more realistic, particularly if the motive for the fee can only be described as selfishness. On the other hand, I would strongly urge towers to charge £5 to £10 a rope to those boycotting the Guild.

I should like to end by thanking all the District Officers and Members for their welcome and hospitality during 2001. Hopefully, the quarter peal initiative for the Golden Jubilee will raise ambitions and generate more enthusiasm for the future. I look forward to receiving the details.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

SANDRA PEREIRA

During the year the Guild Management Committee met on three occasions, with an average attendance of 14. There are still some deaneries which are not represented on the committee and it would be good to see those vacancies filled in 2002.

The Annual General Meeting was held on 21st April at Palgrave. Fifty-nine members were present. The officers were re-elected and Bel Rivers was elected to be Newsletter Editor, having stepped into the breach earlier in the year. Stephen Young agreed to act as Report Editor for one more year and, hopefully, by the time you read this a new Editor will have been found.

This year we had to elect Central Council Representatives. Stephen Pettman, Lawrence Pizzey, Alan Smith and David Salter were all re-elected for a further three year term.

At the meeting it was agreed to invite Revd Harry Edwards of Marlesford to be a Vice President in recognition of his support for the Guild and his work in restoring the bells in two benefices.

The Guild web page has been much further developed this year: the address is www.suffolkbells. org.uk. It is being updated on a regular basis and John Pereira is willing to put suitable material onto it. The database continues to be an ongoing project, but does rely on information coming in from the districts.

At a recent meeting we had a visit from a member the Suffolk Child Protection Committee. We are now urged to be aware of child protection issues and the Management Committee will be looking closely at action we should take. I have a pack of information which is available for all towers who work with minors.

The Committee has continued to support restoration projects, this year grants have been offered to Wingfield, Rendham, Sudbury (All Saints), Campsea Ashe, Mendham, East Bergholt and Easton amounting to £18,025 in all.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

GILLIAN WAKEFIELD

The library has been well used this year and both books and videos have been borrowed. The Central Council's video "The Tutors Companion" has been out on loan several times in the past year.

Some time ago George Pipe presented the library with archive material on Alfred Bowell, a bell founder and bell hanger who worked in Ipswich in the nineteenth century. George was very fortunate to obtain these records as they were about to be flung on a bonfire. Building on work already done

by Ranald Clouston on records about Bowell, Chris Pickford, an archivist and researcher, who is also Master of the Ancient Society of College Youths, has catalogued all the information on Alfred Bowell which the Guild Library possesses, and has produced the material on a CD. Anyone interested in the Wykes Bishop Street foundry and the Bowell family can now access the records, cuttings concerning work undertaken by Bowell, and photographs without the need to consult the original records. Talks are taking place between the Guild Management Committee and Chris on the possibility of marketing the CD, and any profits from sales will go to the Guild.

Without archive material like the Bowell papers a lot of valuable information about bells and bell-ringing would be lost. The Guild library is not only a depository for books but is a valuable source of information on local ringing history. If you have any personal ringing records which you would like to donate to the library they will be very gratefully received.

BELFRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

WINSTON GIRLING AND ALAN MOULT

In September Ranald Clouston MBE stood down as Bells Advisor to the Diocesan Advisory Committee; Ranald has sat on this Committee for 47 years. His first request to attend was for the meeting held on 24th September 1954. Over the years Ranald has ably and willingly advised on many proposals for bell restorations and other work, often before the DAC has been involved. In addition, Ranald was for 25 years the Honorary Technical Advisor to the Guild or carried out the duties before the actual creation of this post. His vast contribution on all aspects of our Suffolk bells has been immeasurable and will continue to be so. We would both wish to thank Ranald for all the invaluable help and advice that he has given and for the hundreds of precise, comprehensive and detailed reports on Suffolk bells which represent not only an irreplaceable library of information, but a dedicated lifetime's work spent in (often inhospitable) bell chambers. Thank you, Ranald. Your MBE award was so very much deserved and we are indeed privileged to have you in Suffolk.

