2003 was for me, yet another exciting year in ringing. Taking over the Mastership for a second time presents different challenges and different problems to last time. The Guild, in my view, is still in pretty good shape. The interest in Ringing continues wherever you go and a lot of the sound work that was done for "Ring in 2000" appears to have resulted in a heightened ringing profile in the media, which can only be good for the Exercise. It is also very encouraging to see those recruited for "Ring in 2000" progressing in ringing and in the Guild. Indeed the number of new faces I have come across during the year is heartening. Seeing those that four years ago were just learning to handle, ringing Double Norwich now, is a great treat and a testament to those that have given so freely of their time to teach and forward the art.

I have not been able to visit as many meetings and practises as during my first term, but those that I have been to have been, friendly, constructive and exciting. The acceptance of "the family" at Ringing events is very positive and we must all try to promote ringing as a "Family" activity as many of those seen crawling about 6 years ago, are now ringing and continuing the family involvement in Ringing.

The Guild Striking competition was held at Polstead and Stoke by Nayland. A previous engagement prevented myself from attending and Winston officiated in my absence.

Anne Carpenter, Ian Holland, Michael Edwards and Mary Dunbavin covered the judging, awarding first place in the Mitson Shield to St Mary Le Tower and the Rose Trophy to St Mary Le Tower. The slight downturn in entrants was expected and a good effort for Southwold in 2004 would be welcomed. Despite recent trends, striking competitions can be rewarding and both fun and a learning curve. After all, good striking is what we all should be aiming for. However, the attainment should not be taken too seriously. When Katharine and I judged the Yorkshire Association Competition, the best piece technically lacked any life or spirit, and that lack of life and spirit was abundantly clear outside the tower. In my humble view, spirited ringing clearly being enjoyed by the ringers, should be the order of the day. A happy band will always sound better outside, over a tense band.

Veterans' Day, (always my favourite event), was impeccably organised by Muriel and the Debenham ringers. A few of the regular faces were missing this year, but as always a tremendous gathering from near and far. Just to be with the names and faces of the past is an education and the stories will hopefully always be remembered. Some good ringing but mostly good socialising and good company.

The bi-annual "Ringing Roadshow" was held just north of Lincoln. This was the first one at which I had not had to man a stand. Being more easterly than previous ones, a very large selection of Suffolk ringers came in cars, coaches and minibuses. The whole day is a complete eye-opener to ringing and the art of ringing. The Lincoln show was organised by Robin Rogers, whom some of you will remember from his days at Horringer. Handbells, Clay bells, mini rings, carillons, stays, muffles, computer programmes, books, a picture of the 1928 Debenham band, beer and seminars made up the day. I did try to get the 2003 event staged in Suffolk, but having seen what Robin did, I think Lincoln was, like the weather that day, ideal.

In August, Katharine and I had our second "Wolery" open day. This year was well attended again, but with a better-spaced out crowd giving more time to ringers. All seemed to have a good time and the variety of methods rung was very encouraging. Watch out for the 2004 date, if you have missed out previously.

The sight of Katharine, on the grass at Stutton, with five ringers walking a course of Plain Bob Doubles in front of her, will be the abiding memory of Training Day 2003. Eighteen students attended two courses, Plain Bob Doubles and Plain Bob Minor. Over 50 ringers helped out at three towers. All in all a wonderful day from which if just one ringer learnt one thing to help them, it will have all been worthwhile. I hope to have more learning events in 2004, mostly aimed at the beginner. However, if you need a course on anything to do with ringing, just let me know. The Guild has a huge wealth of knowledge from method ringing to tower work and beyond.

Work continues on towers in Suffolk. 2003 saw the completion of the Felixstowe and Rendham projects. Both new eights, and both interesting in their own ways. Rendham, where I have yet to ring, can be especially proud of the project which was completed quickly and efficiently, being driven along by the local ringers. Alan Moult finished work at Easton restoring this ring in an excellent manner. This job shows more than most what can be done on a budget with input from the Technical team. However I dread to think how much time Alan spent on it. The Guild can only be very grateful to have such a dedicated Technical Advisor.

