It has been a very quiet year ringing- wise for me, with family and work commitments quite rightly reducing the amount of time I have been able to spend at practices and meetings. However I have done my best and been welcomed at the practices and meetings I have attended. The SW outing to Essex was most enjoyable, the NE Striking competition great fun and produced some excellent ringing, very difficult to judge. Touch of the year however was at a NW District practice where as I arrived they were ringing a most perfect course of Cambridge Minor, well paced, well struck and totally overwhelming in its effect; bringing out the very best of the Pakenham bells - exactly what we all should be aspiring to every time.

The AGM at Sudbury, whilst not particularly well attended, provided a rare chance to ring on the unique bells of All Saint's. Good use was made of both St Gregory's and St Peter's after the meeting, with a higher number of members participating in the ringing than usual. However, it is disheartening that some members come to a ringing meeting then do not ring.

The six bell Striking Competition was held at Reydon and the eight bell at Southwold. A very pleasant afternoon in Adnam's country resulted in St Mary Le Tower winning both competitions.

As usual Muriel produced a memorable Veterans' Day, with members from all over the country and county attending, and all had a great time. There was good ringing interspersed with good company, chat and anecdotes, making this event a highlight of any year. The Guild owes a big thank you to Muriel and the Debenham Ringers.

The following Sunday we had the Loyalty Service at Debenham. Whilst it was open to all members, the GMC decided that those members whose names appear in 25 or more reports prior to 2003 would receive personal invitations. We could only go on the official information provided in the report and it does seem that there have been admin/secretarial errors in years gone by. Anyway these criteria resulted in a list of 110 members qualifying, of whom 65 attended, 20 did not reply and 25 were unable to attend. The result was a church packed with 120 people, the Guild President, Bishop Richard, thanked every member of the Guild for their past and continuing support of ringing in Suffolk. During the service three leads of Kent Treble Bob Major were rung on the bells by a band, all of whom had been members for more than 42 years, giving a combined band total of 376 years' membership. Tea followed in Dove Cottage with open ringing into the early evening. My thanks go to everybody who helped make the afternoon so special. Loyalty is something that often gets overlooked and we must ensure we care for all our members not just the few. I still consider some form of acknowledgement, long service certificate, gold watch or such like should be taken on by the GMC, and now we have a database it is so easy to check.

The SW Open Day, on 2 October 2004, to raise funds for All Saints, was a huge success, largely due to superb organisation by Rolie and his team. The GMC has agreed to a bi-annual open day, starting in 2006, to raise funds for the Guild Restoration fund.

The main training day was held at Stutton on 17 September 2004, again offering two courses, Plain Bob Doubles and Plain Bob Minor. Whilst not as well attended as last year good work was done with the students who did attend. Following requests for courses an additional training day was held on 16 October 2004. This was designed to cover belfry maintenance, teaching beginners, rounds and call changes and method learning. Only the rounds and call changes course ran because of a lack of sup-

port. This was a shame as there is clearly a need for both belfry maintenance and teaching beginners in Suffolk. The number of restoration jobs which have been done in the last ten years that are now odd struck or go badly needs addressing and we must get across that a restoration requires on-going attention in order to assure the longevity of the ring. It still astounds me that ringers who do not know how to do it offer advice to beginners or learners.

During the year I provided one tower peal history and three ringers' peal histories from the Guild Peal Database. Hopefully the Jubilee Fund will have benefited as outlined last year. I am happy to continue and if you would like your details please contact me directly.

During the year we have approved grants at Earl Stonham, where Taylor's have done a terrific job, Thurston and Wickham Skeith. On the whole, bell restoration work these days is very good, but it is disappointing when locals cannot get their bells up right or there are speed/timing/clappering problems, given what the work costs, this should not happen. We also need to remember that the DAC advice is just that. If you want to replace the frame and the DAC says no, appeal. At the end of the day, it is the local tower, local church, local ringers who are going to use the bells, not the DAC and if the Diocese wants to keep ringing alive, then the local ringers' views must be taken into consideration. It does concern me that a lot of advice I hear bandied about is not based on provable facts, just on the giver's personal views. We have a broad spectrum of experience in the Guild. As with ringing itself it is better to ask those that know; Alan Moult, Winston Girling and the Belfry Advisory team will all offer impartial advice, which is not mandatory but can be relied on to be informed.

