#### FOREWORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

The Suffolk Guild Annual Report is something members look forward to, and it is really uplifting to read about the Guild's achievements, for example, "Bailey Day", over the year just gone. This report is a credit to a large team across the Guild, all working with Ruth to make sure you are reading this before the AGM.

Teamwork is important throughout ringing. Here in Suffolk, with our membership spread thinly over the rings of bells available to us, it is not always easy to get bands together to ring, be it on Sundays, for weddings, or for peals and quarters. It takes considerable effort to bring together a team, and towers that are fortunate enough to have a thriving band have usually made their own luck by a lot of hard work.

Over the last few years the Guild has had a steady stream of new members: we now have 100 more members than when I became Chairman four years ago. This is not due to an influx of ready-made: from foreign parts, but largely because of new recruits, which means a high proportion of the membership of our local teams is relatively inexperienced.

In a team activity though, inexperience must be accommodated. If eight ringers turn up at a tower, and seven can ring Surprise but one just call changes, then call changes is what is rung. In the process, how ever, the inexperienced ringer gains more experience and confidence. The opportunity to ring with more accomplished ringers is a fabulous resource, and I am disappointed that often new ringers seem reluctan to go to other towers to take advantage. "They won't want me messing things up is often said, but al ringers get satisfaction from ringing simple things well and helping someone to improve in the process. I was only when, as a teenager, I was exposed to other ringers in other towers by a kindly mentor that my ringing began to climb out of mediocrity (albeit slowly!).

Being a member of the Suffolk Guild team is a privilege , something to be proud of, but it also carries a a responsibility: to do the best for the team, whoever and wherever that team happens to be. Getting ou of bed to ring on a Sunday, doing your homework, and always trying to ring to the best of your ability striking your bell as well as you can, that is what makes a good team member. I hope that's you!

#### TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ending 31 December 2011. Charity

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers was registered with the Charity Commission on 10 December 1975, registration number 266869. The charity's registered address is Millbeck House, Harteston Green, Shelland, Stowmarket 1914 3HU, It is governed under a constitution originally registered in 1977 and most recently revised in 2010.

#### Principal Objectives

The purpose of the charity is to promote and encourage the practice of bellringing within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich; to recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art; and to cultivate the art of scientific change ringing, and to promote and advise on the preservation of bells in an efficient condition.

#### Review of Progress and Achievements

#### **Bellringing Activities**

Ringing Takes place in most of the towers with ringable bells, both for services and practices. Each of the four Districts holds regular activities for members. Striking competitions take place in each District, and the Guild holds an annual striking competition. A good number of peals and quarter peals are rung. The Vestey Ring has been used to demonstrate what the Guild does, at the Suffolk Show and other events.

#### Restoration activities

Major projects have been supported at Campsea Ashe and Helmingham. Members of the Belfry Advisory Committee, as well as other Guild members, frequently give advice and support, both for routine maintenance and restoration projects.

#### **Guild Finances**

#### **Policies**

All money in the Guild's funds not required for day-to-day working purposes is invested or deposited by the Treasurer, as directed by the Guild Management Committee. Grants from the Restoration Fund are authorised by the Guild Management Committee, but are only paid after completed work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants are normally only offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmentation and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

#### General Fund

Leaving aside the final donation to the Vestey mini-ring, General Fund income in 2011 was almost unchanged from 2010, with increases in subscription income and peal fees offset by a decrease in sales (primarily of rope). General Fund expenditure increased slightly from 2010. Significant savings were made in the printing of the 2010 Annual Report but these were balanced by increased administration costs and the purchase of a sizeable stock of badges. Administration costs are monitored carefully and the growth reflects increased activity within the Guild.

#### Restoration Fund

Restoration Fund income showed a 25% increase over 2010, primarily from an increase in the Gift Aid refund and donations from a variety of sources. Tower Affiliation income was up, as was income from Guild events, reflecting the additional activity referred to above. For the third year running, grant approval at £1,850 was low (£5,500 in 2010 and nil in 2009). The sum now available for allocation to new projects stands at £45,374.

