FOREWORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

I can hardly believe that this is my fifth and final annual report as Chairman of the Suffolk Guild – how time flies! In some ways though, it seems as if I have been doing the job forever and, on balance, I am pleased that my term of office is coming to an end. I think it is absolutely right that there should be a maximum term for the “big” jobs, and I think that five years is about right.

It is worth looking back over the five years to see how the Guild has progressed in that time. Peel ringing has really taken off, pushed initially by Richy when he was Master and continued since bywell, you can all read *Campanophile*! Quarter peals too have burgeoned across the county. Membership has increased, and the number of active younger members is very pleasing, with a good showing in the National Youth Contest last year and regular practices since. We have our own mini ring, on which the first peal was rung this year, and our new promotional banners. The Guild handbells are being well-used with a number of quarter peals and practices. We have a highly successful and popular quarterly magazine, and the annual social events, such as the 2012 barn dance at Sproughton, have all been most enjoyable. We have a skilled and experienced Belfry Advisory Committee whose technical expertise, coupled with the grants we have given, has helped a large number of bell projects, such as that at Helmingham, to completion. Our AGMs see above average attendances, with innovative “fringe” meetings: in 2012 we held a debate on teaching, and in particular, the Integrated Teacher Training Scheme (ITTS) which now is being introduced by our Recruitment and Training Committee, led enthusiastically by Jed. The list goes on.

What could we do better? Well, there is always something, and I am not going to throw down a challenge to next year's Officers, but I am proud to have been part of a team which has helped steer the Guild to its current position with so many successes and achievements. My plea to you, the members, is to support your Officers as much as you can, be it at County or District level, and within your individual towers, and to help ensure that the next five years are as successful as the last.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ending 31 December 2012.

Charity

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers was registered with the Charity Commission on 10 December 1975, registration number 266869. The charity's registered address is Millbeck House, Harleston Green, Shelland, Stowmarket IP14 3HU. It is governed under a constitution originally registered in 1977 and most recently revised in 2010.

Principal Objectives

The purpose of the charity is to promote and encourage the practice of bellringing within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich; to recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art; and to cultivate the art of scientific change ringing, and to promote and advise on the preservation of bells in an efficient condition.

Trustees

The Trustees during the period were PJ Gorrod, G E Slack and A J Shedden

Review of Progress and Achievements

Bellringing Activities

In addition to regular ringing activities throughout the Guild, great emphasis has been given this year to the teaching of ringing, in particular the formal training and mentoring of teachers of ringing. The Vestey Ring was used around the County to demonstrate what the Guild does and was also loaned to neighbouring Guilds.

Restoration activities

The main activity was at the Norman Tower where the augmentation to 12 bells was completed. Members of the Belfry Advisory Committee continue to give advice and support, both for routine maintenance and restoration projects.

Guild Finances

Policies

All money in the Guild's funds not required for day-to-day working purposes is invested or deposited by the Treasurer, as directed by the Guild Management Committee. Grants from the Restoration Fund are authorised by the Guild Management Committee but are only paid after completed work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants are normally only offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmentation and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

General Fund

Leaving aside the final donation made in 2011 to the Vestey mini-ring, General Fund income in 2012 increased slightly from 2011 from increases in subscription income and peal fees. General Fund expenditure also increased from 2011 with the introduction of insurance for the Guild's handbells and the purchase of publicity banners. Further savings were made in the printing of the Annual Report and in administration costs, but a stock of rope was purchased for resale within the Guild. The net effect after an increased transfer to the Restoration Fund is a reduction in the General Fund of £359.

Restoration Fund

Restoration Fund income was down by 7% on 2011 although still significantly above the 2010 level. For the fourth year running Grant approval at £6,600 was relatively low (£1,850 in 2011, £5,500 in 2010 and nil in 2009). The sum now available for allocation to new projects stands at £49,078. The interest on our deposit account has diminished substantially in recent years as interest rates have fallen. To help offset this £45,000 has been invested in one-year bonds through the Charities Aid Foundation.

Of the previously allocated grants totalling £5,200, only £600 was paid in 2012 as the other projects are ongoing. The amount reserved for grants allocated to the four projects still in progress stands at £11,200.

