FOREWORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

2010 has been another successful year for the Suffolk Guild. Apart from the considerable ringing achievements (detailed in the Master's Report) the year saw the arrival of our new mini-ring, thanks to the generosity of our Patron and his family, its debut before 20,000 members of the public at the Henham Steam Rally, and the high-profile dedication service at Bury Cathedral. The Guild Social event, the Quiz at Ringsfield, was a triumph for the NE District, and we had a bumper attendance at the AGM at Ixworth, which included the very successful "fringe" meeting on Heritage Lottery Funding. Perhaps the biggest achievement, though, has been the launch of "Aw! A'huld" our periodical magazine that I hope members will agree to continue when the matter is debated at this year's AGM.

One of the most satisfying things about ringing in Suffolk is the number of young people who are coming to prominence, and who promise a bright future for the Guild. In all corners of the county teenagers, some of whom only started to learn the day before yesterday (so it seems!), are now stalwarts of their local bands, and are ringing peals and quarter peals regularly, and putting more experienced ringers to shame with their striking. Two of our four districts have appointed under-eighteen year olds as Assistant Ringing Masters. We must do what we can to encourage and support the new generation, including providing transport, tutorials and helpful advice. We do have to be mindful of Child Protection issues, but these problems are largely overcome by sharing the burden between members of the band, thus strengthening the team ethos that is so important in ringing.

As usual I am most grateful to your Guild Officers for the work they do in making things run smoothly. In particular, Mandy and Gordon have slotted seamlessly into their roles as Secretary and Treasurer respectively. The biggest accolade, though, goes to Richy who retires as Master this year after five years of outstanding service in that role. He has earned a rest, but I hope we can find another role for him to make use of his expertise. After all, we do have to encourage youth!

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ending 31 December 2010.

Charity

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers was registered with the Charity Commission on 10 December 1975, registration number 266869. The charity's registered address is 21 Old Ipswich Road, Claydon, Ipswich IP6 0AB. It is governed under a constitution originally registered in 1977 and most recently revised in 2010.

Principal Objectives

The purpose of the charity is to promote and encourage the practice of bellringing within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich; to recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art; and to cultivate the art of scientific change ringing, and to promote and advise on the preservation of bells in an efficient condition.

Review of Progress and Achievements

Bellringing Activities Throughout the year ringing has taken place for services in many of the (approximately) 200 towers with bells in the Diocese. Regular practices have been held in around 100 towers where training takes place for beginners and more experienced ringers. Each of the four Guild districts held monthly activities, both ringing and social. There were 135 peals rung for the Guild during 2010 in 57 Suffolk towers and 6 outside the county. Quarter peal ringing increased significantly once again to 594 quarter peals and this enables many ringers to improve their skills. Recruitment and Training strategies have been developed to maintain the improvement of skills in the Guild.

Restoration Activities A new grant application was received from Bury St Edmunds (Norman Tower) and projects at Hopton, Dennington and Wissett were completed, with much progress at Campsea Ashe. These projects employing professional bellhangers also use local labour from the ringers and congregations to assist wherever possible. In addition to work carried out on many towers by members of the Belfry Advisory Committee, two very successful maintenance courses were run by them for Guild members.

Guild Finances

Policies. All money in the Guild's funds not required for day-to-day working purposes is invested or deposited by the Treasurer, as directed by the Guild Management Committee. Grants from the Restoration Fund are authorised by the Guild Management Committee but are only paid after completed work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants are normally only offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmentation and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

General Fund. General Fund income, at £4,791 (after transfers to Restoration and Library Funds) represents an 8% increase compared to 2009. Excluding the purchase of the mini-ring, which has distorted the figures, General Fund expenditure has slightly reduced from last year. The production of three issues of a full-colour printed magazine in place of the photocopied newsletter was the only significant increase in expenditure. The increase was partly offset by additional advertising and this could prove more fruitful in the future. The membership will be invited to decide at the AGM whether they wish to continue with this publication.

Restoration Fund. For the second year in succession, Restoration Fund income has been affected by low interest rates with interest income this year at just over £300. At 2008 rates it would have been over £3,500. Excluding interest received, and transfers from the General Fund, income at £4,630 showed a 7% increase over 2009. Grant approval during the year totalled £5,500 (nil in 2009). The sum now available for allocation to new projects stands at £35,625.

Payments of previously allocated grants, totalling £18,000, were made for three projects completed in the year. The amount reserved for grants allocated to a further three projects still in progress stands at £18,100.

Mini-Ring During the year the new Guild Mini-Ring arrived and the old mini-ring was sold. The outstanding generous donation from the family of the late Edmund Vestey to fund the new mini-ring arrived too late to be included in the 2010 accounts, so in 2011 the General Fund will benefit from the remaining instalment.

Summary. The Guild finances remain in a reasonably healthy state, with the General Fund balance maintained from the previous year. The Restoration Fund again has a healthy balance available to contribute to projects that may arise in 2011.

BELFRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

JONATHAN STEVENS

This has been yet another busy year for the BAC during which we welcomed two new members; Carol Girling, long known for her sterling work alongside Winston, and Martin Croucher, who as a chartered structural and civil engineer adds further strength to an already strong team.

We had three meetings; these were held at Barking, Ipswich St Lawrence and Sudbury St Gregory. The approved minutes of BAC meetings can be found on the Guild website; these make interesting reading, showing the breadth of the work the BAC does caring for the Guild's towers.

Four restorations came on stream; Campsea Ashe, Dennington, Hopton and Wissett. Each had its own challenges, the heritage issues at Wissett needing particular care to resolve.

We ran two very successful belfry maintenance courses; one at Rougham, the other at Laxfield and Fressingfield. These had an in-depth theory seminar followed by practical sessions up the tower and on splicing ropes. Next year the emphasis will be on showing individual towers what to do and how to do it.

We have seen a lot of restorations over recent years; these installations need looking after just as much as our older rings if they are to be the pleasure to ring on they should be. Don't be content with poor going and odd-struck bells. The BAC is a valuable Guild resource; use it to ensure Suffolk's bells are in top condition.

