FOREWORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

I am delighted to be writing this at the end of another successful year. We have elected 70 new members in the last twelve months. Over 130 peals and 500 quarter peals were rung. We have acquired our own portable mini-ring, which has been used extensively. Links with BBC Radio Suffolk have continued to provide us with excellent publicity, while the project to restore the bells at St Lawrence Ipswich made the national news. Bell restoration projects continue to flourish, and our Belfry Advisory team, having drawn up detailed protocols, are in regular discussion with the bellhanging firms about improving different aspects of our many installations.

We cannot be complacent though. The retention of new recruits is a national problem to which we are not immune, and maintaining new bands beyond the enthusiastic first few months is a difficult task that all too often ends in disappointment. We will all have our own opinions on how to teach, how to maintain interest, and how to raise standards, but there seems to be no magic formula: sometimes what we do works; sometimes it doesn't.

The Recruitment and Training Committee has piloted some sessions labelled "Teaching the Teachers". Do not be misled: this is not a didactic "This is how you do it" lecture, but an opportunity for participants to pool experiences and learn new ideas from others. I hope many members involved with teaching will take the opportunity to attend one of the sessions planned for 2010.

Once again I extend my thanks to the Guild Officers, District Officers, Tower Captains and all those who help develop our ringing life. In particular I pay tribute to Mary Garner and Keith Ashton-Jones who, having completed five years in office, will be retiring as Guild Secretary and Treasurer respectively at the AGM. It has been good to see people putting themselves forward for office (albeit sometimes with a little arm-twisting) as new blood at all levels guards against stagnation, and I look forward to working with whomever you elect as their replacements.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ending 31 December 2009.

Charity

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers was registered with the Charity Commission on 10 December 1975, registration number 266869. The charity's registered address is 9 The Gallops, Old Station Road, Newmarket, Suffolk CB8 8LA. It is governed under a constitution originally registered in 1977 and most recently revised in 2009.

Principal Objectives

The purpose of the charity is to promote and encourage the practice of bellringing; to recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art; and to cultivate the art of scientific change ringing.

Review of Progress and Achievements

Bellringing Activities Throughout the year Sunday and special service ringing has taken place for most services in the Guild's 178 ringing towers. Regular practices have been held in almost 100 towers where

training takes place for beginners and more experienced ringers. In addition there have been monthly activities in each of the four Guild districts both ringing and social. There have been 131 Peals rung for the Guild during 2009 in 55 Suffolk towers, and 3 outside the county. At least 529 quarter peals have been rung in 119 Suffolk towers enabling many members to improve their skills and keep this ancient art progressing. Emphasis on recruitment and training ensures that this traditional skill continues to flourish.

Restoration Activities Although no new grant applications have been received during 2009, a number of projects have been completed and grants paid, namely Bardwell, Chediston, Ipswich St Lawrence and Elmsett, whilst restoration at Campsea Ashe and Wissett is underway and Dennington has a planned completion early in 2010. Projects employing professionals also use local labour from the ringers and congregations to assist wherever possible. Members of the Belfry Advisory Committee have undertaken work in several other towers, while test rings have also taken place with a view to restoration. A great deal of time and advice is given freely to enable much maintenance work to be carried out, so that the bells across the Guild are kept in as good working order as possible.

Guild Finances

Policies. All money in the Guild's funds not required for day-to-day working purposes is invested or deposited by the Treasurer, as directed by the Guild Management Committee. Grants from the Restoration Fund are authorised by the Guild Management Committee but are only paid after completed work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants are normally only offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmentation and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

General Fund. General Fund income, at £4,448 (after transfers to Restoration and Library Funds) represents a 13% increase compared to 2008. However, high General Fund expenditure, at £5,259, (55% up on 2008) resulted in an £810 reduction in the General Fund closing balance, now at £5,360. The high expenditure was primarily due to the purchases of a supply of Guild badges, stock of bell rope, and the balance-of-cost for the purchase of the mini-ring. All these are considered capital purchases (which should produce some additional income in future years) and accounted for £1,238 of the expenses. Without these, the normal running expenses for the Guild for 2009 (£4,021) are comfortably within the income raised. This was the basis on which the items of stock were sanctioned, despite a rise in running costs of £623 (18%) over the previous year.

Restoration Fund. The Restoration Fund's income, at £5,427, represents a 43% reduction compared to last year's income. However, this was anticipated, being explained by the reduced interest rates received on the reduced amount of money on deposit. The income was however boosted by the repayment of a £6,000 grant paid out in a previous year, and by the traditional transfer-in of half of subscriptions and peal fees from the General Fund. No new grants were approved in 2009. As a result, the sum now available for allocation to new projects stands at £31,822.

Payments of previously allocated grants, totalling almost £20,000, were made for five projects completed during the year. The amount reserved for grants allocated to a further five projects still in progress now stands at £30,600.

Summary. The Guild finances remain in a healthy state, with the General Fund balance sufficient to underpin the cost of day-to-day activities for 2010, and a Restoration Fund balance available to support a vibrant, ongoing programme of restoration projects.

