FOREWORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

2008 has seen a public relations triumph, with ringing featured regularly on BBC radio and television. Recruitment is on the up, with, for example, three brand new bands within five miles of my home. The rejuvenated Recruitment and Training Committee is drawing up an ambitious agenda to co-ordinate the development of these new ringers, and simulators have been installed at three towers. Over 100 peals were rung for the Guild again last year, and the number and variety of quarter peals has been outstanding. Bell restoration projects are taking place all over the county, and the Belfry Advisory Committee has been working tremendously hard to support these.

These successes do not just happen spontaneously: they happen because people make them happen: Guild Officers, District Officers and Tower Captains all play their part, but the real success of the Guild depends on the support and enthusiasm of ordinary members, ringers who week after week ring on a Sunday morning, who turn out in all weathers to help the teach learners, or ring yet another quarter of Bob Doubles to help someone notch up a first.

Well done to all of you, but do keep it up, as there is much more work still to do!

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year 1 January 2008 to 31 December 2008.

Charity

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers was registered with the Charity Commission on 10 December 1975, registration number 26889. The charity's registered address is 9 The Gallops, Old Station Road, Newmarket, Suffolk CB8 8LA. It is governed under a constitution originally registered in 1977 and revised in 1999. Principal Objectives

The purpose of the charity is to promote and encourage the practice of bellringing; to recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art; and to cultivate the art of scientific change ringing.

Review of Progress and Achievements

Bellinging Activities

Throughout the year, Sunday and special service ringing has taken place for most services in the Guild's 178 ringing towers. Regular practices have been held in almost 100 towers where training takes place for beginners and more experienced ringers. In addition there have been monthly activities, both ringing and social, in each of the four Guild districts. The Guild held an annual training day and there have been 120 peals rung for the Guild during 2008 in 44 Suffolk towers, and 2 outside the county. At least 415 quarter peals have been rung in Suffolk towers enabling many members to improve their skills and keep this ancient art progressing. Emphasis on recruitment and training is ensuring that this traditional skill continues to flourish.

Restoration Activities

Grants have been agreed to help with restoration projects at St Lawrence, Ipswich, Dennington, Wissett, Helmingham and Grundisburgh. Projects which employ professionals also use local labour from amongst the ringers and congregations to assist wherever possible. Members of the Belfry Advisory Committee have undertaken work in several other towers, whilst test rings have taken place at others, with a view to restoration. A great deal of time and advice is given freely to enable much maintenance work to be carried out, so that the bells across the Guild are kept in as good working order as possible.

General Fund.

General Fund income, derived principally from subscriptions and peal fees, was slightly up on last year's figure owing to an almost 50% increase in peal fees collected. However, General Fund expenditure was also up; despite a substantial saving on insurance premiums, administrative and printing costs rose significantly. Nonetheless, income still exceeded expenditure (albeit by a smaller margin than in 2007) leaving the fund overall in a sound position, with a balance sufficient to underpin projected 2009 expenses, which is the aim.

Restoration Fund

Grants of £26,200 were approved in 2008, representing another year of substantial allocation of the monies from the Sharpe bequest. In the year, the fund's income was £9,600, leaving the sum still available for allocation at year-end at £16,078. During the year, payments of £24,100 were made for complete projects, including a payment of £14,000 representing the major portion of the grant given for the txworth (Lenny Sharpe's old tower) restoration and augmentation project. The amount reserved for grants not yet disbursed since work is not yet completed, now stands at £50,350.

Policies

All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes are invested or deposited by the Treasurer as is directed by the Guild Management Committee.

Grants from the Restoration Fund are authorised by the Guild Management Committee but only paid after he work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants are normally only offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmentation and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

BELFRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT JONATHAN STEVENS

The work of the BAC continues apace; it is good that not only is there a wealth of skills and experience available to the members of the Guild from this committee, but that there is a demand for help. The help offered ranges from the practical splicing of a rope to advice on how to successfully organise a complete rehang. Following the latter the Guild Inspection ensures the work is up to an appropriate standard and guidance on remedial works, where necessary, is given.

This past year, as well as grant aided restorations being completed at Fressingfield, Stradishall and Ixworth, and the new tenor and replacement of plain with ball bearings at Grundisburgh, projects at Campsea Ashe, Dennington, Helmingham, Ipswich St Lawrence, and Wisset have been offered grants; showing the pace and enthusiasm towards ensuring the future of the diocese's bells continues.

Frustratingly, despite test rings and site meetings at Cratfield, that project seems no further ahead.

Inspections have been carried out at a number of towers including Ufford, where the back four headstocks are in need of replacement with those of a more modern design. It was good to see the three bells at Woolverstone brought into use. Another three, at Elmsett, are up and running; hopefully this ring will continue to grow.

Work on adjusting the striking was carried out at Woodbridge, amongst others, and the replacing of the rotten seventh headstock at All Saints Sudbury was started by a BAC team.