All good things have to come to an end and so I find myself writing my last report as Guild Ringing Master after a thoroughly enjoyable five years.

I can't claim it's all been sunshine and flowers and I've been frustrated by the lack of enthusiasm by so many members in attending the social outlets that the various district and Guild practices, meetings, striking competitions, outings and socials represent. Some people spend much time and even money in preparing teas or booking towers all for large swathes of members to ignore their efforts often for no good reason. Yes, there can be travelling and time involved but these events are all set up to help those learning and need learners and experienced ringers in equal abundance to make them truly worthwhile. In any walk of life people come and go for various reasons and you need to make sure there are others coming in to replace them. That's why learners are welcome and indeed necessary and experienced ringers are needed to help guide them through. This applies at a tower, district and Guild level. So whatever level of ability you consider yourself to be at, come and support us to ensure that ringing can continue in Suffolk and importantly that all enjoy it!

Whilst this aspect of our Guild has remained, on many occasions there have been promising signs. There were finally over a hundred members at the most important event of the year, the AGM at Ixworth and although the meeting was one of the longest for some time, the rest of the day was a very, very enjoyable occasion with ringing at several towers, a fringe event, a superb tea and of course a good crowd in the pub afterwards!

This year William and Kate have ensured that there is an extra Bank Holiday on AGM weekend so people can get those odd jobs done and still attend what promises to be a wonderful day at Henley, my last as Ringing Master.

Growing crowds at the AGM have been a positive in my time as Master (though not necessarily down to me!) as have the fantastic turnouts at the Guild Striking Competitions, helped – I believe – by the introduction of the call-change element in the shape of The Lester Brett Trophy. In 2010, this was won by Debenham and The Mitson Shield by St Mary-le-Tower in the six-bell competition at Hasketon, whilst the North-East District were the worthy recipients of The Rose Trophy at Woodbridge in the evening. Well done to them and thank you to the judges Alban and Chris Forster, David Stanford and Jonathan Dickenson on sharing the duties.

Peals are another element of Suffolk ringing I have been very happy to see flourish, especially with the Guild Peal Week. This year's SGPW equalled that of 2009 in numbers and again contributed a healthy number of first-pealers and first-time conductors, providing all four first-pealers and two of the three first-time conductors.

Well done particularly to Arnie, who has deservedly reached his 1000th after decades of service to the Guild. Personally I have been greatly helped by his advice, often over a pint or three! I know this has been the case for many.

There were also significant peals rung at Fressingfield (first since being rehung), Campsea Ashe (last before restoration and augmentation) Dennington (first since restoration) and Bardwell (first since restoration and augmentation). I often think that quarter-peal ringers don't always get the recognition for their achievements. Part of this is due to the sheer numbers rung by our members compared to peals and so from a practical side of things I couldn't possibly acknowledge everything done through this medium over the year, though I try to on my daily blog on the Guild's website. However, particular congratulations to Alex Scase, Mike Hill, Erin Coolbear, Joan Clinton, Catherine Looser, Richard George, Helen Naughton and Giles Croucher who rang their first quarter in 2010, Davids Steed and Howe on calling their first and at the other end of the spectrum Mike Whitby who rang his 1300th and called his 900th, Josephine Beever who rang her 900th and Marys Allum and Garner who rung their 800th. Well done to Pettistree and Offton in particular who again led the way in both numbers and variety.

Congratulations to all who achieved something either in a peal or quarter and apologies if I've missed anyone. There's just been so much going on.

As usual, dedications were a highlight of the year as they have been throughout my tenure and in 2010 I was delighted to help local and Guild ringers celebrate the projects carried out at Dennington and Ixworth as well as the dedication of the Guild's new mini-ring, the Vestey Ring at Bury St Edmunds Cathedral. All wonderful occasions.

The Vestey Ring is something we must make the most of. It is a superb tool for recruitment and training throughout Suffolk and on its first official outing to the Henham Steam Rally it attracted a huge amount of attention and I believe a handful of recruits.

Talking of Recruitment and Training, some headway has been made with meetings taking place and strategies laid out. However, we are going to need the help of members everywhere to ensure that ringing at all your towers can continue and thrive, surely something we should all be working towards.

It remains for me to say thank you to you all for your support and friendship particularly since 2006. I've had a great time travelling the county meeting members, taking in ringing at all sorts of places with all sorts of people for all sorts of reasons. Particular thanks to those officers past and present who have guided and advised me and most of all to Ruthie and Mason who have stoically put up with my role. I couldn't have done it without them.

I only hope I have been the Ringing Master you all deserve.

For the Guild library, 2010 was a year of change. Gillian Wakefield deservedly reclaimed space in her house after 15 years of curating, developing and cataloguing the collection, and as her successor I would like to express the Guild's thanks to her for her work and legacy.

The library consists of *Ringling Worlds*, periodicals, archive material and audio-visual items. While housing the library at the Wakefields' offered many benefits: visitor access to the entire collection; information at the Librarian's fingertips; and secure storage, it nevertheless demands all too valuable space. To secure it for the future, it was placed in the care of public institutions: audio-visual material at the specialist Archive Centre in Norwich, and documentary material and books at the Suffolk Records Office. At present, most of the material is still being catalogued in Ipswich, with the intention of a move to Bury.

Despite these arrangements, a significant development since April has been the return of non-Suffolk-related material from the Records Office. So far, the *Ringling Worlds* are temporarily with me until a new repository for them and the rest of the library can be found. Ideally, this should be permanent and public. Suggestions are welcome – the possibility of building a learning centre into any upcoming augmentation project is one very good idea.

Please use the library – it is valuable for all aspects of ringing, bells and the history of ringing in Suffolk. Enquiries can still be addressed and access arranged even during the changeover. The catalogue is a vital linking element now that the library is dispersed, and I plan to add the location, availability and reference numbers of items to the information that is available on the Guild website.