It has been another busy year for the BAC Team. Three meetings were held; February's at Sweffling, June's at Chediston and October's at Fressingfield. We were made most welcome at each, and at Chediston and Fressingfield the members took the opportunity to look at these recent restorations.

Looking at the minutes (all approved BAC minutes can be read on the Guild Website) I see that forty two towers are mentioned. For some it was a reference to maintenance or repair work, others test rings and reports written, yet others because their restoration was underway or completed.

Our knowledge base was deepened with Alan Moul and myself attending the Central Council Sound Control Seminar, which added some useful tools to our "sound" repertoire.

We are pleased to be offering Belfry Maintenance Seminars this year; one in the North West and one in the North East. There will be some theory, some practical and some rope splicing at these.

Many hundreds of hours have been spent up towers and technical advice freely given by the BAC members this year, and I am most grateful for this hard work. Should any Suffolk Guild Tower need such assistance, it is only a call away.

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

RICHARD MUNNINGS

Whether it is old age or the fact that this year has been very busy, it doesn't feel very long since I was writing my last report - but here I am. And what has changed in 2009? Last year I started with the positives and finished with the negatives. I'll do things the other way round this year and part on a high!

Attendances, particularly at district level, were a negative – again. I've tired myself out making this point but it's worth reiterating. These district events are set up for the members, primarily for learners as a chance to try something new, improve, make new friends, meet old ones, get a bit of advice. But the presence of more experienced ringers is vital too. So next time you see one of these events, which may only require your attendance once a month, if that, please do not dismiss it as something irrelevant. The quality and usefulness of such events are guided entirely by YOU!

The cancellation of this year's Training Day was a huge let-down. There are many lessons I have learnt from this. And although there has been a lack of progress on the Recruitment and Training front, there is nevertheless an abundance of ideas, so this should hopefully be something that will come on in 2010.

It was also a shame not to be able to enter a Guild band in the Ridgman Trophy, a competition that we do stand a real chance of winning. It seems I began organising it too early, believe it or not! Still, I am already onto the 2010 entry, so let's bring the trophy back to Suffolk!

I do find it disappointing occasionally when personal disagreements detract from the enjoyment of ringing. You cannot expect 700 members to agree on everything, but I do expect grown adults to find ways of working together to further ringing in the county. We also all need to remember that we are representing the Guild and the way we behave often reflects on the Guild itself.

Positively, it's been another good year for PR, with many newspaper, radio, TV and internet reports on various projects within the Guild, perhaps most spectacularly involving St Lawrence in Ipswich which also featured on the front page of the bumper Christmas double-issue of The Ringing World. Once again BBC Radio Suffolk did us proud with extensive coverage of the St Edmund's Day ringing which again presented the Guild in a good light, especially as all peals and quarters were scored.

Talking of peals, 2009 has seen another rise in the number rung for the Guild for the fourth consecutive year. There have been many achievements (highlighted below) and congratulations to those listed below; The number of first pealers in particular is astonishing and well done to them all and especially those who have gone on to ring further peals.

Guild Peal Week was a huge factor in these impressive figures, accounting for sixteen peals, seven first-pealers and a new conductor. Well done to Gordon who called Cambridge Major (which he was also pealing for the first time) and Maggie who called Stedman Triples, no mean feat! Also well done to Louis Suggett who has really progressed not only with conducting but also in composing. Keep it up Louis!

Quarters are not to be overlooked, either, and this year we have seen many towers quartered which is encouraging. Again Pettistree and Offton have been leading the way in numbers whilst also producing much quality and variety, but the ringing done by the Blyth Valley ringers and the North-West group who have toured the county and indeed the region has been wonderful to hear about. Keep it up guys.

Both peals and quarters have been key to celebrating bells augmented and/or restored this year, with the first quarters rung at Bardwell, Chediston, Stradishall and Wissett in their new state as well as the first one on the Guild Mini-Ring since we acquired it. Meanwhile, the first peals have been rung since restoration, augmentation or acquisition at Chediston, Felixstowe, Ixworth, Parham and on the Guild Mini-Ring.

The celebrations of significant projects have been a real highlight for me and I have enjoyed seeing the satisfaction and joy on the faces of those involved at Chediston in March, Bardwell in October and Wissett in December as one of the most visible benefits of 50% of the subscriptions going to the Bell Restoration Fund showed itself regularly in 2009 - as it has done for some years now.

For a while it looked as if the return of the Guild Social would be one of the big negatives of this year as an incredibly sad amount of apathy meant ticket sales were very slow. The total attendance was still a lot lower than had been hoped but as it turned out the event was a huge success and very, very enjoyable. Huge credit has to go to the South-West District for organising such a wonderful occasion and particularly the ringers of Hadleigh for hosting the main event. It's the North-East's turn this year, so keep an eye out for more details and please, please support it!

Having criticised the level of support for many of the District events earlier, the turnout at the AGM and the Guild Striking Competitions was marvellous! The former was superbly hosted by the Blyth Valley ringers in the North-East District and although it didn't quite hit the century attendance that I was hoping for, the highly enjoyable day should serve to encourage enough people along to meet that target in 2010.