Summary

The small reduction in the General Fund balance in 2012 was in line with budget. The Restoration Fund has again grown leaving the Guild in a strong position to assist with projects which may arise.

When we look back over 2012, I am sure we will all remember two things above all else. Firstly the Diamond Jubilee weekend with the flotilla of boats of all sizes moving majestically down the river Thames, led by the Thames barge with the ring of bells on top and the bells seen turning over and over as the band rang a celebratory peal, all in weather conditions that got worse and worse as the day progressed.

Secondly we had the Olympics and Paralympics with Team GB doing so well and, at the opening ceremony, Bradley Wiggins ringing "that bell".

As we always do in times like this, we went to the ropes and rang quarters and peals to mark the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and then again, either as the Olympic Torch Relay passed by our tower or as our team picked up medals. Though some of us thought little of it when first mooted, we also joined in the crazy Martin Creed Project giving the chance for many non ringers to come into the tower to see just what we did.

Attending the various District meetings gives me the chance to meet up with our grass roots members and to see how our learners are progressing from rounds and call changes into method ringing. Much is said about ringing being on the decline but reassuringly at each GMC meeting the Chairman and I sign a good number of new membership certificates.

As part of our initiative to bring more people in to ringing, we have embarked on the Integrated Teacher Training Scheme (ITTS) and have now held three courses for new teachers and mentors. This is now starting to show results as new recruits are stepping over the first big handling hurdle to take their place as Sunday Service ringers. Time will tell if this is successful but I do urge people not to knock this scheme without giving it a go.

On the weddings front I would like to congratulate Ruth and Richy Munnings and Maggie and Philip Gorrod for tying the knot.

The Guild six bell striking competition was held at Blythburgh, a good easy going ring, our judges for the day being Andrew Higson of John Taylor and Co and Iain Mitchell formerly of Taylor, Eayre & Smith. They spent a pleasant afternoon by the river listening to and marking the teams as they rang. After a massive tea with wonderful cream meringues they gave us the results, with Otley taking the Lester Brett trophy for some really good call changes and Pettistree coming out top in the Mitson Shield.

Rushing down the lanes to Leiston saw the draw for the eight bell competition where six teams competed and the NE district were rightfully declared the winners. Again I wish to thank our Guild Technical Advisor, Jonathan Stevens, for checking over the bells in both towers and doing a lot to correct the oddstruckness in Leiston's bells

At the Ridgman Trophy held at Kempston we did not sparkle, and although our ringing was of a good standard it only brought us 5th place.

On the national side we entered a youth team in the competition at Birmingham and elected to ring method when we could easily have played safe with call changes (as did several experienced bands). Again we were placed 5th. Next year we will have the core of a band to go one better so let's wish them luck at York.

On Easter Sunday the two new trebles for the Cathedral were dedicated by Bishop Nigel with many ringers present; on the following Tuesday they were lifted and hung, and the first peal on the twelve rung on the August bank holiday Saturday. The flat 6th was cast in November and we expect to hang it before too long.

The only other major restoration to report on is that at Beccles where new gudgeons and bearings have been fitted, the other fittings refurbished and the cracked third recast.

In 2013 we look forward to the restoration and augmentation of Redgrave, made possible by the legacy from Albert Driver and the persistence of Chris Davies on steering a way through the minefields of bureaucracy.

The big social event of the year was the barn dance at Sproughton Barns, where a good turnout danced the night away to Inertia Reel, and in typical ringers' fashion, drank the bar dry! In all it was a good night with the great majority showing their prowess on the dance floor. A fair profit was also made to add to the Restoration Fund.