At 76, the 2004 peal total was average, but the total number of peals rung in Suffolk continues to be high, mostly because of the handbell band at Bacton whose output is prolific at present. They must be congratulated for their 15 in a day (31st October) - a stunning performance.

2004 saw several record performances. Richard Brown, who whilst not being born in Suffolk learnt to ring in the NE, reached his 1000th peal. Mary Allum & Katharine Salter, both Suffolk born also reached the 1000th peal milestone. Stephen Pettman became only the fourth person to ring 1000+peals for the Guild, joining myself, Lester Brett and Martin Thorley. Alan Mayle became only the eighth person to ring 750 peals for the Guild and is now fourth in the conductors' table. Stephen Pettman also passed 800th as conductor for the Guild, the first person to do this. There were 9 first in the methods for the Guild, most coming from the continuing activities of the Aldeburgh peal band. I was pleased to be able to ring in the peal to mark the 50th anniversary of Muriel Page's first peal. It was good to see performances to mark the 100th anniversary of first peals at Ashbocking and Haverhill, a very fitting way to remember the exploits of our predecessors. Congratulations go to all first pealers and first as conductors, hopefully you will not have been put off but will have discovered the joy, challenges and fun of peal ringing.

Harkstead is only the second Suffolk tower to have had a 720 of each of the standard 41 surprise rung in it. It was a very worthwhile project and now we are trying the 29 Treble Bob.

Although not Guild members, the Exercise lost two ringers during the year, who will have had an effect on every ringer. William J Hall, who set up the main Internet peal Database, which has now at his family's request been taken over by the Ringing World. David W Beard, who was solely responsible for BYROC and its associated programmes. In both cases they will be greatly missed but their legacy will live on.

My thanks go to my fellow officers, for their help and assistance throughout the year, always there, always helpful, currently a first rate team. And of course my thanks to Katharine and the boys for supporting me throughout the year.

And finally, a big thank you to everybody that has helped, supported or attended Guild events throughout the year and rung Suffolk's bells. We need to try to involve all members at all levels so that we stand as one Guild dedicated to the furtherance of ringing in Suffolk.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

GILLIAN WAKEFIELD

During the past year the Guild library has been used frequently, both by ringers wanting to borrow books and by people with requests for information on a variety of topics related to bells and bellringing. The library catalogue is published on the Suffolk Guild web-site and it is evident that this is consulted by people outside the Guild, as requests for information this year have come not only from Suffolk, but from Hampshire, Essex and even the USA.

One request was for information on the medieval casting of bells and it was very interesting to find references to this in several books in the library. One of the acquisitions made this year is "The Craft of the Bell Founder" by George Elphick. This book traces the history of the craft from prehistoric China to the present day and every aspect of the craft is covered, from the mining, smelting, purifying and alloying of the metal, through design, moulding, casting, tuning and repair of bells. The author even attempts to look into the future.

Each year ringers kindly donate items to the library, and this year I am grateful to Jonathan Stevens for the video recording of the BBC's televised broadcast of Songs of Praise. Made in 1992, this video shows 1000 ringers at a service at St. Martin's in the Fields in London, and includes an interview with one very well known Ipswich ringer speaking about the part ringing plays in worship. Bruce Wakefield has also been very generous in donating several of his own books on ringing and methods.

So do use the free service of the library for information, or to borrow books, records, tapes and videos.

As usual during the past year the Guild management committee has met three times. Attendance has been better than in the past, two new members have been welcomed and two returning ones.

The Annual General meeting, held at Sudbury on April 26th attracted a mere 43 members, the lowest in living memory. This was especially disappointing as there had been the opportunity to ring the bells in the newly repaired tower at All Saints. The officers were all re-elected, with the exception of Alan Mayle, who was thanked for twenty years' service as Peal Secretary. The new Peal Secretary elected is Christine Knight. The post of Public Relations Officer was again left vacant.