My deepest gratitude to Brian Meads and John Hall for their patient judging of both striking competitions as they sat through an enormous entry that was nonetheless highly pleasing for me and it was a day that all who took part in should be highly proud of, especially as the North-West served a welcome reminder of how far the Guild's reach is as we all travelled over to Exning and Dalham. Thank you to the North-West, it was a wonderful day despite the wasps nest next to the entrance at Exning! Congratulations to St Mary-le-Tower on winning the Mitson Shield and Rose Trophy and to Sweffling for winning the Lester Brett Call Change Trophy as this competition continues to encourage those who previously may not have such opportunities. As if to highlight this, well done to young Holly Abell who was part of the Halesworth band that came second to Sweffling, just months after first handling a bell.

The Guild website is growing and has been a great aid to providing information and for me personally has provided a fantastic platform from which to impart my ideals and thinking through the medium of my daily blog, which I hope gives an insight into not just what I'm up to and trying to do but what the Guild is trying to do.

However, by the time you read this, my time as Guild Master will be short. My reign of terror ends at the 2011 AGM and even as I write this with tinsel and Christmas trees sparkling you should all be giving some thought as to who you would like to replace me. I can't say it's always been a pleasure, but I would urge any potential successors to consider that actually it doesn't involve as much work as the many district officers carry out (though more travelling!) and is in the main a highly enjoyable role. LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

GILLIAN WAKEFIELD

During the last fifteen years that I have been Librarian the Suffolk Guild Library has grown considerably. *Ringling Worlds* date from the present day to the 1930s, archive material, ringing memorabilia and audio visual items have increased thanks to the generosity of people who have donated items over the years, and the purchase of books has extended both the reference and fiction sections.

Indeed, the library is frequently used by researchers with an interest in bells and ringing both in the UK and abroad. For instance an Australian asked for information on the bells of Mendham, someone in Belgium wanted to know about Dutch or Flemish bells in Suffolk, and from the USA a request came for copies of Orders of Service for the dedication of new hand bells. (Although on this occasion the library could not satisfy the enquirer; there are copies available of Orders of Service for the dedication of tower bells).

One valuable resource is on long term loan to the Ipswich Record Office. This is the collection of Bowell Papers referring to the Bowell Bell Foundry that existed in Ipswich. The papers were catalogued by the archivist Chris Pickford and recorded on a CD that is kept in the library for reference.

Other interesting items are the two hand bells that were part of the ring belonging to a band of Stradbroke ringers in the early 1900s. The larger bell is a "two hander" as it has a diameter of 28cm, and it has the most beautiful deep, mellow tone when rung.

Because the complete library has been kept together under the supervision of the librarian, storage conditions have been maintained appropriately. This has been an important consideration as some of the books are worth several hundred pounds each. Also, all the resources of the library have been easily accessible to any member of the Suffolk Guild, enabling a researcher to consult books, *Ringling Worlds* and archive material on one visit. In the same way the Librarian has been able to cross reference using any relevant source in the library to answer a query that has been phoned in or sent by e-mail.

The enquiries have been so interesting that it has been a pleasure to be the Guild Librarian and I hope that my successor will find it equally rewarding.

I have certainly learnt a great deal about the Guild and ringing in general and I would to thank everyone who has helped me along the way. I hope that my successor derives similar enjoyment from this post.

WEBMASTER'S REPORT

CHRIS GARNER

The Guild Website continues to grow. A section about Restorations has been added, and information about towers, bells, ringers and events is constantly updated. Diary inserts for each district showing events in 2010 are available for download. The Ringing Master's Blog is posted daily and is now in its third year. An email system has been set up, whereby information can be sent to everyone for whom addresses are held, members in a district, Tower email correspondents either within a district or across the Guild. These email addresses are known only to me and are not published even to other members. If you would like information distributed please email it to me. PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER'S REPORT

BRUCE WAKEFIELD

Perhaps the most significant PR coup this year must have been the reporting of the restoration of the pre-reformation bells of St Lawrence in Ipswich. The event was widely covered on national and local TV, radio, and in the national and local press. Now that the bells are back, the Town Council is keen that they are rung as much as possible, and anyone who would like to ring on these historic bells is welcome to come on Wednesday lunchtimes between 12:30 and 1:00 pm when there is a commitment to ring them.

BBC Radio Suffolk is still taking a significant and positive interest in bellringing in the county. During March and April, their popular presenter, Lesley Dolphin, elected to learn to ring as part of the BBC's "Learn a New Skill Challenge". Her progress was regularly covered in her afternoon broadcasts, and in the space of four weeks she had progressed from being a completed beginner to being able to ring behind to Bob Doubles. Again as part of its campaign to raise the profile of Saint Edmund, the station gave wide coverage to the Guild's special ringing activities for St Edmund's Day. The Ringing Master (Richard Munnings), was awakened from his slumbers and interviewed live on the radio on the morning of St Edmund's Day, and later in the day he and I were invited into the studio to chat about ringing in general with Lesley Dolphin from the comfort of her "sofa". Then, just before Christmas, I was again interviewed live on Radio Suffolk to talk about the annual Christmas ringing event in Ipswich during which all the ringable bells are rung for half an hour around midday to remind the shoppers of the presence of the church in the town and of the true meaning of Christmas.