Peal ringing has shown an increase this year due no doubt to the number of occasions to celebrate, and this would certainly have been higher still if David Salter had not had an enforced lay-off. In times like this someone will step up to the mark and push things on, so enter elder son George, who has taken over the reins of organising the young ringers and in doing so brought himself, Colin and Clare Veal forward in leaps and bounds.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

MANDY SHEDDEN

2012 has flown by. Nationally of course there was much to celebrate, but in the confines of our rural corner of East Anglia here too we have much to be proud of. The Suffolk Guild continues to benefit from the freely given time and efforts of its members. Every month there is activity in each of the districts aimed at improving the abilities of all age groups, or promoting the social benefits of the art. Although Suffolk is a large county, members are always within reach of an event which will enhance their ringing experience in some way. As I write, we are preparing for the 90th Anniversary dinner, which is an achievement in itself. 90 years of existence of an organisation such as this, in a world where computers and micro technology rule many facets of our lives, and when there are many more demands on our time from other sources, is something to be proud of. Credit for this has to be given to the collective efforts of our members who are passionate about bellringing and who help the Guild to thrive. It is encouraging to see a growing number of young ringers, who by the means of social media, are managing to arrange ringing events for themselves. They are supported by older members whose input is invaluable. For the time being at least, it appears that the Suffolk Guild is bucking the national downward trend in attracting new and younger members. Forty two new membership forms have been received during the year and the total membership was 783 after the number of members who had passed away had been accounted for, but at the time of writing, this figure does not reflect those who may not have renewed their membership for whatever reason in 2012. Attendance at the AGM was lower than last year with 70 names signed in the register, although a further 60 members did send their apologies. GMC meetings have been well attended through the year with attendance figures of over 85% at each of the three meetings.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

ABBY ANTROBUS

This year, the Suffolk Records Office has been working through the Guild collection, packing and cataloguing the original material relating to ringing, bells and ringers in Suffolk. This material is accessible at the Records Office, and several people have made arrangements to study books and papers at the SRO in Gatacre Road, Ipswich. Once cataloguing is complete, it will be easy to pop in and request items, but for the present I am happy to help arrange appointments. Other resources will be returned to us, and are destined to be made available from the Norman Tower in Bury St Edmunds. The *Ringling Worlds* were returned earlier in the year, and are up on the mezzanine floor. As I write the rest is packed up ready to be picked up, once we have some shelves sorted out. An advance batch has been loaned to the Great Barton bell ringers, and it's good to see the books in demand. The catalogue on the Guild website will be updated to include information on what is where and how to borrow or consult it – otherwise, do please keep asking me. Ringing networks mean that there are always volunteers to ensure items reach their destination, and where I can e-mail or post information, I will endeavour to do so. I have received several requests for information about past ringers and local bells from relatives and Guild members, and requests for information from the *Ringling World* – either for personal or ringing records. The library is a living collection, and the Records Office have been very patient as I take things back with one hand and give them more material with the other. Recent depositions include *Aw! A'huld* and Annual Reports to ensure they have full runs; Leslie Wright's ringing diaries and notebooks spanning 60 years; Dennis Knox's diaries (1950-1973); the Guild Account books 1957-1993, and blue lines for a range of less common surprise major methods drawn by Fred Bailey of Leiston and donated by Lynda Lazzerini. Our digital collection is also growing, including scans of older material (such as Fred Bailey's blue lines) and photos of new events. As for last year, if you have any questions, requests or suggestions for items for the library, please do get in contact. I haven't yet spent the year's library budget, but am developing a design for a custom 'ex libris' stamp.

PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER'S REPORT

It's been a busy year for publicity, but not the easiest! The Diamond Jubilee, Torch Relay and Olympics were national events that offered PR opportunities, but they offered those same opportunities for just about every organization in the county, so it was hard work making ourselves heard! We managed it though, with both BBC Radio Suffolk and the *East Anglian Daily Times* giving us coverage over a hectic summer! On a national level, it was wonderful to see bells given such a huge platform, not least in the Royal Pageant on the River Thames for the Jubilee.

Before that, the resumption of ringing at Woodbridge was covered by the EADT and since then, the tremendous project at Redgrave was visited by the paper and BBC Look East. Beyond the new stuff, it was heartening to see Radio Suffolk continue to offer support in promoting the annual St Edmund's Day ringing on 20 November and the Christmas Ringing in Ipswich.

In the December edition of the *East Anglican* (the monthly magazine of the Diocese of St Edmundsbury & Ipswich) there was a page feature on the ringing at Helmingham, and the front cover was given over to bells!

