BELFRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

WINSTON GIRLING AND ALAN MOULT

Belfry Advisory Committee Meetings were held in February, June and October, 2005. Various major restorations (some completed, some current and others being proposed) were discussed. There seems to be every likelihood that the current enthusiasm to restore our time expired installations will continue. This is excellent and must be encouraged. It is also apparent that when bell restorations are taking place there are those who are willing to give their time voluntarily to help. Thank you to those members of the Committee and others who have done so over the last year.

Space will not allow all the items to be recorded but the following is a summary covering 2005.

Chediston – are looking at rehanging the bells in a new frame.

Mildenhall – work on front 6 bells now complete. Restrictions on ringing all 10 bells in place because of concerns about the integrity of the tower.

Sudbury (All Saints) – repairs to 7th bell have not been done so far. A fresh look seems to be needed as to the way forward.

Haverhill – work on the clappers on 4 and 5 has now stabilised them.

Westhall – the 2nd has been rehung on ball bearings and now goes much better.

Hepworth – are raising funds to rehang the bells.

Framsden – frame decay, excessive frame movement and worn gudgeons have meant that restricted ringing has been advised until a trial ring and assessment can be carried out in January, 2006.

Stonham Aspal – excessive movement in the bell frame is to be assessed at a trial ring in January, 2006.

Wingfield – are looking at the possibility of installing a ringing gallery.

Barsham – local ringers complained that the tenor bell has a tendency to 'drop.' These bells have been rehung in the original wooden frame right at the top of a slender round tower. Resultant tower movement is clearly a contributory factor to any difficulties being experienced.

Thurston – following restoration, bell hangers have returned to cure problems with 4 and 5 slipping wheel. Sound proofing has now been installed on the bell chamber floor to reduce excessive bell noise getting through to ringing chamber.

Rushmere St. Andrew – the tenor has been recast and made a little heavier.

Restorations discussed – Parham, Felsham, Hopton, Rattlesden, Wissett, Aldham (single bell), Gislingham and Dennington.

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

DAVID SALTER

A quiet 12 months has passed and 2005 will be remembered for the passing away of some key members whose contribution to the exercise was immense. Some excelled at all aspect of the art, others contributed by loyal service, district and practice ringing. However, all were irreplaceable, and will be greatly missed.

The question of the legacy of knowledge we leave future generations needs to be addressed by the Guild. Where are the likes of Arthur Knights, Gabriel Lindoff or Rod Pipe to be found in Suffolk ringing now? Or the next generation of composers to follow Stephen Pettman with his original and innovative approach to ringing? We are very short of knowledgeable proponents of the art, in terms of change ringing skills, method construction or composing. In order to keep the art alive we need to foster and promote these important aspects of the art. Likewise, competent conducting not just bob calling. Ringing the treble by numbers is wrong, and we need alumni to understand when things are done correctly and pass that on to the next generation. Hopefully the Guild will look at this with urgency this year, as without quality informed leadership towers will fall silent.

The Striking Competitions this year were at Finborough and Stowmarket. Several last minute entries were welcome, but from the point of view of organisation can I please ask that deadlines for entries be respected. However, first class ringing from Grundisburgh, just edging ahead of Pettistree, won them the Mitson Shield. There is a target, as it is also many years since the Mitson Shield was won by a six bell tower. The North West District won the Rose Trophy very creditably turning in a fine tenor and back bell dominated performance. It makes all the difference when rollups and the attendant changes are presented well.

Central Council was in Yorkshire in 2005, and as usual all four Suffolk Guild representatives attended. At times the Central Council may seem very remote from day to day ringing, and needs to publicise its work better to the average ringer. I am sure the other reps would agree with me in welcoming comments from both members and Districts. It is after all your Council.

I have had several complaints during the year about tower correspondents not replying to requests as helpfully as perhaps they might. Late replies or incomplete information has a detrimental effect on the perception of Suffolk and its ringers, and is totally preventable. Please urge your own correspondent to "treat requests and enquiries as they would wish to be treated", that is, promptly and courteously, so that visitors take away a good impression of Suffolk ringers.

