BELFRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

WINSTON GIRLING & MICHAEL ROLPH

Committee meetings were held in February, June and October 2006. The following restorations were discussed: **Ixworth**, **Stradishall**, **Bardwell**, **Chediston**, **Rattlesden**, **Felsham** and **Gislingham**. Grants on all seven have been agreed by the GMC and offered subject to the usual conditions. It is understood that the bells at **Fressingfield** will be removed from the tower during April 2007. A decision on grant aid by the Guild has been deferred until after the bells are out because the final details on the work will not be available until then. It seems fair to say that the Guild has seen an unprecedented number of restorations or potential restorations over a short period of time. Surely the overall condition of our Suffolk bells must be improving to some degree.

Gislingham have been restored to the tower, augmented to eight and rung for the first time. First impressions are of an excellent 14 cwt eight. Congratulations to all involved. **Parham** are also now ringing, a really delightful peal of six and a credit to Simon Cotterell and all involved. It was a great pleasure to hold our October Meeting there - thank you Simon.

The following matters have also been raised:

Stowmarket - reports are with PCC to consider rehanging bells in a steel frame for 10 bells at the same level. The present wooden Howell frame is now difficult to keep tight and even after tightening the bells quickly become harder to ring as the frame slackens off. Reports on the frame indicate that it is worn out and frame repairs alone would not guarantee any degree of success.

Stonham Aspal - bells 7 & 8 are not to be rung because of excessive frame movement around these two bells. Reports from engineers and the architect set out a method of repairing the frame cills and supports on the outer edge of the frame adjacent to these two bells which should resolve the problem and allow all ten bells to be rung again.

Framsden - recommended that professional advice be sought regarding serious bearing wear on some of the lighter bells.

Campsea Ashe - advice requested regarding problems with second clapper which needed some engineering work.

Little Waldingfield - advice sought from Church on current state of bell installation, which requires major restoration.

Sudbury All Saints - hard work by local ringers has raised sufficient funds to re hang the 7th bell (which has a decayed headstock) provided that the work is done in the tower. Enquiries have revealed that the work could be done in the tower, but the Diocesan Bells Advisor feels that it would be preferable to have the crown staple drilled out in the workshop. This increases the cost beyond the reach of the Parish owing to much additional work including installing lifting beams and moving other bells around. Problems centre around the fact that the one ton bell is pre-Reformation and also has canons. It is hoped that a way forward can be urgently found so that all eight bells can be rung again.

Assington - the bells have remained silent in this tower for a number of years. A trial ring was requested by a Churchwarden. This revealed that the bells are in need of restoration but with some minor work could be made ringable for short periods. Unfortunately, the very short trial ring caused such a local uproar that it is unlikely that there will be any more ringing in the near future.

Thank you to all who have been involved with work on Suffolk's bells over the last year, particularly those who have helped to remove and install at the various major restorations. It looks as if there will continue to be plenty of work during the next 12 months!

SECRETARY'S REPORT

MARY GARNER

The Guild Management Committee has met three times during the year. Attendance has improved to about 60%, but there are one or two deaneries that have had no representative attend at all. Hopefully this will not be the case in the coming year. This year's venue has proved to be warm, welcoming and cheerful.

The AGM, held at Bury St Edmunds on 22 April, was attended by sixty three members. Whilst the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer were re-elected, Richard Munnings was elected as Ringing Master and Michael Rolph as Honorary Technical Adviser.

The central database of members has grown substantially during the year. It can only be maintained with the help of the district secretaries and my thanks go to those who keep me fully informed.

A small display was mounted at the AGM showing examples of pages from the updated website. This has continued to grow during the year with photographs, details of towers and news items. It certainly provides a speedy way to advertise events in addition to the printed "What's On" and also to report on tower and district events. Digital photography allows illustrated reports, with a few words or only a caption, to be posted quickly; though to be really successful it does require copy to be submitted to the webmaster. The success of the site might be one reason for selling fewer copies of the report this year.

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

RICHARD MUNNINGS

Having started the year still finding my feet back in Suffolk, I certainly didn't expect to end it with the job of Guild Ringing Master. I am very honoured to hold this position.