During July, a BBC film crew spent a whole evening filming ringing at Woodbridge as part of an Arena programme about musician Brian Eno, who was born in Woodbridge. Even though Brian Eno was not a ringer, the producer was keen to include the ringing footage. How much of it will actually get shown remains to be seen. As I have said before, if you think you have a newsworthy event to report, let the media know. In my experience they are always willing to consider a good story for publication.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

Note 1. 50% of the sum of subscriptions and peal fees is transferred to the Restoration Fund.

Note 2. The interest received from the CBF General Deposit account is distributed to the Jubilee, Restoration and Pipe Trust Funds in proportion to the ratio of their respective capital sums.

Note 3. For 2008, following Guild policy decision, transfer was of interest accumulated since Jubilee Fund foundation. The 2009 figure represents the ensuing annual interest.

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers will not support or condone any attempts by its members or indeed anyone else to ring on bells which are classified as condition 3 or below. 0 - Some bells unhung on the ground.

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or Maintenance Officer.

KEY

The key of a ring (ie the note of the tenor) is given in cents (ie, hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C# -20, and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

The upward trend of the last few years continued in 2009, with 131 peals being rung. Peals were rung in 55 Suffolk towers and at three towers in Norfolk, namely Woodton, Thetford and East Raynham. In addition, the Guild's mobile Mini-Ring was pealed for the first time by Guild members at Moats Tye. Peal Week in February was even more successful than in the previous two years. Sixteen peals were rung and there were no less than seven first pealers. The Master deserves great credit for his efforts to encourage a larger proportion of the membership into peal ringing. On November 20th, extensive coverage of St Edmund's Day by Radio Suffolk portrayed peal ringing in a very positive light and all four District peal attempts were successful.

It is always very heartening to record peals rung as the culmination of restoration projects. A well co-ordinated mix of dedicated local effort and Guild support led to no less than six projects coming to fruition in 2009. Peals were rung to mark the restoration of the bells at Chediston, Stradishall and St Lawrence, Ipswich. The first peal on the eight was rung at Ixworth, whilst the first ever peals on the bells were rung at Parham and Felixstowe. Bardwell bells have been dedicated and a peal will, no doubt, follow soon. Two major restoration and augmentation projects in the adjacent villages of Ixworth and Bardwell is a phenomenal achievement by Ruth Suggett and her team. As the oldest complete ring, the restoration of the five bells at St Lawrence, Ipswich, received extensive media coverage, appearing on national TV news. The first peal on the bells since restoration was rung on 11th November and there is much interesting material about the project in George Pipe's article 'Ipswich St Lawrence and Cardinal Wolsey', which appeared in the Christmas edition of 'The Ringing World'. A peal of Wolsey Surprise Maximus (a new method especially devised by Rod Pipe) was rung on 5th December at St Mary le Tower as part of Ipswich's celebration of Cardinal Wolsey and to mark the completion of the St Lawrence project.

Interest in composing peals of a particular length to commemorate special events has continued. Some celebrated personal milestones, but others had much wider significance. On 7th June, 5065 Gold Surprise Major was rung at Grundisburgh to commemorate the 65th anniversary of the D-Day Landings. A 5040 of Houston Surprise Major by Brian Whiting was rung at Henley on 21st July for the 40th anniversary of man walking on the moon. Stephen Pettman composed a 5076 of Ipswich Delight Royal as a tribute to the life and work of Sir Bobby Robson. This peal was rung at Grundisburgh on 6th August. Another commemorative peal was Bristol Surprise Major at Thetford (a rare visitor to the peal columns) on 7th November, rung as part of the closing ceremony for the Thomas Paine 200 celebrations.

The Wolery Mini-Ring topped the list of towers used for peals once again, and the 100th peal on these bells was rung on 31st May. As well as ambitious peals of Spiced Surprise Minor at The Wolery, several peals of single method Surprise Minor have also been rung. The number of Suffolk towers hosting peals rose from 44 in 2008 to 55 in 2009. Many local community events have been marked by a peal. Much work has been done by Guild officers, through the media, to raise the profile of the Guild in the eyes of the general public. Peal ringing is also starting to receive more publicity and it is good that extended ringing is being heard by a wider section of the local population.

This has, undoubtedly, been an exciting year for peal ringing in Suffolk, with many positive developments. In a largely rural county, an invitation to ring in a peal is often the main opportunity for progress in method ringing and striking. Many individual 'firsts' have been achieved and it is good to see a number of younger members emerging onto the peal ringing scene. There were eleven first pealers, a very encouraging total, and in Peal Week, two members were persuaded to ring another peal after gaps of 16 and 37 years! Another trend in 2009 was the substantial increase in the number of peals in the Stan-

Standard 8 Surprise Major methods. There were 9 of Yorkshire and 5 of Cambridge, compared with just 2 of each in 2008, an excellent means of progress for several members. All the Standard 8 were pealed except London S Major, which was attempted.

There has been a shift in the Guild's peal ringing activity; 35% of all peals in 2009 were of Major, compared with 26% in 2008. Another pleasing development is the increased interest in conducting. Two members called their first peal in 2009 and 10 resident members called more than one peal for the Guild, compared with 6 in 2008. A year then, with many positives; hopefully, this enthusiasm will lead to more peals on 10 and 12 in the near future.

