

The GMC is up to strength, while at the time of writing we have two members of the executive about to complete their maximum of five years in office, with no replacements yet identified. Fingers crossed.

A message from Bishop David

Ding dong merrily on high! With your kind help, for which many thanks, the Bells of Suffolk rang out last year for both our Diocesan centenary and the great festivals of our faith, as well marking the steady courses of our lives.

They are a vital and time-honoured part of the texture of our life, speaking of both time and eternity. Each bell rings with its own unique timbre, often known by its own name. But together they weave a pattern and a tune that in full change ringing takes us out to the mathematical extremities of the possible permutations – like the amazing profligacy of life itself – before returning in the end to the point from which it came, resting satisfactorily back (like the ringers!) into a renewed peace.

So here is an avocation (to use an old word) that is also a vocation into which we can be called and through which we can call others. We are given a work-out in body, mind (all that maths!) and spirit – and others are invited to share in it too. Most of that sharing is through listening; but if you are reading this and not already a bell-ringer, are reasonably sound of wind and limb, and are wondering what it would be like to pull a rope and make a merry sound – then do have a word with your local ringers or vicar and give it a try. I think you'll enjoy it.

Obituaries

Winifred Ivings - Euston

Win, 'Mrs Ivings' was a member of the Suffolk Guild from 1958. She and Henry were very much part of Euston life and together raised the money to rehang and augment the bells there in the early '80's. Win rang 26 peals for the guild and was the NW District secretary and treasurer for two years. Win enjoyed district events, outings, minibus tours and Sunday afternoon ringing at the Norman Tower and ringing for Bury in Bloom judging. Win had spent the last six years in a nursing home at Wickwar and passed peacefully away on 26 April aged 95 years.

Anthony Mitchell - Bardwell

Anthony joined the Bardwell band at the age of 78. He was a wonderful, happy, funny and caring man who relished Wednesday evenings in the tower. He adored bellringing and infused practice night with humour and jollity. He gave his time freely and he took the weekly commitment of service ringing and practice seriously, setting a shining example to the other members of the band. His death at the age of 80 was a blow, but his legacy is a burgeoning band of friends and ringers.

David Moyse - Reydon

Visitors to Reydon tower have frequently been greeted by the lovely Suffolk accent of David Moyse. Living only two fields away from St Margaret's, he was the first ringer to be taught there, when a peal of six was installed in 1996, joining the band who learnt at Southwold and attending regularly until his last short illness. He rang the tenor for several quarter peals, notably one for his 70th birthday with 13 year old grandson Philip (now Ringing Master of Southampton University) on the treble.

David was Steeplekeeper and an active member of the Suffolk Guild Belfry Advisory Committee. Active in the support of the community, his annual slide-show in aid of Reydon's spectacular Christmas lights was always a sell-out and left the audience better informed and chuckling at his anecdotes. He is sorely missed by ringers, his close family and beloved wife Joan.

Roger Peters - Benhall

Born on the 12 Dec 1925 Roger lived his early life at Barking Tye near Needham Market. His father Alfred was tower captain at Barking and would cart young Roger around on the back of his bike, hoping Roger would take up the art, but Roger resented being propped on window sills in the cold - no way was he going to learn to ring.

After leaving school Roger joined the Merchant, then the Royal Navy, serving until the end of the Second World War. Transferring to the Royal Engineers, he rose to the rank of Staff Sergeant and became a qualified Clerk of Works, moving back to Suffolk to become Clerk of Works for the Blyth District Council in Saxmundham and buying a house at Benhall. When Roger's father Alfred died, Roger deeply regretted never having rung with him. Finally in January 1969 Roger and second son Michael came under instruction from Peter

Bedford of Aldeburgh. Roger struggled to acquire rope sight in the early days and rang his first couple of quarter peals entirely by numbers, but he soon progressed.

Roger served as District Chairman and on the GMC. He was Benhall Tower Captain and correspondent for many years and the driving force behind the tower, ringing just on three hundred peals, from Doubles to Royal, including half a dozen handbell peals.