Although only elected in April, I have seen enough to know that the Guild is running quite well but I feel that there are areas that could be improved on. One thing that does bother me is how relatively few people come to District and Guild events or indeed leave their own tower. As a Guild we are very lucky to have many people who give up a lot of time, energy and indeed money to help other practices out, organise events and teach ringers. We are also extremely fortunate to participate in one of the few (in fact the only one that I can think of) hobbies in which you can go to almost any practice in the county, country and indeed the world and be welcomed and asked to join in. It's such a shame that so few of us take advantage of this. Not only is ringing at other towers good experience, it's also nearly always a massive help to those practices you visit. However, it has to be appreciated these days that people's lives are a lot busier and this level of commitment is difficult. But if you are in a position to help, what's stopping you?

Tied in with this is many people's fear of trying something new. I appreciate we shouldn't be crashing about on Sunday mornings or at weddings, but what is the point of going to a practice night and not trying to improve yourself? The more we improve at practice nights, in quarter peals and peals, the better the ringing will be when it really matters. Surely that's what we all want?

The striking competitions were fairly popular, although they could still be better supported, both by more teams and most importantly more ringers. It's a nice day out, not too serious, but still good experience. The Guild came a respectable third in the Ridgman Trophy, the ten-bell striking competition open to guilds, associations and societies in the Eastern Counties. As it happened, the result between first and second was very controversial, so we were probably safer in third! Still, we're hoping to win it this year, especially as I'm looking for a bigger emphasis on ten-bell ringing in Suffolk in general this year.

Ipswich has also entered the National Twelve-Bell Competition for the first time in nine years. Although this is an Ipswich entry, many of the eligible ringers come from various parts of Suffolk, so we feel we are representing the Guild to a large extent. Also, the better ringing we have on higher numbers, the better it is for the Guild in general as I feel this filters down to all ringing in the area.

On the restoration and augmentation front we have seen the jobs at Parham and Gislingham come to fruition. The dedication at Parham was a marvellous afternoon with lots of people enjoying the six bells there. It'll be very interesting to see how Gislingham turn out and I've heard good things so far. There has been a lot of hard work going into fundraising for Chediston too, another worthwhile job progressing within our borders.

As if to highlight what can be achieved, 2006 saw well attended celebrations marking the 10th and 20th anniversaries of the successful jobs at Reydon and Pettistree.

It's good to see the young ringers in the county getting together for practices and outings. This is something very important to me, having started young myself and with the realisation that these are the future of the Guild. I have been particularly impressed with the Young Ringers' practices held on the 3rd Thursday of each month at Tostock and run very well by the Monk sisters. Do encourage your young ringers to attend, though Sarah and Claire are willing to take the practice 'on the road' so to speak, if there are enough youngsters from other parts of Suffolk who can't easily make it to Tostock. It's also worth keeping an eye out for the regular outings they organise.

The R & T Committee has started meeting again and an abundance of ideas came forward - in fact we didn't really have enough time to do them all justice! All good signs though. The training day was also relatively well attended, although I have decided to move it to a different date in 07.

On the peal and quarter-peal front there has been plenty happening, with lots of achievements. From the quarter-peal columns, Sylvia Perry's first as conductor was noticeable not least because she chose to call Stedman Triples, no mean feat! Peals and quarter-peals are an important tool in helping to learn methods, get used to good striking and achieve a good rhythm, so I would strongly urge members to do more of them this year.

Four members rang their first peal during 2006 - Anne Buswell, Louis Suggett, Becky Munford and Jason Busby, who rang his for the Lancashire Association at Halesworth in April. At the other end of the spectrum, Simon Rudd rang his 1000th peal and David Salter rang his 1000th peal of Surprise. In between Mary Garner rang her 200th peal and Ruth Eagle rang her 100th for the Guild. Well done to you all and apologies to anyone who I've missed.

It has been good to see George Pipe return to the peal columns and to ringing in general. George and Diana have been tremendous servants to the Guild over the years and George's presence has been missed by many recently.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone who has helped me settle into the Master's role. Without the wise words of many officers past and present the job would be extremely hard to carry out. I look forward to seeing you all over the course of this next year and hope to see lots of people at various ringing events, both District and Guild!