The updated catalogue will also show this year's additions. John Girt has offered to continue our run of *The Ringling World*, and we have purchased a searchable DVD of it from 1911-1940. Continuing the historical theme, David Rogers has donated an issue of *Picture Post* from July 1949 which features photographs and descriptions of the Lavenham ringers. The author observed that 'in the belfry all types and ages of men and women meet on common ground'. This still rings true, and in 60 years' time people may want to look back to today. I would therefore like to finish with a general plea for materials - orders of service, leaflets, photos (digital or otherwise), newspaper cuttings, videos, notes on trips and other items will all create an archive of today's Suffolk Guild of Ringers, so do please send or e-mail them.

PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER'S REPORT

BRUCE WAKEFIELD

This year saw the delivery of the Guild's new mini-ring, a generous gift from the estate of the former Patron of the Guild, Edmund Vestey. His son, George Vestey, the Guild's current Patron, says that he and his brothers, Timothy, James and Robin, are pleased to be able to help the ringers and, in doing so, provide a lasting memorial to their father. The ring is to be known as the Vestey ring. It was dedicated in the cathedral at Bury during evensong in the autumn. The mini-ring is proving to be a valuable tool to help with the promotion of bellringing in the county. Manned by members of the Guild, it has been taken along to a number of public events, including the Henham Steam Rally. At these events, members of the public have been actively encouraged to safely "have a go" at ringing.

Ringing at St Lawrence in Ipswich on Wednesday lunchtimes has now become a regular occurrence. Any ringer who happens to be in Ipswich on Wednesday lunchtimes between 12:30pm and 1:00pm will be welcomed. Methods that are rung range from rounds and call-changes up to Stedman Doubles. If you haven't already rung on these historic bells this is a good chance to ring them. And of course, because the ringers can be clearly seen (if not heard) from the cafeteria in the main body of the church, ringing here is valuable from a public relations point of view.

BBC Radio Suffolk are still campaigning to raise the profile of Saint Edmund, hoping that in time he might be adopted as the country's Patron Saint. The station again gave wide coverage to the Guild's special ringing activities for St Edmunds Day. Our Chairman was interviewed on the Mark Murphy Show which was being broadcast from Bury St Edmunds, and later in the morning Abby Antrobus and Jed Flaters were interviewed by the presenter at the Norman Tower.

On the last Saturday before Christmas we managed to ring all the ringable bells in Ipswich together for half an hour around midday to remind the shoppers of the presence of the church in the town and of the true meaning of Christmas. This is a feat that requires at least 51 ringers. In previous years, one or more of the Ipswich towers has been unavailable for one reason or another.

Earlier in the year the bells of St Mary's Woodbridge were rung for the special service in the church attended by the 23 Engineer Regiment (Air Assault), who are based at the Rock Barracks Woodbridge, prior to their deployment to Afghanistan.

Everyone must have heard via the media of the theft of the Campsea Ashe bells whilst they were at the bell hanger's works. Fortunately the stolen bells were able to be replaced, and Campsea Ashe now has a lovely ring of 6 bells which replaces the old ring of 4 that used to be in the tower. If you have a newsworthy event to report, don't keep it to yourself. Let the Guild's PRO or the media know. The media is always willing to consider a good story for publication.

WEBMASTER'S REPORT

- 4 - Rung occasionally. Frame/fittings nearly life expired.
- 3 - Not to be rung mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2 - Not to be rung mainly because of frame and/or fittings.
- 1 - Hung dead.
- 0 - Some bells unhung on the ground.

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or Maintenance Officer.

KEY

The key of a ring (ie the note of the tenor) is given in cents (ie, hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C# -20, and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

John Smith has now started to teach a prospective new band at St Gregory's, to go some way towards rectifying this situation. It is hoped that in 2011 bells will be rung again in Sudbury on Sunday mornings.

At the ADM in November Rolie Whiting stood down as District Treasurer, a post he had held for many years. Indeed, he has been an officer of the district for over three decades. He was presented with a gift by the District Officers as a token of appreciation for all the work he has done for the South West District.

OBITUARIES

JULIA BARRY

Long Melford

Julia joined Long Melford Tower in spring 2007 where she learnt very quickly how to handle a bell, within 6 months she was ringing in rounds and call changes and at Sunday services, she also loved to get out and about visiting other towers. Julia had a very dry sense of humour and was never shy in telling other ringers if they were not 'focused enough' on the task. It is a year now since she lost her fight to cancer, but still we miss her and often comment how she would be 'glaring' at our mistakes as we learn new methods. Julia was a much loved and valued ringer and will be always remembered at Long Melford

D SIMON COTTRELL

Parham

Simon and his wife Audrey spearheaded the restoration and augmentation of the three medieval and unique bells at Parham to the present six. Simon was a terrific chap to work with; enthusiasm, kindness and generosity personified and good humour besides. It was his drive that saw this project through to completion. One applauded too his willingness to learn the Art so late in life, but he did it, and gave us as much pleasure as it obviously gave him.

ALBERT G. DRIVER

Redgrave

Albert was born at Moneypot Farm, Redgrave on 14th February, St Valentine's Day, 1915 and lived there all his life. He learnt to ring at the age of 8, being taught by his father Frederick. Albert rang the bells for Redgrave's Harvest Festival for 81 consecutive years. Peals were rung for his 60th and 70th anniversaries and the 80th anniversary was celebrated by a Quarter Peal of Grandsire Doubles on 21 September 2008. Albert ringing the tenor. In recent years Albert taught a new band using the bells at Rickinghall. It is a credit to him that four of them were able to ring in a quarter peal following his funeral. Full accounts of Albert's life and bellringing appear in the *Ringing World* at pages 876 and 1000.

DENNIS KIDDY

Cowlinge

Dennis was already in his forties when he was taught to ring at Cowlinge by Harry Stubbings. The band was very depleted and had merged with the one at Stradishall. Dennis joined the Suffolk Guild in 1975 and soon began training a new band at Cowlinge. He organised his own first peal there in 1976 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the first peal on the bells. It was conducted by Walter Perry of Clare, who had helped with teaching recruits. Dennis rang just one other peal, but was proud to have rung 72 quarter peals. He was always looking out for new recruits, working extremely hard to maintain a band for regular service ringing at Cowlinge. Stradishall bells were unringable for many years owing to tower problems, but once the tower was restored in the mid-1990s, Dennis began working tirelessly towards having the bells re-hung. The project came to fruition in 2007. Dennis died suddenly, aged 81, on 27th August 2010, at his life-long home, Hawbush Farm. He made a huge contribution to local ringing and he will be greatly missed.