The following were elected as members of the Guild; Richard Lawrence, Ixworth (Senior), David Brand, Ixworth (Senior), Graham Mace, Ixworth (Full), Alistair Whybrow, Euston (Full), Maureen Slinger, Palgrave (Senior), proposed by Ruth Suggett, seconded by Maurice Rose; Eileen Russell Roberts, Ixworth (Senior) proposed by Ruth Suggett, seconded by Chris Nunn; James Lucas, Tattingstone (Full), proposed by Richard Hobson, seconded by Richard Beeston; Hilary Steam, SE Unattached (Full), proposed by Mary Garner, seconded by Kate Eagle; Rupert Bragg, Mendham (Senior), proposed by Trevor Hughes, seconded by Julie Hughes; Christine Pickup, Unattached (Full), proposed by PJG, seconded by Maggie Ross; Pam Davies, John Davies, Richard Treloar, Peter Carter, Campsea Ashe (Full), proposed by Glenys Fear, seconded by Kate Eagle; Andrew Fisk, Woolpit (Full), proposed by Alan Moulit, seconded Ruth Suggett; John Pallant, Stutton (Full), proposed by John Pereira, seconded by Sandra Pereira; Michelle Williams, Reydon (Full) , proposed by Tom Britten, seconded by Jason Busby.

4. Minutes of the 2008 AGM

These had been published in the Annual Report. Their acceptance was proposed by Chris Garner and seconded by Peter Harper and they were signed as a true record.

5. Officers' Reports:

Ringling Master: Richard Munnings (RJM) presented the Master's Report as printed in the Annual Report. He added his thanks to everyone who had taken part in the Guild Peal Week in February, congratulating the seven first pealers. The acceptance of his report was proposed by David Mulrenan, seconded by Robert Beavis and agreed by the meeting.

Secretary: Mary Garner proposed the acceptance of the Secretary's report as printed. This was seconded by Diana Pipe and agreed by the meeting.

Treasurer: Keith Ashton Jones explained that his written report was contained in the Trustees' Report. Robert Beavis proposed, seconded by Maurice Rose, that the accounts and trustees report should be accepted. This was agreed by the meeting.

Public Relations Officer: Bruce Wakefield reported that TV and radio had taken a positive attitude to Guild activities during the year especially restoration projects. He asked members to let the media and himself know if their band or tower had done anything which is good news. He is keeping a log of coverage. Most recently Richard Munnings, Kate Eagle and Alan McBurnie have been teaching Lesley Dolphin from BBC Radio Suffolk and her lessons at St Mary-le-Tower have been featured on her Tuesday afternoon programme.

Belfry Advisory Committee: Jonathan Stevens proposed that the report as printed should be accepted. Philip Gorrod said that this was just a brief snapshot of the achievements of the BAC. It has a lot to be proud of. As well as practical work throughout the county their discussions have resulted in the BAC

Chairman presenting an update of the grant conditions and a protocol for a restoration project, both of which are on the website. George Pipe added that the Guild should congratulate itself having passed the 100 mark for restorations since the war, especially for a Guild between 600 and 700 members. The proposal was seconded by David Salter and agreed by the meeting.

Librarian: Gillian Wakefield proposed the acceptance of her report as printed. This was seconded by Robert Scase and agreed by the meeting.

Peal Secretary: Christine Knight reported that it was noticeable that a wider cross section of our membership is being encouraged into peal ringing as seen in the 120 peals scored last year. It was also very noteworthy for the breadth of achievement: first on 14, Cambridge Maximus and the St Edmunds Day peal ringing with upbeat and extensive coverage on Radio Suffolk. She thanked David Salter for his help with the peal report. She proposed the acceptance of her report as printed. It was seconded by David Salter and agreed by the meeting.

Handbell Trustee: Brian Whiting reported a dormant year with regard to borrowing. He has two sets at home, a 16 and a 25. There are two sets in the NE district. They are available for tune or method ringing. He proposed the acceptance of his report, which was seconded by Diana Pipe and agreed by the meeting.

6. Central Council Report

PJG told the meeting that four members had been elected to represent the Guild interest. Last year's meeting was in Newcastle and full reports are on the website. He invited questions to our representatives or any points they should take to the next meeting. There were none.

7. Subscriptions and Peal Fees for 2010

The GMC proposed that the subscriptions should be as follows:

Animated discussion followed. It included noting a 50% increase for OAPs. Consideration was given to an increased peal fee, or a quarter peal fee, but it was felt that neither would encourage more ringing. Others felt that it was right to keep pace, that it was only the price of a wedding fee and that it was a cheap hobby which gives a lot of pleasure through ringing with friends and visiting lovely churches. Were we not arguing over trivialities when the money is needed for restoration? Shirley Girt seconded the proposal and the vote that followed found all in favour, with three abstentions.

8. Proposed constitution changes, proposed by GMC

B4: add "of an amount at least equal to a Ringing member (65-74) subscription".