His other talents were drawing, painting, sign writing, making stained glass windows, wood carving, turning, home brewing and making teddy bears. He spoke six languages and his diary entries were in Arabic!

Roger was an unassuming man who led a relatively simple life. He never sought any reward, content that people got pleasure as he did, from the things he did or made. He died on 6th February 2014. Rest in peace you deserve it.

Simon Griffiths - St Mary Le Tower

In the early nineties a young man walked into St Mary Le Tower Belfry; none of us knew him except perhaps by name, because Simon was in the first peal ever of Orion Surprise Maximus. I quote from the Ringing World of March 19th 1982 "The most difficult single method ever attempted - Orion, was rung in Birmingham last week". Orion is still considered as such.

Simon was a Sutton Coldfield man and, happily for us here, was seconded to BT at Martlesham. He became a valuable member of the Tower band - someone who could ring anywhere in the circle and was a fine conductor too. He was not a keen peal ringer although whilst here he rang peals of Maximus in all the standard methods, plus York, Snow Tiger, Queenscliffe and Rochester.

What Simon loved best was a day's outing, good towers, preferably a ratio of 2 pubs to one tower, good company and good conversation. He was a very private man and was devoted to his wife Linda and his son James. His untimely death at 56 was a great shock to us all and we shall miss him keenly. Our sympathy goes out to his family.

Rev Janet Bufton - Winston

Janet followed two of her children, Richard and Sarah, to learn to ring at Debenham in the 1980s. She was a loyal and reliable ringer for several years. She rang quarter peals and enjoyed joining in with outings and other social activities. In the late 1990s she trained as a locally ordained priest for the Debenham and Helmingham benefice. Understandably her ringing had to take a back seat but she was always willing to help out when needed for weddings and services. She loved hearing the bells ring and enjoyed meeting visiting ringers when they visited her home village of Winston, where she remained tower correspondent until she died on 4 May 2014.

Those of us who knew her felt privileged to have been touched by this calm, quiet, spiritual lady who cared so much for her Church and for those around her.

Trustees' Annual Report

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014.

Charity

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers was registered with the Charity Commission on 10 December 1975, registration number 266869. The Charity's registered address is Millbeck House, Harleston Green, Shelland, Stowmarket, IP14 3HU. It is governed under a constitution originally registered in 1977 and most recently revised in 2013.

Principal objectives

The purpose of the Charity is to promote and encourage the practice of bellringing within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich, to recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art; to cultivate the art of scientific change ringing; and to promote and advise on the preservation of bells in an efficient condition.

Trustees

The Trustees during the period were A F Stanley, G E Slack, and A J Shedden.

Review of Progress and Achievements

Bellringing

It has been another busy year for ringing, restoration, and social activities and we welcome the progress made by learners and young ringers. More ringers have completed teaching training and this should stand us in good stead for recruitment and retention of ringers. The Guild had a high profile in marking the centenary of the start of World War I and in celebrating the centenary of the Diocese. A well-attended AGM incorporated a valuable fringe meeting with guest speakers on the use of handbells in teaching church bell ringing; and an open forum on the Future of Ringing which in turn has led to actions being taken by the General Management Committee to consider how best the Guild can contribute, both financially and practically.

Restoration activities

Our main contribution was to Rattlesden where the restoration of the bells was completed. Smaller contributions were made to Stowmarket, Thurston and Thelnetham. Members of the Belfry Advisory Committee continue to give advice and support, both for routine maintenance and restoration projects.