By the time this report is published, Chediston should have been rehung, with the dedication on March 15. Bardwell has its funding in place and the restoration will be completed during the life of this report. Plans for a restoration are well under way at Eye and at Woolpit.

Many smaller works were undertaken by the BAC team, such as the work on the pulleys at Easton and the rehanging of the Treble at Buxhall.

Committee meetings were held in February, June and October. A sub-committee was set up primarily to rewrite the Guild Grant Conditions, but also to look at how the BAC's knowledge could be best shared. The new conditions have been ratified by the Management Committee and are now available on the Guild website. These conditions have been circulated to the bell-hangers who have given some positive feedback.

I would like to express the Guild's and my own thanks to Winston who has carried out the role of BAC Chairman for many years, with such dedication. I am pleased he is still on the BAC where his experience is most valuable.

RICHARD MUNNINGS RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

2008 was - as most years - made up of highs, lows and much in between, punctuated with some of the age-old problems that have always threatened the Guild as well as the continuation of some fine traditions that have helped keep the Guild going.

The highs are easy to recall and pick out. The Guild Dinner at Woolpit, held every five years, was a massive success. Much credit has to go to Mary Garner, who I know first hand worked incredibly hard on this very difficult event to organise. So many things go into it, so many people to speak to, so many people to please. Well done Mary!

The Guild striking competitions were almost too successful, with a large entry working the judges - Fran Dodds and Andrew Ellis from Birmingham - extremely hard. Well done to St Mary-le-Tower on winning the Rose Trophy, Pettistree 'A' winning the Mitson Shield and Debenham 'O' winning the Lester Brett Call Change Trophy. This was the first time Pettistree had won the competition, an inspiration to all aspiring bands. Well done to Debenham, but they need more competition for the call change trophy. Don't be shy! The Guild's first peal on 14, rung at Winchester Cathedral in August was both historic and a huge achievement. Encouragingly, there was a substantial splash of youth in the band, with Louis Suggett and Tom Scase in particular doing very well.

Peals in general were a highlight over the twelve months. Once again well over 100 peals were rung in our name, including the notable handbell peals, the peals of 41-spliced Surprise Minor, 8-Spliced Surprise Major and Bristol Maximus. Landmark achievements included:

Well done to everyone above, particularly the first-pealers (a good entry this year) and Mary Dunbavin on what is still - even today - a landmark milestone.

1200th & 450th in hand - Jeremy Spiller

There was also much done through the medium of quarter-peals, with Pettistree leading the way in numbers, ringing very varied range. However, there were half-lead surprise Major quarters being rung in the Woodbridge area, much happening in the Halesworth region as well as a grand contribution from a healthy number of North-West members.

This year also saw the return of the Recruitment and Training Committee meeting again, thanks largely to the efforts of Alan McBurnie. Initial moves have been made with John Harrison coming down to Stowmarket for a 'Teaching the Teachers' course, which went very well.

Bar one bit of notonous PR - which I shall come to later - the Guild enjoyed the amount of publicity that I can't remember it ever having before. The highlight was The Inside Out Show, featuring the Hollesley ringers. A presentation to Albert Driver, a stalwart servant, appeared on BBC Look East and the St Edmund's Day celebrations that the Guild marked with peals and quarters received blanket coverage from BBC Radio Suffolk most of the day. The White Ribbon Campaign used the Guild and bells as a focus for its worthy campaign against domestic violence.

With all this going on, you'd be forgiven for thinking everything was blooming in the Suffolk Guild garden, but I'd be failing in my role if I didn't highlight where things haven't gone quite so well and more importantly what I think needs to be done to improve these areas.

Attendances at many district and Guild events are still relatively poor given the number of members we have. Whilst the AGM had a much-improved number of attendees from the 2007 one, I am still disappointed that an organization with nearly 700 members cannot muster even 100 for the most important and relevant event of the year. I am not going to lie and say the meeting itself is a thrill a minute. But it isn't a meeting you would normally experience at work or anywhere else. We try to keep dull figures to a minimum, jargon out of it and focus on things that directly affect YOU. Things like reintroducing the call change element to the striking competition which was passed at this year's AGM. Electing officers who will be endeavouring to directly serve you, help to teach ringers, recruit ringers and other matters that WILL make a difference. Apart from anything else, it is an interesting day where you can see how fellow members — many of whom you may not have met for a long time, if at all — are carrying out their ringing. A chance to meet friends old and new. And this goes for any ringing event. Most district events in particular are arranged at considerable time and effort by people who want LEARNERS to benefit. They are wasted if you do not turn up. No one judges you, scoffs at you or tuts away in the corner. Rather your presence is welcomed. Please, please, please, please, PLEASE turn up to these events, if you possibly can.