On the peal ringing front, there was just two more than in 2002. Of concern is the downturn in peals of Major from 39 in 2000 to 17 in 2003. Whilst the Aldeburgh peal band continues apace, with peals of Major, there clearly is more room for effort in other areas in order to give as many members as possible the chance to do well on eight, and the Guild needs to look at this carefully as eight bell ringing is fundamental to progression to higher numbers.

The 200th peal on the bells was rung at Aldeburgh.

I was pleased to see the 50th anniversary of Diana Pipe's first peal marked with a peal at Debenham, and the two peals for Herbert Jillings' birthday, one at the tower (Huntingfield) where he rang his first peal for the Guild in 1934.

I was also very pleased to ring in the first 41 Surprise Minor for the Guild by a resident band. This has been a long time coming, but was well worth it.

There are three Suffolk born ringers who should pass the 1000th peal mark in 2004; Mary Allum, Katharine Salter and Richard Brown. Even in this day and age, it is a very creditable achievement to reach 1000 and takes a lot of doing and organisation.

I have now all Suffolk Guild peals on a database in full. With the exception of corrections, which will

take some time yet to verify, this record is correct in most details. Any members or towers who would like a copy of their Guild peal record should contact me. I am charging £5 per 100 records or part thereof for this service, with all monies going directly into the Jubilee Fund. So: cheques to Eric, and requests to me.

Whilst I would like to see more members ringing peals, it is very pleasing to see the large number enjoying quarter peal ringing. This is an area where for little effort, great strides can be made. If each Guild member this year organises one quarter for one other member to help them improve or advance, then I believe the Guild would benefit. Please see what you can do. I am currently involved with two quarter peal projects, one to ring quarters in each of the standard 41 Surprise Minor methods. Themed projects of this type can offer valuable encouragement to the less achieved members.

I must say it very pleasing to see so many beginners ringing in Suffolk. However they will remain "beginners" unless somebody helps them to advance. I personally would never have progressed at any stage of my ringing without help. Cecil Aldous, Reg Kersey, Howard Egglestone, Martin Thorley, Frank Price, Peter Ellis and many others, all took time to give me good advice and from that advice I was able to progress. As a project for 2004, if you are a ringer "who can", why not spend a little time helping a ringer "who cannot" to progress? Why not, as a beginner, ask those "who can" for advice? Perhaps a little more sharing and working together, will provide a sounder base from which to move into the future.

The other plea I would make concerns enjoying what you do. The whole point of ringing is to enjoy it. A band that rings in fear of the conductor will always perform poorly. A happy band will produce a better product than a miserable band. Relax, enjoy and the ringing will be less strained, less hesitant and better for it.

Finally, it remains for me to thank all my fellow officers with whom I have worked during the year. It is only at the sharp end that you can see exactly how much Guild work goes on unseen by most members. A thank you to all members who have greeted and welcomed my family and myself during the year. And a special "Thank you" to Katharine, George and Colin, with out whose help and support, I would never get anything done.

During the past year the Guild management committee has met three times. Attendance has looked up since the AGM, but there are still one or two spaces on the committee where deaneries have not appointed representatives. Three new members have been welcomed during the year.

The Annual General meeting, held at Barking on April 26th attracted 67 members, considerably more than the previous year's. Brian Whiting and Stephen Pettman, having completed their term of office, stood down. Winston Girling was elected Chairman, and after the most exciting election seen for years, David Salter was elected Ringing Master on the casting vote of the Chairman. The officers were all re-elected, and Ruth Suggett was elected Report editor, much to the relief of the Secretary!

Two minor rule changes were agreed, one to clarify the Trustees for the Auditors and the other to include the Pipe Family Trust Fund.

1983 marked the eightieth anniversary of the founding of the Guild. To celebrate, 105 members of the Guild together with Bishop Clive and his wife enjoyed an excellent meal, kindly organised by Liz Pettman, and afterwards we were well entertained with stories of Suffolk life in years gone by.

Plans are now in hand for a service to mark the long membership of some members. This will be in July and Bishop Richard has agreed to participate.

The website has been further developed and is updated regularly by John Pereira, and the central database is steadily improving, although more returns from members would be appreciated.