JOHN MARDON

Sproughton

John and his wife Jean moved to Sproughton from Cock Clarks near Purleigh, Essex some 8 years ago and John immediately became an enthusiastic, regular and valuable member of the Sproughton band. John learnt to ring at Purleigh in his mid seventies. Sadly John suffered a stroke a couple of years ago and although he tried, he knew it was no longer practical for him to ring. John sadly suffered a further stroke in the autumn of 2009 and died Monday 11th Jan at the age of 89. His warm, kindly, generous, humorous and Christian personality will be missed.

ROBERT MARES

Edwardstone

Robert and his wife Mavis came to live at Groton in 1987. They were eager to participate in the various local activities on offer, one of which was church bellringing, and presented themselves for instruction in our noble art at St. Mary the Virgin church in the next door parish of Edwardstone. They were taught to ring by members of the local band under the captaincy of Sarah Tittford, (the local Rector's wife), and became regular Sunday service ringers there for several years. Both Robert and Mavis were elected ringing members of the Suffolk Guild in 1990.

In 1997 the restoration of the eight bells in St Mary the Virgin church, Boxford, was completed and they became regular Sunday Service ringers at that tower. The advancing years began to take their toll on Robert's health however and, sadly, he eventually became unable to handle the bells.

WENDY MASON

West Stow

Wendy was the experienced ringer needed when teaching a new band from scratch at West Stow for the Millennium. She was born and brought up in the village and spent her whole life in that general area. She originally learnt to ring as a teenager in the fifties, being taught by Arthur Ballam. This was the era when each ringer had his own bell. Work and family took over and she had not rung for 40 years when a chance meeting persuaded her to have another go, and she found that she had not forgotten as much as she thought. She was a loyal member of the band that rang in the Lark Valley Benefice, ringing regularly there and with the Breckland ringers until May 2010 when she started feeling unwell. She died on 9 September 2010, aged 68 years. The bells at West Stow were rung open before her funeral as a celebration of her life.

SUSAN MUNFORD

Pakenham

Susan Tipple was born in Pakenham in 1958 and learnt to ring there in 1971 along with her future husband Stephen Munford. The tower at Pakenham became unsafe for ringing in 1976 and handbells were rung for their wedding in 1977. Susan became Secretary of the North West District of the Suffolk Guild between 1975 and 1976.

In 1993, following repair work on the tower, and the re-ordering of the bells, Susan and Stephen returned to St Mary's, bringing with them their son Carl and daughter Becky. Since then the family have been regular ringers, always reliable, and always ready to "have a go" at anything new. Susan rang six peals, including the first following the re-ordering of the bells at Pakenham in 1995, and the first after the addition of a sixth bell for the Millennium, and many quarters, among them several family-only, the four Munfords being joined by Susan's mother, Joan, and Stephen's brother-in-law, Maurice Rose. Their enthusiasm was such that they also rang at Great Barton, juggling Sunday services where possible, and were ever ready to help with teaching. Quietly confident, Susan was an asset to any team, and a pleasure to ring with.

H MALCOLM OLIVER

Nayland

Malcolm was a 'ready-made' ringer who came to live in north Colchester in the early 1980s in connection with his job as a railwayman. He joined the St. Peter's Colchester company and soon began to visit local towers in the North East Essex and South West Suffolk Districts on their respective practice nights. He became a member of the Essex Association and served as Master of their North Eastern District for several years. Malcolm was elected as a member of the Suffolk Guild under Nayland in 1985 and rang 7 peals for the Guild between 1986 and 1995. He remained a member of the Nayland band until his death but had not rung anywhere locally for many years as he became deeply involved in the running of the East Anglia Transport Museum at Carlton Colville during the latter part of his life which took up most of his leisure time.

KEITH RANDS

Old Newton

A loyal and supportive member of both the Old Newton and Buxhall bands, and a Stowmarket Sunday ringer, Keith died on 18th March 2010 at the age of 80. Keith was actively involved in the restoration of the Old Newton bells to 'full circle' ringing in 1999, ready for the Millennium.

His other great interest was choral singing and the church choir at Old Newton was delighted when Keith rejoined them, having left many years previously. He stayed in the choir until problems with breathing caused him to give up singing and also to restrict his bell ringing.

He is remembered fondly by his friends as a great lover of Stedman, and as a man with a very wry sense of humour.

DAVID TALLIS

Yoxford

A regular and loyal ringer who supported his local practice at Yoxford, but had not rung for many years.

GEOFFREY TIMMS

Reydon

A professional singer and musician, Geoffrey and his wife Josephine retired to Reydon in 1986, where he soon became involved in local choral activity and at the time of his death, aged 84, he was Conductor of the Blythe Consort, which benefited several East Anglian charities.

Soon after moving to Reydon, he was taught to ring at Southwold, becoming a regular member of the band. He also became a great supporter of the Reydon Bell Fund, which successfully augmented the one bell to a ring of six, and he looked forward to ringing without having to climb Southwold's 50 steps. Geoffrey was a witty and popular member of the band until motor neurone disease prevented him from taking part. The church at South Cove was overflowing for his funeral, and that evening, a well-struck quarter peal of mixed doubles was rung in his memory at St Margaret's, Reydon.

and we also remember the family and friends of them all. May they rest in peace.