Payments of previously allocated grants, totalling £13,750, were made for three projects completed in the year. The amount reserved for grants allocated to three projects still in progress stands at £5,200.

#### Summary

A satisfactory year financially with an increase in the General Fund balance. The Restoration Fund has a significantly higher balance available to contribute to projects that may arise in 2012.

#### RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

#### JED FLATTERS

I would like to start my report by thanking everybody for helping me to slot into the Ringing Master's seat so easily, and especially Richy, who made sure that my first event, the Guild Striking Competition, was already well organised. A handy church hall, a large churchyard and Nayland's pleasant bells with a good turnout of 14 teams and supporters made for a superb afternoon. In the evening at Stoke by Nayland, five teams competed for the Rose Trophy on the tricky eight, with the SE District running out as worthy winners.

In the weeks before and after, I was able to attend all but the SE District's striking competitions, standing in as a spare ringer for two of the NE teams who, I am pleased to say, carried off trophies on the day.

On a regional level we hosted the Ridgman ten bell competition at St. Mary le Tower in June. Home advantage did not fully benefit us, although our ringing was more than creditable. This year we look forward to a better placing when we ring at Kempston in Bedfordshire.

I was privileged to attend George Pipe's master classes for learners held at Pakenham and Brandeston in March and June respectively. George's talk held us all, beginner and expert alike, as he drummed home the mantra of good handling being the key to progression and good striking. I was also pleased to be able to get over to the young ringers' day at Aldeburgh and Leiston to see the younger ringers in action. Well done to Maoqie Ross for running this event.

Also we have to thank Maggie for organising the North East's novel ADM Open Day at some of the rarely rung fives. The hard work and resulting sore hands were well worth it though, for the ringer's ten with the famous cream meringues. Although not a Guild event, I was pleased to support Angela and Crawford Allen's Open Day in aid of the Elmsett augmentation, which gave me a chance to ring at many towers in the north of the county and meet up with ringing friends out for a grab. One pleasing aspect of this day was to see so many ringers enjoying the chance to ring on different and often difficult bells for the first time and gaining experience whilst doing so.

The Guild Social, held in the NW District, struggled for numbers due partly to Jason Busby's wedding meaning an almost total absence of NE ringers but we had a good evening and, on the plus side, made a small profit to keep Gordon happy. I am very much looking forward to this year's event, a barn dance at Sproughton barn, so please put the date in your diaries (Sat 15 Sept).

On the celebrations side, we supported Cindy Fitsell and the Leiston ringers helping them to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Bailey brothers ringing a family peal. A peal band under Richy's guidance repeated the peal of Plain Bob Major, using the same composition, although their performance somewhat quicker than the 1911 venture. Other ringers gathered for a buffet lunch before heading off for a series of quarter peals at various towers ably arranged by Maggie, and Jonathan Stevens, our Guild Technical Adviser, spent some considerable time armed with spanners and oil at Kelsale and made our task much easier. The day was rounded off by a fish and chip supper in the evening plus a few beers in the Engineer's Arms. We gained good coverage of this in the press and through the *Ringing World* and the *Church Times*.

This year we can look forward to the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, with the extended Bank Holiday weekend from 2 to 5 June, giving us plenty of chance to ring peals and quarter peals in celebration. We also have the opportunity to ring as the Olympic torch passes through the county on 5 and 6 July and, if you feel so inclined. You can ring Five Rings Triples, the special method designed for the event.

Despite what we do in the county as a Guild, we are judged from the outside by the number of peals rung and the mileposts passed. It has been another successful year for peal ringing with the total just slightly down on last year, but I would like to draw attention to the following achievements:

Just starting on their peal careers are: Chris Davies, Derek Rose, Andy Green, Clare Veal and Kay Lucas, and on the conducting front, well done to Robert Beavis and Alex Tatlow for calling their first peals.