D6: revised as follows:

D6

6.1 The President shall be the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

6.2 A Suffragan Bishop within the Diocese shall be a Vice-President.

6.3 A member may be elected as a Vice-President at an AGM.

6.4 A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM.

6.5 Patrons and Vice-Presidents shall hold office without re-election, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM. Vice-Presidents elected under 6.3 shall cease to hold office if they cease to be a member of the Guild.

D7: delete "Vice-Presidents may be elected. Subscriptions and fees for the year beginning the following

January shall be set at the AGM or a SGM". [See H2 below]

D9: delete "to certify the accounts" and add "to act as Independent Examiner in accordance with The Charities Acts"

D10 (3rd line): delete "Certified".

E14: delete "applied to the work of the Guild in the restoration and maintenance of bells" and add "transferred to the Guild Restoration Fund".

F24: add "and the secretary shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of other Guild assets"

G 26.2 Delete "1 Jan following" and insert "the date given in the proposal"

PJG explained to the meeting that these had been drawn up by a sub committee of himself, Mary Garner and Keith Ashton Jones with John Girt overseeing, before presentation to the GMC. They were to be regarded as a tidying up rather than major changes.

Discussion revealed that B4 contained a mistake. It was commented that the constitution as it stood was purposely kept flexible.

The meeting agreed to the changes with the exception of B4, which will be revised and presented at the next AGM.

9. Proposed rule changes, proposed by GMC

H2 (2nd line after "year"): add "and shall be set at the preceding AGM, or a SGM".

K16 (3rd line): add "(including District)"

Handbell Regulations Delete 8 [duplication of 6]

The proposal was seconded by Chris Garner. The following vote recorded 68 in favour, none against with one abstention.

10. Election of Officers for 2009/2010:

Prior to the elections Maurice Rose thanked the GMC and all the Guild and District Officers for their hard work throughout the year.

The Vice Presidents were elected en bloc. Philip Gorrod was re elected Chairman to a round of applause. As each of the remaining nominees were re elected, each was met with a round of applause and they were thanked for their work during the year.

The Chairman was asked whether a minute secretary to the GMC might be considered. He agreed that it would be desirable but as a position delegated by the GMC rather than an officer.

11. Appointment of Independent Examiner

David Mulrenan proposed, seconded by John Taylor, that Larking Gowen be appointed as Independent Examiners of the Guild Accounts. This was carried by the meeting.

12. Election of Life Honorary Members

On behalf of the NW district Maurice Rose proposed Chris Nunn as a Life Honorary Member. Maurice described his long friendship with Chris, Chris's long hours and his commitment to the BAC. Jonathan Stevens endorsed the proposal saying that he had known Chris for 12 years on the committee as someone who always worked hard and never missed meetings. Brian Whiting added that he had known Chris since 1966 when he was taken round by him to other towers. Trevor Hughes added that he had known him since 1969, both as peal ringer and serving together on the maintenance committee. Chris Nunn was elected unanimously. Chris Nunn thanked everyone for their endorsement, and said that it was most enjoyable and uplifting having to use basic principles.

John Girt explained that in the past Vice Presidents had been elected and their remit was to serve on the GMC enabling continuity through the years. Since they no longer sit on the GMC he questions the value of awarding Vice President but rather to award Life Honorary Membership since this represents a greater acknowledgement of what people do. PJG thanked him for his comments and said that the matter would be taken to the GMC.

13. Mini-Ring

PJG explained that he and RJM had discussed whether or not the Guild should own a portable mini-ring. PJG had been given first refusal on one for £2100. He took this to the GMC who agreed in principle but felt that there was no money to finance this, even with the Pipe Trust Fund.

Discussion followed regarding the uses of a the mini-ring, ie publicity, to raise the profile of the Guild, an aid to recruiting, demonstrations, targeted teaching, possibly to help people into method ringing, ringing for service at a church without bells, ringing for weddings in secular places etc.

The point was made that although the technique doesn't relate directly with tower bell ringing it does connect people and bells. Further, a trustee for a mini-ring would need to be appointed. Questions were raised about storage, transport and insurance.

PJG thanked people for their comments and said that he was pleased to announce that our Patron, George Vestey, along with his brothers Timothy, James and Robin, has offered to buy a new ring to be cast in memory of their father, at a cost of about £5000. When the new ring is ready the current ring will be handed back in part exchange.

PJG reported that the ring would have Bowditch bells and that a provisional order had been placed with Matthew Higby. This news was very well received and PJG was asked to write and say thankyou to Mr Vestey. Furthermore the view was expressed that the new ring should be dedicated in the Cathedral by the Bishop.

14. Child Protection - new legislation October 2009

PJG advised that the Guild was alert to recently published CCCBR notes. The changes include the appointment of a Vulnerable Persons Officer for the Guild.

15. Guild History

PJG told the meeting that following an approach from a member of the Guild the GMC agreed that it would be good to have a history of the Guild. George Pipe(GWP) was approached and agreed. GWP reported that he has started and that it is great fun to do. He said that he feels that the Guild is worthy of history and that he hope to do it justice. He will be pleased to accept input for this. GWP related the story about Bailey brothers of Leiston. There were 11 of them, 10 of whom rang. 8 rang more than 20 peals together, in some very advanced methods. In 1926 six of them rang a peal of Stedman cinquies in hand, repeating it the following month. Adrian Knight added that he was taught to handle by one of the brothers.