Applications for grants have been received from Wickham Skeith, Earl Stonham, Parham and Mildenhall, and enquiries received from Rumburgh and Thurston where restoration work is being considered. This contrasts with last year when no applications were made for restoration work.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

GILLIAN WAKEFIELD

The Guild library contains not only books but also archive material. Most of the archive material consists of past ringers' personal papers and photographs, but the library also possesses two handbells which are of considerable interest as they once formed part of a set which were rung by a Stradbroke band in the early 1900's. The handbells are inscribed "Presented to Herbert Bayles by Mrs F W Ffrench". Herbert Bayles was a saddler, and the verger, steeple-keeper, and clock winder at Stradbroke church for many years. Mrs Ffrench, whose husband unsuccessfully contested the Eye parliamentary seat for the Conservatives against the Liberals in 1914, must have had an affection for Herbert Bayles and his love of bells. One of the handbells is 11" in diameter, a "two-hander" and has a superb deep booming tone. The handbells were in poor condition; however Winston Girling has recently restored them beautifully, fitting them with new handles, re-fixing the clapper of the larger of the two bells, and polishing both of them, and they are now a valuable possession of the Guild.

The library also contains videos and one recent acquisition is "The Nine Tailors". This classic BBC adaptation of the novel by Dorothy Sayers stars lan Carmichael as Lord Peter Wimsey, and is interesting to ringers because of the strong bell ringing theme, and shots of actors ringing. Another recent purchase is a new training video "Look and Learn — Plain Hunt". Made by some Kent ringers the video is intended for learners grappling with the complexities of rope sight and coursing orders. Some of the material is presented very well, some of it is difficult to follow, but overall this video will be helpful to new ringers. A third video, "Campane alla Bolognese" donated by Stephen Pettman, shows ringing Bolognese style, and for those who haven't seen Italian bell ringers standing on the bell frame, pushing the bells with their hands, and jumping on the headstocks to raise the bells, it is a "must". There are also some wonderful sequences of a 90 year old Italian ringer chiming the all the bells by means of cords attached to his hands and feet.

The library has been used more than ever this year. Do continue to use it to borrow books or videos, or for information on bells or bellringing.

BELFRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

WINSTON GIRLING AND ALAN MOULT

Meetings of the above Committee were held during February, June and October, 2003. The following is a summary of the matters discussed.

Thurston — Work is to start in February, 2004 to rehang and augment to 6 in a new steel frame. The new frame will be easily adapted to house 8 bells if this becomes possible at a later date.

Rumburgh — Severe frame movement and other problems has necessitated moves to rehang and augment this peal of 5 bells. The tower is unusual in that only the southern half of the bell chamber is taken up by the present wooden frame and it will be possible to install a new steel frame for 6 bells in the remaining empty northern part of the chamber. The old frame will be left in situ.

Sudbury, All Saints — Following recent tower repairs these bells could again be rung but unfortunately the 7^{th} headstock was found to be badly decayed preventing the bell being rung full circle. The Parish has now decided to re—hang this one bell on modern fittings.

Bramford — Early in 2003 it was reported that ringing had been stopped because of problems with the tower buttresses. At the present time (December 2003) fund raising is going ahead and hopefully the tower will be repaired as soon as possible.

Wickham Market — Tower repairs at this Church have been completed and ringing commenced again towards the end of 2003.

Wickham Skeith — The 6 bells have become unsafe owing to severe wear in the gudgeons and other problems. However, the Day wooden frame is still in excellent condition and a restoration and rehanging of these bells in the old frame is to take place. Wickham Skeith and Thornham Magna were once two of the towers which shared an enthusiastic and competent peal band, and it is excellent news that Wickham's bells will now be restored and preserved for future generations.

Whepstead — Recent problems with the 'go' of the tenor on this peal of 5 revealed that all are very much time expired and Alan Moult has recommended complete restoration as soon as possible. Temporary repairs were made to the tenor bell which means that all 5 can still be rung for the time being and the Church is looking at the possibility of rehanging in due course.

Felixstowe, St. John — A great success story. A new peal of 8 bells on the Felixstowe peninsula to join the 6 not too far away. The packed Church at the Dedication bore witness to the importance of this new installation and an excellent peal of bells has resulted. Congratulations to all concerned.