There were 135 Suffolk Guild peals in 2010. These were rung in 57 towers in Suffolk and 6 towers outside the county, namely Campton in Bedfordshire, Chelmsford Cathedral and Belchamp St Paul in Essex, Great Yarmouth, Hagley in Worcestershire and Bitterne Park, Southampton. The Master had hoped for 150 peals during his last full year in office. We may have fallen slightly short, but so much has been done to promote peal ringing and widen participation by members, not least through Peal Week, which was re-introduced in 2007. The 2010 Peal Week equalled the 2009 total of 16 peals and, more importantly, there were 'firsts' of many kinds, including 4 first pealers. It has been particularly encouraging to trace the progress of younger members in Peal Weeks, and several have now joined the ranks of Guild conductors. Once again, St Edmund's Day was a superb PR exercise; 3 out of 4 attempts were scored and the Guild received excellent publicity, both in the press and on radio.

Peals to celebrate restoration featured again this year. In January, the first peal on the re-hung bells was rung at Fressingfield. A peal of Minimus at Campsea Ashe in March was the last peal on the bells prior to restoration and augmentation to six. July saw the first peal on the restored bells at Dennington. A peal of Double Norwich at Bardwell in November was the first peal on the bells since 1938 and also the first of Major, following augmentation from six to eight.

It is a noteworthy achievement to ring a local band peal in a village. A peal of Plain Bob Minor at Reydon on 14th February was rung by a band made up entirely of village residents, conducted by 15 year old Philip Moyse. During Peal Week, the NW District led the way in organising peals by a district band. There was a first pealer at Great Barton, and a district band, conducted by Ian Holland, achieved a peal of Stedman Triples at Elveden on 20th February, an excellent peal by all accounts. Peal Week also saw a footnote of historical interest: on 17th February, at The Wolery, George Salter became the fifth consecutive generation of his family to have rung a peal. Soon after, on 25th April at St Lawrence, Ipswich, his parents, David and Katharine Salter, rang their 1000th peal together, becoming the first Suffolk born couple to achieve this. Another personal milestone was achieved by Adrian Knights, who rang his 1000th peal on his birthday, 1st June, on the front eight at St Mary le Tower. A 5063 of Bristol S Major was composed by Brian Whiting to celebrate the occasion. On 19th June, Stephen Pettman became the first person to have conducted a thousand peals for the Guild, an incredible achievement. The peal of Grandsire Cinques was also the 750th peal on Grundisburgh bells.

Several trends in Guild peal ringing have been carried over from recent years. Surprise Minor has remained popular. At the Wolery, many individual methods have been pealed for the Guild for the first time and Spliced Surprise Minor has also been a focus. A peal of 41 Spliced Surprise Minor was rung there on 14th July. The Master has also led a band with this aim, and a peal in 27 Surprise Minor methods was rung at The Folly on 30th December. Stephen Pettman and Brian Whiting have retained their interest in composing peals of a commemorative length. There were 7 such peals in 2010, rung as birthday or memorial peals. The increased involvement of younger members in peal ringing is a very pleasing trend. Although they were very modest and did not claim an 'average age' footnote, it was good to see a very youthful band ring a peal of 7 Surprise Minor at Reydon on 11th August, conducted by Tom Britten. In me, progress and enthusiasm will, hopefully, generate more 10 and 12 bell peals, and also more peals if wrong place Surprise Major. Only 2 peals of Bristol Major were rung, and none of London. A very encouraging trend, though, has been the growing interest in conducting. In 2008, only 6 resident members called more than one peal for the Guild; by 2010, this total had doubled. I should like to extend my thanks to Ruth Suggett, Brian Whiting and David Salter for all their help, and also to those conductors who have submitted peal fees and compositions without needing to be reminded, making my job much easier.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS, HELD AT IXWORTH, SATURDAY 10 APRIL, 2010

1. The Chairman, Philip Gorrod (PJG) opened the meeting by giving a warm welcome to the one hundred and four members present. He thanked Gill Walker for taking the service and the organist, the local ringers, masterminded by Anita Rose (on her birthday), for the wonderful tea and the Girl Guides who had been serving teas all day. He thanked Ruth Suggett and Jonathan Stevens for organising the Restoration Seminar at Bardwell during the afternoon, which had been very well supported. The meeting stood in silence in remembrance of John (Jack) Banks from Bury St Edmunds, Henry Ivings from Euston, Dr David Pearson from Haverhill, David Rutherford from Long Melford, George Salter from Ipswich, Albert Wade from Haverhill, Ruth Wright from Halesworth and Woodbridge and three non resident members who had died during 2009.

2. Apologies were received from 51 members.

3. Election of New Members

Nine people were elected as members of the Guild: Rowan Patricia Wilson, Bury St Edmunds (Full), proposed by Mandy Shedden and seconded by Ian Holland, Ewan James Gadd, Great Barton (Junior), proposed by Jacky Savage and seconded by Sally Veal, Sue Tyler, Huntingfield (Full) proposed by Jason Busby and seconded by PJG, Sandra Elizabeth Harle, Leiston (Full), proposed by Cynthia Fittell and seconded by Richard Rapior, Fiametta Buckley, (Full), Beatrice Buckley (Junior), Amelia Buckley (Junior), Edward Buckley (Junior) all from Thornham Magna, proposed by Sylvie Fawcett and seconded by St John Perry, Emma Creasey, Wickham Skeith (Junior), proposed by P J Davidson and seconded by St John Perry.

4. Minutes of the 2009 AGM

These minutes had been published in the Annual Report. Their acceptance was proposed by Peter Harper and seconded by Chris Garner and they were signed as a true record.

5. Officers' Reports:

Ringmaster: Richard Munnings (RJM) presented the Master's Report as printed in the Annual Report. The acceptance of his report was proposed by Robert Beavis, seconded by Alan Munnings and agreed by the meeting. Secretary: Mary Garner (MSG) proposed the acceptance of the Secretary's report as printed. This was seconded by Jane Harper and agreed by the meeting.

Treasurer: Keith Ashton Jones (KAJ) explained that his written report was contained in the Trustees' Report. It was explained that the Library expenses of £10 was the Guild subscription to the Central Council Library and the apparent disparity in the figures for the Mini Ring was due to the method of accounting which works on the day an item is received and paid for. It will resolve next year and show that it has cost us nothing. RJM proposed, seconded by Diana Pipe, that the accounts should be accepted. This was agreed by the meeting.