Yet another successful Training Day was held in September with everybody taking something away from the sessions. Please book the third Saturday in September 2006 to help and pass on your experience where it is needed. Veterans' Day as always was a high point, with yet another good gathering. Muriel and the Debenhams ringers deserve our grateful thanks for this wonderful event.

New jobs were a bit thin on the ground this year. Rumburgh has had a complete re-hang in a new metal frame with augmentation to six. What a superb first Suffolk job Nicholson's have done. Let's hope it is not their last. If you are thinking of re-hanging, do go and have a look at Rumburgh before deciding to whom to give the work. There were problems during the year with bells re-hung in old wooden frames. Could this be seen as a false economy in a church that is short of funding and needs financial security in the future? Even when an old wooden frame is used, it has to be cut about to facilitate the re-hang, so it is not retained unaltered or untouched. The state of some of our rings that have been restored in the last 10 to 15 years is also worrying. In some of these, I have come across odd struck and poor-going bells. Bells cannot be re-hung and then not touched till the next re-hang. Routine maintenance and care are needed to ensure the full cost effectiveness of any project. The Belfry Advisory Committee need only to be approached for good effective advice on how to get the best from your bells.

On the peal front 76 is average for the past few years. The Aldeburgh band continues to ring a great variety of new methods. First peals were rung on restored rings at Wickham Skeith & Rumburgh and a first on the bells at Campsea Ashe.

Only three first peelers this year but a batch of first in methods and first on higher numbers. Congratulations to all who have achieved this year and my apologies to any missed from the following list:

His motivation and enthusiasm in my early days certainly encouraged many others and myself into progression in ringing. "Beginning to conduct" on the grass at Horringer was a stepping-stone that Howard provided. What a stepping-stone! Thank you Howard.

Because of my work/family life balance I have found it difficult to attend as many meetings and practices as I would have liked. I am now in a position where I consider that I am not able to deliver the service the members deserve. The Guild should be actively looking for a new Ringing Master to take the Guild forward. LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

GILLIAN WAKEFIELD

The Suffolk Guild library continues to expand thanks to the generosity of ringers in donating material, and thanks also to the financial support from the Guild Management Committee which enables the librarian to purchase items considered to be of general interest.

This year for example, Ralph Earey very kindly donated a folder of press cuttings relating to his demo bell, which makes interesting reading. George Pipe has kindly donated a copy of the Pipe family tree. Chris Pickford gave an updated CD of his catalogue of the Bowell bell foundry records. Pippa Moss donated two videos, one which includes an episode of "Heartbeat", featuring ringing, and another of the ringers' "Songs of Praise" so the library now has two copies of this; well worth watching if you haven't already seen it. Shirley Girt continues to send Service leaflets of the dedication of new rings of bells, and of funerals of Suffolk ringers. The librarian collects copies of "What's On", Suffolk Guild Newsletters, and leaflets of Don Price's walks. All these items, some of which may seem ephemeral, but which may be useful to researchers in the future, build up a collection of archive material which otherwise would be lost.

Library purchases this year include a large collection of Ringing Worlds going back to 1935. Not all the years are complete but hopefully they will be of great use to anyone researching their peal records. Also purchased are "Church Bells of Norwich" by Paul Cattermole, "Bellframes: a practical guide to inspection and recording," "Church Bells of Britain" by Dove 6th edition, a CD "Let the Bells Ring Out" in aid of Parham bells, a video "Bells for St. John's Church Felixstowe", and "Diagrams - Jasper Snowden Change Ringing Series 1985".

Eleven videos, and three books have been borrowed this year, and the librarian has had three requests for information, one of which came from Australia! Please continue to use the library. The services are free, loans are made to any ringer living within Suffolk, (though items must be collected and returned in person, not posted) and the librarian is happy to answer queries and give information on ringing topics.

TREASURER'S REPORT

KEITH ASHTON JONES

The Guild accounts (un-audited) for 2005 show the Guild finances to be in a sound condition. Subscription and Peal Fee income continues to be apportioned equally between the General Fund and the Restoration Fund, whilst Gift Aid refunds and deposit account interest are allocated in full to restoration.