And The Vestey Ring continues to offer us tremendous exposure at various events, not just in Suffolk but beyond. Whilst it was a shame that due to a miscalculation by the Diocese we were unable to pitch it up with their tent at the Suffolk Show, we didn't miss out too much as the weather was pretty terrible, to the extent that the second day of the Show was cancelled.

It is important to note that we are all ambassadors for ringing. Anything we say or show to non-ringers in relation to our art, is in itself PR. And not everything has to come through me. I appreciate it when I'm told about any PR for Suffolk ringing being done off someone else's backs, but it doesn't have to involve me if you don't want to! Likewise, if you want to publicize something ringing related, but don't know who to contact, how to go about it, or just want advice, then I am more than willing to help out to whatever extent you want me to.

PR isn't just external either. There is much happening within the Guild, with District and Guild events. Please use all the tools available to keep in touch – *What's On*, the website, *Awl a'huld* and my daily blog are all there to help inform and keep as many members as possible in the loop. Make sure that everyone in your band is aware of these means of catching up and help with PR on all levels.

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers will not support or condone any attempts by its members or indeed anyone else to ring on bells which are classified as condition 3 or below. At these churches the Suffolk Guild Technical Adviser or deputy, and if necessary the architect concerned, must be present when assessment of the bells or tower is taking place.

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or Maintenance Officer.

KEY

The key of a ring (ie the note of the tenor) is given in cents (ie, hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C# -20, and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

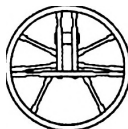

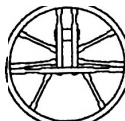

The South West District has had generally a good year. The newly instigated Teaching and Training days have been well supported and it is proposed to continue with this innovation as it allows beginners to improve with the help of experienced ringers. This is fortunate, as regrettably, the Triples practices held at St. Gregory's in Sudbury have had to be discontinued for the moment as the Deputy Ringing Master is suffering from medical problems. The committee is very appreciative of the work done to promote eight bell ringing in the district by John Smith.

Three members from the District have attended the ITTS course and they all felt that the information and advice that they gained was very helpful towards improving their teaching skills. A positive result of this course is that several new learners have started under their tuition and this can only benefit the District.

The Striking Competition held at Polstead on June 23 introduced two classes of competition: a trophy for

call change ringing and a second trophy for method ringing. It is hoped that this will encourage the less experienced bands to enter the competition with the knowledge that they will be competing against bands of a similar level, while more experienced bands can attempt something more challenging.

This year, the mini tour visited three Essex towers; Ardleigh, Langham and Little Horkesley. The tour, organised by David Lee, was very successful and ended with a dinner at the Eight Bells in Bures that was enjoyed by more than twenty ringers.

A great friend of the District, Jürgen Bath, passed away during the year and a peal in his memory was rung at Kersey in September. He had been taught to ring by Peter Cummings at Camelford, Cornwall, while on one of his many trips to the UK, and was a frequent visitor to practice nights in the SW District.

It is hoped that the forthcoming year will be as successful as the last.

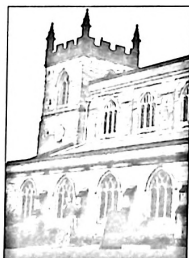

OBITUARIES

PATRICIA BAILEY (née CLARKE)

Beccles

Pat was an Ipswich lass, taught to ring by Frank Wiseman at Rushmere St Andrew in the 1940s. Frank was a stern tutor but this stood Pat in good stead, and it wasn't long before she joined the Grundisburgh practice and later Helmingham and Framsdén with their conductor Leslie (Lester) Brett. She took her ringing seriously and was soon capable in all the standard methods. At the age of 16, she rang Cambridge Maximus at the Tower, on the first attempt. She married Trevor Bailey at Beccles and they were blessed with twin daughters. Pat held Guild Office in the NE District and went on to ring 1,000 peals, the first Suffolk lady to do so. Sadly, a long illness curtailed her ringing in the last ten years of her life but she bore the disappointment with great fortitude. 'Lester's gals' - Pat, Muriel and Diana rang together and helped liven up the well known Framsdén outings. May she rest in peace.