Public Relations Officer: Bruce Wakefield presented the Public Relations report as printed. The acceptance of his report was proposed by Veronica Downing, seconded by Alan Smith and agreed by the meeting.

Belfry Advisory Committee: Jonathan Stevens presented his report as printed with one amendment. He explained that Winston Girling had been omitted inadvertently in the report but that his name should appear on the list of Belfry Advisory Committee members. His report was proposed by Jason Busby, seconded by Chris Garner and agreed by the meeting.

Librarian: Gillian Wakefield presented her report as printed. Its acceptance was proposed by Shirley Girt, seconded by George Pipe and agreed by the meeting.

Peal Secretary: Christine Knight thanked Brian Whiting for producing the compositions section of her report, David Salter for allowing her to use his database for checking details and Ruth Suggett for her patience and support during the completion of her report. Her report as printed was proposed by Robert Beavis, seconded by Diana Pipe and agreed by the meeting.

Handbell Trustee: Brian Whiting reported that there had been little demand for the Handbells during 2009, saying that two sets were with members in the NE and the other two sets with him, one of 16 the other of 25. He reported that Winston Girling had complete minor refurbishment on the 16.

Webmaster: Chris Garner presented his report as printed, adding that the email system for contacting members was used mainly for distributing letters from PJG. He explained that there is an email correspondent for almost every tower as well as many individuals. He stressed that emails were always sent as blind copies, that is, ensuring nobody else's address was visible to other recipients. The acceptance of his report was proposed by Robert Beavis, seconded by Veronica Downing and agreed by the meeting.

6. Trustees' Report: The Trustees for 2009, PJG, MSG and KAJ presented the report as printed. Its acceptance was proposed by Jacky Savage, seconded by Valerie Eagle-Bott and agreed by the meeting.

7. Central Council Report

PJG told the meeting that there were two reports on the website. He said that two of the Guild representatives were present, Laurence Pizzey and Richard Munnings. He invited questions but there were none.

8. Subscriptions and Peal Fees for 2011

The GMC proposed that there should be NO CHANGES and that the 2011 subscriptions should be:

KAJ explained that since last year expenses were covered comfortably there was no need to consider an increase in subscriptions. The proposal was agreed by the meeting.

9. Proposed constitution changes

The following were proposed by GMC to take immediate effect:

B4 to read: Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation of an amount at least equal to a Senior member's subscription. It was commented from the floor that no reference was made to Senior Members in the Annual Report. The following amendment was proposed by MSG and seconded by John Girt:

B4 to read: Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation of an amount at least equal to the subscription payable by a ringing member aged between 65 and 74.

PJG answered a question posed regarding qualification for Affiliation by explaining it was open to a parish where the PCC likes to be associated with the Guild.

The amendment was carried and would have immediate effect.

D6, revised as follows:

D6 (6.1 & 6.2 to be unchanged.)

6.3 Vice-Presidents elected before 2010 shall hold office for life and shall not be required to pay a subscription.

6.4 A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM. Patrons shall hold office without re-election, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM.

6.5 (to be deleted)

PJG reminded the meeting that two proposals with regard to LHMs and VPs had been circulated for

discussion at each ADM. He reported that the districts displayed a great deal of agreement, that is VPs should keep their office for life but no further ones will be elected, adding that the SE had felt that VPs should not be required to pay a subscription. In reality many do not need to pay but do anyway, but the gesture is there.

The question about the need for a Patron was raised and PJG explained that it presented an opportunity for a non-member to support the Guild, especially financially. Our present Patron is funding a Mini Ring in memory of his father a previous Patron.

The proposal was carried with one against and two abstentions.

D8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Change "Newsletter Editor" to "Magazine Editor", add "Mini-Ring Trustee".

The proposal was carried unanimously.

10 Election of Officers for 2010/2011:

Prior to the elections Maurice Rose explained that two officers had completed their term of office whilst no more did not seek re-election. He wished to record the thanks of the whole Guild to all the officers.

Chairman: Philip Gorrod had been proposed by Tom Britten and seconded by Stephen Pettman. RJM asked if there were any further nominations. There were none and PJG was elected unanimously. PJG said that he had enjoyed the last two years largely because of the excellent team of officers.

Ringmaster: RJM was proposed by Louis Suggett and seconded by Maggie Ross and elected unanimously.

Secretary: PJG explained that MSG had been Secretary for five years and was not eligible for re-election. He thanked her for her work and for being a valuable member of the team. He said that Mandy Shedden was willing to stand, proposed by Mary Garner and seconded by Jacky Savage. He invited further nominations, but there were none. Mandy was elected unanimously.

Treasurer: PJG explained that KAJ had been Treasurer for five years and was not eligible for re-election. He praised KAJ's contribution to the team adding that his understanding of money meant that he always put the opposing view before standing down graciously for the business to continue. Gordon Slack, proposed by Keith Ashlon-Jones and seconded by Mary Garner, was elected unanimously.

Technical Adviser: Jonathan Stevens, proposed by Chris Garner and seconded by Helen Price, was elected unanimously.

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee: PJG explained that this job was separate from the Technical Advisor but was pleased that Jonathan had agreed to do this too. Jonathan Stevens, again proposed by Chris Garner and seconded by Helen Price, was elected unanimously.

Public Relations Officer: PJG reminded the meeting of the stunning success achieved during 2009 with regard to Publicity and was pleased that Bruce Wakefield was willing to stand for re-election. He was proposed by RJM, seconded by Gillian Waterson and elected unanimously.

Librarian: PJG told the meeting that Gillian Wakefield had been Guild Librarian for many years during which time the collection had grown a great deal. She had done a great job fielding requests, looking after the archive and keeping it updated. The meeting showed their appreciation with hearty applause. He was pleased to announce that Abby Antrobus was willing to take on this role, proposed by Gillian Wakefield and seconded by Mary Garner. Abby was elected unanimously.

Report Editor: PJG thanked Ruth Suggett for producing an excellent report and handbook. She was proposed by Veronica Downing, seconded by Louis Suggett, and elected unanimously.