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

GILLIAN WAKEFIELD

The library continues to increase, partly from archive material kindly donated by ringers, and partly from library purchases – books or CDs that the librarian thinks Suffolk ringers would find interesting. Archive material donated in 2006 included a description of Great Cornard bells written by Randal Clouston and donated by Alan Moul, copies of certificates made following two successful peals rung at St. Mary's church Woodbridge donated by Bruce Wakefield, the Order of Service for the Dedication of Parham bells from Simon Cottrell, the Order of Service of Thanksgiving and Blessing celebrating George and Diana Pipe's Golden Wedding sent in by Shirley Girt, a report on the design, and estimate for installation of sound control at St. John Baptist Church Felixstowe donated by Frank Bloomfield. Frank also wrote an interesting account of a visit he made to Bowell's bell foundry in Ipswich when Bowell had ceased casting bells but was then making parts for a "lead chamber" sulphuric acid plant, one of the last such plants to be constructed. The Librarian also keeps copies of the Suffolk Guild Annual Report, Newsletters, and the monthly "What's On".

Part 1 of the Central Council Library Catalogue has now been published so a copy is now available in the Suffolk Guild Library. Other purchases include a CD of the Service of Dedication of Parham bells, CD of the Swan Bells in Perth Western Australia for all those who aspire one day to ring on 16 bells, and for those who are not quite so ambitious but wish to improve their ringing, the Abel Ringing Simulator CD. Another audio visual addition to the Library is a recording of a BBC production of the augmentation of the bells at East Raynham, Norfolk – long standing members of the Suffolk Guild will remember Simon Rudd who is seen in the programme very ably teaching new recruits at East Raynham.

Because ringing features in "Akenfield" by Ronald Blythe, this book has been added to the fiction section of the Library. Similarly "The Bell" by Iris Murdoch might appeal to ringers wanting fiction with a strong bell theme - a submerged bell plays a significant part in the plot.

Strangely, one of the most interesting requests for information in 2006 was regarding the submerged bells at Dunwich. An artist designing an art work in lights involving the patterns generated by the blue lines of ringing methods wanted to link them with the myth of sounds of the submerged bells of Dunwich. Who said that the work of a librarian is dull and never interesting?

TREASURER'S REPORT

KEITH ASHTON JONES

The Guild accounts for 2006 (un-audited at time of writing) show that the Guild finances continue in a healthy state. Subscription and Peel Fee income continues to be apportioned equally between the General Fund and the Restoration Fund, whilst Gift Aid refunds and deposit account interest are allocated in full to restoration.

General Fund. General Fund income, derived principally from subscriptions and peel fees, is marginally below last year's figure. However, the income has continued to meet expenditure after the customary transfers to the Restoration Fund have been made. At first sight there is a reduction in General Fund expenditure compared to 2005. However, if the exceptional expenditure in 2005 on Guild badges (£550) is excluded, a truer comparison emerges. This reveals a 9% increase in Guild running costs for the year. Even so, projecting into 2007, if the 2006 General Fund level of income is maintained, it should cover 2007 expenses. In addition, the General Fund year-end balance is sufficient to underpin projected 2007 expenses, a prudent additional safeguard.

Restoration Fund. The Restoration Fund income (excluding transfers from the General Fund) was £1800 higher than 2005. This does not, of course, include the capital from the L Sharpe bequest reflected in the 2005 income. The additional interest from the Fund's much enhanced sum on deposit is almost entirely responsible for this increased income received in 2006. When put together with the transfer from the General Fund, the Restoration Fund benefited from an income of £10,400. Therefore, although Restoration grants of £28,000 were approved in 2006, the balance still available for allocation reduced by only £17,600, to £32,520. In addition, money reserved for grants approved, but not yet paid out stands at £39,000. Approved grants totalling £5000 were paid out in 2006.

PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER'S REPORT

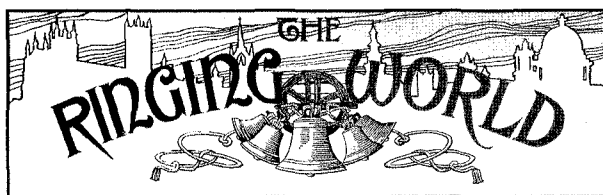
BRUCE WAKEFIELD

This is my first year in office, and I now have a working relationship with the local press, radio and TV. My first activity was to point out some errors in an item broadcast by Radio Suffolk concerning the proposed augmentation of Chediston bells. This together with input from Veronica Downing resulted in a more accurate version of the story being broadcast a few days later. Later in the year I drew the attention of the media to Stowmarket's Christmas Tree Festival, and in particular to the Tower Open Day which was arranged by the Stowmarket ringers as part of that event. Then just before Christmas I publicised the simultaneous Christmas ringing in all the ringable Ipswich towers on 16th December, which was arranged once again by Revd Brian Redgers. All brought positive responses from the media.