It was reported last year that David Salter rang his 2600th peal and conducted his 1700th, this year he and Mary Dunbavin have rung their 750th together. Without their prolific achievements our totals would be all the poorer, although it is pleasing to see young Alex Tatlow rising to the challenge and bringing several youngsters with him. Also George Salter has moved from ringing behind when needed at the Wolery to new heights on an inside bell and, by the time you read this, Louis Suggett will probably be over the 200 mark as he continues to ring with the Birmingham band.

Coming from a bellfoundry background, I look forward to restorations and I am pleased to report on the first peal on Gislingham's restored and augmented bells and the first since 1889. At Helmingham, Doris Haas is to be congratulated on her efforts to get this historic ring put back into good order. The Dedication there took place on 15 October, and earlier in the year the new 8 at Hopton were dedicated. I was delighted to be asked in the first peal, which was dedicated to the memory of Stephen Young, whose efforts saw the old ring tuned and augmented. A worthy addition to the NW District. The first peal on the new six at Campsea Ashe was rung by a mostly local band and I hope to see many more on these handy bells in years to come.

I enjoyed my trip over to Pettistree in December to celebrate their 25th anniversary. It was good to go back for another ring on this well-used six that has now had over 700 quarter peals rung on them, some 500 or so called by Mike Whitby, who has developed the band from nothing. And on the personal side, I am looking forward to the Dedication of the two trebles at the Cathedral, but there is some hard work to do there first to get things right.

Congratulations must go to Sarah and Jason Busby and to Lesley and David Steed who were married this year. We are also pleased for Julie and Richard Rapior, on the birth of their daughter, Emily.

Sadly, several well known and well loved members passed away this year, and we especially remember Rod Pipe, who did so much for ringing composition and placed his adopted home of Birmingham at the top of 12 and higher numbered ringing. All will remain in our memory.

Following last year's deposition of most of the Guild Library with the Suffolk Records Office or East Anglian Sound and Vision Archive, 2011 has seen the acceptance by the GMC of a welcome offer: a new home for the rest of the material on purpose-built shelves in the Norman Tower. The Ringing Worlds and other non-Suffolk resources, scheduled to be returned from the Records Office (where the collection is still being catalogued), will be available to read there, and the conditions in the tower were considered satisfactory by an archivist from Bury Records Office. We are still to have discussions about binding the Ringing Worlds.

The library is still growing, and recent additions will also be stored in the Norman Tower until they are deposited with the rest of the collection. Do feel free to borrow items — the catalogue is online. A new highlight is a DVD, courtesy of Mr Pettman, with good footage of Italian bells and countryside taken this summer; some familiar 'campanari inglesi Suffolk' appear as handbell stars, and another can be spotted watching a rather more athletic display on some much bigger bells. I have received several requests for information about past ringers and local bells, from relatives, Guild members and the Central Council Biographies Committee. If you have any questions, requests or suggestions for items for the library, please do get in contact. I have also started a collection of digital photographs, so if you have any good ones, do please send them.

#### PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER'S REPORT RICHARD MUNNINGS

It's been a busy year for publicity in the Suffolk Guild and it's hard to know how to squeeze it all in to a smaller space than I'm used to! I must start by thanking my predecessor Bruce Wakefield. Through both good and bad publicity, he always found the right person to front up to the right outlets. Thank you Bruce.

For me I've found two of our assets extremely useful PR tools. Awl a huld is a superb publication, but isn't just for members. Please put it into your churches, doctor's waiting rooms, hairdressers; give them to incumbents – anywhere they can spread the word to the public. The other tool is The Vestey Ring, which has had a hectic 2011, most notably appearing at The Suffolk Show and the Henham Steam Rally. Our presence at the former event attracted Radio Suffolk, who also interviewed me about what we were doing for The Royal Wedding, Christmas ringing in Ipswich and St Edmund's Day. They also interviewed Philip Gorrod about Balley Day, and some of these caught the attention of the East Anglian Daily Times. The EADT have been superb, featuring the Young Ringers' Outing in the summer, and the Dedications of both Helmingham and Campsea Ashe.