LESLIE CARTER

Marlesford

Leslie learned to ring at Little Glemham, where he worked on the Cobbold estate farm. He and his family moved to Marlesford in 1953 when Lord Marlesford offered him a job as gardener at Marlesford Hall, and they remained there until they moved into Wickham Market in 2002. Initially he worked as "boy" to George Finch, one of the founder members of the Suffolk Guild, who was at the time Head Gardener at the hall. When George died, Leslie took over as Head Gardener. He was Churchwarden for many years and was always a very keen and active member of the band. He was a Marlesford ringer for 50 years and a Guild member since 1981. He rang with many of the "old school" ringers of the time - Ernie Steward, George Finch and Joe Priestner. He didn't aspire to be a serious method ringer, he seemed just as happy with call changes, but he was persuaded to his one and only quarter peal at Marlesford. He was always chuffed about that. Leslie had a wonderful sense of humour and was always great company - a true good old Suffolk boy.

BOB GOWAN

Stoke-by-Clare

Bob learned to ring at Stoke-by-Clare over fifty years ago and was a valuable and totally committed member of the of the team. Although ill health forced him to give up at the age of 81, he continued to take a keen interest in the band, almost up until the time of his death in 3 July 2012, at the age of 89.

Being a carpenter, he used his practical skills to assist with bell maintenance work, as well as in many other ways. Many fine examples of his carpentry skills can be found, not only in the Church, but in the neighbourhood generally, which are a constant reminder of his skills and achievements.

His daughter - Mrs Valerie Jay - followed in her father's footsteps and has been a member of the Stoke-by-Clare team for over forty years. Bob was a valuable ringer and a fine carpenter: a real gentleman who is sadly missed by us all.

EPHRAIM (TINKER) LOCKWOOD

Hadleigh/Hintlesham

In the late 1950s Tinker and his wife Winnie were ringing at Barking and at Offton (6 bells in those days), and even with a young family they found time to attend practices and support Sunday service ringing. Winnie became District Secretary, and Tinker willingly played a very supportive role. He later went to work on a farm at Hintlesham where ringing was at a low ebb, but they soon livened things up and also Tinker did quite a lot of work on the bells. Eventually retirement came, and they moved to Hadleigh. Sadly ill-health curtailed and finally ended their ringing careers. For the Suffolk Guild, Tinker rang a total of 25 peals and numerous quarters. In any consideration of Tinker's work in both parish life and ringing in particular, mention of his devoted and generous wife Winnie always creeps in, simply because they always worked so closely together. Winnie now lives in Hadleigh, where anyone visiting would, as always, be most welcome.

ALAN W. ROGERS

Marlesford

Alan and Katrina moved to Marlesford in the Autumn of 1987, when Alan took up the post of Buildings Manager on the Marlesford estate. He was encouraged to take up ringing by Leslie Carter who was Head Gardener on the estate. He and Katrina both learned to ring. In 1994, when the tower captain left to go to the USA, Alan took charge of the ringing. His combination of firm teaching and a great sense of humour made Marlesford a popular tower (it was the only ringing tower in the benefice at that time). Alan became SE District Ringing Master for a spell in the 1990s. Alan and Katrina were always there at ringing and social events, in fact the Christmas meal enjoyed by up to 50 local ringers was organised by them. He also spent many hours helping with the Hacheston bells restoration, not forgetting his 53 peals and numerous quarters.

Alan was diagnosed with cancer in December 2001, but they both decided to carry on as normal, fighting it every step of the way. As we know, Alan's activities were curtailed by his illness, but he and Katrina made the most of the time they had together with frequent holidays, both at home and abroad. Wales was their favourite destination, and they went there so many times that they became part of the family near Llandiloes.