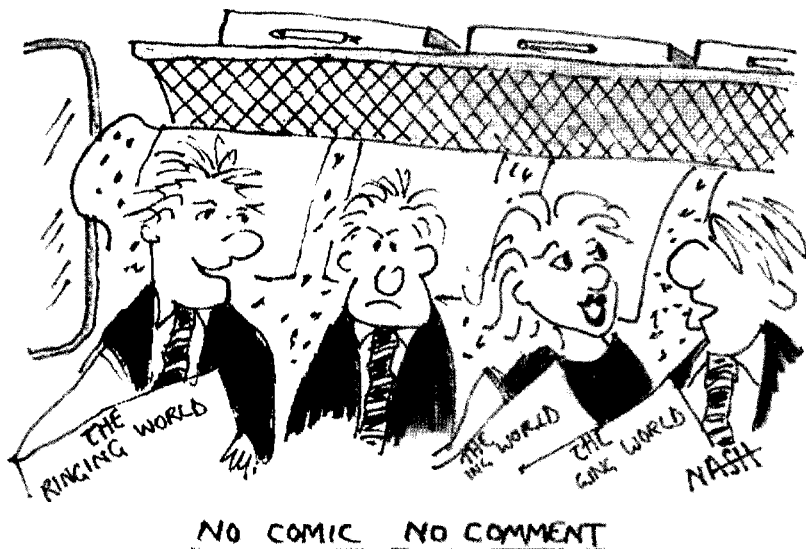
An article by Revd Margaret Blackall, the Diocesan Tourism Officer, in the monthly magazine of the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich about a proposed Open Churches Week in the summer of 2007, prompted me to contact her with the idea that bellringers could take advantage of the occasion to promote bellringing in their respective parishes. Her enthusiastic reply suggested that it would be great if every church with ringable bells could ring out sometime during the week.

May I now pass on a PR idea that we have been practising at Woodbridge for many years now? Whenever we ring for a wedding, rather than just taking the fee for ringing, we also send to the newly married couple a memento, in the form of a small certificate, giving the names of the ringers and a few other details printed against a background of St Mary's church tower. In this way it makes our ringing more personal, and makes the couple and their families aware that there are real people ringing the bells to celebrate their special day. If they are not already doing so, perhaps other towers could consider doing something similar. It is good Public Relations.

Finally, if there is any ringing event that you would like assistance with in publicising, please let me know. That is my job, but I cannot help you unless you tell me about it.

0 - Some bells unhung on the ground.

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or Maintenance Officer.

KEY

The key of a ring (ie the note of the tenor) is given in cents (ie, hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C# -20, and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

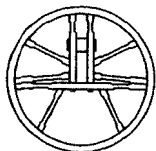

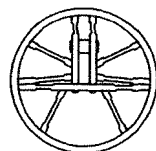

PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

CHRISTINE KNIGHT

In 2006, 93 peals were rung for the Guild, a healthy increase of 19 on the revised total for 2005†, and the highest number since the year 2000. The year started very slowly, with only 11 peals being rung during the first quarter, but such was the resurgence of interest as the year progressed, that 61 of the total number were rung in the second half of the year. Much enthusiasm has been generated by the new Master, and the year finished on a really high note with 19 peals being rung in December alone. Peals were rung for the Guild in 37 Suffolk towers, and also at Great Yarmouth in Norfolk and St Leonard, Shoreditch, in London.

During the year, members rang peals to celebrate the 80th birthday of Her Majesty The Queen at Tostock, Rendham and Monewden, where a special peal of Queen Elizabeth II Treble Place Minor was rung. At local level, a peal of Plain Bob Major at Framlingham on 29 May marked the 250th anniversary of the first peal on the bells. In July, the first peal for 50 years was rung on the bells at Blaxhall to coincide with The Blaxhall Festival. Gordon Slack's mini-ring at Claydon, The Folly, was pealed for the first time on 22 October. There was also a note of commemoration, with a peal to mark the centenary of Jim Pipe's birth, Stedman Cinqes at Grundisburgh on 5 September.