Easton — The peal of 6 bells have now been restored and rehung in the old wooden frame. The frame was first lifted and RSJ's inserted underneath to replace the original wooden frame supports which were much decayed. Alan Moult and Committee members then completely restored the bells and fittings which were rehung in the old frame. This was a long term job which was very successful and the bells can now be rung again. Alan has spent many, many hours carrying this out and congratulations and thanks are due to all for their efforts.

Wissett — It has been reported that a major restoration is being seriously considered for this peal of 6.

Middleton — There is some interest in restoring this unringable 5.

Stowmarket — During the summer the bells were out of action for 2 weeks. During this time all of the vertical tie rods on the wooden Bowell frame were fitted with new metal plates and half cotters and other metal fixings on the frame were repaired as necessary. Following this work, carried out by Winston and Carol Girling, the frame could then be tightened properly for the first time for many years and the bells are reported to be considerably easier to ring. The Church has agreed that in the long term it will consider rehanging in a new 10 bell steel frame as the present frame is now well over 100 years old and is proving more and more difficult to repair.

Earl Stonham — Complete restoration involving a new steel frame and possible augmentation to 8 is likely to to start soon.

Parham — A tower with at present 3 chiming bells, 2 of them 14^{th} century. The Church intends to rehang the existing treble and tenor bells and and install a new second bell with full ringing fittings in a new bellframe and augment to a peal of 6 with a 6cwt tenor. The present medieval wooden bell frame is to be preserved. It is believed that long ago there were 4 bells in this tower which were rung full circle, but documentation is scarce.

Mildenhall — Large cracks in the tower walls have prevented much ringing of the whole peal of 10 bells and consequently ringing is restricted to the front six only. The Church is taking steps to carry out some restoration on the front six so that these bells can continue to be rung.

 $\mbox{{\sc Rougham}}-\mbox{{\sc All}}$ the bells have been lifted and the bearings cleaned and repacked.

Ixworth — Some work has been done to improve the 'go' of the bells.

Thank you to all who have helped in any way with restoration, repairs, cleaning out towers and general bell work over the last year. Our Suffolk bell installations are nearly all in flint rubble towers which are notoriously susceptible to integrity problems. Add on the (all too often) tendency for ailing bells to be neglected in favour of other Church repairs and the long, uphill task ahead of us becomes all too clear. We must keep up the excellent work of the last few years.

DIRECTORY OF SUFFOLK TOWERS

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers will not support or condone any attempts by its members or indeed anyone else to ring on bells which are classified as condition 3 or below. At these churches the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or deputy, and if necessary the architect concerned, must be present when assessment of the bells or tower is taking place.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The accounts for 2003 (not audited) show our finances to be in a healthy state at this time. The balance in the general fund remains sufficient to cover a years expenditure after the regular transfers to other funds have been made and with gift aid refund and interest payments allocated directly to the restoration account. While it is not proposed to increase the subscriptions for the coming year we must not be too complacent as the following table would seem to indicate:

Some unfortunate trends can be observed. The number of junior members has steadily decreased. The number of senior member paying reduced or nil subscription has increased at the expense of the adult members. Naturally we would wish that these trends can be reversed but if not then income must inevitably decrease. If not offset by increased subscriptions (not always a popular move) or other remedy, our ability to help towers by grants for restoration or augmentation eventually could well be diminished. The G.M.C. is at present considering its options.

Grants paid this year amounted to £6,650 and grants promised on satisfactory completion of the work amounted to £15,000 leaving £20,143 still available in the restoration fund.

Finally may I make my annual plea for all taxpaying members who have not yet filled a Gift Aid declaration to consider doing so. The accounts will show you what a considerable sum has already been clawed back and that from less than 50% of the members. We could do much better. There is no commitment to pay a set amount over a set period as with the previous covenants. If your tower captain does not have one of the forms to hand just telephone me and I will send one.

His was the land of Polstead and the Naylands - what prettier? - and in all he did, warmth and humour shone through.

BERTHA HARDMAN née REEVE

IPSWICH, TATTINGSTONE AND PRESTBURY

Bertha Reeve with eight other ladies (what a catch!) was taught by Cecil Aldous at St Matthew's, Ipswich in 1935. Some measure of her flair, was the ringing of a peal of maximus at the Tower for only her fourth peal; no mean feat even in those days.