General Fund income has been maintained at a similar level to last year and continues to meet expenditure. This was achieved because, even with the purchase of £550-worth of Guild badges from this fund, expenditure overall was reduced. This resulted primarily from a significant (29%) reduction in administration costs. Other regular expenditure items generally show inflationary increases.

Notable in this year's Restoration Fund is the inclusion of the significant legacy from the late Leonard Sharpe which, with interest accrued, amounts (as at 31 Dec) to £33,375. This legacy is held on interest-earning deposit, but is shown separately in the accounts pending Guild decision on its most appropriate utilisation. Apart from this, the unallocated balance on the Restoration Fund has increased by some £3600 after the grant of £5000 to Hopton. The reserve for grants allocated-but-not-yet-approved stands at £16,300 with payments (totalling £5,200) made this year to Rumburgh and Mildenhall.

The refund received as a result of gift aid was up by nearly £200 for 2005, an encouraging 18% increase. We are still, however, well short of maximising the benefit we would gain if all those members who are UK tax payers filled in Gift Aid declarations. If you have not done it yet, please consider doing so.

The key of a ring (ie the note of the tenor) is given in cents (ie, hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C# -20, and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.







PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

CHRISTINE KNIGHT

In 2005, 76 peals were rung for the Guild, exactly the same total as in 2004. Peals were rung in 36 Suffolk towers, and members also rang peals at St Mary Magdalene, Oxford, Saffron Walden in Essex and Biddenham in Bedfordshire.

The first peal on the bells since re-hanging and augmentation was rung at Rumburgh. It was at this tower, in 1906, that the first peal in Suffolk including a woman took place, Miss Birdie Robinson. A peal by a ladies' band in August marked the anniversary of this event. Also in August, a peal of Stedman Caters was rung at The Norman Tower in Bury St Edmunds to celebrate the completion of the Cathedral's Millennium Tower. Guild peal ringers also joined in the national commemoration of the 60th anniversaries of VE Day and VJ Day, and the bi-centenary of The Battle of Trafalgar.

The overall peal statistics for 2005 are similar to those of 2004. Peals were rung in 16 different Surprise Major methods, and it was good to see three members achieve their first peal of 8 Spliced Surprise Major in a peal at Grundisburgh on 26th November. At Aldeburgh, the regular peal band's visits over the years led to the 150th peal of Surprise on the bells in May. There was a notable lack of peals of Royal in 2005. The only one rung was of London Surprise Royal at St Mary Magdalene, Oxford in January, this being David Salter's 2000th peal. Two handbell peals, of 420m Spliced Treble Dodging Minor and 405m Spliced Surprise Minor, contained only one resident Guild member, but they represent advances made in multi-method handbell peals of Minor.

There has been a slight increase in the pool of resident conductors calling more than one peal, a healthy development. Interest has also continued in producing compositions of a special commemorative length for a variety of personal, local or national anniversaries. There were eight such peals in 2005.



OBITUARIES

ROBIN ALLUM

Laxfield

Robin was taught to ring in 1948 at Laxfield. His early ringing was mainly call changes, but he conducted his first peal in 1979 and went on to ring 892 peals, including Mary's 1000th peal. Robin, along with Mary, helped teach numerous bands, and in recent times the band at Mendham have benefited from Robin's skills. Throughout his illness, Robin never lost his sense of humour and he died peacefully at home on 10 July. He will be sadly missed by the Guild and especially by the North East District.

TREVOR BAILEY

Beccles

Trevor Bailey was a well known ringer, not only in Suffolk and Norfolk but throughout the British Isles. He was, perhaps, equally well known as a bell hanger for Whitechapel where he worked for many years, travelling all over Britain. He married his wife Patricia in 1971 and they had twin girls, Janet and Stella.

Trevor rang 1314 peals, 760 of which were for the Suffolk Guild. The last Guild peal he conducted was Pat's 1000th in 1992. The Guild, the North East District and the Beccles band will miss this quiet man, both for his sense of humour and his skills as a ringer.