Two rule changes were agreed, one to clarify the position and definition of non resident life member Rule H5, and the second to agree that members who attain the age of 65 pay a reduced subscription, irrespective of length of membership. (H 2.3)

In July a service was held to celebrate the long service of a number of members. We were privileged to have our President, Bishop Richard, to speak to a full Debenham church on this occasion.

Alongside the distribution to all towers of guidelines for Child Protection procedures, a letter was sent from Bishop Richard and the Guild reminding all towers of their obligations in this matter. It is important that all bands are aware of the implications of Child protection legislation and that they all have procedures in place to ensure that they comply with the law at all times.

The website has been further developed and is updated regularly by John Pereira, and the central database is steadily improving, although more returns from members would be appreciated.

Applications for grants have been received from Parham, Rumburgh, Mildenhall and Gislingham and enquiries received for extra help from Earl Stonham and Wickham Skeith. The restorations at Earl Stonham, Wickham Skeith and Rumburgh are now complete.

During the course of the year a number of officers have indicated their wish to stand down. The Secretary and Treasurer, under the five year rule, must be replaced and Honorary Technical Adviser and Newsletter Editor, as well as Chairman of Belfry Advisory Committee have also indicated their intention to step down. Together with the vacancy for Public Relations Officer, these vacancies offer the Guild a unique opportunity to make positive strides into the future with some new blood at the helm.

I have enjoyed my five years as Secretary. It has been an interesting experience with some difficult moments. and I wish my successor all the best in the next five years.

BELFRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

WINSTON GIRLING AND ALAN MOULT

This year has seen many days of work by volunteers from the Guild at the various towers where projects are in progress. This has helped save thousands of pounds across the diocese with the result of adding several pleasant and easy-going rings to the number already available. The technical advisor would like to express his thanks to all the volunteers, particularly those where he has organised the help on behalf of the parish and volunteers have agreed to help at towers at a considerable distance from their homes. Thank you.

The year 2004 has proved to be a very busy year with several major projects being completed. The following is a summary of work carried out or agreed and any known changes in condition of rings in the diocese.

Earl Stonham. The five bells have been rehung in metal frames for eight bells and augmented to six, leaving two vacant pits for future augmentation.

Thurston. The five bells have been rehung with all new fittings in a new metal frame for six bells, leaving a vacant pit for future augmentation.

Wickham Skeith. The six bells have been rehung with all new fittings in the existing frame.

Rumburgh. The five bells have been rehung with all new fittings in a new metal frame, with the addition of a new treble. The interesting and historic old frame is retained in situ at the side of the new frame in this odd shaped rectangular tower.

Mildenhall. The headstocks from bells three to six have been removed for the fitting of new gudgeons and ball bearings to replace the old plain bearings. The existing ball bearings on bells one and two are to be cleaned, regreased and refitted. The work is scheduled to be completed by early February 2005.

Easton. The swing-chiming bell has been rehung with new fittings in the spire.

Sudbury All Saints. The aim is to rehang the seventh bell on new fittings to allow the bell to be rung. The South West district Open Towers Day raised the sum of £783 towards the project. Agreement has yet to be reached on the work to be carried out.

Parham. Fundraising is well advanced to rehang two of the three bells for full circle ringing, augmented to six in an eight bell frame. The bells are currently hung dead, and bell number 2 will be hung for swing chiming as a service bell.

Rattlesden. The PCC has agreed to the rehanging of the existing six bells in the existing frame. The frame is an unusual steel design by Day of Eye.

Gislingham. The parish have obtained tentative agreement from English Heritage to rehang the six bells with all new fittings in a new eight-bell frame. The project fundraising is to be launched in January 2005.

Hopton. Fundraising has started to rehang the six bells with all new fittings in an eight-bell frame.