Meanwhile, ringing in Suffolk has had a high profile thanks to the Symphony of Bells, which kicked off this year's lp-art Festival, and the Ridgman Trophy, the ten-bell striking competition for the Eastern region which was held at St Mary-le-Tower in June. It was also pleasing that our ringers played an important part in The Ringing World Centenary Celebrations, with 1911 peals at Leiston, Palgrave and Thornham Magna rung for the occasion.

2012 promises to be even busier, with the Olympics and Diamond Jubilee celebrations, so look out for more initiatives like Five Rings Doubles and Triples, and ringing along the Torch Relay route in July. And be wary of the Martin Creed project, more details of which can be found on my weekly blog on the Guild website.

Whilst I am the PR Officer for the Guild, I don't decree that every bit of ringing publicity in Suffolk comes through mel Indeed, much has been done off the backs of others which is great and bodes well for the future of our Guild. It would be helpful if people let me know about any PR they're doing to avoid any doubling up, though. Likewise, if you want to publicise something, I am more than happy to do so for you if you prefer! For now though, thank you to Mason and Ruthie for supporting me even when I should have been resting up after five years as Master and indeed to all who have helped me settle into the role.

Note 2. The interest received from the CBF and Barclay's bank accounts and shown in the Jubilee, Restoration and Pipe Family Trust Funds has been apportioned in the ratio of their respective capital sums.

Note 3. For clarity, the net cost each year is shown. The total mini-ring cost over three years is zero.

The independent examiners, Larking Gowen, had not completed their examination of these accounts at the time of printing. Their report will be published on the Guild website when it becomes available.

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers will not support or condone any attempts by its members or indeed anyone else to ring on bells which are classified as condition 3 or below. At these churches the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or deputy, and if necessary the architect concerned, must be present when assessment of the bells or tower is taking place.

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or Maintenance Officer.

#### KEY

The key of a ring (ie the note of the tenor) is given in cents (ie, hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C+20, and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

Framlingham

Jim was a dedicated beliringer and member of the choir at St Michael's Church, Framlingham, for 55 years. He was a much loved, respected and reliable man, who got on with things in a quiet way and with a quirky sense of humour. He was involved in several activities, both within the church and the community, as well as enjoying an interest in aircraft and caravanning. On Christmas morning he would play carols on the Ellecombe apparatus in the ringing chamber. A call change ringer for many years, Jim eventually trebled to doubles methods, but professed to not knowing how. He said he 'just filled in the gaps'. The Framlingham ringers will remember him with great affection.

#### **ROY THOMAS (TOM) PARKE**

Earl Stonham

Tom learned to ring at Brome where he was bom, and at Oakley. He settled in Creeting St Mary, but maintained the connection with Brome. In later life he rang at Earl Stonham, Barking, Stonham Aspal and sometimes at Debenham and Walsham-Le-Willows. He was active in the restoration of Earl Stonham bells and was always busy, helping people, visiting friends and family or pursuing his interests. At his funeral in Brome church he received a true bell ringer's send-off which thrilled his family, and a peal was rung at Earl Stonham, and a quarter at Henley.

#### BERNARD POLLARD

#### Walsham le Willows

Walsham le Willows is personified by Bernard Pollard. He represented everything that was best about the village, but it was the church which was most important to him, being organist, Lay Reader, and PCC Treasurer over the years. Bernard joined the choir when he was five, and as a teenager started helping to ring the bells. In 1970 a new team of ringers was recruited and Bernard was made Tower Captain. He went on to train many new ringers and oversaw the restoration of the bells in 1988. Bernard is listed as a member since 1973 and rang 16 peals for the Guild. In 2009, Bernard was chosen to be one of the recipients of the Maundy Money distributed by The Queen in the Cathedral.