LADY RACHEL BRIDGES

Orford

Lady Bridges was one of the most influential members of the Orford community responsible for the restoration and augmentation of Orford bells to celebrate the Millennium. As a teenager during the Second World War she had lived in Church House near to the remains of the church tower. She and her sisters referred to the two bells hung in the tower at that time as 'Bim Bom' because of their musical pitch (the 6th and tenor of the present ring). Shortly after their marriage, she and Lord Bridges purchased the Great House in Orford and returned there whenever their diplomatic duties allowed. They supported the restoration of the tower during the 60s and 70s, and when the bells were restored, gave a bell in memory of her father, raised it into the tower themselves, and learnt to ring in preparation for the dedication. Rachel became a very loyal member of the Orford band, and with great determination was able to ring after she had fractured her hip. Unfortunately, illness prevented her from ringing in the last months of her life. The Orford band will remember the personality and determination to succeed of this remarkable lady.

AUDREY FOREMAN

St Matthew's, Ipswich

Audrey came to ringing late in life and, along with her husband Alan, was an important part of the St. Matthew's band, taught en masse in 1992. The strength of her Christian background served her well throughout her life, and her 20 year battle against cancer was one of sheer determination and unswerving faith. Loved by all who knew her, she was never without a twinkle in her eye and always enjoyed life to the full. When presented with new challenges, as learning to ring well into retirement certainly was, the one thing you could guarantee was that Audrey would never give up. She was a keen member of the Ladies Guild and all who knew her miss her greatly; especially the fun she brought to any occasion.

MARIE GOODSHIP

Grundisburgh

Marie was part of an established ringing family in the Harrow Weald area. She rang 8 peals, including two of Stedman Caters at that time. After her father, Gilbert Goodship, moved to Suffolk in the fifties, she was a regular visitor to Suffolk until she settled permanently in Grundisburgh after her father died in 1971. She only rang one further peal at Grundisburgh. Marie was an extremely loyal member of Grundisburgh Church and ringers. She was also involved in many activities within the village, usually in the background. She rang for the last time the day before she died. She is missed by many.

NEIL F. HURSEY**Rattlesden**

Neil Hursey who was SouthWest District Maintenance Officer from 1990 until 1993, died in May 2005 aged 59 years. Neil learned to ring as a young teenager at Monken Hadley in Hertfordshire. As happens with many youngsters, Neil gave up ringing in his late teens but when Rattlesden started ringing again in 1989 Neil became a loyal member of the band and was its ringing master during its formative stages. He rang in a number of quarter peals as well as at least two peals. Around 1994 Neil once again gave up ringing but was still an enthusiastic supporter of the Rattlesden band. Unfortunately he became very ill during 2003 and although he struggled bravely he eventually succumbed to cancer in May 2005. He is much missed both as a loyal member of the Rattlesden band as a personal friend of the writer of this obituary. Fittingly his ashes are interred within the sound of the Rattlesden bells.

ROBIN PAINE**Harkstead**

Robin learnt to ring at Harkstead and joined the Guild in 1997. Like everything he did, he embraced ringing with great enthusiasm, taking great pleasure from participating in a number of quarter peals. His ringing also led to his greater involvement in the Church; holding the posts of Churchwarden and Steeple Keeper at the time of his death. He used his great practical abilities to the benefit of the church and especially the bells. His contribution will be missed.

BRENDA PEPPER**Peasenhall**

Brenda passed away on 18 July. Although not a well known peal or quarter peal ringer, she was a long-serving and loyal member of the Peasenhall band and of the Guild for many years. She will be sadly missed by the local band.

SYLVIA PIPE**Grundisburgh**

Sylvia learnt to ring at St Matthews, Ipswich in the 1930s. She soon established herself as a leading light in the area. She married C. W. "Jim" Pipe and moved to Grundisburgh, where she continued to ring until ill health prevented her in the nineties. She was a prolific peal ringer until an injury curtailed her activities in the fifties, but nevertheless she was able to continue peal ringing up to 1989 on her beloved seventh at Grundisburgh. She was first woman to conduct many methods for the Guild and set many records. Her legacy to the exercise are her two sons George and Roderick and her grandson David, all exceptional ringers. May she rest in peace.