The Suffolk Guild Parish Affiliation Scheme continues to grow. There are now well over 80 members and the Guild is grateful for the support of members for the work of our Guild and the Bell Restoration fund. We look forward to achieving the first 100 members.

During the last 12 months a great deal of work has been carried out on bell installations all over the county. Space will not allow mention of every item that has been discussed but we would like to say thank you to all those who have worked on bells in whatever way and who have also assisted us in the various jobs that we have been involved in. It is gratifying to see how readily people will come forward and get involved and how much parishes appreciate their bells.

The bells at St Mary at Elms in Ipswich were last rung in 1903 and are not safe to even swing chime. A chiming apparatus has been fitted to the tenor bell to allow chiming for the time being. Nettlestead (single bell) have expressed an interest getting their single bell back into use and a report has been prepared. The 2 bells at Ashfield cum Thorpe (near Debenham) hang in an inaccessible bellcote and members of the Committee (via a very long ladder) managed to fit ropes to the bells so that they could be chimed.

Restoration and augmentation to 8 at Earl Stonham is proposed and all necessary advice and assistance has been given. At Brandeston (Mortuary Chapel) a single bell has been re-hung on a new

headstock by Chris McArthur. The clappers have also been rebushed and the frame painted at Brandeston Church. East Bergholt is now ringing again following modifications to improve the safety of the cage and the bells. At Hitcham, the bells have been out of action since the 1950s and there is the possibility of restoration. Campsea Ashe are fitting new bearings to the existing headstocks.

Laxfield PCC have agreed to the installation of a new frame after completion of other non-bell work. Rendham are fund raising with a view to restoration and Parham (chiming 3) are in the early stages of a project to hang the bells in a new frame and augment to 6 or 8. The existing frame is a very interesting medieval 4 bell frame. It has been recommended that ringing of the treble at Thurston should cease owing to a badly cracked headstock. It is likely that the bells will now be fully restored before too much longer. Interest in restoration has been shown at Worlington and proposals for re-hanging Stowmarket in a new 10 bell steel frame have been presented to the PCC. Problems with rainwater getting into the tower at Bildeston in large quantities have now been resolved. A report has been prepared for All Saints, Newmarket describing the options available to the PCC to get these bells ringing again.

Fund raising is continuing at Wickham Market to have the tower repaired and all ringing has been stopped because of the cracks which are present in the tower. Interest in restoration was shown at Little Waldingfield but this is likely to be in the much longer term. Restoration at Old Newton is now complete and the bells are very easy to ring following the completion of this Guild Project, carried out by the Guild maintenance team assisted by local ringers.

It will be noted that we have from time to time been involved in advice and assistance on installations with one, two or three bells. Although the Guild is primarily concerned with peals of bells which are rung full circle, we are nevertheless pleased to advise and assist with chiming bells of any number.

OBITUARIES

RONALD H DOVE - LEEDS, DERBY AND HARROGATE

Dove as a name became synonymous with ringing towers — a bit like Hoover in vacuum cleaners. Building on a gazetteer of the pre-war Bristol and United Ringing Guilds Directory of Towers, RH Dove produced in 1952 a quite remarkable Directory of Rings in both the UK and abroad. For such a work there were very few errors and his book has now run to nine editions, an almost indispensable guide for ringers everywhere.

Ronnie Dove worked for both Gillett & Johnson and Smiths Clocks of Derby. Besides being a prolific collector of towers, around 5000, he was also a member of the brilliant Maurice Swinfield's Stedman Triples band of the thirties — Swinfield calling one hundred different compositions, almost all non-observation.

Ron was a Non Resident Life Member of our Guild and the Central Council gave him Honorary Membership in 1985.

NORMAN V HARDING BEM - SURREY AND KINGS LYNN

Small of stature but big of heart, Norman was for many years in one sense West Norfolk ringing and a proud Non Resident Life Member of our Guild.