Guild Finances

Policies

All money in the Guild's funds not required for day-to-day working purposes is invested or deposited by the Treasurer, as directed by the Guild Management Committee. Grants from the Restoration Fund are authorised by the Guild Management Committee but are only paid after completed work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants are normally only offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmentation and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

General Fund

Income to the General Fund decreased by 5% overall, although this conceals increases in some categories and decreases in others. The most notable change was a reduction in subscription income of 10%. Membership numbers have fallen and a further contributory factor is the increasing age profile of our members with more paying the senior rate or becoming free. We are grateful that many such members give a generous donation to the Restoration Fund in lieu of their subscription. Expenditure was virtually unchanged from 2013 although again there were increases and reductions. The Young Ringers raised sufficient funds for the Striking Competition to offset their costs and although this income and expenditure is included in the accounts, they virtually balanced out. Overall there was a small reduction in the General Fund of £162 which was anticipated in the budget for the year.

Restoration Fund

The significant increase in Restoration Fund income from donations and interest reported last year has meant that income this year is down by 20%, especially as interest rates have deteriorated further. Grants made were relatively low again at less than £7,500 but after several years where requests for grants were small, grants of over £21,000 were approved in 2014. As a result, the sum available for allocation to new projects has decreased to £46,600.

Summary

As anticipated, there was a small reduction in the General Fund balance in 2014 and the reduction in subscriptions is a cause for concern. It was encouraging to receive significant funding requests for restoration work after some years of declining activity.

Belfry Advisory Committee's Report Winston S Girling

After previously completing 17 years as BAC Chairman I now find myself having almost completed another year with the post of Technical Adviser added on. Because of the ever increasing workload facing myself steps are being taken with a view to appointing District Technical Advisers. This has been discussed both on a District and Guild level and has not been opposed in any way. I will of course still act as Guild Technical Adviser. At the moment we have Jonathans Stevens (NE) Winston Girling (NW) and Neville Whittell (SW) It is hoped that a suitable and willing candidate will be found for the SE in due course. Whilst the Guild wishes I will of course remain as Guild Technical Advisor.

After a great deal of work the Ranald Clouston Reports have finally been digitised. This includes the locations with one, two and three bells. I can now pass on a report (hopefully by email) but they are not being made public because of some of the information contained in them. I am grateful for the help and advice given by other Guild Members. I also organised a sponsored peal which raised enough money to buy an additional odd-struckness meter so that there will be one with Jonathan Stevens and one with myself, covering the north and south of Suffolk.

Restorations continue and Rattlesden were completed during 2014 by Taylors. These have been transformed into an easy going and very pleasant sounding six. Redgrave should have been under way by now, but in spite of planning permission being issued for the work at this redundant Church, the Churches Conservation Trust have stopped things in their tracks by ordering major changes to the proposed restoration. This is a pity because Albert Driver had already left the money for this work in his will. A solution is being sought. Horringer continue to raise money towards a major restoration and there are also moves at St Mary at Quay, Ipswich, to restore the bells. Little Cornard have also expressed an interest in restoration.

In conclusion I would like to thank all the Members of the BAC and others who have helped in any way to keep our bells in order. Thanks also to Jonathan, my very hard working predecessor, for all that he has done and continues to do so.

Ringing Master's Report

Jed Flatters

This year was always going to be about the centenary of the Diocese with peals arranged at some of our less well featured towers to celebrate the year long event. Our planned week long cycling tour around the border, ringing at most of the towers and cycling through the Suffolk lanes also helped us to commemorate the event. We received good support from each of the four districts and the East Bergholt ringers also did their bit to help by demonstrating this unique ring to us. In addition to this, we raised money for Guild funds.

Our Guild Social, hosted by the SW District, was held on a pleasant August evening in the wonderful setting of Hadleigh Guildhall. At one stage it looked as though apathy was going to win but on the night a good turnout made a success of the evening and everyone enjoyed the quiz, raffle, garden games, mini-ring, Guildhall tours and participating in an auction for two radio controlled cars. Richard Finch and his ringers also put on a good barbecue with ample food for all.