FRANK PRICE**Dalham**

Frank was born in Feltham, Middlesex in 1933 and was taught to ring by his father, Tony, when the wartime ban on ringing was lifted. His first peal was at Cranford in 1944. He went on to ring 1608 peals, from doubles to 22 –in. 681 of these peals were on tower bells (and 29 of these double-handed), and 787 were handbell peals. One of his proudest memories was being selected as one of ten ringers from England to dedicate the new ring at Washington National Cathedral in 1964. He assisted in numerous restoration works and even built his own 10 bell campanile in his lovely garden. He will be sorely missed by all.

CANON JOHN RUTHERFORD

Walsham-le-Willows and Hinderclay

John Rutherford learnt to ring as a young curate in Portsmouth. He was keen to pass on his knowledge and after moving to Walsham in the summer of 1970, started a new band of ringers ably supported by experienced ringers from the local area. Being an ex school teacher, he was enthusiastic to encourage the younger members of the village to participate and join the band. In 1985 he retired from Walsham and moved to Hinderclay, where on occasions he would join the band of ringers on practice nights. John spent his last years at Stowlangtoft Nursing Home and was always keen to hear how his "band of ringers" were progressing, some still the originals from 1970. May he rest in peace.

ARTHUR SCARSE

Stowmarket

Arthur will be affectionately remembered by all who knew him at Stowmarket, Buxhall and Great Finborough. Both he and his wife, Margaret learned to ring at Stowmarket during the time that Marie Carson was tower captain. They both supported the local band of ringers and were also members of the Churches at Stowmarket and Buxhall. Arthur was always cheerful and friendly. He served in 170 Squadron, Royal Air Force, during the 1939-1945 war as a navigator on Lancaster bombers. At his funeral a colleague from those days remembered how Arthur used to cheer them up when they were in the thick of it, often by a hand on the shoulder and a comment on the firework display below. He would then get back to plotting a course home. All of us are indeed privileged to have known such a man as Arthur, and our thoughts are with Margaret and his surviving son, David.

The Chairman, Mr Winston Girling, opened the meeting and welcomed the 64 members present. He thanked Revd John Beauchamp for leading the service, and also the organist. He also thanked Bel Rivers and Barry Pickup and their band of helpers for arranging the afternoon and providing the tea.

The meeting stood in silence in remembrance of members who had died during the past year.

On a happier note he mentioned that two ladies, Katharine Salter and Mary Allum had passed their 1000 peal mark.

2. Apologies for absence were received from Michael and Jennifer Warren, Ralph and Tessa Earey, Mary Garner, Chris Garner, Ruth Suggett, Jonathan and Suzanne Stevens, Stephen Pettman, Owen Claxton, Rolie Whiting, Peter and Sheila Franks, Muriel Page, Robert and Jennie Scase, Ken Brown, Sal Burrows, Angela Cable, Timothy Stanford, Eleanor Houghton, Doug Crooks, Tricia Markery, Josephine Beever, Mary and Robin Allum, Rose Godfrey, Frank and Gwen Bloomfield, Celia Sims, Lorraine Beer, Brian Aldous, Diana Duckery.

The Chairman asked the meeting to remember Pat Bailey and Robin Allum who are both suffering long term illness, also Dennis Kiddy who had recently suffered a heart attack.

The Chairman presented the St Edmund Clapper to Brian Whiting of Offton, who had raised £250 for the restoration fund, and also mentioned Sally Munnings and Sproughton who had raised £150.

3. Minutes of the 2004 AGM

These had been previously published in the Annual Report. It was proposed by Brian Redgers, seconded by John Girt and agreed that these be accepted, with the addition of the statement, "Five people did not vote" at the end of item 6 and also the corrected spelling of Clayton in the list of apologies.

4. Matters Arising

There were no matters arising from the minutes.

5. Officers' Reports

Master: David Salter presented the Master's report as printed. The report was accepted by the meeting.