Closely linked to the above is the number of people who actually organize things or take up positions on the GMC. Currently we have a dedicated group of people who carry out various roles. The problem is, it's a relatively small group of people and the strain on time and energy can be tremendous. We want the Guild to function so that it benefits ALL its members. Sadly, it's not going to do that if we continue to rely on the same people to do everything year-in-year-out. We need more of you to get involved. We're not asking you to hand your lives over to the Guild or even ringing itself. But for example, we have vacancies on the GMC. Now this is no great strain on a person's lifestyle. The meetings can be long, but that's because they are used to their full potential, with reps making sure the decisions made are the right ones for those they are representing. More to the point, there are only THREE meetings a YEAR. Yes, that's right three a year. Not one every week or even every month, but one every four months! So come on folks, put yourselves forward, help us to help you.

The traditional second Sunday peal at Aldeburgh was – for a brief time – national news this year and not for good reasons. A resident made a complaint against the ringing that has regularly taken place at the same time for decades. Thankfully the complaint never came to anything more than the national coverage that if anything actually went in our favour. Indeed, there was more support for ringing than even I had expected. However, it was a reminder that we do need to be aware of our neighbours and those who can hear the bells. We perhaps need to give more consideration to soundproofing as we can't always rely on the goodwill of those who live nearby. It only takes one new resident, an unsympathetic council and a thriving tower could be shut down instantly. Always try and interact with those who live in the community, let them know what's happening, when you're ringing. Have open days or just invite the locals to a practice sometime.

Despite these problems, the Guild is thriving. Keep it up, bear in mind what I have just said and most of all, enjoy your ringing in 2009!

Thank you very much to all those who have helped me, most of all Ruthie and Mason who have had to put up with my prolonged absences and sometimes prolonged presence and put up with my whims and silly ideas. Also to Mum and Dad, Kate and anyone else who has helped look after my boy and to all who have offered their time to myself and the Guild this year.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

The Guild Library has been used 18 times during 2008 by people wishing to borrow items or requesting information, and 10 people have very kindly donated items of interest including CDs, a record, books and leaflets. In addition to accepting donated material, items are purchased from time to time and this year, following the acquisition of the 3rd and 7th editions of Dove's Guide for Church Bell Ringers, the library now has the complete set of the nine editions. (The 3rd edition is becoming difficult to get hold of). It could well help any ringer researching new rings or augmentations of rings to look back through the editions of Dove to see in which year a ring was installed or augmented.

The Nine Tailors by Dorothy L. Sayers is the best known work of ringing fiction, but the library does possess several other novels in which ringing or bells feature; some ghost stories, a detective novel and three light romances for example. Another library purchase this year was The Nebuly Coat by J. Meade Faulkner. This book, a masterpiece by the author of Moonfleet is a mystery and a romance. It was discussed in the letters column of the Ringing World earlier this year, as towards the end of the book it describes briefly the ringing of a peal of Grandsire Triples before the catastrophic collapse of the church tower (though not when the bells are being rung so no fictitious ringers are killed!) If you would like a change from learning blue lines or composing touches, borrow a novel from the library and have "a good read".

The Guild Management Committee has met three times during the year. Attendance has been about 80%. There has been much frank and lively discussion and it is good that so many deaneries in the Guild have had their representatives there. However there are still vacancies on this decision making body. It would be great if they were all filled.

The AGM at Long Melford on 5 April was attended by seventy three members, a 34% increase on 2007. Philip Gorrod was elected Chairman, whilst Ringing Master, Treasurer and Secretary were re elected.

The Dinner, marking the 85th Anniversary of the formation of the Suffolk Guild, was held at Woolpit. All the tickets were sold and the draw raised funds for the Bell Restoration Fund. It was felt to be a good social event and the SW district has planned a Guild Social for June 2009. It is hoped that the other three districts will do likewise for 2010-12, until the next dinner in 2013.

The website continues to grow. Our webmaster updates it almost daily and is pleased to receive any photos and copy for it. There are tower notices and diary inserts available for download which contain the appropriate District and Guild events, as well as a wealth of other information and links.

PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER'S REPORT BRUCE WAKEFIELD

The Guild has received substantial favourable coverage in the media this year. Many of its activities have been featured on TV, radio and in the press. The most widely reported event was the unsuccessful attempt by some of the residents of Aldeburgh to stop the long established practice of peal iniging there. Support for the ringers appeared in the media both nationwide and worldwide. Bell Restoration Projects seized the imagination of reporters. Chediston's project featured on BBC Look East in April, and the now completed project at txworth made a number of appearances in the local newspapers, as did the ongoing project to restore the 5 pre-reformation bells of St Lawrence in Ipswich. All these projects have received grants from the Suffolk Guild of Ringers and from the Heritage Lottery Fund.