PHIL WILLIS

Wickham Market

Phil was just 57 when he died earlier this year after a short illness. His passing was a real shock to us all. He learnt to ring at Wickham Market along with his daughter some 20 years ago and soon became a Guild member and remained so ever since. A keen and active member of the band, he became deputy tower captain and rarely missed a practice or Sunday service. He rang numerous quarter peals, but only one peal (knowing Phil, he probably felt it was too much like hard work). He was such a nice guy and great fun to be with, always lightening up the mood in the tower with his cheeky sense of humour. He loved his sweets and anyone who has visited Wickham in recent years will have seen the carefully stacked empty sweet tins in the alcoves of the ringing chamber. Whereas other towers have peal boards we have Cadbury's Roses & Quality Street tins – we suspect they will stay there for a very long time in memory of our dear friend Phil.

Two national events, the Diamond Jubilee of HM Queen Elizabeth II and the London Olympics were a focus for celebratory peals in 2012. There was also the eagerly anticipated first peal on the augmented ring at the Cathedral in Bury St Edmunds. 2012 was a very positive year for Suffolk Guild peal ringing. Not only did the Guild's peal total rise by 19 to 147, the highest total since 1999, but there were peals in 54 Suffolk towers and 7 out of county, namely at Ardleigh, Coggeshall, Great Dunmow, Mistley and Toppesfield in Essex, Thetford in Norfolk and Bristol, St John.

The Master decided to move Peal Week so that the Jubilee celebrations could be a focus for peal attempts. Six peals were rung during the Peal Week dates of 26 May to 3 June but, in all, 15 peals were dedicated to the Jubilee between May and July. There were also peals at Grundisburgh and Pakenham to mark the 60th anniversary of the Accession in February, and a peal at Hopton in April for HM Queen's 86th birthday. The other big national event of 2012, the Olympics, was marked by two peals in July. A peal of Olympic S Major, called by Stephen Pettman, was specially arranged for 5 July at Felixstowe so that the bells would ring out as the Olympic Torch Relay passed the church. There was also a peal at Freckenham on 28 July to celebrate the opening of the Olympics. At a more local level, the project to augment the Norman Tower bells culminated in a peal of Yorkshire S Maximus, conducted by Ian Holland, who had played a leading role in the project. Many members of the band had also worked towards the augmentation and the footnote recorded thanks to the Stannard and Vestey families for the new trebles, and to the late Dean of St Edmundsbury, the Very Revd Neil Collings, who had inspired the launch of the project. This was the first twelve bell peal on tower bells in West Suffolk, a landmark peal, and the start of increased opportunities for ringers in the west of the county to gain experience in twelve bell ringing.

Unusually for recent years, there were no peals to celebrate the completion of restoration projects, but there were several individual peals worthy of mention. On 7 January, Katharine Salter conducted a peal of Plain Bob Major at Rendham, in which the band consisted of four mothers and their sons, all Suffolk residents, to a composition by Suffolk-born Rod Pipe. This is believed to be only the second mother and son peal, the first having featured in 'The Ringing World' in 1951. On 21 March, David Salter became only the second person to have called a thousand peals for the Guild, an incredible achievement. It was good that he could share this peal at The Wolery with his wife Katharine and sons, George and Colin. It is always encouraging to see progress through local peals, such as the peal of Doubles at Reydon on 22 February, in which there was not only a first pealer, but also a 'first as conductor'. Also, it was pleasing that the first peal on the Vestey mini-ring was rung at High Hill House in Halesworth on 3 April, 7 Surprise, called by Richard Munnings.

David Salter leads the list of conductors by a considerable margin, even more remarkable as he was out of action for three months. No longer is the Conductors' List restricted to a few established names. Fourteen resident conductors called more than one peal in 2012, up from 12 in 2011, and only 6 in 2008. Such bare statistics do not reveal that the Conductors' List now has a considerably more youthful profile. George Salter and Michelle Williams recorded their first as conductor in 2012, and Alex Tatlow and Louis Suggett have become established conductors, who are also interested in composition. Alex called his own composition of Double Norwich at Elveden on 23 June, and Louis composed a peal of 4 Spliced S Major, which he called on 1 September, also at Elveden. David Potts has arranged regular attempts of Surprise Major and called his first of London S Major at St Mary-le-Tower in March, as well as his first of Maximus as conductor for the Jubilee in June. Stephen Pettman and Brian Whiting have maintained their interest in composing peals of a commemorative length. There were seven such peals during the year.