16. Guild Social Event – Hadleigh, 27th June 2009

Richard Knight said that the arrangements were well in hand. There is ringing planned for the afternoon in unusual towers including All Saints' Sudbury. The new mini-ring will be at the evening barbecue which starts at 6pm at Hadleigh Guildhall. Tickets available at £10 each.

17 St Edmund's Clapper Competition

The trophy was made by John Uden of Southwold, hence the reference to St. Edmund, and was first competed for in 1991. It is a simple competition, open to all towers, the object being to raise the most money for the Restoration Fund between the period 1 April to 30 September by any chosen means. Initially organised as part of The Friends of Suffolk Bells scheme, it lapsed in the mid 1990s but was relaunched in 2001. It provides an excellent opportunity for towers to involve non-members in a variety of fund raising activities

The results of the competition for the tower which raises most money for the Bell Restoration Fund were announced as follows: 3rd The Folly, Sproughton £260, Offton £325. Offton won the trophy and it was noted that £635 is the highest amount raised so far in any year. Brian Whiting urged more towers to take part.

18. There were no further matters arising from the minutes of the 2008 AGM not already covered
19. The 2010 AGM will be held in the NW District. It is hoped it will be at Ixworth, probably on April 10th.

20. Any Other Business

2. GWP spoke about the Essex recruitment weekend at Coggeshall and asked whether some of our young people could go there. He and Rod are very keen for the Pipe Family Trust Fund to be used for this purpose, that is, to target beginners. He is pleased that it is still going after 19 years. (PJG reported that it had been used recently to make grant for training at Worcester).

3. With regard to the AGM date, Alan Moulton said that it was difficult to get the report done in time. PJG said that the GMC will consider the date.

4. Muriel Page reminded the meeting that the Veteran's Day will be on July 8th at Debenham.

OBITUARIES

JOHN WILLIAM BANKS

Bury St Edmunds

John Banks, known as 'Jack', was a post-war ringer and member of the Bury St Edmunds Company, who rang at the Cathedral and St Mary's. He rang 18 peals for the Suffolk Guild, his first, Plain Bob Major, at the Norman Tower, on 13 September 1947. Jack rang 2 peals on St Mary's bells prior to their removal in 1964. The Cathedral bells were removed for re-hanging in 1973. The bells at St Mary's were returned in 1975 but hung 'dead' and Jack trained a band there to chime the bells for services. He died on 15 June 2009 and his funeral was held at St Mary's Church, Bury St Edmunds. An obituary appears in the Ringing World No. 5145.

HENRY IVINGS

Euston

Although synonymous with Euston and the Estate, Henry was from Oxfordshire, and was a bricklayer and carpenter by trade. He learnt to ring at Euston and he looked after the bells there from 1952 for 55 years. Henry became a member of the Suffolk Guild in 1953 for whom he rang 30 peals. In the early 1980s Win and Henry raised funds to re-hang and augment the 5 bells at Euston to 6 in a new frame and this was completed in 1983. Henry's practical skills enabled him to do a lot of work in the tower himself and assist with the re-hanging. Win and Henry made good use of the bells and arranged peals and quarter peals for local and national events, as well as for family occasions of the Duke and Duchess of Grafton. In 2007 both Henry and Win moved to Gloucestershire, and Henry died on 29 May 2009. On Sunday 23 August 2009 a Thanksgiving service for Henry's life was held at Euston St Genevieve church. A full obituary appears in the Ringing World No. 5140.

DR DAVID PEARSON

Haverhill

David was a GP in Haverhill, who along with his wife Lynn, had been involved with St Mary's Church for many years. He expressed an interest some ten years ago in becoming a bellringer and duly joined the tower, being taught by the Tower Captain Albert Wade, assisted by long time member, Gordon Adams. David regularly attended Monday evening practice and subsequently became a reliable ringer for the Sunday morning services. He was held in great respect in Haverhill and died on 28 September 2008; the comparatively early age of 66 years.

DAVID L C RUTHERFORD

Long Melford

David and his brother Nicholas were the fourth generation of a seafaring family, both becoming Captains of some of the largest supertankers in the world. In 1974 David came ashore to work in the London office as the Fleet Safety Officer. With his wife Jean and daughter Mary, he moved to Long Melford. Something that David had always wanted to do was learn bellringing; he learnt with his daughter Mary. David rang some quarter peals but his main interest was to ring for Sunday Service. He had a great interest in the Church and became a lay reader. Then he became a fully ordained non-stipendiary minister working with Lawrence Pizzey at Acton and Great Waldingfield. One of David's proudest moments was conducting the wedding service for his grand-daughter Emma and afterwards ringing a few rounds with his family. David had his first bout of cancer in 1999, but following a successful operation continued with a busy Church life for the following years. He was always pleased to hear the bells even if he was unable to ring them. The cancer returned in 2009 and he died on 15 May. His funeral service, conducted by Lawrence Pizzey, was held at Acton church. The bells were rung half muffled and David would have had a chuckle that one of the muffles slipped and one of the bells was then rung open!