The Guild six bell striking competition was held at Ashbocking, a lovely easy going ring. Our judges for the day were Lesley Boyle and Gareth Davies. As is usual for these events we sat them in the churchyard in a quiet corner where they could hear the bells clearly and mark each of the teams as they rang. All went well until the thirteenth team took hold and the tenor rope decided to undo above the sally. A temporary repair saw things running again but crucial time was lost resulting in an unforeseen knock-on effect. Then it was on to the hall for a quick tea and results, the worthy winners of the Mitson Shield being St Mary le Tower whilst Hollesley claimed the Lester Brett call change trophy with a good steady piece of ringing. A mad rush through the lanes took us to Helmingham where a late start was made for the Rose Trophy. Unfortunately time was against us however and were it not for the voluntary withdrawal of the last two teams, the competition would not have been brought to a successful conclusion. The NW District team were judged the winners with a good rendition of Plain Bob Major. The Ridgman Trophy was more local this year being held at Coggeshall. The test piece was a touch of Stedman Caters ably called by Simon Griffiths though it was only good enough to place us fifth, one up from last year.

A good fund raising effort by the young ringers and their supporters raised sufficient monies to enable a team and their 'groupies' to travel to Worcester for the National Youth Contest where again our team rang method and were placed well being beaten by bands that were much more capable but chose to ring rounds and call changes. Monthly young ringer events are being run to improve standards but like all things they need good support if they are to continue, not just from the young learners but also from the more experienced members of the Guild.

It has been a very slow year with restoration work, only two major projects being completed. At Rattlesden the poor going ring of six have been transformed by careful tuning into a pleasant sounding ring that in spite of the long draught respond well. Well done to Dave Ward and his team and thanks to Ruth Suggett for help in submitting the application to Heritage Lottery whose grant made this project possible.

Last year I mentioned Elmsett and I am delighted to have helped install the new treble just before Christmas to make what is a super light ring of five. Well done to all in this project that has taken several years to bring to its conclusion. Although not really restorations we welcome ringing again at Copdock and Ingham where the bells are now in regular use.

Fittingly on St. Edmund's day we received news of the appointment of our new Bishop, the Rev. Canon Martin Seeley. We wish him well in his new post and look forward to welcoming him to future Guild events

Quarter peals still feature strongly with Lesley and David Steed and friends pushing the numbers up most weekends and the Scase family doing likewise most Friday nights, whilst in the east, the Pettistree ringers keep plugging away each Wednesday evening with different methods. From the records I note:-

Secretary's Report

As I write this I am nearing the end of my maximum term of 5 years as secretary and from a physical perspective I can't say with honesty that I will be sad to go. During my time in office it has been a pleasure to write and send letters offering the Guild's financial support to successful grant applicants for the numerous restorations and augmentations that have been completed. It is worrying though that the number of recruits into ringing may not be enough to sustain ringing in the future in Suffolk. Like everyone else, the recruits that stay long enough to become useful members of a ringing band are giving of their time voluntarily and there are many other demands on their time.

The whole structure of the Guild is dependent on volunteers giving of their time from teaching to administration, restoration and maintenance and like many other organisations the Guild is struggling to find willing bodies to take on these roles for the future. Looking at the list of officers both at county level and district level we see the same names in many cases fulfilling more than one role, and whilst this is admirable and we should be grateful for it, it is something that needs to be addressed in the longer term.

Despite this it is pleasing to see the amount of enthusiasm and energy being brought into some areas of the Guild, especially in a county where sustaining recruitment is difficult and the population density is low with a higher proportion of older people who are unlikely to become involved. Suffolk has a high proportion of retired people amongst the membership and many more of us are heading that way, so anything we as a Guild can do to ensure that Sunday Service ringing is maintained has to be welcomed.

Librarian's Report Abby Antrobus

The main credit for library-related activities this year goes to those who have digitised some of our items. Neal Dodge has been scanning old Annual Reports, and a number are available on the Guild website (http://www.suffolkbells.org.uk/guildreports.php): thanks to him for devoting so much time to making the reports accessible. GMC also commissioned the scanning of Ranald Clouston's unpublished reports, compiled particularly throughout his DAC years. There are over 400 of these, relating to church and secular towers. Alongside recommendations for work, they contain illustrated information on the history and condition of bells and their frames, and are an invaluable resource for research and restoration projects. PDF files are available on request from Winston Girling or me.