The Chairman congratulated the Master on the excellent loyalty service in July 2004 which had seen Debenham church full for the service which was addressed by Bishop Richard.

Secretary: Sandra Pereira presented the Secretary's report as printed. This was accepted by the meeting.

Treasurer: Eric Bull presented the accounts as published, highlighting some of the figures. He corrected a small error on page 13, where the figure 10640 be changed to 16400. This year Hopton had been promised £5000 and £4200 had been paid to Rumburgh. There was over £11000 remaining in the restoration fund. It was known that two bequests had been left to the Guild, but no further details were available.

He again reminded members of the benefits of Gift aiding subscriptions. The meeting approved the Treasurer's Report and accounts for 2004.

The Chairman thanked both Secretary and Treasurer for the hard work they had done on behalf of the Guild over the past five years.

Public Relations Officer:

The post being vacant for the past year, there was no report.

Technical Adviser and Belfry Advisory Committee: Winston Girling proposed that the report as written by Alan Moul be adopted. This was agreed.

Richard Knight raised the question of lack of progress on the work needed on the seventh at All Saints' Sudbury. The Chairman reminded the meeting that any work carried out there was the responsibility of the PCC and the Bell Hangers. The Guild could only offer advice, not dictate what should be done.

Librarian: Gillian Wakefield proposed that the Librarian's report as published be adopted. This was agreed.

David Salter suggested that the library should purchase the indexes to Bell News and The Ringing World, at a cost of about £55. It was agreed that this be discussed at the next GMC meeting.

Peal Secretary: Christine Knight proposed that the Peal Secretary's report as written be adopted. This was agreed by the meeting.

Handbell Trustee: Brian Whiting, the trustee gave a verbal report reminding members that there are handbell sets in SW (with Winnie Lockwood) and NE districts (with Jonathan Stevens), and two sets in his care. All were in good order, although not used very much. He proposed, that the report be adopted. This was agreed.

6. Subscriptions and Fees for 2006:

Chairman: Maurice Rose proposed, seconded by James Smith, that Winston Girling be elected as Chairman. Mr Girling was elected.

Ringling Master: Barry Pickup proposed, seconded by Keith Ashton-Jones that David Salter be elected as Ringling Master. Mr Salter was elected.

Secretary: John Girt proposed, seconded by David Salter that Mary Garner be elected as Secretary. Mrs Garner was elected.

Treasurer & Gift Aid Secretary: Eric Bull proposed, seconded by John Pereira, that Keith Ashton Jones be elected as Treasurer. Mr Ashton Jones was elected.

Technical Adviser: John Pereira proposed, seconded by John Girt, that Alan Moulton be re-elected as Technical Adviser. Mr Moulton was elected.

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee: Diana Pipe proposed, seconded by Jackie Savage, that Winston Girling be elected as Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee. Mr Girling was elected.

Public Relations Officer: As there were no nominations for this post, it was left vacant.

Librarian: Sally Munnings proposed, seconded by Geoff Pulford, that Gillian Wakefield be re-elected as Librarian. Mrs Wakefield was elected.

Report Editor: Sandra Pereira proposed, seconded by Maurice Rose that Ruth Suggett be elected as Report Editor. Mrs Suggett was elected.

The thanks of the meeting were expressed to Ruth for the effort she has put into producing this year's report.

Newsletter Editor: Carol Girling proposed, seconded by Brian Whiting, that Carl Melville be elected as Newsletter Editor. Mr Melville was elected.

Brian Whiting expressed his delight at a younger member taking a role in helping to run the Guild.

Peal Secretary:

David Salter proposed, seconded by James Smith that Christine Knight be elected as Peal Secretary. Mrs Knight was elected.

Auditor: Eric Bull proposed, seconded by Maurice Rose, that Larking Gowen be re-elected as Auditor. This was agreed.

Handbell Trustee: David Stanford proposed, seconded by Jim Whiteman, that Brian Whiting be re-elected as Handbell Trustee. Mr Whiting was elected.