Monks Eleigh. Agreement has been reached to permanently fill in the 'hole' in the floor of the timber ringing gallery. This will allow the removal of the low hand railing around the 'hole' on which ropes have caught in the past.

Wrentham. Ringing has stopped due to the condition of the tower.

Copdock. It has been reported that ringing has been restricted to services only due to the condition of the tower.

Sadly, George Pipe announced his resignation from the Belfry Advisory Committee during the year, following many years of support for the committee and the many projects that have taken place around the diocese. Thank you, George, for your hard work, help and support.

In addition, both Alan and Winston have announced their intentions to step down as Guild Technical Advisor and Chairman of the BAC respectively at the AGM in April 2005. We would like to thank all those on and off the BAC and GMC for their help and support over the years.

The accounts for 2004 show our finances to be in a healthy state. The balance in the general fund is only a little more than that of 2003. It amply covers a year's expenditure after the regular transfers to other funds have been made and with gift aid refund and interest payments allocated directly to the restoration account. It would seem that we have the balance about right. We consider that we need only keep in the general fund sufficient to guarantee solvency for the coming year the rest we can dedicate to keeping our bells ringing.

Grants paid this year amounted to £14,540.00 and grants promised during the year to be paid on satisfactory completion of the work amount to £16,040.00. This leaves a total of £16,500.00 of grants promised but yet to be paid. A fund of £12,822.22 is still available for approved restoration work.

The greater part of the fund available for grants comes from the subscriptions of members. This year the tax claw back added £960.83 (if you are a tax payer and have not yet filled in a Gift Aid declaration please do so — it does not cost you anything but you can see how the cause of bell-ringing benefits). By the way, if you no longer pay tax don't forget to let the Gift Aid Secretary know — it is illegal to claim if insufficient tax is paid by the member. Another important contribution is made by the members of the "Affiliation Scheme". Those members are P.C.C.s who, every year, donate say £10 to £25. This year the donations amounted to £1159.50. A list of those members is printed elsewhere in this report. Many of those members have already received grants and all give to help other churches in need. If your church is not on that list you may care to commend the scheme to your P.C.C. - you never know, your tower might be in need of a grant in the future. Help is not restricted only to those who give regularly but I am sure that one would feel easier requesting a grant when one has, over the years, helped others.

In April I will have completed my maximum of five years in office and, at the Annual General Meeting will be handing over to a new Treasurer. It has been an interesting task and one that has enlarged my database (computer speak) of friends considerably.

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or Maintenance Officer.

KEY

The key of a ring (ie the note of the tenor) is given in cents (ie, hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C#-20, and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

The number of peals rung for the Guild in 2004 was 76. This increase, from the 69 rung in 2003, continues a modest upward trend. Peals were rung in 38 Suffolk towers. Members also rang peals at 4 towers outside the county, namely Tibenham and North Lopham in Norfolk, St John's, Peterborough and The Swan Tower, Perth, Western Australia.

A peal was rung at Haverhill to mark the centenary of the restoration of the bells, and at Ashbocking the exact centenary of the first peal on the bells was commemorated on 22 December.

2004 was a significant year in Guild Peal Records in that two Suffolk ladies reached the 1000th peal mark, each with a peal at Ashbocking. Mary Allum and Katharine Salter became, respectively, only the second and third Suffolk ladies to achieve this total, Pat Bailey being the first in 1992. Another noteworthy peal was the Little Penultimus LP Cinques rung at Grundisburgh on 28 March. This was Stephen Pettman's 1000th peal for the Guild. It is particularly significant, not only because it was rung with a band whose first peals had all been conducted by him, but also due to his long-term encouragement of the peal ringing careers of several of the band. Thus, Ruth Eagle achieved her first peal as conductor with a peal of Yorkshire Maximus on 17 July at St Mary-le-Tower on the day after her fifteenth birthday, a tremendous achievement. Two members also rang their first on 12 in that peal.