An encouraging trend during the year has been the substantial increase in the number of peals of Maximus and Cinqes – 7 peals of Maximus and 3 of Cinqes, compared with only 2 of each in 2005. One of these, Cambridge Surprise Maximus at St Mary le Tower on 18 November was Simon Rudd's 1000th peal. Another peal of note is that of Bristol Surprise Maximus, rung at Grundisburgh on 27 December; not only a superb effort with the number of 'firsts' achieved, but an excellent peal too, by all accounts. It is also very pleasing to see increasing numbers of young ringers becoming involved in peal ringing, and making rapid progress. The seeds of this are sown, of course, at local level, and I would highlight the local band peal at Pakenham on 26 November as an excellent example of this.

It is interesting, however, that despite the substantial increase in the total number of peals compared with 2005, there has been an increase of only 1 in the number of Suffolk towers which have hosted Suffolk Guild peals. It is always good to read footnotes which relate to church or community events, or to the dedicated service of clergy or members of local congregations, and such peals meet with great appreciation. This type of 'grass-roots' ringing is also invaluable in integrating the culture of celebratory or commemorative peal ringing into the wider context of parish life, as well as helping to prevent situations in which a request for a peal attempt might be refused because a lengthy period of time had elapsed since a previous peal.

Once again, I should like to extend my thanks to those conductors who have forwarded peal fees and compositions without the need for reminders.

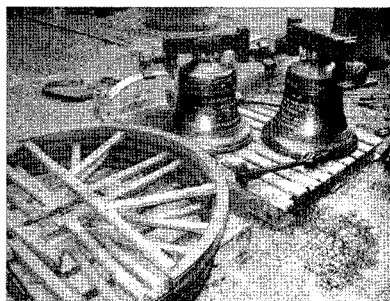

OBITUARIES

JOHN W C BLYTHE

Ipswich

John was a Southwold boy - steeped in its history whether it was the branch railway, the lovely town and countryside around, the church or Southwold people. He learned to ring just after the last war and soon became very competent, coming under the influence of the bands at Beccles, Norwich, Leiston and elsewhere. John rang nearly 400 peals, mostly in Suffolk, and conducted a large proportion of them. He served the Guild faithfully and well - as Guild Secretary for 10 years, Central Council member, as well as a keen Sunday service ringer. In the early fifties he married Margot (Thompson), herself a keen ringer, and our sympathy goes out to her and the family.

OLIVE BUNN

Bacton

Having been taught to handle a bell by her friend and work colleague Sylvia Pipe, Olive joined the band started in the 60s by the self-taught Ernest Wallace, ringing mostly at Wetheringsett, where the bells were quite a handful even then, before the rotting and mobile frame eventually silenced the tower. Ringing with her children at Cotton and the newly re-hung Bacton was the highlight of her life in the 1970s. After the passage of time and many more miles, her enthusiasm for ringing has rubbed off onto her son James, now a prolific quarter and peal ringer in Darwin Point, Sydney Australia. Latterly her gift for flower arranging kept her active following her retirement to Stowmarket after the death of her husband.

HERBERT JILLINGS

Ipswich

Herbert came from Heveningham and was taught to ring there and at the surrounding towers by the redoubtable Frederick Lambert, shopkeeper, bandsman, vergers and recruiting sergeant at the Halesworth Drill Hall. Herbert rang his first peal at Huntingfield on St George's Day 1938. The well-known Harold Rogers from Chediston was also in that peal - his first, too. Herbert moved to Ipswich in 1946 and was a regular ringer at St Mary le Tower for 50 years. He was a Christian gentleman, faithful worshipper at St John's, carpenter and wheelwright, raconteur, famous for his malapropisms, Special Constable and a great family man. We shall miss him.

He welcomed the opportunity for Guild members to ring on such a fine ten.

The meeting stood in silence in remembrance of members who had died during the past year.

2. Apologies for Absence were received from John and Shirley Girt, Revd Brian Redgers, John Taylor, Peter Ernst, Corinne Ellam, Susan Schurr, Jonathan and Suzanne Stevens, Bel and Ray Rivers, Catherine and Julian Colman, Jackie Savage, Susan Freeman, Rose Godfrey, John Malster, Michael Rolph.

3. Minutes of the 2005 AGM

These had been published in the Annual Report and were accepted by the meeting.

4. Matters Arising

There were no matters arising.

5. Officers' Reports

Master: David Salter presented the Master's report as printed in the Annual Report. It was accepted by the meeting.

Secretary: Mary Garner proposed the acceptance of the Secretary's report as printed. This was seconded by Maurice Rose and agreed by the meeting.