Stephen produced two compositions of 5060 Yorkshire S Major for the Jubilee, one to mark the Accession, which was rung at Grundisburgh on 8 February, and one rung during the main Jubilee celebration period on 6 June, also at Grundisburgh.

Footnotes record a wide variety of achievements in 2012 peals. Ten first pealers is an encouraging number for the Guild. Another cohort of young peal ringers is emerging, and the achievement of a first peal for the older members in the list is, in many ways, even more of a feat. For all age groups, the footnotes make positive reading. Four first peals inside, four firsts of Surprise Major, two firsts of Spliced Surprise Major, four firsts of Bristol S Major and two firsts on twelve is only a selection of the achievements recorded. Alex Tatlow rang his first of Royal and first of Maximus on consecutive days in March, a huge achievement. It would still be good to see more ten and twelve bell peals, but peals of Major as a percentage of the total continues to rise, with almost half of all the 2012 peals, 73 out of 147, being of Major. There have been more peals of wrong place standard Surprise Major methods, with nine peals of Bristol and one of London. Also, peals which deserve credit are the peal of Double Dublin S Major for St Patrick's Day at Debenham, and a peal of Glasgow S Major, rung at Ixworth on 9 August, which contained three firsts in the method. This was the first peal of Glasgow for the Guild for eight years. The peal columns reveal real enthusiasm for progress, which looks set to continue in 2013. As always, I should like to record my thanks to Ruth Suggett, Brian Whiting and David Salter for all their hard work and support.

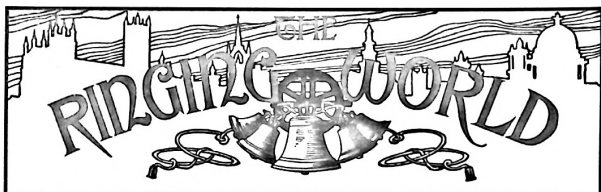

There was some concern from the meeting that people who had been teaching in their own towers for many years would now not be considered qualified to teach if they did not do the scheme even though they were very experienced and had taught many who had gone on to become successful ringers. The question of insurance for non-accredited teachers was also a worry. Jed assured the meeting that no-one would be excluded from the scheme. A proposal from the Chair that the Guild supports the Master in the adoption of the ITTS was carried overwhelmingly.

Mini Ring on Tour

The mini ring is booked to go to the Suffolk Show again following on from the success of last year and also Henham Steam Rally. The Chairman asked the meeting to consider volunteering to help with the mini ring at the Suffolk Show in return for reduced entry price. It is also being used by neighbouring associations which is good publicity for the Guild.

Deanery basis of representation

The Chairman explained that two deaneries in NE District had merged and other towers had changed benefices across District boundaries. The GMC had set up a committee with a representative from each District to consider how the constitution should be amended in the light of these changes and whether any changes in the existing makeup of the Districts were desirable. He asked members to give their views to their District representative so that any changes could be effected at next year's AGM.

Guild Social Events.

The NW District hosted the Guild Social on Saturday 30th July. Numbers were depleted due to the wedding of Jason and Sarah Busby, but a sizeable number enjoyed a historic quiz based on Bury St Edmunds Town Centre before moving on to a barbecue at Great Welnetham Village Hall. Jed Flatters ran a bar and it was an enjoyable evening.

It is the turn of the SE District to host the Guild social this year and tickets will be available for a barn dance at Sroughton Tithe Barn on Saturday 15th September. Next Year the Guild will be celebrating 90 years of existence with the 5 yearly Guild dinner.

National Youth Striking Competition

Alex Tatlow is organising practices for a group of young ringers from around the Guild to take part in the second National Young Ringers Striking Competition to be held in Birmingham at St Paul's on 30th June. The Chairman encouraged everyone to support our young people as this is quite an undertaking for the band, all of whom have to be under the age of 19.

Guild Clothing

Stephen Cheek is able to supply a variety of Guild Clothing with the Logo embroidered on it. The choice is wide e.g. T-shirts, fleeces, sweatshirts and polo shirts. Items can be ordered individually as there is not a minimum order required. A link to his website and his details can be found on the Guild website. The aim is not to be a profit-making venture, but rather to advertise the Guild.