A recent addition to the library is Heather Nicholas's campanological and social study, 'The Bells of Rattlesden: A History' - whilst the Guild website documents our recent activities, there is still call for interesting items to be deposited in the Guild library, to be kept either in the Norman Tower, or the Suffolk Records Office if directly relating to the history of the Guild. Our collection is gradually being catalogued (ref. GC522), and whilst mostly it is in lpswich, staff can transfer items to Bury for viewing.

Public Relations Officer's Report

I'll be honest - I haven't been awfully proactive as Public Relations Officer this year for one reason or another!

That's not to say there hasn't been some good publicity out there for the Guild, mainly provided for by BBC Radio Suffolk. They were at Rendlesham's Village Fete on the August bank holiday Monday, as were a band of soggy ringers with The Vestey Ring, and although she was cut off in her prime due to technical problems, Sally Munnings gave an informative explanation of ringing to the Beeb's roving reporter live on air. St Edmund's Day and the Christmas ringing in Ipswich saw us get coverage to varying degrees, with myself being interviewed on the phone for the latter, and whilst I'm not aware that anything was ever broadcast, it is worth noting that Radio Suffolk approached us about what we might be doing for St George's Day having seen it mentioned on our website!

They also gave The Norman Tower's Open Day for the Heritage Day in September a plug, with the East Anglian Daily Times also mentioning this and the Mayor of Sudbury having a go at St Peter's for the same occasion. The newspaper also reported the news of the two bells stolen from the floor of Little Saxham church. Generally though, the EADT and the rest of our local media weren't as responsive as Radio Suffolk. It is a reminder that the best way of getting publicity is off our own back. The Open Day at St Mary-le-Tower in October was the textbook way to hold such an event, and I'm sure others have had similar successes with these - please consider opening your tower to your local community and don't be afraid to ask those who have done the same for tips.

Twitter, Facebook and Awl a'huld offer avenues to reach out to the public and each other, and I try to get across as much as I can through my daily blog on the website. Maybe we should also be looking at Instagram and even Wikipedia? Ultimately though, we are all responsible for the image of ringing when we speak and deal with non-ringers, so please put across the best impression you can. Whether you want me to publicise something or to tell me about publicity you are arranging, then please do not hesitate to contact me!

Webmaster's Report

The Guild Website now contains over two thousand pages. Information about towers, bells, ringers and events is constantly updated. Photos and snippets of news can be sent to the webmaster for posting on the web site. Richy's Blog is now in its eighth year and is posted daily, generating friendly repartee on Facebook. The Guild also has a Twitter account (@SuffolkBells). Thank you to all those who have made contributions. The Guild email system continues to be used to circulate What's On and news and now contains the email addresses of about 450 members. The addresses are known only to the webmaster and are not published even to other members. If you would like information distributed please email it to the webmaster. A significant number of emails are returned as undeliverable so, if you change your email address, don't forget to let the webmaster know. The system itself has been changed recently. The Guild now uses a free system, MailChimp, instead of a program written by the webmaster. Emails are formatted and include the Guild logo. Members can now unsubscribe using a link in each email.

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor.

The key of a ring (ie the note of the tenor) is given in cents (ie, hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C# -20, and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

Peal Secretary's Report

Christine Knight

Since 2006, when 93 peals were rung for the Guild, annual rises in the peal total had become an almost unbroken trend. This peaked at 155 in 2013, and the 2014 total of 121 is disappointing. The exceptional total of 60 peals at The Wolery in 2013 dropped to 46, and there were also 9 fewer peals at Grundisburgh. The decline in peals on higher numbers and less interest in Peal Week are also contributory factors. There are also relatively few members prepared to take on the, often frustrating, task of organising peals. 2014 was the first year since 1976 that no peals of Maximus were rung for the Guild. There were also no peals of Surprise Royal. Peals were rung in 49 Suffolk towers and just two outside the county, the church of Our Lady and the English Martyrs in Cambridge and Great Bentley in Essex.