Treasurer: Keith Ashton Jones presented the accounts as published. He commented that they had now been audited. He added that some grants had been awarded which were yet to be paid. He proposed the acceptance of the accounts for 2005, which was seconded by Gordon Slack and carried by the meeting.

Public Relations Officer: Bruce Wakefield had been co opted during the year. He reported that the Ipswich Christmas ringing had been well publicised and had good coverage on local television and radio. He reported that the proposed restoration at Chediston had been given one sided local radio coverage. The radio station had been contacted and a second broadcast made giving a more balanced view. He suggested that the Guild ringing for the Queen's 80th birthday should be publicised. He stressed the importance of publicising the Guild and welcomed the opportunity to advertise appropriate events.

Belfry Advisory Committee: Alan Moulton proposed that the report as printed should be adopted. It was seconded by Diana Pipe. This was agreed with one correction, that the old tenor at Rushmere was now hung as a clock bell, not recast.

Librarian: Gillian Wakefield proposed the report as presented. This was seconded by Carl Melville and agreed by the meeting.

Peal Secretary:

Christine Knight proposed the acceptance of her report as printed.

It was noted that two peals referred to The Ringing World for a full description of methods. It was explained the decision was made because of the length of the list of methods and printing costs. However it had since been decided that the details would be published in full in the next report. The Chairman reported that he had recently received a letter expressing a wish for the peals to be withdrawn and attributed to the Icení Guild. Lively discussion followed which concluded that the current rules cover all situations adequately. The rule change to be proposed later in the meeting, namely:

Guild Constitution F. Records and Handbells. Handbell Trustee: Brian Whiting, the Trustee, reported that in addition to the set in the SW with Winnie Lockwood, the NE district with Jonathan Stevens, the two sets in his care, there was now a set in the NW district. He proposed that his report be adopted. This was seconded by Maurice Rose, and agreed by the meeting.

6. Subscriptions, fees and donations for 2007

Vice Presidents: Mandy Shedden proposed and David Mulrenan seconded, that the Vice Presidents as listed in the 2005 Annual Report be re-elected on bloc. This was agreed.

Chairman: Maurice Rose proposed, seconded by Alan Moul, that Winston Girling be re-elected as Chairman. Mr Girling was elected.

Ringing Master: Winston Girling thanked David Salter for all his hard work during the past three years. Brian Whiting proposed Richard Munnings for the post of Ringing Master. Brian told the meeting that Richard had suitable credentials, being born and bred in Suffolk and coming from a ringing family. While

living away he had been ringing with one of the best bands in the country and now, back in Suffolk, he was involved with teaching and service ringing. The proposal was seconded by Stephen Pettman and carried by the meeting.

Secretary: Brian Whiting proposed, seconded by Diana Pipe, that Mary Garner be re-elected as Secretary. Mrs Garner was elected. She was thanked for her work during the last year.

Treasurer and Gift Aid Secretary: Maurice Rose proposed, seconded by Carol Girling, that Keith Ashton-Jones be re-elected as Treasurer and Gift Aid secretary. Mr Ashton Jones was elected. He was thanked for all his hard work during the past year.

Technical Adviser: The Chairman recorded thanks from the Guild for all the work that Alan Moulton had done in this post. Michael Rolph was proposed from the Chair and accepted by the meeting.

Newsletter Editor: Carol Girling proposed, seconded by Dr Ann Gath, that Carl Melville be re-elected as Newsletter Editor. Mr Melville was elected.

Peal Secretary: James Smith proposed, seconded by David Salter, that Christine Knight be re-elected as Peal Secretary. Mrs Knight was elected.

Auditor: Keith Ashton Jones proposed, seconded by James Smith, that Larking Gowen should be re-elected as Auditor. This was agreed by the meeting.

Handbell Trustee: Gordon Slack proposed, seconded by Adrian Knights, that Brian Whiting be re-elected as Handbell Trustee. Mr Whiting was elected.

8. Election of Life Honorary Members

Sally Munnings, on behalf of the SE District proposed Geoff Pulford for Life Honorary Membership. She spoke of his many years as Deanery Representative and his faithful commitment to his band. The proposal was seconded by Alan McBurnie and Geoff was elected by the meeting.

9. Election of New Members

10. Proposed Rule Changes

The GMC proposed that Rule 3 be deleted from "The Mitson Shield and Rose Trophy Striking Competitions."