GEORGE SALTER

Ipswich

George A W Salter was taught to ring at St Clement's Ipswich by Fred Steward in the early 70s. He gave many years of support to St Clement's and his sons helping with all aspects of the tower from Sunday service ringing to clock winding. Regrettably he stopped ringing in the 80s but always retained an active interest, being particularly supportive of fund raising for bells through the Suffolk Police Male Voice Choir. He passed away on 1 January 2009.

ALBERT JAMES WADE

Haverhill

Albert was a bellringer at Haverhill St Mary's Church for almost sixty years, learning under the then Tower Captain, Harry Backler, and Harry Clark. He was a keen and excellent ringer and was appointed Captain in 1984. He also undertook the maintenance of the bells until some four years ago, when hip problems forced him to conclude his active ringing career. Despite this, he maintained his dedicated interest, organising ringers for weddings as well as ensuring the tower was open and someone available to meet any teams of visiting ringers. Albert died suddenly on 2 December 2009 at the age of 90 years. In accordance with his wishes the St Mary's Church bells were rung open, both before and after his funeral service.

RUTH WRIGHT

Halesworth and Woodbridge

Ruth Wright (nee Dickens) learnt to ring at Halesworth, and joined the Suffolk Guild in 1987. She married in 1993 but remained in Halesworth until 2004 when she and her husband Chris moved to Woodbridge. Ruth immediately became a loyal member of the Woodbridge band, until her sad and untimely death in 2009. A keen bellringer, needlewoman and gardener, Ruth was also a talented violinist and soon took over the running of the Woodbridge handbell team, raising it to a standard that she considered high enough for public performances. Despite valiantly fighting cancer in the last years of her life, Ruth remained a regular ringer at Woodbridge, and, whenever her health permitted, she was always ready to ring for weddings and other special occasions. She is greatly missed.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 2009 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
3. Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
4. Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
5. Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. Name

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
- 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).
- 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule J 13, and shall be elected at the AGM.

B. MEMBERSHIP

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild
 - 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.

C. DISTRICTS

- 5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:
 - 1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
 - 2 North West: Ixworth, Hartismere, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
 - 3 South East: Bosmere, Colneis, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
 - 4 South West: Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6
 - 6.1 The President shall be the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - 6.2 A Suffragan Bishop within the Diocese shall be a Vice-President.
 - 6.3 A member may be elected as a Vice-President at an AGM.
 - 6.4 A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM.
 - 6.5 Patrons and Vice-Presidents shall hold office without re-election, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM. Vice-Presidents elected under 6.3 shall cease to hold office if they cease to be a member of the Guild.

7. The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC).
8. Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Ringling Master	Librarian
Secretary	Handbells Trustee
Treasurer	Peal Secretary
Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee	Public Relations Officer
Report Editor	Newsletter Editor
Central Council Representatives	Webmaster
9. The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to act as Independent Examiner in accordance with The Charities Acts .
10. The following Committees shall be formed:
 The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.
 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.
 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

11. All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
12. All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
- 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
13. The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
14. The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be transferred to the Guild Restoration Fund. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
15. Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
16. The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
17. The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
18. The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
19. The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
20. The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
21. The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
22. The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

- 23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild, and the Secretary shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of other Guild assets
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from the date given in the proposal.
 - 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year, and shall be set at the preceding AGM, or a SGM. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the

matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.

8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.

8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

- 9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

Guild Chairman	Treasurer
Ringing Master	Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee
Secretary	One Elected Representative from each Deanery

9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.

9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.

- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.

- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.

- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.

- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Chairman	Treasurer	Secretary
Ringing Master	Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee	

The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.

- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.

- 15 The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:

- The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
- The expenses of Guild Meetings (including District)..
- Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
- Guild insurances.
- Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
- Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
 - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
 - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

- 1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors	size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw	size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner	size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)
13 bells by various founders	size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
- 2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same

lower as the preceding borrower.

- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.

THE MITSON SHIELD, LESTER BRETT TROPHY AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 The Mitson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows:

MITSON SHIELD AND LESTER BRETT TROPHY

- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:

- a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual Report
- b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.

- 3.2 a) For the Mitson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s). Opening rounds will not be marked.

- or b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Titlums. "Marked" changes start when the first change is made.

ROSE TROPHY

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.

- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.

- 4 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
- 5 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 6 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 7 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 8 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 9 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 10 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 11 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

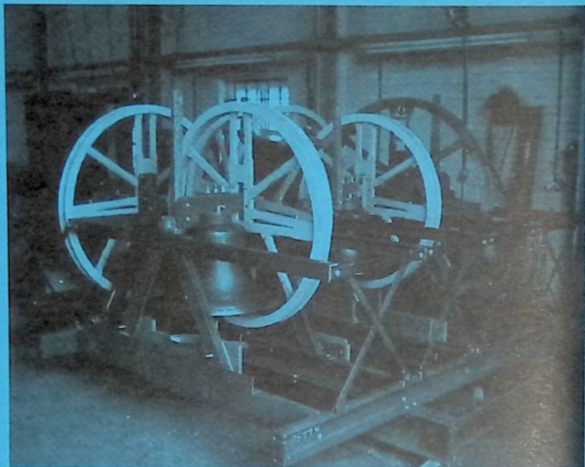