During the war Bertha was a Sergeant Major in the ATS, no doubt the reason for her disciplined approach to things. She was utterly dependable, a real worker and it was her determination that saw Tattingstone bells restored and made six.

We missed her when she moved to Prestbury in 1981 but she took with her the (first) Honorary Life Membership of our Guild. As one can imagine, she made her contribution in Gloucestershire too, right up to her death when she almost reached ninety.

DR DAVID R M HEIGHTON

Norwich

President of our neighbouring Association, the NDA, David died in April aged 68. He was also a Ringing master at 'St Peter in the Magna Crofta' - Mancroft, one of the most famous towers in the land.

Chorister at Norwich Cathedral, David read medicine at Bristol University and eventually returned as a GP at Saxlingham Nethergate. He was very effective in office, a great encourager of young ringers, indefatigable collector of towers (over 3000 worldwide) and loved peals. Small of stature, he certainly made up for it by his infectious enthusiasm and always retained his fondness for Norfolk, Bristol and Suffolk, where he had been a Life member for almost fifty years. A memorial service was held for him at St Peter Mancroft in June.

ALFRED HONEYWOOD

MISTIRY

Alf was 79 and was taught by his father, also Alfred in 1946. Another Life member, he rang 86 peals mostly in the Tendring Hundred of Essex.

Contemporary of George Moss, Daisy Andrews and others, Alf was a staunch figure in the Stour Valley area and will be missed.

COLIN LOKE

HENLEY AND ASHBOCKING

Coming under the influence of Howard Egglestone, one of our past Masters in the late sixties, Colin became proficient in six and eight bell ringing and was especially fond of Spliced Minor. He much enjoyed his time in Suffolk and we were sorry to read of his passing aged 71.

PHYLLIS EVELYN MARRIOTT (née TILLETT) IPSWICH

Phyll came from a good stable, as they say; she was the sixth generation of the Naunton-Tillett family to ring - a fine pedigree indeed.

In 1933 aged 14 she became the youngest person to ring a 12 bell peal - Grandsire Cinques, a record that was to stand until 1948. By 17, she had rung peals of Superlative and Rochester Maximus, no small achievement pre-war. Following on from her father Ben, grandfather Fred and great-uncle Bill she was the pride of the old Tower band. Ill health prevented her doing much ringing after 1939 although she maintained a keen interest up to her death and loved events like the Rushmere Outing.

HARRY J MILLATT

COLCHESTER

A well-known ringer on the Essex-Suffolk border, Harry died at the great age of 88. Until the last few months one could be excused for thinking he was no more than 70. Except for the belt and the voice. The belt (holster) got lower and lower and the voice not guite the bark for Stedman Triples and Double Norwich that it was.

Taught by George Andrews at Thorrington in the thirties, Harry's contribution to NE Essex and his friendship in Suffolk will long be remembered. A very useful ringer on six and eight, conductor too, we shall miss his shiny face and keen ear and eye. Of the many anecdotes, one comes to mind when Harry was chairing a meeting after a particularly greasy tea. Tapping the table he said 'has anyone anything to bring up - in AOB'. Laughter - when he saw the joke he took it in good part.

RAYMOND MITSON

EARL STONHAM

Cousin of Hubert (donor of the Guild's Striking Competition Shield) and brother of John, Ray served the Church and ringing for many years. He remembered of course the old band at Stowmarket and Frank Sterry and others at Earl Stonham and Mendlesham.

How pleased he was that plans were afoot to restore and augment his local bells; like David Barnard he will be remembered on Dedication Day.

JOHN J PRENTICE

BARKING

I think it was dear Bob Lester who gave John his nickname 'Twisty', due to the ballet-like style he had coming down from backstroke - a sort of corkscrew effect.

Lovely chap John and many's the happy hour I spent on Barking bells looking out over that fine church and the ghosts of Samuel de la Bere and George Read, priests there in John's time.

HILDA GWENDOLEN SNOWDEN

HALSTEAD AND GOSFIELD

Sadly these days it seems politically incorrect to single out a lady ringer for being a lady but there is no doubt, in her day, Hilda was an outstanding lady ringer. This was mainly due to her prowess on heavy bells, something essayed only by Edith K Fletcher (née Parker) up to the 1930's.