In November, the BBC TV Look East programme "Inside Out" broadcast a feature on the application of simulators in bellininging. This was recorded mainly at Hollesley, but did include footage of the public having a go at ringing" on a mini-ring that had been specially erected for the occasion on the Market Hill in Woodbridge. Hollesley and Woodbridge also featured in an excellent article on bellringing in Suffolk that appeared in the June edition of the glossy magazine "Suffolk and Norfolk Life". The local press also picked up on a performance of Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture given by the Suffolk Concert Band at Woodbridge fingers were asked to ring the tower bells at the appropriate time.

BBC Radio Suffolk is now taking a significant and positive interest in beliringing in the county. As part of its campaign to raise the profile of Saint Edmund it asked whether the Guild could put on special ringing on St Edmunds Day. Four peal attempts were subsequently arranged and the Ringing Master (Richard Munnings), together with the Bishop, were interviewed live on the radio on the morning of St Edmund's Day, and described what had been planned and chatted about ringing in general. On another occasion the Ringing Master was interviewed live about ringing in Sulfolk that had been arranged to draw attention to the start of the 2008 White Ribbon Campaign, the international event highlighting violence perpetrated against women. Just before Christmas, I was interviewed live on Radio Sulfolk to talk about the annual Christmas ringing event in Ipswich during which all the ringable bells are rung for half an hour around midday to remind the shoppers of the presence of the church in the town and of the true meaning of Christmas.

So let us continue to make positive use of the good relations that we have with the media. If you think you have a newsworthy event to report, let the media know. In my experience they are always willing to consider a good story for publication.

The key of a ring (ie the note of the tenor) is given in cents (ie, hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C#-20, and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

SYLVIA MORLEY Barrow

Sylvia was taught to ring at Whepstead by Bob Hartley c1990. Sylvia would freely admit she rang by numbers and never progressed beyond Plain Bob and Grandsire Doubles. Sylvia moved to Barrow in 1995 and joined the local band to whom she was already known and was a loyal member, always available for weddings, and often for those extra services during the church's year for which she suggested the bells should be rung. Sylvia worked hard as a fundraiser for the local church and St Nicholas Hospice. She cared for her immediate family and beyond in all sorts of ways. Sylvia was struck by a massive stroke in September and died a few days later. She never mentioned her age, despite the fact that quarently indefatioable woman was 81.

DOUGLAS ROWLAND

Bury St Edmunds

Doug's childhood was spent at Great Livermere, where he probably learnt to ring, as he could ring when he used to join the ringing at Ingham in the 1940s. In the 1950s Doug was one of the few with a car and gave fellow ringers lifts to meetings and practices, Lakenheath being an especial attraction in those days! Doug married his childhood sweetheart, Joan, and moved to the outskirts of Bury St Edmunds where he joined the Bury St Edmunds Company which then included ringing for services at both he Cathedral and St Mary's. Doug was tower captain/steeple keeper at the Norman Tower for over 20 years, retiring from this post in 1986. Doug organised the annual tower outing which in those days was by coach and included an organised lunch and tea, along with sandwiches and crates of beer for the stop on the road' in the boot. Doug continued to ring until he had a serious abdominal operation in 1993. Doug is attributed to having rung 9 peals for the Guild. Two of these are of note, the first peal at Eriswell in April 1958, the stays being removed as the bells were so light, and the peal of Plain Bob Royal at the Norman Tower on 18 November 1978 following the bells' rehanging. Doug died on 18th December 2008 in his 91th year.

REGINALD 'JACK' STURGEON

Mildenhall

Jack was a belininger at Mildenhall for over 40 years. If ever you went to Mildenhall to ring, Jack was always there. For his own reasons Jack was not a member of the Guild and did not visit other towers although he helped Peter Goodwin teach many ringers over the years. Jack was a quiet person and devoted to St Many's church as verger, again holding this position for over 40 years. His tragic death at the age of 80 years and occurring at the church he loved on 30 August, having rung for a wedding and climbing to wind the church clock is all the more poignant.

2008 has been a very interesting year for peal ringing in Suffolk, with many examples of individual progress and achievement, as well as peals of significance for the whole Guild, and beyond. After the large increase in peals in 2007, three extra peals in 2008 led to a total of 120. Hopefully, the seeds of an upward trend have been sown. Peals were rung at 44 Suffolk towers and at just two towers outside the county, Great Yarmouth and Winchester Cathedral. At Ixworth, the last peal before re-hanging and augmentation was rung on 30 March. The first peal was rung on the new tenor at Grundisburgh on 5 October, and a peal of Oxford Treble Bob Major on 16 November marked the centenary of the first peal on the bells at Palgrave. Another peal worthy of note was one of Cambridge Surprise Major at Horringer on 21 June; Mary Dunbavin is to be congratulated on joining the ranks of Suffolk ringers who have rung a thousand peals.