His early days in ringing before the war in Surrey and Sussex were under the tutelage of fine ringers like Oliver Sippetts of Crawley and Alfred H Pulling of Guildford before moving to Kings Lynn in 1946. There he became master of the St Margaret's ringers and rang much with the Ely and Norwich Associations, representing the NDA as a Central Council member. Norman was a fine striker on all numbers and, despite his short frame, an excellent heavy bell ringer.

He is greatly missed especially in the Fens, and we in turn miss his cheery face. He rang about 700 peals and was awarded the BEM for services to ringing, known of course to the Sandringham Estate and its churches.

MARGARET LOVETT - GRUNDISBURGH

Margaret and her late husband Clifford came to the village from Bolney in Sussex in the early fifties and soon became integrated into local life. She rang at Grundisburgh and was skilled in many other things — embroidery, flower arranging; the whole gamut of WI activities, one might say. The Lovetts made a great contribution to the area.

STANLEY G MOSS – MISTLEY, ST MARGARET'S AND ST MARY LE TOWER, IPSWICH

Stan was the son of George W Moss of Mistley who came down from Bolsover in Derbyshire between the wars. He was a 'natural' and soon graduated from his six and eight bell opportunities to Cinques and Maximus at the Tower.

Due to illness he did little ringing after the war but always maintained his interest in the Guild.

EDNA PEACHEY - LAKENHEATH

Edna Peckett was a fen girl and lived all her life in that area of black soil, skeletal trees, fine churches and big skies. She was taught to ring by the old Lakenheath and Elveden bands, Jimmy Paul, George Miller and Co.

When she married, she became a very competent District Secretary in a part of the Guild that has always been pretty tough going.

People like Edna are the real backbone of rural ringing. How good it was to see her at the 2001 Veterans' Gathering at Debenham.

SIDNEY PHILBRICK MBE - LYME REGIS AND EWELL.

Sidney was a distinguished man, a service background as a warrant officer in the RAF, mentioned in despatches in 1964 and receiving the Palestine Medal. He died, aged 85, after a long and varied life, with interests as wide ranging as engineering, carpentry, horology and ringing. I remember meeting him just after the war and was struck then by his infectious personality.

Sidney rang a peal of Double Norwich at Stowmarket during a visit to airbases in the region and certainly had a fondness for Suffolk.

SUSAN RILEY - WHITTLESEY AND NORTHAMPTONSHIRE

Susan was a non-resident member of our Guild and, with her husband John, a frequent visitor. She was a delightful lady and a first-class ringer and, although saddened by her early death at the age of 41, we are thankful for having known her.

J Martin Thorley – Yorkshire, Rutland, Lancashire and Laxfield

League tables are fashionable these days and if one created a table for sheer enthusiasm Martin would be in the Premier Division. He was indefatigable, whether it was towers, general ringing, quarters or peals, especially the latter — nearly 3000 of them.

Supported by Paddy his wife, his three daughters, all excellent ringers, Martin was just as happy ringing Bob Doubles as Superlative Maximus. During his two sojourns in Laxfield he was Master of the Guild.

Yorkshiremen are very proud of their county and rightly so, but he loved Suffolk almost as much—who knows, perhaps more. Knew a bit about cricket too—and footnotes! We won't forget the Thorleys and to (almost) quote Dr. Johnson "if you are tired of Bob Triples you are tired of life".

ANNE WALTER - BLYTHBURGH

The ladies of Blythburgh ... and the gentlemen ... faithful ringers on that lovely six in one of the great village churches of England. Anne was one of them and much involved in local life in so many ways. How valuable are members such as she.

WILLIAM G WHITING - HELMINGHAM AND CHELMSFORD

William was always known as Wiggle due to his rather delightful handling style — a cross between Twisty Prentice and Groucho Marx — and to distinguish him from his brother Tubby!