Fine tenor ringer she certainly was but also a precision striker and stylist anywhere in the circle. Strong on opinion, criticism and loyalty, Hilda was certainly her own person. Immensely gifted too; piano, organ, golf, management, driving and much more. Her contribution to Essex ringing in office, teaching and restoration work and to the Ladies' Guild was huge and she will be a name talked about for generations.

Amongst many heavy bell performances - her greatest? Perhaps the 10th at Exeter (33cwt) to a peal in the 1950's.

G ANTHONY SUTHERLAND

HALESWORTH AND LOWESTOFT

Michael Parker's fine tribute to Tony in the Guild Newsletter said it all. A popular figure in both the NDA Eastern District, in north east Suffolk and beyond, Tony Sutherland's membership exceeded fifty years. His other middle name was surely 'helper' for that is what he did so well in the Halesworth area, Lowestoft and Kessingland in particular.



SECRETARY'S REPORT

This year has been another fairly successful year, but attendance at meetings could have been better especially at the October practice where nine ringers attended. In the last twelve months, the average attendance at practices has bee 17 and at meetings 31 - hardly impressive from a District membership of 280. However, once again the outing was nearly fully booked and everyone enjoyed themselves in the Peterborough area. Sadly many of these members we do not see at Guild or District meetings. Does this tell us anything?

During the year 19 members were lost but of these 12 gave up ringing for various reasons including poor health/age, or other commitments. 7 left the county and little can be done about that. Three

members have not yet paid but may later, but they are still members who ring little, if at all, or only ring in their own towers, so I feel we must class their subscription as a bonus to our accounts. On the plus side, 18 new members have joined, so let's give them every encouragement and keep them as active ringers.

The District account continues to look healthy, but because of lack of numbers at some practices we would have had a shortfall had we not introduced Draws at meetings by popular request and the outing had not made a profit. We did give the Guild Bell Fund £100 during the year.

One problem I have when I come to do the accounts is that many towers have \underline{not} banked their donation cheques from up to 6 months ago. At the time of writing, 6 cheques totalling £50 have not been banked, making the bank balance a rather deceiving £228. Please bank them.

The Guild AGM was held at our District at Offton and Barking, which was very enjoyable. Learners' practices were held at Hollesley, Burgh and Hacheston and were fairly well attended.

The number of peals rung by the Guild showed a slight increase to 69 in 2003, from the 67 rung in 2002. Peals were rung in 40 Suffolk towers and 2 other towers outside the county, i.e. East Retford, Notts and Peterborough Cathedral.

The first peal on the bells since restoration and augmentation was rung at Rendham during the year. A peal was rung at Stoke by Clare and at Walsham-le-Willows on the 100th anniversary of the first peal on those bells.

The peal of the 41 regular Surprise Minor rung on the mini-ring at Old Stoke, Ipswich was the first time that this has been rung for the Guild by an entirely resident band. It is remarkable that not a single peal of Stedman was rung during the year, although Grandsire seems to have made a comeback, especially of triples and caters.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 2003 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- 1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
- 2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
- 3. Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
- Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
- 6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. NAME

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
 - 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).
 - 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be the Guild Executive, as defined in Rule I 13.

B. Membership

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to
 - the Guild.
 - 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who

resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1,

- 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. DISTRICTS

- 5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:
 - 1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
 - 2 North West: Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
 - 3 South East: Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
 - 4 South West Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6 The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there can be Patrons and Vice-Presidents.
- 7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Vice-Presidents may be elected. Subscriptions and fees for the year beginning the following January shall be set at the AGM or a SGM.

Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Secretary Treasurer

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

Report Editor

Central Council Representatives

Technical Adviser

Librarian

Handbells Trustee

Peal Secretary

Public Relations Officer

Newsletter Editor

The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to certify the accounts.

10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Certified Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.

The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

- 11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
 - 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- 19 The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
- 20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 22 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be

published in the Annual Report.

- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.
- G. GENERAL
- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect
 - from 1 January following.