After a dip to only 17 peals of Major in 2003, the 2002 level of 25 has been regained. Peals were rung in 17 different Surprise Major methods, and as well as the methods rung at Aldeburgh, it is pleasing to note at least one peal of all the Standard Eight Surprise methods, except Cambridge. There was also a peal of Glasgow at Grundisburgh in May, it being the first in the method for three of the band. The overall statistics for 2004 are finely balanced, with 25 peals of both Major and Minor, but it is disappointing to record only one peal of both Maximus and Cinques.

The numbering of the Guild's 2003 peals ended at No. 8013, but following a decision by the 28 February Guild Management Committee Meeting to grant an 'amnesty', the previously unpublished peal at The Wolery Mini-Ring on 12 January 2002 (printed in last year's report) has become No. 8014. Historically, there have been several peals for the Guild containing ringers who had not been elected properly, but it was agreed that, having now been clarified, the rules on Non-Resident Life Membership and bona fide resident status should be enforced strictly from 1 January 2004.

Alan Mayle served the Guild for 20 years as Peal Secretary, and I should like to express my thanks for the advice he has given me in my first year. Many thanks also to those conductors who have been prompt in forwarding compositions and peal fees.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 2004 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- 1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
- 2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
- Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
- Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
- 6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. NAME

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
 - 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).
 - 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be the Guild Executive, as defined in Rule J 13.

B. MEMBERSHIP

2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:

2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.

2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.

2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to

the Guild.

2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who

resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1,

2.2 or 2.3.

- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. DISTRICTS

5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:

1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.

2 North West: Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.

3 South East: Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.

4 South West Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6 The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there can be Patrons and Vice-Presidents.
- 7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Vice-Presidents may be elected. Subscriptions and fees for the year beginning the following January shall be set at the AGM or a SGM.

8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Chairman Ringing Master

Secretary Treasurer

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

Report Editor

Central Council Representatives

Technical Adviser

Librarian

Handbells Trustee

Peal Secretary

Public Relations Officer

Newsletter Editor

9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to certify the accounts.

10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Certified Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.

The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

- 11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
- 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- 19 The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
- 20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 22 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.

- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from 1 January following.
 - 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. ELECTION OF MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
 - 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
 - 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
 - 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

Guild Chairman

Treasurer

Ringing Master

Secretary

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee
One Elected Representative from each Deanery

9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.

- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Chairman Treasurer Secretary

Ringing Master Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGM's.

- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
- 15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. Expenses

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings.
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
 - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
 - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)

13 bells by various founders size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.

- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance,
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.
- 8 The Trustee and the Guild Management Committee would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

THE MITSON SHIELD AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 No Member may ring more than once in the Rose competition, except as specified in Rule 11.
- 4 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy shall be competed for as follows:

MITSON SHIELD

- 4.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
 - a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual report
 - b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 4.2 The test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s).

ROSE TROPHY

- 4.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 4.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 5 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 4.
- 6 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 7 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 8 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 9 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 10 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 11 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 12 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 13 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 14 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

OBITUARIES

JOYCE LESTER BARKING

Joyce will be affectionately remembered by all who knew her. Many have enjoyed the famous Lester family hospitality over the years and district meetings were always favoured with Joyce's excellent fruit cake and sausage rolls. She was a loyal member of the Barking band and staunch Guild member for well over forty years. She rang four peals for the Guild and reliably rang many quarters during her ringing career. She will be sadly missed as a loyal and cheerful friend to all.

KEN MULLEY WETHERDEN

Ken learned to ring at Great Ashfield with his brother Dennis before the War. He started ringing again in 1973 when he became Tower Captain of a newly formed band at Wetherden and held that position until he died in October. Ken was very involved in all aspects of church life, being a Churchwarden and Sidesman. He spent many hours maintaining the bells and always ensured the grass in the churchyard was cut regularly. Using his skills as a welder he made the very sturdy ladder to the ringing chamber which will surely be used by ringers for many years to come.

Visitors of all abilities were warmly welcomed and numerous people - young and old - learned to ring under his guidance. Ken ensured that the social side of ringing was not neglected and presided over many parties, barbecues and outings where he and Gwen would always ensure a cup of tea was available, however remote the location. Ken never aspired to be a great peal ringer but succeeded in keeping a band together for over 30 years where his priority was to ensure the bells were rung for Sunday services.