Peal Week 2008 was a resounding success. Eleven out of fourteen attempts were scored between 10 and 16 February, and there were no less than thirteen individual 'firsts' recorded in the footnotes. Members had the opportunity to develop their ringing skills in a wide variety of methods, ranging from Doubles to Caters. A highlight of the year was the Guild's first peal on Fourteen, Yorkshire Surprise, rung at Winchester Cathedral on 25 August, including nine resient members, a tremendous achievement. Another notable peal was Bristol Surprise Maxius at St Mary le Tower on 28 June, in which there were three firsts of Bristol Max and one st on twelve. Also at St Mary le Tower, a peal of Stedman Cinques on 13 September was a bint celebration for George and Diana Pipe; the 60th anniversary of George's first peal on twelve coincided with Diana's 100th peal on twelve. At Grundisburgh on 14 August, compositions of 1440's of New Bob, St Simon's and St Martin's Bob Minor by James Smith were rung together with a 720 of Grandsire Minor to achieve the most methods of Twin-Hunt Minor yet rung to a peal.

At The Wolery Mini-Ring, the series of Surprise Minor peals begun in 2007 culminated in a peal of 41 Spliced Surprise Minor on 11 June. The band then consolidated their achievement with two further peals of '41' on 17 September and 5 November. Handbell peals made a return in 2008, with a resident band ringing a peal of 19 Methods Minor on 10 April at Bacton. Jeremy Spiller and Cherril Thompson also took part in a series of eleven Spliced Surprise Minor peals in July and August, ranging from 35 to 200 methods. Each peal represents very advanced handbell ringing in itself, but to ring eleven such peals over eight days is a really significant achievement.

2008 marked the centenary of a peal in Ipswich of great historical importance. "The Ringing World" of 19th September carried a fascinating front page article by George Pipe, which described the events leading up to the first ever peal of Surprise Maximus. There had been considerable rivalry between bands in Gloucester, Ipswich, London and Bristol to achieve this feat, but it was the St Mary le Tower band which rang the first peal of Cambridge Surprise Maximus on 15 August 1908, an event which, to quote George, "put them firmly in the vanguard of the development of Surprise on twelve." A Centenary Festival of Cambridge Maximus peals took place between 9 and 16 August, with peals being rung around the country. A Suffolk Guild peal

at Great Yarmouth on 9 August launched the week, and there was also a peal at St Mary le Tower on 16 August. Unfortunately, an attempt at Grundisburgh on 15 August, the exact centenary, was lost after two hours due to a broken rope.

Another exciting development in 2008 was the integral part peal ringing played in some really positive local publicity for the Guild. The Master planned simultaneous attempts of Minor in each District to mark St Edmund's Day. The progress of peal attempts during the morning of 20th November formed the focal point of the 'Ring Your Bell for St Edmund' feature on BBC Radio Suffolk. Only two of the four attempts were successful, but the Master and other ringers interviewed were able to introduce our Guild and Art to a wide audience tuned into the upbeat coverage.

Interest in ringing peals of a special commemorative length continued. Seven such peals were rung in 2008, for a variety of events. One, 5085 Suffolk Surprise Major at Rendham on 13 December, was specially composed by Brian Whiting to celebrate the 85th anniversary of the formation of the Suffolk Guild. It would be good to think that the one negative trend in 2008 could be addressed in 2009, namely the dip in the number of peals of Surprise Major and Royal. Only one peal of Surprise Royal was rung in 2008. As for Surprise Major, there were two peals of 8-Spliced, the peal of Suffolk and the series of 'Firsts in the method for the Guild' rung by the Aldeburgh peal band, but there were only five peals of single method Standard Eight Surprise Major, compared with seventeen last year. Nonetheless, 2008 has been an overwhelmingly positive year, stretching the boundaries of both individual and Guild achievement. Once again, I should like to thank all those conductors who have supported me by submitting peal fees and compositions without the need for reminder.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS, HELD AT LONG MELFORD, SATURDAY 5 APRIL, 2008

1. The Chairman, Winston Girling, opened the meeting by giving a warm welcome to the seventy five members present and visitors. He thanked Fr Nick Woodhouse for the service and Jeremy Blaiby the organist, those who helped with the tea, especially Sue Freeman, John and Stephen. He thanked the Tower Captains of Lavenham and Long Melford, Richard Brewster and Richard Lant and the SW district for the arrangements for the day and the warm welcome to the Guild.

The meeting stood in silence in remembrance of the thirteen resident and five non resident members who had died during 2007.

- 2. Apologies for Absence were received from 32 members
- 3. Minutes of 2007 AGM

These had been published in the Annual Report and were signed as a true record.

4. Matters Arising

There were no matters arising.

5. Officers' Reports

Master: Richard Munnings presented the Master's Report as printed in the Annual Report. It was seconded by Chris Garner and accepted by the meeting.

Secretary: Mary Gamer proposed the acceptance of the Secretary's report as printed. This was seconded by Stephen Munford and agreed by the meeting.

Treasurer: Keith Ashton Jones presented the accounts as published, commenting that they had now been examined and were ready to be submitted to the Charities Commission. He said that the Trustees' Report was reproduced in full for the first time in the Annual Report and will be out on the website.