Webmaster: PJG thanked Chris Garner for his work, saying that the website was regularly cited as comprehensive and up to date. This received hearty applause. Chris, proposed by Kate Eagle and seconded by Maggie Ross, was elected unanimously.

Magazine Editor: PJG thanked Carol Girling for her work over the past few years. Alan Stanley, proposed by Mandy Shedden and seconded by Sue Freeman, was elected unanimously.

Peal Secretary: PJG thanked Christine Knight for keeping the records so efficiently. She explained that the job was quite bitty but that she had routines, which enabled her to keep everything up to date. Christine, proposed by Mary Garner and seconded by Gillian Waterson, was elected unanimously.

Handbell Trustee: Brian Whiting, proposed by Stephen Pettman and seconded by Helen Price, was elected unanimously.

Mini-Ring Trustee: PJG thanked Brian Whiting for all his work during the year, including writing a manual, taking bookings and moving the ring around the county. Brian, proposed by Stephen Pettman and seconded by Helen Price, was elected unanimously.

11. Election of Trustees

MSG proposed, seconded by John Girt that the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer be the Trustees. They were elected unanimously.

12. Appointment of Independent Examiner

Larking Gowen was proposed by Keith Ashton Jones to be appointed as Independent Examiner for 2010. This was seconded by Philip Gorrod and carried unanimously by the meeting. When asked KAJ said that the examination of the accounts was done for nothing but that a token of appreciation was given.

13. Election of Central Council Representatives

PJG explained that these elections were for the posts in 2011, 2012 and 2013.

Canon Revd Lawrence Pizzey said that he had been a member of CCCBR since his election by the Guild in 1969. This received great applause. He thanked the Guild for having provided him with the privilege for so long. He explained that the Central Council has changed much in that time, with a great deal of work being done by committees. He had served on the committee for Peal Analysis for twelve years. There are many very experienced ringers who are on CC but also a great number of ordinary ringers. Their names do not appear in peal columns and they have no particular expertise as conductors, but are people who genuinely reflect the ringers both in this country and abroad. He repeated how privileged he had been and said that he was standing down now. John Girt endorsed what he said about CCCBR and added that Lawrence had been extremely modest about his contributions. David Salter, proposed by Glenys Fear and seconded by Winston Girling, and Stephen Pettman, proposed by Philip Moyse and seconded by Tom Scase, were standing for re-election. Alan McBurnie, proposed by Kate Eagle and seconded by Chris Garner, and Veronica Downing, proposed by Hugh Spink and seconded by Jason Busby, had expressed willingness to stand. He invited other nominations. There were none. The four nominees were elected unanimously.

14. Mini Ring

PJG explained that Brian Whiting had taken custody of the Mini Ring in August 2009. Brian told that meeting that since then it had been out to eight different venues, there had been five before. He had received bookings for eight events so far this year. Last year the first peal was rung which took place at Kimberley Hall. PJG added that this was an interim ring. Matthew Higby had promised the new ring (Vestey Ring) for this spring. Bishop Nigel has agreed to dedicate it when it arrives, at present negotiations are continuing between George Vestey, the Bishop and the Cathedral to find a suitable date, hopefully a Sunday evensong in July or August. He added that after that time there will be a second hand one for sale. The question was posed as to whether registry offices were aware of its availability. PJG replied that it was going to wedding fair in Halesworth and that it is something to encourage when the new ring arrives and has a large logo on display.

15. Child Protection – update

PJG explained that John Girt had filled this post as a temporary measure during last year. A new person will be appointed at the next GMC meeting.

16. Guild Library – update

Gillian Wakefield, outgoing Librarian, addressed the meeting. She said that it had been a tremendous privilege to have custody of the valuable books and artefacts. The collection had grown over the years as generous donations were made by the families of ringers past and present and £50 a year had enabled her to buy appropriate publications as they became available. She thanked Ruth Suggett for her initial contact with the Office Manager at the Bury Record Office and MSG for her help setting up a meeting with the archivist along with herself. The AV items have been deposited at the Bury RO to be sent to the East Anglian Film Archive for conservation. It is these items that will deteriorate most rapidly and will need transferring to appropriate media in order to be heard and viewed. The remainder had been placed temporarily at Ipswich before being moved to Bury when space becomes available. The Bowell Papers are already at Ipswich and will remain there since Bowell was an Ipswich Bellfounder. The Ringing Worlds date back to the 1930s and have been referred to on a number of occasions. Everything is on long-term loan and remains the property of the Guild. The two handbells from Stradbroke remain in the care of Gillian & Bruce Wakefield. Regarding the *Ringing Worlds*, in recent years these have been donated by St Mary's Woodbridge, which will no longer be practical. Should the Guild wish this collection to be desirable it will need to consider how it will be carried out. She thanked her husband and Mary & Chris Garner for the morning spent in depositing the archive at Ipswich. Finally she expressed her delight that Abby has taken over as Librarian and hoped that she has as much fun as Gillian has with the care of the collection, and a feeling of pleasure that the library is in good hands at the RO.

17. Guild History – update

PJG invited George Pipe to talk about the book he is writing about the history of the Guild. George told the meeting that he was getting on quite well with the project and was keen that it would appeal to a wide range of people. He plans to include 30 chapters, the first 6 leading up to the establishment of the Diocese of St Edmundsbury & Ipswich and the formation of the Guild in 1923. Others would be about ringers and towers in various decades, VE & VJ days, handbell ringing, famous ringing families, the Millennium and the Guild today and looking to the future. In all about 100 photographs will be included. He hopes it will be published by the end of 2010. When asked about size and cost he was unable to give any indication but said that he had a friendly printer. A show of hands indicated that many would buy a copy. George jokingly added that signed copies would be £5 extra!