He came from a notable Helmingham family — the Whitings: Noah was his grandfather (Noah Whiting that is) and George his father, one of the four conductors of the forty different Surprise Major methods on the bells. Those were the days when, moving on from Treble Bob and Double Norwich, the mid twenties to thirties band became one of the leaders in the country alongside Leiston and the Hertfordshire men.

Wiggle was a regular visitor to the Debenham gathering and we shall miss his amusing company. A top rate eight-bell striker in his day.

URBAN W WILDNEY - KIRBY LE SOKEN

It wasn't just that by the sixties Urban had rung exactly half his 210 peals in Suffolk that we thought of him as a bona fide full Guild member, it was that we knew he loved Suffolk as much as his north-east corner of Essex.

The Tendring Hundred knew Urban for nearly all of his ninety years as a man of integrity, ability, gentleness and encouragement; a paradigm to any belfry.

How proud he was of Kirby and Holland's bells, two of the best eights in Essex. His contribution in that area was considerable and I for one can say that some of my happiest six-bell ringing was in his company.

He rang 164 peals for the Guild, conducting many of them. We especially remember Gill who cared for him for long years.

LESLIE WRIGHT - ROUGHAM

The Sergeant-Major (or was it Captain!) — Les was a character indeed, personified by discipline in all he undertook, not least to himself, and especially in ringing. His outings were reminiscent of a military operation in Warmington on Sea but great fun, meticulously arranged and given one hundred percent.

A man of immense ability, Leslie held a number of jobs. Born at Ixworth he lived in many Suffolk and Essex places. His first wife, Ethel, a member of the pre-war ladies band in these parts, looked after him, as did Connie his second, devotedly — and they had their hands full!

The Suffolk Guild is indebted to Leslie's great energy and commitment to ringing and the Church. We shall miss his robust presence — and, of course, the whistle.

We also especially remember Margaret Arbon, widow of the late Sydney (Mendlesham), Dorothy Rose, widow of the late Richard (Dick) of Rougham and all the relatives and friends of the above.

May they rest in peace.

The number of peals rung by the Guild during 2001 was 70, a further decline and the lowest number since 1967. This does not mean that less peals are being rung in Suffolk but simply more peals are for other associations, guilds and societies. Maybe the Queen's Golden Jubilee in 2002 may see an increase in the Guild totals, although the increase in peal fee may counteract this.

Peals were rung in 34 Suffolk towers and only one tower outside the County. The first peal since restoration and augmentation of the bells was rung at Iken.

A notable performance during the year was the peal of Grandsire Triples using Holt's Original, to celebrate the 250th anniversary of this difficult composition first being rung. In 1751 it was considered too complex for someone to ring and conduct this peal at the same time and John Holt sat in the belfry and called the peal from his manuscript.

The Central Council, at their meeting in Liverpool, decided to rename the two peals of Penultimus rung during 2000 by prefixing the word 'Little' numerous times dependant upon the number of bells below the Maximus method rung first. They are therefore now known as Little Little Little Little Penultimus Little Place Major and Little Little Penultimus Little Place Royal. It would seem that you can extend a method to a higher number of bells without any prefix but you cannot reduce a method to a lesser number!





THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 1999 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- 1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
- 2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
- 3. Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
- Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
- 6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. NAME

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
 - 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref. 266869).

B. MEMBERSHIP

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A persor
 - 2.2 Associate Member:

A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell. A person who wishes to support the Guild.

- 2.3 Life Honorary Member:
- A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service
- to the Guild.
- 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member:
- A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under
- 2.1. 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. DISTRICTS

- 5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:
 - 1 North East:
- Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
 - 2 North West:
- Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
- 3 South East:
- Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
- 4 South West Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6 The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there can be Patrons and Vice-Presidents.
- 7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Vice-Presidents may be elected. Subscriptions and fees for the year beginning the following January shall be set at the AGM or a SGM.

8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Ringing Master

Secretary

Treasurer

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

Report Editor

Central Council Representatives

Technical Adviser Librarian Handbells Trustee

Peal Secretary

Public Relations Officer

Newsletter Editor

9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to certify the accounts.