Since the accounts were finalised, it has been realised that a deposit by the Peal Secretary of £310 (for peal fees and NRLM subs) was wrongly assigned in the accounts to Affiliation fee income. The result of this is that in the accounts, Affiliation Fees are overstated by £310, whilst Peal fees are understated by £12. In terms of the Guild income overall, there is no discrepancy, and therefore the error does not misrepresent the Guild's financial position. Technically, however, the Restoration Fund benefited from 100% of the Affiliation Fees, whereas it would only have benefited from half had the correct attributions been made. The General Fund on the other hand lost out correspondingly. A retrospective adjustment could be made. However, the General Fund more than broke even last year, and had a healthy balance to start 2008. Keith therefore proposed that, subject to the AGM's agreement, the Restoration and General Funds balances as per the published accounts be allowed to stand. The proposal was seconded by David Mulrenan and agreed by the meeting

Public Relations Officer: Bruce Wakefield reminded the meeting that the media are interested in anything that bellringers promote, especially restoration. He reported that the BBC had been filming and interviewing at Hollesley and Woodbridge in preparation for an item for Inside Out, to be shown on 2nd May. He thanked Tony and Belty Baines for bringing their mini ring to Woodbridge. He proposed the acceptance of his report which was seconded by David Steed and agreed by the meeting.

Belfry Advisory Committee: Winston Girling proposed that the report as printed should be adopted. The report was seconded by Chris Gamer and agreed by the meeting.

Librarian: Gillian Wakefield proposed the acceptance of her report as printed. This was seconded by Diana Pipe and agreed by the meeting.

Peal Secretary: Christine Knight addressed the meeting and spoke of the Guild as a body which has always given support and encouragement to others. Richard and Christine have been very touched by the abundance of care and support shown to them during the past few months and offered their thanks to everyone.

She proposed the acceptance of her report as printed. It was seconded by Ruth Suggett and agreed by the meeting.

The Chairman thanked her and added that it was good to see that the number of peals had increased from previous years.

Handbell Trustee: Brian Whiting, the Trustee, reported that a set had been returned and was in need of some attention, and that he held a set of 25. Two sets were in the NE and he was pleased to know that they are being used for change ringing.

Winston Girling thanked all the officers of the Guild for their reports and work and for keeping everything running so smoothly.

6. Subscriptions, fees and donations for 2009

The GMC proposed that the subscriptions should be as follows

This was seconded by Chris Garner and carried unanimously.

7. Proposed Constitution changes

The GMC proposed the following:

A1 1.3 to read 'The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule J 13, and shall be elected at the AGM."

A question from the floor prompted assurance that the Trustees would be named. The proposal was seconded by Jason Busby and passed unanimously.

C5 shall be amended by moving "Hartismere" from "1 North East" to "2 North West". This was proposed M.J.Rose, NW Chairman, and seconded by P.J.Gorrod, NE Chairman.

Discussion followed noting that one or two events organised by the NE in Hartismere Deanery received no support locally, also that the ringers at Gislingham feel it easier to support NW events. It was also reported that all the ringers in Hartismere had been asked which district they wished to be in and that they supported going with the NW. The current Deanery Representative reminded the meeting that the Deanery would need to appoint someone from within Hartismere since he resides in the NE.

The vote which followed recorded 56 for the proposal, 1 against and 14 abstentions. The proposal was carried with more than the two thirds majority required.

D8: to add "Webmaster" to list of members to be elected to Offices. This was seconded by John Taylor and carried unanimously.

It was noted that the rules dictate that these changes can only take effect from 1st Jan 2009.

8. Proposed rule changes

The GMC proposed the following rule changes:

The title of The Mitson Shield and Rose Trophy Striking Competitions shall read:

"The Mitson Shield, Lester Brett Trophy and Rose Trophy Striking Competitions"

Rule 3 shall read: "The Milson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows:" MITSON SHIELD and LESTER BRETT TROPHY

(Rule 3.1 shall remain unaltered.) Rule 3.2 shall read:

"a) For the Mitson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor Method(s) Opening rounds will not be marked.

or b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Tittums. "Marked" changes start when the first change is made. (Rules 3.3 and 3.4 shall remain unaltered)

The Master explained that he hoped that the introduction of a rounds and call changes competition within the Guild six bell would encourage more bands to take part and help boost the confidence of many ingers whilst enabling more people to hear and take part in good ringing. In the discussion that followed concern was expressed from the floor that an extremely capable band could enter for rounds and call changes. Qualification for the Essex competition was mentioned where each band must contain an appropriate number of rounds and call change only ringers. It was suggested that a tower should enter a method ringing team if at all possible and only call changes if not. Concern was also expressed at the need for tight rules at all.

The proposal was seconded by Veronica Downing. In the vote which followed 57 were in favour, none against with 13 abstentions. The proposal was carried.