Matters arising from 2011 AGM

George Pipe apologised for the fact that the History of the Guild book had not yet been published due to illness but he was able to show members a prototype cover which was very impressive.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 2010 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
3. Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
4. Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
5. Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
6. Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. Name

1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.

1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).

1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule J 13, and shall be elected at the AGM.

B. MEMBERSHIP

2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:

2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.

2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.

2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.

2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.

3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.

4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation of an amount at least equal to the subscription payable by a ringing member aged between 65 and 74.

C. DISTRICTS

5 There shall be four Districts, comprising the following Deaneries:

1 North East: Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hoxne and Saxmundham.

2 North West: Ixworth, Hartismere, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.

3 South East: Bosmere, Colneis, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.

4 South West Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Sudbury.

D. GOVERNMENT

6 6.1 The President shall be the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

6.2 A Suffragan Bishop within the Diocese shall be a Vice-President.

6.3 Vice-Presidents elected before 2010 shall hold office for life and shall not be required to pay a subscription.

6.4 A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM. Patrons shall hold office without re-election, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM.

7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the Guild Management Committee (GMC).

8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Ringling Master	Librarian
Secretary	Handbells Trustee
Treasurer	Peal Secretary
Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee	Public Relations Officer
Report Editor	Magazine Editor
Central Council Representatives	Webmaster
Mini Ring Trustee	

9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to act as Independent Examiner in accordance with The Charities Acts .

10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment.

The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.

12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.

12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.

13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.

14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be transferred to the Guild Restoration Fund. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.

15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.

17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.

18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.

19 The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.

20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.

21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.

22 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

- 23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild, and the Secretary shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of other Guild assets
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
 - 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and, unless it ceases to be published, the Guild Newsletter.
 - 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from the date given in the proposal.
 - 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. Election of Members and Subscriptions

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
 - 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year, and shall be set at the preceding AGM, or a SGM. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
 - 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
 - 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
 - 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5 A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
- 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
- 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

- 9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of:

- 9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two representatives from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

- The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.
- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
- The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings (including District)..
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
- (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman; Ringing Master; Secretary/Treasurer, Newsletter Correspondent and Deanery Representatives. Each District shall also elect a representative from each Deanery (who may hold other office in the District) to serve on the GMC and two representatives to serve on the RTC.
- 20.1 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.
- 20.2 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
- Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

- 1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells viz:

| 16 bells generally by Shaw | size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones) |
| 13 bells by Warner | size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone) |
| 13 bells by various founders | size 20 in F (diatonic 13) |
- They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
- 2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.

- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.

THE MITSON SHIELD, LESTER BRETT TROPHY AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS

RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 The Mitson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows:

MITSON SHIELD AND LESTER BRETT TROPHY

- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
 - a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual Report
 - b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 3.2 a) For the Mitson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method(s). Opening rounds will not be marked.
- or b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Tittums. "Marked" changes start when the first change is made.

ROSE TROPHY

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 4 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
- 5 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the 'Ringing World' and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 6 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 7 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 8 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 9 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 10 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to band meeting short.
- 11 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.

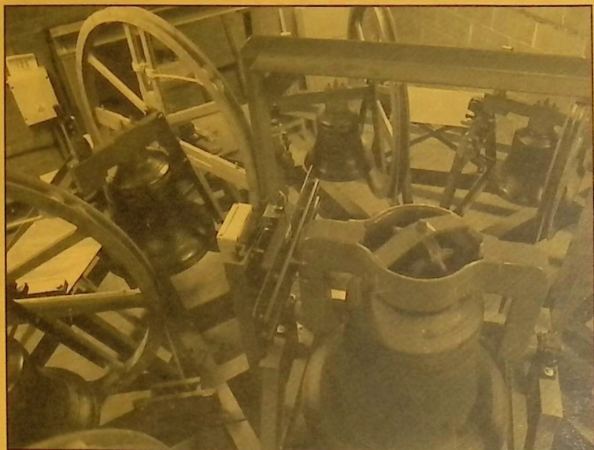