David Salter explained that the background to this was to enable people to take part in the competitions representing their tower and or district. It is hoped that it will encourage more ringers to take part. Discussion followed during which concern was expressed regarding the possible abuse of the spirit in which this was meant. The District competitions were cited and comments made that there had been no

problems there. Concern was also expressed that this rule change might lead to exclusivity. The rule change was seconded by Stephen Pettman and carried by the meeting with 1 vote against and 17 abstentions.

11. Date and Venue for 2007 AGM

The 2007 AGM will take place on Saturday 14th April 2007 in the SW District at a venue yet to be decided.

12. Any Other Business

David Salter reported that he had been approached by Christain Aid who had asked that the bells in Ipswich be rung between 11am and 1pm on the Saturday prior to Christain Aid Week as an aid to their publicity.

Veronica Downing advertised the Olde Time Farming Day to be held on 15th July to raise funds for the Chediston Bells Appeal.

St Edmunds Clapper* Two towers only had taken part, Sproughton and Offton, and it was unclear which had won. Offton retained the trophy until the matter was clarified. It was felt that more promotion was needed for this competition.

Fleeces, sweatshirts and polo shirts with the Guild logo will be available again in the autumn.

The Librarian announced that that various items were on sale, including a CD with records of the Bowell Foundry. Pictures and cards were for sale in aid of the Guild Library. She will also undertake portraits.

Disappointment was expressed that proposals for work at All Saints, Sudbury had come to a halt again and querying whether the Guild should put money there. Concern was expressed about the limited ringing at Stonham Aspal and Mildenhall. Alan Moulst reported that tests at Mildenhall showed that the tower was being damaged by the ring of ten and that the back two should only be rung occasionally. He said that the 7 and 8 at Stonham Aspal were unringable due to movement in the side frame. It was thought that this would be repairable.

Ringling for the Queen's 80th Birthday. It was agreed that David Salter would collect together the Guild records of special ringling between the Queen's actual and official birthdays. Please submit information to him for publication.

There being no further business, the meeting closed at 4.45pm.

*** The St Edmunds Clapper Competition**

The trophy was made by John Uden of Southwold, hence the reference to St. Edmund, and was first competed for in 1991. It is a simple competition, open to all towers, the object being to raise the most money for the Restoration Fund between the period 1 April to 31 September by any chosen means. Initially organised as part of The Friends of Suffolk Bells scheme, it lapsed in the mid 1990s but was relaunched in 2001. It provides an excellent opportunity for towers to involve non-members in a variety of fund raising activities - even the medium of Ebay could be used! THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 2006 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
3. Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
4. Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
5. Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. NAME

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
 - 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).
 - 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be the Guild Executive, as defined in Rule J 13.

B. MEMBERSHIP

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
 - 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. DISTRICTS

- 5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:
 - 1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
 - 2 North West: Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
 - 3 South East: Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
 - 4 South West: Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6 The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there can be Patrons and Vice-Presidents.
- 7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Vice-Presidents may be elected. Subscriptions and fees for the year beginning the following January shall be set at the AGM or a SGM.

- 8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

- 9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to certify the accounts.
- 10 The following Committees shall be formed:
- The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Certified Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.
- The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.
- The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

- 11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
- 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- 19 The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
- 20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 22 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

- 23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from 1 January following.
 - 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
- 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
- 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

- 9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

- 9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

- The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.
- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
- The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings.
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
 - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
 - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

- 1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors	size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw	size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner	size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)
13 bells by various founders	size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
- 2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same

tower as the preceding borrower.

- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.
- 8 The Trustee and the Guild Management Committee would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

THE MITSON SHIELD AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy shall be competed for as follows:

MITSON SHIELD

- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
 - a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual Report
 - b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 3.2 The test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s).

ROSE TROPHY

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 4 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
- 5 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 6 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 7 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 8 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 9 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 10 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 11 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

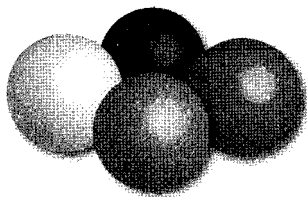

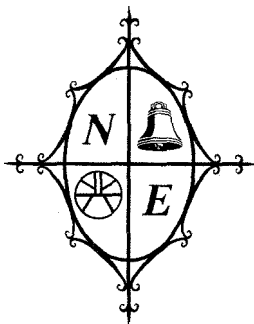