The meeting was asked to vote for its introduction for May 2008. This was carried with none against.

9. St Edmund's Clapper Competition*

The total raised in 2007 was £542 for the Bell Restoration Fund, with Offton raising £250, Sproughton £242 and The Folly £50. The trophy was awarded to Offton.

Maurice Rose thanked the GMC and all the Guild and District Officers for their hard work throughout the year, especially to Winston Girling at the end of his term as Chairman.

10. Election of Officers for 2008/2009:

Vice Presidents Maurice Rose proposed that Winston Girling should be elected as a Vice President. This was seconded and carried unanimously by the meeting. Chris Garner proposed and Keith Ashton Jones seconded, that the Vice Presidents as listed in the 2007 report should be re-elected en bloc. This was agreed.

Chairman: Winston Girling thanked the Guild for their support during his five years as Chairman remarking that he had enjoyed his time in office.

Chris Garner proposed and Alan McBurnie seconded that Philip Gorrod be elected as Chairman.

It was explained that Philip was willing to stand. There were no further nominations and Philip was elected. Since Philip was unable to be at the meeting, Winston continued in the Chair.

Ringing Master: Diana Pipe proposed, seconded by Trevor Hughes, that Richard Munnings be reelected as Ringing Master. Richard was elected.

Secretary: Maurice Rose proposed, seconded by Sandra Pereira, that Mary Garner be re-elected as Secretary. Mary was elected. She was thanked for her work during the last year.

Treasurer & Gift Aid Secretary: Sue Munford proposed, seconded by Sally Munnings, that Keith

Ashton-Jones be re-elected as Treasurer and Gift Aid secretary. Keith was elected.

Technical Adviser: Winston Girling explained that Michael Rolph was unable to stand as Technical Advisor. Mary Garner proposed, seconded by Maurice Rose, that Winston Girling be elected as Technical Adviser. Winston was elected

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee: Maurice Rose proposed, seconded by Keith Ashlon Jones, that Winston Girling be re-elected as Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee. Winston was elected.

Public Relations Officer: Alan Munnings proposed, seconded by Carol Girling, that Bruce Wakefield be re-elected as Public Relations Officer. Bruce was elected.

Librarian: Shirley Girt proposed, seconded by Suzanne Stevens, that Gillian Wakefield be re-elected as Librarian. Gillian was elected.

Report Editor: Kate Eagle proposed, seconded by Lesley Wilson, that Ruth Suggett be re-elected as Report Editor. Ruth was elected. She was congratulated on the report and thanked for all her hard work during the year.

Webmaster: John Taylor proposed, seconded by Sally Munnings, that Chris Garner be elected as Webmaster. This was carried unanimously and Chris was elected. (It was noted that this position will not be recognised officially until 1st January 2009)

Newsletter Editor: The Chairman explained that Carl Melville had moved to Yorkshire recently and was unable to stand. He was thanked warmly for all his work. Sheila Franks proposed, seconded by Ruth Suggett, that Carol Girling be elected as Newsletter Editor. Another nomination failed to secure a seconder. Carol was elected

Peal Secretary: lan Holland proposed, seconded by David Lee, that Christine Knight be re-elected as Peal Secretary. Christine was elected.

Handbell Trustee: Jonathan Stevens proposed, seconded by Diana Pipe, that Brian Whiting be reelected as Handbell Trustee. Brian was elected.

Trustees: It was noted that the following were eligible for election as Trustees: The Chairman, Philip Gorrod, The Treasurer, Keith Ashton Jones, The Secretary, Mary Gamer, and the Chairman of the BAC, Winston Girling. Jonathan Slevens proposed, seconded by Lesley Wilson, that the four be elected en-loc. They were elected. (The four will be recognised under the new rules from 1st January 09, but until then will be Trustees under the current rules.)

11. Appointment of Examiner

Keith Ashton Jones proposed, seconded by Maurice Rose, that Larking Gowen be appointed as Independent Examiners of the Guild Accounts. This was carried by the meeting.

* The St Edmunds Clapper Competition

The trophy was made by John Uden of Southwold, hence the reference to St. Edmund, and was first competed for in 1991. It is a simple competition, open to all towers, the object being to raise the most money for the Restoration Fund between the period 1 April to 30 September by any chosen means. Initially organised as part of The Friends of Suffolk Bells scheme, it lapsed in the mid 1990s but was relaunched in 2001. It provides an excellent opportunity for towers to involve non-members in a variety of fund raising activities - even the medium of Ebay could be used! (See info at http://pages.ebay.co.uk/community/chanty/sellennfo.html). Make the effort this year to enter the competition. Your contributions need to be with the Treasurer by Odober 2009.