8. Election of Life Honorary Members

Sue Freeman, on behalf of the South West District proposed Ed Hynard for Life Honorary Membership. She mentioned his devotion to good Sunday ringing, his 43 years service to Polstead tower, where he

was a skilled teacher of so many ringers, his emphasis on good striking and his encouragement of learners by ringing quarter peals and visiting other towers. Ed had celebrated his 80th birthday a while ago and had decided to move to Guernsey to be near his family. The proposal was supported by Richard Knight and George Pipe. The meeting agreed to his election.

Trevor Hughes, on behalf of the North East District proposed Pat Bailey for Life Honorary Membership. Pat is gravely ill at the moment, but over the years has given devoted service to the Guild, at one point being chairman of the North East District. She was the first lady ringer in Suffolk to reach 1000 peals. The proposal was supported by Barry Pickup and Diana Pipe. The meeting agreed to her election.

9. Election of New Members

It was agreed that the following be elected members of the Guild:

Coral Fry from Tunstall and Stuart Reader from Bredfield, both proposed by Anne Pilgrim and seconded by Sally Munnings

10. Date and Venue for 2006 AGM

The 2006 AGM will take place on Saturday April 22nd 2006 in the North West District. The venue had not been confirmed, but it was hoped that Bury St Edmunds would host the meeting.

11. Any Other Business

Shirley Girt asked members to inform her of older members who no longer ring nor have contact with many ringers. She will keep them in touch by sending Newsletters.

Shirley Girt asked that service sheets for weddings, funeral or other special events involving ringers should be sent to the librarian. Gillian Wakefield endorsed Mrs Girt's comments by asking for any items of interest to be sent to her. She also mentioned that she would take commissions for portrait painting to raise funds for the library.

Sally Munnings drew the attention of the meeting to sweatshirts which she had for sale.

Eric Bull put two proposals to the meeting:

i) That Barclays Bank plc continue to be bankers for the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, that Keith Ashton Jones be authorised correspondent and signatory and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorised as additional signatories, as set out in the Guild's rules. (Rule E12)

ii) That the CCLA Investment Management Ltd continue to be bankers for the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, that Keith Ashton Jones be authorised correspondent and signatory and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorised as additional signatories, as set out in the Guild's rules. (Rule E12)

These proposals were seconded by John Girt, and carried unanimously.

After mutual birthday greetings all round, there was no further business and the meeting closed at 5.17pm.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES – 2004 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
3. Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
4. Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
5. Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. NAME

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
 - 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).
 - 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be the Guild Executive, as defined in Rule J 13.

B. MEMBERSHIP

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
 - 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. DISTRICTS

- 5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:
 - 1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
 - 2 North West: Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
 - 3 South East: Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
 - 4 South West: Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6 The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there can be Patrons and Vice-Presidents.
- 7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Vice-Presidents may be elected. Subscriptions and fees for the year beginning the following January shall be set at the AGM or a SGM.

- 8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

- 9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to certify the accounts.
- 10 The following Committees shall be formed:
- The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Certified Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.
 - The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.
 - The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

- 11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
- 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- 19 The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
- 20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 22 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

- 23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall

be published in the Annual Report.

- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from 1 January following.
 - 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
 - 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
 - 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
 - 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

- 9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

Guild Chairman	Treasurer
Ringing Master	Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee
Secretary	One Elected Representative from each Deanery

 - 9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
 - 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Chairman	Treasurer	Secretary
Ringing Master	Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee	

The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.
- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings.
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.

Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.

- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
 - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
 - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

- 1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors	size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw	size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner	size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)
13 bells by various founders	size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
- 2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower

without prior consent of the Trustee.

- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.
- 8 The Trustee and the Guild Management Committee would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

THE MITSON SHIELD AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 No Member may ring more than once in the Rose competition, except as specified in Rule 11.
- 4 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy shall be competed for as follows:

MITSON SHIELD

- 4.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
 - a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual report
 - b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 4.2 The test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s).

ROSE TROPHY

- 4.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 4.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 5 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 4.
- 6 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 7 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 8 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 9 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 10 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 11 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 12 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 13 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 14 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.