#### GEOFF PULFORD

Otley

Geoff took up ringing when he retired to Otley in the early 1990s. He was keen to master the art and very enthusiastic in his support of Otley and the surrounding towers. He enjoyed outings and visiting other practices, always keen to make progress. He rang several quarter peals and was particularly round that he had managed to ring Stedman Triples. He was active in the District and Guild and eventually became a Life Honorary member. He was a reliable, committed and kind gentleman who is missed by many, especially the band at Otley where he was a real mainstay of the band.

#### SUSAN SCHURR

#### Pettistree

Susan was in her 70s when she decided to become a Millennium ringer. A warm kindly lady with an open mind to new ideas and an enquiring nature, she won the hearts of the Petitstree band who willingly taught her the art of change ringing. She did her homework diligently, and gradually progressed through Doubles to Minor, and was not afraid to ask questions on points which she was uncertain about. She was able to ring Cambridge Minor, but her finest achievement was probably a quarter of Grandsire Triples at Ufford (another tower she regularly supported). In all she rang an amazing 56 quarter peals. Supported by her husband, Peter, she hosted the annual tower meeting in her home, providing refreshments an always ready with supportive comments on the band's progress. Sadly, age caught up with her, but hememory lives on. Petitistree church was packed for her memorial service in August, and she would havbeen thrilled that the local band have named a new method in her memory 'Schurr Surprise Minor'.

#### STEPHEN YOUNG

Hopton

Stephen learnt to ring at Drayton, Oxfordshire in 1972. He moved to Beccles in 1982 and establishet regular ringing at Blythburgh and for some years was NE District. Ringing Master. In 1993 Stepher married Ruth Bedford and they moved to Coney Weston. The bells at nearby Hopton were becoming increasingly difficult to ring and Stephen was the driving force in a project to re-hang and augment the bells to 8. The bells were taken out in March 2010, but Stephen had been diagnosed with a brain tumour Thankfully, he was able to see the bells return in June 2010 and ring them for services until December when his condition worsened. We very much feel for Ruth in her loss. Stephen rang around 50 peals and a thousand quarters. A full obituary appeared in the *Ringing World* at page 688.

There was a slight dip in the Guild peal total in 2011, to 128, but it was pleasing to see 58 Suffolk towers nealed during the year. There were just 2 peals outside the county, at Ardleigh, Essex, and Longstanton in Cambridgeshire. Three memorable events were a focus for peals in 2011. The centenary of The Ringing World was celebrated in March and peals were rung across the country at towers which had had peals published in the first issue on 24th March 1911. As part of this commemoration, a NW District band rang a peal of Grandsire Triples at Palgrave on 21st February, and a peal at Thornham Magna on 18th March replicated the 7 methods rung on that day in 1911, April saw the sudden death of Roderick W Pipe of Birminoham, an event which shocked the whole Exercise. It was fitting that 5 in memoriam peals were rung in his home county, including a 5070 of Stedman Cinques on 9th April at Grundisburgh, where he learned to ring. This was specially composed and conducted by Stephen Pettman. On the following day, Richard Munnings called one of Rod's compositions of Cambridge S Maximus at St Mary-le-Tower. October 22nd 2011 was dubbed 'Bailey Day'. On October 21st 1911, 8 of the 11 famous Bailey Brothers of Leiston rang the first peal by a band made up entirely of brothers. On the day following the centenary, this remarkable feat was commemorated with quarter peals, an exhibition and a re-run of the peal of Bob Major at Leiston, using the original Gabriel Lindoff composition. A lovely touch too, that Adrian Knights, the only surviving pupil of the brothers, rang the same bell (6th) as his tutor Ernest Bailey had a hundred years before.