Nationally, many peals were rung during the year to commemorate the centenary of the outbreak of the First World War and also to honour individual ringers who had made the ultimate sacrifice. A peal to mark the outbreak of the conflict was rung at Stoke Ash on 7th August. The loss of individual Suffolk ringers was commemorated at their home towers by peals at Great Barton and Wissett. Another focus for peals was the centenary of the founding of the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich. Peals were rung to celebrate this at The Norman Tower, Pettistree, Gislingham, Kelsale and, perhaps most notably, Offton, where a peal of 5120 Spliced Edmundsbury and Ipswich S Major was conducted by Stephen Pettman on AGM Day. Appropriately, James Smith had produced a composition containing exactly the same number of changes of each method.

There were several individual peals worthy of note during the year. On 5th January, Wilby was the venue for a peal of 4 Spliced S Major, the very difficult Horton's 4 'all the work' composition of Glasgow, London, Bristol and Belfast, The project was organised by Maggie Ross and half the band came from Suffolk. This was the first performance of the Horton 4 for the Guild, for which the band deserves great credit. Another noteworthy peal was one of Stedman Cinques, rung at St Mary le Tower, Ipswich on 15th February. This was George Salter's first ever touch of Stedman Cinques as conductor and the band contained 5 firsts of Stedman Cinques and 2 firsts on 12. In June, Stephen Pettman's light-hearted response to Central Council rule changes in a peal of 22 methods and 18 blocks at Earl Stonham, was voted by ringers nationwide into the 'Featured Performance' slot on the 'BellBoard' website. Also in June, Katharine Salter rang her 1000th peal for the Guild in a peal at The Wolery, becoming only the fifth person, and the first female ringer, to achieve this landmark. There was just one peal to celebrate the completion of a restoration project. This was rung at Clopton on 11th January, and it was good to see a further 4 peals rung there for the Guild during the year. A very rare visitor to the peal columns was Stansfield, where a peal of Grandsire Doubles on 13th January marked the exact centenary of the only previous recorded peal on the bells, also Grandsire Doubles.

Once again, many trends of recent years have continued. There were regular peals of Surprise Major at The Wolery and Aldeburgh, the latter seeing the 300th peal on the bells for the Guild on 14th December. Surprise Minor also remained popular. There were no fewer than 16 peals of 7 Surprise during the year. At The Wolery, interest in peals of Spliced Surprise Minor continued, leading to 41 Spliced Surprise being rung three times during the year, all conducted by David Salter. Spliced Surprise Major has been a focus of attempts on the front eight at 5t Mary le Tower, conducted by Brian Whiting. Two peals of 10 Spliced were rung, with three of the band achieving their first of 10 Spliced on 21st May. Stephen

Pettman called 6 peals of a special commemorative length, of which 5 marked special birthdays or anniversaries. In contrast, a 5090 of Yorkshire S Major was rung at Debenham on 10th November to commemorate the 90th anniversary of the first peal of Yorkshire S Major rung for the Guild, Both peals were rung half-muffled on 10th November, the eve of the Armistice.