Frances Joan Muxlow

ACTON

Joan, an experienced ringer, came to Suffolk in the mid 1950's when her husband Arthur, also a ringer, was appointed as Vicar of Stowmarket. They then joined the band, led by 0 G Barnard, and with him played an important part in the organisation of the major overhaul of Stowmarket bells in the mid 1960's.

Following Arthur's death in 1977, she moved to Acton where, in addition to becoming organist and churchwarden, she was active in supporting the small band of ringers. In her later years, although always willing to help out, she only rang occasionally but the high point of her later ringing career was the short ring with the band specially recruited for the Millennium.

He also thanked Virginia Bonner and her band of helpers for providing the tea

2. 3. Minutes of the 2003 AGM

Handbell Trustee: The Chairman gave a verbal report reminding members that there are handbell sets in SW (with Winnie Lockwood) and NE districts (with Jonathan Stevens), and two sets in his care. All were in good order. He proposed, that the report be adopted. This was agreed.

Auditor: Maurice Rose proposed, seconded by John Girt, that Larking Gowen be re-elected as Auditor. This was agreed.

Handbell Trustee: Richard Knight proposed, seconded by Lawrence Pizzey, that Brian Whiting be reelected as Handbell Trustee. Mr Whiting was elected.

Central Council Representatives: John Pereira proposed, seconded by Trevor Hughes, that David Salter, Lawrence Pizzey, Stephen Pettman and Alan Smith be our Central Council representatives for the coming triennium. This was agreed by the meeting.

- 8. Election of Life Honorary Members: There were no nominations for Life Honorary membership.
- 9. Election of New Members

It was agreed that the following be elected members of the Guild:

Richard Clarke from East Bergholt - proposed by Sally Munnings; Celia Sims from Falkenham - proposed by Sally Munnings. Both nominations were seconded by John Pereira.

10. Proposal for Rule Changes

A proposal was put to the meeting by the GMC to change the following in the Constitution and Rules:

Rule H5 to read:

A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life Membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.

This was proposed by David Salter on behalf of the GMC, seconded by James Smith and agreed by 42 votes with one abstention.

Rule H 2.3 to read:

Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription.

Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.

Rule H 2.4 to be deleted.

This was proposed by David Salter on behalf of the GMC, seconded by James Smith and agreed by 41 votes with two abstentions. It was emphasized that members between the ages of 65 and 75 currently enjoying free membership would continue to do so.

11. Date and Venue for 2005 AGM

The 2005 AGM will take place on Saturday April 2nd 2005 in the North East District at Beccles. Lawrence Pizzey commented on the current low attendance, and recalled the days when 150 members would attend the AGM. He asked that the GMC look at the format of the day to try and make it more attractive for more members.

12. Any Other Business

The Secretary drew members' attention to the CCCB guidelines on child protection and sample parental consent form that were distributed with agendas. It is hoped that all towers will use these documents in order to fulfil the law on child protection.

John Girt felt that the current officers had a lack of concern for the members. He put in a plea for more social events to concentrate on members and put less emphasis on the apparent obsession with restoration.

David Salter reminded members about the Loyalty service with the Bishop to be held on 18th July at Debenham and encouraged all members to attend.

Muriel Page reminded members about the Veterans' Day at Debenham on 14th July.

Gillian Wakefield offered to take commissions to paint portraits, with proceeds going to the library fund.

Brian Whiting expressed concern about the website. John Pereira had been abroad and had not been able to do recent updating. Stephen Young had offered to be web master; it was hope that he would take it on soon.

Rolie Whiting reported that the collection from the service amounted to £101.80. This would be donated to All Saints bell restoration fund.

In answer to a question from Bruce Wakefield about cover for bell ringing being in household insurance, David Salter said that he doubted that most policies would include such cover.

There being no further business, the meeting closed at 5.12 pm.