The year saw 5 peals to celebrate restoration. A peal at Wissett on 10th February was the first on the bells since re-hanging, and since 1958. At Gislingham, a NW District band rang a peal of Grandsire Triples on 29th April to celebrate the marriage of HRH Prince William to Catherine Middleton, the first peal on the bells since restoration and augmentation, and the first peal in the tower since 1889. Sadly, this was the only successful Royal Wedding attempt for the Guild. The first peal on the newly restored and augmented bells was rung at Campsea Ashe on 12th October, and it was very pleasing that a first pealer rang in both this and the Gislingham peal. Restoration and augmentation at Hopton was completed just before the untimely death of the project leader, Stephen Young. The first peal on the eight was rung in his memory on 26th November. The Ringing World of 13th January 2012 featured a very interesting article by George Pipe on the restoration of the famous bells at Helmingham, given by the sixth Eart Tollemache to mark the victory at Waterloo. The restoration was celebrated by a peal of Yorkshire S Major on 10th December.

Once again, Peal Week took place in February. The former Master may have been disappointed that only 8 peals were rung, but despite several losses, it was good to see 2 firsts as conductor, a first pealer and peals by both NE and NW District bands. Richard Munnings deserves great credit for the reintroduction and development of Guild Peal Weeks. Since 2007, 58 peals have been rung in Guild Peal Weeks, involving 115 ringers, 22 conductors, no less than 14 first pealers and 6 firsts as conductor. The wider participation in peal ringing, and especially that of younger members, has been a huge achievement.

Several trends in Guild peal ringing have continued. Surprise Minor has remained popular at The Wolery. Richard Munnings continued a project to ring a peal of Spliced S Minor in 41 methods, and it was good to see the band achieve their goal at Brandeston on 14th November. Regular peals of Surprise Major have continued at Aldeburgh and the 200th peal of Surprise Major on the bells was recorded on 9th October. Stephen Pettman and Brian Whiting maintain their interest in composing peals of a commemorative length. 12 such peals were rung for a variety of birthdays and other anniversaries.

There are many positives to draw from the Guild's peal ringing in 2011. Six first pealers is an encouraging sign, as is the growing involvement of young members in peal ringing, including conducting. Foot-

notes have included a wide variety of achievements by younger members. Robert Beavis, Philip Moyse and Alex Tatlow all rang their first peal of Bristol S Major in 2011. Messrs Beavis and Tatlow also progressed through firsts of Stedman Triples, Caters and Cinques between August and December, all conducted by Stephen Pettman at Grundisburgh; a superb achievement. It remains disappointing that few 10 and 12 bell peals have been rung for the Guild in recent years. There was only one peal of Maximus and none of Royal in 2011. However, peals of Major as a percentage of the Guild's peal total showed a substantial increase from 30% in 2010 to nearly 43% in 2011. It is encouraging that a wide variety of firsts' was recorded in footnotes to peals of Major. The increase in peals of Surprise Major at The Woler, has contributed to this statistic, and it was good to see a peal of Bristol rung there on 9<sup>th</sup> November.

As ever, I should like to record my thanks to Ruth Suggett, Brian Whiting and David Salter for their invaluable help. Many thanks also to those conductors who have submitted peal fees and compositions promptly, but may I remind conductors that it is imperative to check the membership status of all members of the band before commencing a peal attempt.

GES advised that the cost was £285 per issue of 500 copies and that the cost did not reduce proportionately if fewer copies were printed. It was suggested that wastage could be addressed by everyone making a conscious effort to deliver copies to other places in the community such as GP surgeries. Shirley Girt commented that she sent out 12 copies to retired ringers who did not have access to the internet and that it was much appreciated because of the continuity of contact. Brian Whiting pointed out that the magazine cost approximately £1 per member to produce over the course of a year (3 copies per year). Shirley Girt proposed and David Mulrenan seconded a motion that the magazine should be continued. The meeting agreed.

## Suffolk Show

The mini ring is going to be demonstrated at the Suffolk Show this year on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>st</sup> of June. PJG asked for two or three more volunteers to help with the manning of it. The Diocese and the GMC have between them agreed to pay half the entrance fee. An invitation had also been received to take the Mini Ring to Henham Steam Rally again this year.