10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Certified Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.

The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

- 11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
 - 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- 19 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 20 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 21 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

- 22 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 23 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.

24 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 25 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 25.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 25.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from 1 January following.
 - 25.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in
- 26 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. ELECTION OF MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription.
 - 2.4 Members over the age of 65 who have been ringing members for at least ten years shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
 - 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
 - 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
 - 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

Guild Chairman

Treasurer

Ringing Master

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

Secretary One Elected Representative from each Deanery 9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a guorum.

- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Chairman

Treasurer Secretary

Ringing Master Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGM's.

- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
- 15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings.
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council
 meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be
 determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
 - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
 - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)

16 bells generally by Shaw size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)

13 bells by Warner size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)

13 bells by various founders size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.

- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.
- 8 The Trustee and the Guild Management Committee would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

THE MITSON SHIELD AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 No Member may ring more than once in the Rose competition, except as specified in Rule 11.
- 4 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy shall be competed for as follows:

MITSON SHIELD

- 4.1 Bands shall comprise six bona fide ringers from a tower, of whom at least four are shown in the Annual Report as members of that tower.
- 4.2 The test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s).

ROSE TROPHY

- 4.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 4.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 5 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 4.
- 6 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 7 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 8 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 9 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 10 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 11 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 12 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 13 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 14 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

The 2002 AGM will take place on Saturday April 6th 2002 in the North West District. No venue has yet been arranged. The meeting agreed to the proposal of Mr John Girt that the GMC meeting in June be informed of the venue.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Mr Stephen Young informed the meeting of several amendments to the Annual Report.

Mr Geoff Pulford reminded members that the Annual Veterans' Day would be on July 11th.

Mr Rolie Whiting mentioned the change of address of B Mills, tower correspondent at Great Thurlow, this is now 28, Recreation Road, Haverhill, telephone unchanged.

Mrs Bel Rivers asked that Barsham bells be upgraded to 7, following recent work.

A query was raised about the amount of space taken up in the Annual Report for non Guild peals. After lengthy discussion, Revd Lawrence Pizzey proposed that instead of listing them all, a footnote be added to the peals section stating that "in addition to peals listed in church towers, there were peals rung at privately owned towers" This proposal was seconded by Mr John Girt.

Mr Richard Knight proposed an amendment that the listing be left as it is. This was seconded by Mr David Stanford. The amendment was defeated by 24 votes to 10.

The original proposal put by Revd Pizzey was then accepted by the meeting.

Mr Richard Knight proposed that 14 pages of peal compositions also took up expensive space in the Annual Report. He proposed that the Guild Management Committee consider whether or not these should be included, or a record kept in the Guild Library. This proposal was seconded by Mr Stephen Young and agreed.

There being no further business, the meeting closed at 4.35pm.

Income is up and expenditure overall is fairly static so we end the year with a comfortable surplus.

Much work has been done to recover tax on subscriptions/donations under the Gift Aid scheme but we will not see the fruits of our labours until all the forms sent out have been returned, the calculations completed and the claim made. This should be accomplished well before the end of the year. Do keep a supply of Gift Aid forms in your tower so that new members can fill them in when paying their first subscriptions. This will save much time and cost in sending out forms afterwards. A quick phone call to me will get you a supply whenever you run out of them.

Restoration work at East Bergholt has been completed and the Guild donated £2,000 towards the very considerable cost. In 2001 seven towers have been allocated grants totalling £17,975 and, together with the grant to Elmsett which was promised in 2000, the total allocated sum is £19,575 leaving £14,850 still available.

You will see that there is a new fund called "The Pipe Family Trust Fund". We thank Sylvia, George and Roderick Pipe for the very generous first donation that enabled it to be set up. The Management Committee added £200 and it will be further enhanced later in the year by a Gift Aid reclaim. The purpose of the fund is "for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild". It will be administered by the Guild Executive.