18. Guild Magazine

Alan Stanley talked about the first issue of the Guild Magazine. It has an editorial team who were hoping that the magazine would fulfill the needs of new and experienced ringers alike, forming a key part of communication in towers both to encourage and report on things happening in the Guild. He stressed that the team was keen to hear from members. They had discussed the possibility of defraying some of the expenses with advertising, and asked if anyone might be able to assist there. Some discussion followed complimenting the impressive style and questioning the quantity produced. It was explained that the greater number of copies was to enable a wider distribution, e.g. clergy, churchwardens, in the body of the church. PJG said that the GMC had agreed to underwrite for a year, but could not continue without considering increasing subscriptions or getting advertising. Further comments were made about printing out copies from the web, but it was felt that the good paper copy was important and helped keep members in touch, especially those who were unable to attend the tower regularly. PJG asked members to send any ideas to the editorial team.

19. Guild Social Event – Ringsfield 20th November 2010

PJG reminded the members of the great success of the Guild Social at Hadleigh last June. This year the NE are organizing the Guild Social on November 20th centred on Beccles and Bungay. Ringing in the afternoon will culminate with a meal and quiz night at Ringsfield. Tickets from Julie Rapior, price £7.50.

20. Any matters arising from the minutes of the 2009 AGM not already covered

There were no further matters arising from the 2009 AGM.

21. St Edmund's Clapper competition

Three teams were about equal in second place; the winners were Offton raising £300.

22. Date and Venue for 2011 AGM - SE District

Peter Harper, Chairman of the SE District invited the members to Henley on 30th April 2011.

23. Any Other Business

(i) Veronica Downing offered to sell a pair of silver earring and a silver charm which were left from the fundraising for the restoration at Chediston, the proceeds to go to the BRF

(ii) Ian Holland from The Norman Tower thanked the Guild for their financial support to augment from 10 to 12. He was hopeful that it would take place in 2011.

(iii) Ruth Suggett said that there were wooden items for sale, turned out of the old headstocks at Ixworth.

(iv) RJM reminded the members about the Guild Striking Competitions on 15th May.

(v) Please let RJM if you wish to ring in a peal on 20 November, St Edmund's Day. Radio Suffolk are keen to have more peals than ever rung, especially as it falls on a Saturday.

(vi) Alan McBurnie told the members that the concession for reclaiming VAT on repair work for churches is due to finish in 2011. He advised the membership that a petition against its finishing was available on the Government website. He was seeking the approval of the membership to inform them of its existence through the e-mail system. There was lively discussion, during which it was reiterated that that petition was not on the Guild website, and that the zero-rated new building works was set to continue. Richard Coe proposed that the email system could be used, with discretion, to advise members of items of importance to ringers in general. This was seconded by Robert Beavis and carried by the meeting with twelve against and five abstentions.

(vii) The Ringing Master was asked whether there were plans for ringing on St George's Day.

(viii) Peter Harper emphasised that mid week ringing was open to everyone. It took place monthly, the second Tuesday, an hour before and after a leisurely lunch.

(ix) Gillian Wakefield said that she had paintings and cards for sale in aid of the Guild.

(x) Sally Munnings said that she has one Guild fleece for sale, suitable for a large child.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 2010 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
3. Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
4. Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
5. Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. Name

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
- 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref 266869).
- 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule J 13, and shall be elected at the AGM.

B. MEMBERSHIP

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
 - 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation of an amount at least equal to the subscription payable by a ringing member aged between 65 and 74.

C. DISTRICTS

- 5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:
 - 1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
 - 2 North West: Ixworth, Hartismere, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
 - 3 South East: Bosmere, Colneis, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
 - 4 South West: Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6
 - 6.1 The President shall be the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
 - 6.2 A Suffragan Bishop within the Diocese shall be a Vice-President.
 - 6.3 Vice-Presidents elected before 2010 shall hold office for life and shall not be required to pay a subscription.
 - 6.4 A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM. Patrons shall hold office without re-election, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM.

7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC).

8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Chairman	Technical Adviser
Ringing Master	Librarian
Secretary	Handbells Trustee
Treasurer	Peal Secretary
Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee	Public Relations Officer
Report Editor	Magazine Editor
Central Council Representatives	Webmaster
Mini Ring Trustee	

9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to act as Independent Examiner in accordance with The Charities Acts .

10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.

The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.

12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.

12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.

13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.

14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be transferred to the Guild Restoration Fund. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.

15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.

17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.

18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.

19 The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.

20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.

21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.

22 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

- 23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild, and the Secretary shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of other Guild assets.
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from the date given in the proposal.
 - 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year, and shall be set at the preceding AGM, or a SGM. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.

Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ring Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
- 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
- 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

- 9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

- 9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

- The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.
- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
- The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings (including District).
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 9 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 10 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman: Ringing Master: Secretary/Treasurer: Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
 - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
 - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 11 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 12 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors	size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw	size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner	size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)
13 bells by various founders	size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.

- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.

THE MITSON SHIELD, LESTER BRETT TROPHY AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 The Mitson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows:

MITSON SHIELD AND LESTER BRETT TROPHY

- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:

a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual Report
b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.

- 3.2 a) For the Mitson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s). Opening rounds will not be marked.

or b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Tittums. "Marked" changes start when the first change is made.

ROSE TROPHY

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers

- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.

- 4 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
- 5 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 6 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 7 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 8 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 9 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 10 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 11 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

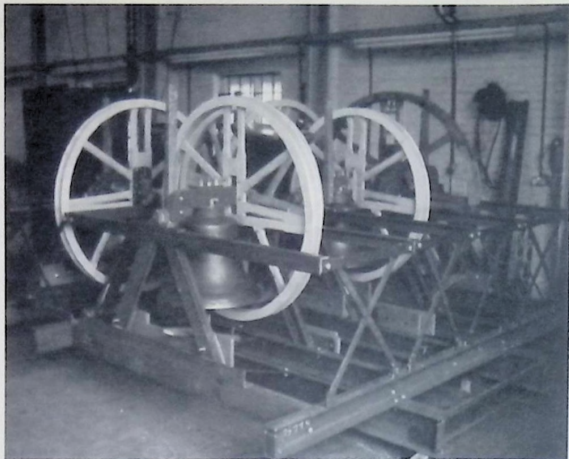