# Any Other Business

- i) John Girt drew attention to an article in the RW on 15 April regarding the Ringing Foundation and the intention of the CC to develop an Integrated Teacher Training Scheme to train new instructors which it was suggested all Guilds and Associations could adopt to complement any existing training for teachers that they already do. He asked that this could be taken further and PJG agreed that it would be put on the agenda for the next GMC meeting.
- ii) George Pipe reported that the Ringing World had approached one subscriber in each of the Guilds and Associations to act as a spokesman for the publication, which is danger of becoming a casualty of the new digital age if subscriptions do not increase in number. In Suffolk out of over 700 members only 60 were subscribers. For less than the cost of a pint of beer per week, he urged each tower to subscribe to the Ringing World so that it could be shared amongst the ringers in the tower. It could be that as a result the number of personal subscriptions increases.

  - v) Peter Harper asked if handbell ringing could be a regular feature during future AGM church services.
- vi) Ann Pilgrim asked if a reminder of the subscription rates and when they were due be put on the What's On.
  - Vii) The BRF Collection during the service amounted to £135.36



# THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

# OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 2010 REVISION

#### OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
- Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
- Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
- Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
- 6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

# CONSTITUTION

#### A. Name

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
- 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).
- 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule 1.13 and shall be elected at the AGM.
- B. Membership
- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
- 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
- 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
- 2.3. Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
- 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1. 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation of an amount at least equal to the subscription payable by a ringing member aged between 65 and 74.
- C. Districts
- 5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:
  - North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
    - 2 North West: Ixworth, Hartismere, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
    - 3 South East: Bosmere, Colneis, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
    - 4 South West Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

# D. Government

- 6.1 The President shall be the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
  - 6.2 A Suffragan Bishop within the Diocese shall be a Vice-President.
  - 6.3 Vice-Presidents elected before 2010 shall hold office for life and shall not be required to pay a subscription.
  - 6.4 A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM. Patrons shall hold office without reelection, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM.

- 7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC).
- 8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Chairman Ringing Master Secretary Treasurer

Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

Report Editor

Central Council Representatives

Mini Ring Trustee

Technical Adviser Librarian Handbells Trustee Peal Secretary Public Relations Officer Magazine Editor Wehmaster

9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to act as Independent Examiner in accordance with The Charities Acts.

10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.

The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

### E. Finance

- 11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
- 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be transferred to the Guild Restoration Fund. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- 18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- 19 The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
- 20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- 22 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

- F. Records and Handbells
- 23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild, and the Secretary shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of other Guild assets
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.
- G General
- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
  - 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter,
  - 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from the date given in the proposal.
  - 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

# **GUILD RULES**

- H. Election of Members and Subscriptions
- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
  - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year, and shall be set at the preceding AGM, or a SGM. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
  - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
  - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
  - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

# Election of Officers

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
  - 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
  - 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
  - 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.
- J. Committee Structure
- 9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

Guild Chairman

Treasurer

Ringing Master Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee

Secretary One Elected Representative from each Deanery

9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum. 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be

taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting. 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor

and two representatives from each District. 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and

such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.

12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.

13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Chairman

Treasurer

Secretary

Ringing Master Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.

- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
- 15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

#### K. Expenses

16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:

- The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
- The expenses of Guild Meetings (including District)...
- Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
- Guild insurances.
- Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as ma be determined by the GMC.
- Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

#### L. Peal Records

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
  - (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
  - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
  - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

#### DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually. Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
  - 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
  - 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
  - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
  - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
  - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
  - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

# REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

25 bells by Taylors size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)

13 bells by Warner size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)

13 bells by various founders size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrower for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.

- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notic if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for the maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.

# THE MITSON SHIELD, LESTER BRETT TROPHY AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

# RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing thei subscriptions are paid.
- 3 The Milson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows:

# MITSON SHIELD AND LESTER BRETT TROPHY

- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
  - a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual Report
  - b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 3.2 a) For the Milson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles o Minor method(s). Opening rounds will not be marked.
- or b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Tittums. "Marked" changes start when the first change is made.

#### ROSE TROPHY

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 4 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
- 5 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 6 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 7 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 8 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band nnging a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 10 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 11 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.