 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

- H. ELECTION OF MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS
- Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is
 - unpaid.2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year
 - and the whole of the following year.
 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription.
 2.4 Members over the age of 65 who have been ringing members for at least ten years shall pay no
- subscription.

 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members.
- For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

1. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
 - 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
 - 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
 - 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

Guild Chairman

Ringing Master Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee
Secretary One Elected Representative from each Deanery

9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.

Treasurer

- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Chairman Treasurer Secretary

Ringing Master Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGM's.

- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
- 15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings.
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council
 meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be
 determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
 - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work
 - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)

16 bells generally by Shaw size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)

13 bells by Warner size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)

13 bells by various founders size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.

- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.
- 8 The Trustee and the Guild Management Committee would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

THE MITSON SHIELD AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 No Member may ring more than once in the Rose competition, except as specified in Rule 11.
- 4 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy shall be competed for as follows:

MITSON SHIELD

- 4.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
 - a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual report
 - b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 4.2 The test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s).

ROSE TROPHY

- 4.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 4.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 5 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 4.
- 6 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 7 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 8 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 9 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 10 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 11 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 12 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 13 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 14 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 2003

Minutes of The Annual General Meeting of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers held on Saturday 26th April 2003 at Barking.

The Chairman, Mr Brian Whiting, opened the meeting and welcomed the 67 members present. He thanked Revd. Brian Redgers for a very enjoyable and unusual service, and Paul Chapman for playing the organ. He also thanked Peta Whiting and her band of helpers from Offton for providing the tea.

2. Apologies for absence were received from John Taylor, the Bredfield Ringers, Michael and Jennifer Warren, Margaret Roberts, Jonathan Stevens, Suzanne Stevens, Richard Wilson, Ralph and Tessa Earey, Angela Cable, Mary Ridd, Peter Davies, John Barry, Roger Coley, Sue McCouaig, Alan Munnings, Chris Munnings, Lesley Southgate, Alan Foreman, Audrey Foreman, Kate Eagle, Mary Garner, Katharine Salter, Ian Holland, Robin Allum, Hannah Kidger, Gill Waterson, Margaret Cherry, Ann and David Jessop, Ed and Mary Hynard, Stefan Labedzki, Charles Ablitt, Sue Freeman, Tinker Lockwood, Paul Simon, Richard Pegg, Joyce Lester, Ruth Suggett.

3. Minutes of the 2002 AGM

These had been previously published in the Annual Report. It was proposed by Stephen Young, seconded by Canon Lawrence Pizzey and agreed that these be accepted.

4. Matters Arising

David Salter raised a query about peal number 7867, which the 2002 AGM had agreed should be struck from the record as Frank Price, a non member had taken part. He proposed, and Trevor Hughes seconded that this peal be reinstated. The meeting agreed to this proposal by 17 votes to 11. It was then proposed by Richard Knight and seconded by David Salter that the GMC look to clarifying rule B 2.4 to ensure that NRLMs moving into the Guild's geographic area become full ringing members if they wish to continue their membership of the Guild.

5. Officers' Reports:

At the end of his five year term of office, Brian Whiting expressed his enjoyment of his time as Chairman. During that time, membership had increased as had the Guild's financial resources. The Restoration Fund had made grants of over £50,000 in that time, thanks to the policy on subscriptions and peal fees.

On the negative side, he had been disappointed at the response to his attempts to revive the St Edmund Clapper competition. He also expressed his disappointment at the disloyalty shown by certain members in ringing peals in Suffolk towers by Suffolk bands, and crediting them to other associations.

Master: Stephen Pettman presented his report, giving special thanks to his wife for the excellent dinner for the Guild's 80th Anniversary, which was enjoyed by all who attended. David Salter made considerable criticism about aspects of the Jubilee Quarter Peal project, a matter which, it was pointed out, had been thoroughly aired by the GMC. Following explanations and apologies from certain ringers, the GMC had agreed to safeguards being put

in place to prevent further similar problems, and the matter was now closed. The Master's report was accepted.

Secretary: Sandra Pereira presented the Secretary's report as printed. This was accepted by the meeting.

Treasurer: In presenting the accounts for the year, Eric Bull corrected an error in the printed version. He again emphasised the benefits of Gift Aid to the Guild. The accounts were accepted by the meeting.