12. Election of Life Honorary Members

The GMC proposed seconded by John Girt, that Alan Smith and Albert Driver be elected as Life Honorary Members. The Chairman reminded the meeting of the contributions made by Alan Smith both as Guild Treasurer and as a Central Council Representative for many years. Trevor Hughes explained that Albert Driver aged 93, who has given very long service at Redgrave, has been teaching a new band at Rickinghall Superior. One of his pupils has just rung their first quarter on the treble.

Alan Smith and Albert Driver were elected unanimously.

13. Election of New Members

The following were proposed, seconded to become members of the Guild:

George Fry (full) Tunstall; Paul Bray and Anne Bray, (both full) St Mary le Tower; Angela Hay, (full), Adam Hay, Wingfield; Christopher Barber (full), Malcolm Roberts (senior) Fressingfield; Edith Nurse, David Reeve, (both senior) Ixworth; Roger Fouracre, Brenda Fouracre, Wickham Skeith; Henrietta Fawcett, Ruby Mason from Thornham Magna.

They were all elected and warmly welcomed to the Guild.

14. Date and Venue for 2009 AGM - NE district

The NE District invited the Guild to the AGM on Saturday 18 April 2009, venue yet to be decided.

15. Any Other Business

- a) Glenys Fear, Campsea Ashe, expressed sincere appreciation for the great support by the Guild, both financial and technical, in their augmentation project. Their next fundraiser is a concert at Campsea Ashe church on Sunday 27th April (4pm-6pm). All welcome.
- b) Veronica Downing announced that a Heritage Lottery Grant of £40,000 had come through. The total cost of the project is £120,000. They are still fundraising and the next event is The Old Time Faming Day on July 19th at Bridge Farm, Chediston.
- c) Graham Downing said that additional funds were being raised at Chediston where a local silversmith has been commissioned to produce ear rings. They are available in silver or gold (9 or 18 carat).
- d) Brian Whiting gave the thanks of the Guild for the dinner arrangements to Mary and Chris Gamer and to Christine Knight for her brilliant report on the website. Chris Garner added that Ruth Eagle and Richard Munnings had also done a great deal to help with arrangements.
- e) Sally Munnings announced that she has a child's fleece for sale at £9.
- f) The Dedication of the bells at Stradishall will take place next Sunday April 13th, at 4pm.
- g) Alan McBurnie explained that the BBC had become very interested in the ringing at Hollesley, particularly the Listening Course. He wanted to publicly thank Richard Munnings for getting the BBC involved. A nine minute piece for the programme to be screened at 7.30pm on 2nd May on BBC1.
- He further explained that the ringing course is for people who can handle rather than for complete beginners. He issued a general invitation for members to come and look at the installation and to take part. Winston thanked Alan very much for telling the meeting about this exciting event.
- h) Jonathan Stevens announced that 6 bells at Sweffling and 8 bells at Rendham are available for practice before the Guild Striking competition. He urged prospective bands to book times for a visit.

There being no other business the meeting closed at 7.40pm.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 2008 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- 1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellninging.
- 2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
- Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
- Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
- Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. Name

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
 - 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).
 - 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule J 13, and shall be elected at the AGM.

B. MEMBERSHIP

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
 - service to the Guild.
 - 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. DISTRICTS

- 5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:
 - 1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hoxne and Saxmundham,
 - 2 North West: Ixworth, Hartismere, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
 - 3 South East: Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
 - 4 South West Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6 The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and there can be Patrons and Vice-Presidents.
- 7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Vice-Presidents may be elected. Subscriptions and fees for the year beginning the following January shall be set at the AGM or a SGM.

8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Chairman Ringing Master Secretary

Treasurer
Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

Report Editor Central Council Representatives Technical Adviser Librarian Handbells Trustee Peal Secretary Public Relations Officer Newsletter Editor Webmaster

9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to certify the accounts.

10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Certified Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.

The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

- 11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
 - 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- 19 The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
- 20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 22 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

- F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS
- 23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.
- G. GENERAL
- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from 1 January following.
 - 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

- H. Election of Members and Subscriptions
- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
 - 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
 - 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
 - 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

Guild Chairman

Treasurer

Ringing Master Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee Secretary One Elected Representative from each Deanery

9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.

- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Chairman Treasurer Secretary

Ringing Master Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.

- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as obssible.
- 15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.
- K EXPENSES
- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings.
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council
 meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may
 be determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking

part must be members of the Guild.

- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
 - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
 - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDRELLS

1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)

13 bells by various founders size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

- 2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned

- to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.
- 8 The Trustee and the Guild Management Committee would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

THE MITSON SHIELD, LESTER BRETT TROPHY AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

RULES

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 The Mitson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows:

MITSON SHIELD AND LESTER BRETT TROPHY

- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
 - a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual Report
 - b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 3.2 a) For the Mitson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s). Opening rounds will not be marked.
- or b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Tittums. "Marked" changes start when the first change is made.

ROSE TROPRY

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
- 5 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 6 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 7 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 8 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 9 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 10 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 11 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

CALENDAR OF EVENTS FOR 2009- 2010