It is always pleasing to see young conductors emerging. On 29th January, Colin Salter rang his first peal as conductor, at The Wolery. Congratulations must also go to Richard Stevens who rang his first peal, at Monewden, on 1st November, aged just ten, Indeed, several members achieved personal milestones during the year, with 2 firsts on 12, 2 firsts on eight, 2 firsts of Surprise Major and a first of Spliced Surprise Major being recorded. It is a cause for concern, however, that there was only one first pealer. Especially in a rural area, peal ringing provides a vital opportunity to improve striking and gain experience in more complex methods. The diminishing interest in Peal Week is regrettable as it seemed to crystallise the theme of progression early in the year and act as a catalyst for further achievement. Peal Week 2014 generated only 4 peals, the lowest total since its reintroduction in 2007. At its peak, 16 peals were rung during the Peal Weeks of both 2009 and 2010, with a wide variety of 'firsts' achieved. It has also been proved in recent years that age need not be a barrier to ringing a first peal, and it would be good to see a wider cross section of the Guild membership ringing peals. Celebrating a local occasion with a peal can be excellent PR for ringing, and a means of stimulating interest in our Art. I should like to thank David Salter, Brian Whiting and George Reynolds for their hard work on the peals section of this Report.

THE SUFFOLK GUILD OF RINGERS

OBJECTS, CONSTITUTION AND RULES - 2014 REVISION

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
- Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.

3 Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.

- 4 Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
- 6 Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. NAME

- The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
- 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref.266869).
- 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule J 13, and shall be elected at the AGM.

B. MEMBERSHIP

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
- 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
- 2.2 Associate Member: A person who wishes to support the Guild.
- 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
- 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation of an amount at least equal to the subscription payable by a Ringing Member aged between 65 and 74.

C. DISTRICTS

5 There shall be four Districts, North East, North West, South East and South West. Towers may move from one District to another with the agreement of both Districts and subject to approval by the Guild Management Committee (GMC).

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6.1 The President shall be the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 6.2 A Suffragan Bishop within the Diocese shall be a Vice-President.

- 6.3 Vice-Presidents elected before 2010 shall hold office for life and shall not be required to pay a subscription.
- 6.4 A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM. Patrons shall hold office without re-election, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM.
- 7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the GMC.
- 8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

- The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to act as Independent Examiner in accordance with The Charities Acts.
- 10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorize expenditure from Guild funds and may organize general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment. The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

- All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
- 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- 14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be transferred to the Guild Restoration Fund. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- 15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- 16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
- The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
- 21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the

- purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the
- The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

- All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild and the secretary shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of other Guild assets.
- The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
- 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change to the Constitution and Rules of the Guild must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and the Guild website.
- 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from the date given in the proposal.
- 26.3 No amendment shall be authorized which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. ELECTION OF MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

- Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
- 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year and shall be set at the preceding AGM, or a SGM. If a change in subscription has not been passed the existing rate shall continue.
- 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
- 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
- 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM after their nomination has been approved by the GMC, No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.

- A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident Life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
- 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
- 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

- 9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of the Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee, and up to five members from each District, elected in accordance with Rule 20.
- 9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convener and two members from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10, and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- The Guild Executive shall consist of: of the Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee.

 The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.
- The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
- The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
- The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorized by the GMC.
- The expenses of Guild Meetings (including District).
- Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
- Guild insurances.
- Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
- Such other expenses as the GMC may authorize.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
- a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
- b) The appropriate peal fees.
- c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

M. DISTRICT RULES

20

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year. election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January, Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
 - The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary/Treasurer, Magazine Correspondent, two members to serve on the RTC and up to five members to serve on the GMC.
- A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the 20.1 District.
- 20.2 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the Annual District Meeting on the year's work.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
- Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
- Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
- Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
- Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Magazine Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Magazine, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

1 The Suffolk Guild Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four distinct sets of handbells:

25 bells by Taylors	size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw	size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner	size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)
13 bells by various founders	size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

- The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
- The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are re-turned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without prior consent of the Trustee.
- The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- f the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that committee.

THE MITSON SHIELD, LESTER BRETT TROPHY AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITIONS RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life Honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- The Mitson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows:
 Mitson Shield and Lester Brett Trophy
- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
- a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual report
- b) the ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- a) For the Mitson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor Method(s) Opening rounds will not be marked.
 b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Tittums. Marked changes start when the first change is made.

Rose Trophy

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a district or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 4 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
- 5 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the Ringing World and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples a cover bell must be used.
- 8 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 9 In the event of a large entry the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 10 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