Public Relations Officer: Stephen Pettman gave a brief verbal report, emphasising that no complaints about ringing had been received during the year. His report was agreed.

Technical Adviser and Belfry Advisory Committee: Winston Girling proposed that the report as written be adopted. This was agreed.

Librarian: Gillian Wakefield proposed that the Librarian's report as published be adopted. This was agreed.

Peal Secretary: In the absence of the Peal Secretary, the meeting agreed to adopt his report as written.

Handbell Trustee: The Chairman gave a verbal report reminding members that there are handbell sets in SW and NE districts, and two sets in his care. All were in good order. He proposed that the report be adopted. This was agreed.

Trevor Hughes proposed, seconded by Stephen Young, that these subscriptions and donations be accepted. This was agreed by the meeting.

John Pereira suggested that we take a careful look at the membership in relation to rule H 2.4, as at some point in the future, the number of paying members will make it difficult to raise the funds to keep the Guild running.

He was advised that the GMC already had this matter in hand, and some research was being undertaken.

7. Election of Officers for 2003/2004:

Vice-Presidents: Stephen Young proposed, seconded by Winnie Lockwood that the Vice Presidents as listed in the 2002 Annual Report be re-elected en bloc. This was agreed.

Stephen Pettman proposed, seconded by George Pipe that Brian Whiting be elected to the position of Vice President on his retirement from the position of Chairman. This was agreed by the meeting.

Chairman: David Salter proposed, seconded by Stuart Harrison, that Winston Girling be elected as Chairman. Mr Girling was elected, and subsequently took the chair.

Ringing Master: There were two nominations for Ringing Master. Mary Garner was proposed by Stephen Pettman and seconded by Diana Pipe, and David Salter was proposed by Stephen Young, seconded by Gordon Slack. Following a ballot which produced a dead heat (33 votes each), Mr Salter was elected on the Chairman's casting vote.

Peal Secretary: David Salter proposed, seconded by Mandy Shedden, that Alan Mayle be reelected as Peal Secretary. Mr Mayle was elected.

Auditor: Revd Brian Redgers proposed, seconded by Maurice Rose, that Larking Gowen be reelected as Auditor. This was agreed.

Handbell Trustee: Winnie Lockwood proposed, seconded by John Pereira, that Brian Whiting be re-elected as Handbell Trustee. Mr Whiting was elected.

10. Proposal for Rule Additions

A proposal was put to the meeting by the GMC to add the following to the Constitution and Rules:

Rule A 1.3 to read:

The Trustees of the Guild shall be the Guild Executive, as defined in Rule J 13.1

Rule E 19 to read:

'The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild Executive.'

As a consequence of this addition, Rules E 19, 20 and 21 will become E 20, 21, 22; rules F22, 23, 24, will become F 23, 24, 25; rules G 25, 25.1, 25.2, 25.3 and 26 will become G26, 26.1, 26.2, 26.3 and 27.

These proposed additions were notified to members in the Ringing World on Friday 11th April 2003.

The first addition was proposed as a result of a query from the Auditors about the Charity Trustees of the Guild. The second was a necessity following the setting up of the new Trust Fund.

The 2004 AGM will take place on Saturday April 17th 2004 in the South West District; venue has yet to be arranged.

12. Any Other Business

Winnie Lockwood thanked the Guild for the card sent with best wishes for her and Tinker's Golden Wedding. She also expressed her delight at revisiting Offton, where she had first rung. In answer to a query about the Ringing World Roadshow, it appeared that individuals were making their own arrangements to visit this.

The Ringing Master announced that David Heighton, President of the Norwich Diocesan Association of Change Ringers had died recently. The Secretary agreed to send a message of sympathy to the NDA.

Stephen Pettman reported a quarter peal rung at Monewden, where the ringers were his two young nieces, and four girls from Grundisburgh, including Ruth Eagle who conducted. The average age of the ringers was 13 years 11 months and 23 days.

He also expressed the hope that Chairman and Ringing Master would cease their habit of ringing peals in Suffolk with Suffolk ringers in the name of other associations.


David Salter agreed to start doing What's On from July. Districts were asked to be more forthcoming with data for What's On.




