Obituaries

Bridget Sayers - Earl Stonham

Bridget joined the Earl Stonham band about 15 years ago when she, and her husband Brian, moved to the area. Her father had been a previous Rector of Earl Stonham and her widowed mother was still living in the area. Bridget learnt to ring in Hythe about 40 years ago and had rung quarters and a peal. She and Brian quickly became valuable members of the church and of the ringing band, including being active in the restoration and augmentation in 2004. Her friendship and ringing ability was a great bonus to the band. She will be greatly missed by the Earl Stonham ringers and those who knew her.

Dr Peter S. Franks

Dr Peter S. Franks MBBS (Lon) DRCOG lived at Bacton, and latterly at Ardleigh, Essex.

Although he did not start to ring until the 1970's he always played the organ at Bacton. In 1973 the 5 bells at Bacton were restored and hung in a new steel frame and are now a superb 6. Peter and his wife Sheila were the prime movers in getting these bells restored and it is doubtful whether they would have been done without their tenacity and grit. Peter finally took up ringing when his son, Tim, was being taught, and he rang with Sheila in the first peal on the restored bells in 1973.

Peter and Sheila were synonymous with Bacton. As he said once, "I have brought half this village into the world and seen the other half out". He will always be remembered with great affection by all the villages he covered, and everyone will remember the great hospitality they insisted on at home, especially after ringing.

Ken Brown - Ixworth

Ken was taught to ring in 1950 by Harry King. Ken was a member at Ixworth but also rang at other local towers namely Pakenham, Great Barton, Rougham and Bury St Edmunds both at the Norman Tower and St Mary's. He gave up ringing because of his work as a milkman and a part time fireman. On retirement he came back to ringing and rang 129 peals and many quarter peals, also looking after his wife Wendy full time. Ken passed away in April 2016.

Valerie Jay - Stoke-by-Clare

The entire village of Stoke-by-Clare as well as many people from the surrounding area were totally shocked and saddened by the death on 9th June 2016, after only a very short illness, of Val, as she was respectfully known, at the age of 62 years. She was born in Stoke-by-Clare and was encouraged to take up ringing at the age of fourteen by her father, the late Bob Gowan, who was a member of the Stoke team, and was taught to ring by the then Tower Captain, Aubrey Peacock, and often assisted by another well known ringer, Walter Perry. Val became a very competent and much respected ringer not only at Stoke-by-Clare but at many other towers in the area where she was also a regular ringer.

She leaves behind her husband Leslie and her daughter Carolyn and son Christopher. A truly respected person who will be sorely missed not only amongst her bell ringing friends, but also by all who knew her so well in the many other organisations in which she was involved. The church at Stoke-by-Clare was full to capacity for her funeral with the bells being rung half-muffled both before and after the service. May her soul rest in peace.

Chris Plummer—Worlingham

It was with great sadness that the ringers in the North East District heard of Chris' death, shortly before Christmas. He had withstood serious illness with great fortitude for some years, but had retained his energy and enthusiasm right until the end.

Chris learned to ring at Worlingham in the late 60s. Shortly afterwards, when Worlingham had to cease ringing, he transferred his allegiance to Beccles. From then on, he regarded himself as a Beccles ringer, thoroughly enjoying ringing in Plain Bob Royal on Sundays unless it was the sailing season! He rang in a handful of peals, always viewing a peal of Yorkshire Major rung by a Beccles Sunday service band in 1988 as his high point.

Chris and his wife Sarah were a well-known ringing couple who first met in Beccles tower in 1982. They were married in Worlingham Church, Chris having earnestly requested that the organist (a fellow ringer) play Widor's Toccata 'as impressively as possible' even allowing for the limitations of the organ.

Although Chris did not ring so much as his illness progressed, he remained a strong supporter and was invaluable at practices standing behind people new to various methods. He was very popular with the local ringers for his kindness, sense of humour and ability to sing Plain Bob Doubles to help the striking!

The Beccles band was privileged to ring for Chris' Service of Thanksgiving in December, which was very well attended. Chris had a wide variety of interests, including sailing, and we were regaled with many anecdotes about his very active life.

A quarter peal of Plain Bob Royal was rung at Beccles on 8 February 2017 in memory of Chris.

Trustees' Annual Report

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2016.

Charity

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers was registered with the Charity Commission on 10 December 1975, registration number 266869. The Charity's registered address is 2 Fredellen, Upper Street, Witnesham, Ipswich, IP6 9EW. It is governed under a constitution originally registered in 1977 and most recently revised in 2014.

Principal objectives

The purpose of the Charity is to promote and encourage the practice of bellringing within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich; to recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art; to cultivate the art of scientific change ringing; and to promote and advise on the preservation of bells in an efficient condition.

Review of Progress and Achievements

Bellringing—107 peals were rung in 2016, an increase of 12 on 2015. Peals were rung in 43 towers. The number of quarter peals rung declined slightly from 552 in 2015 to 499 in 2016. Quarters were rung in 98 towers. Both peals and quarter peals covered a wide range of methods from Doubles to Maximus, involved a diverse range of towers and ringers, and benefited all who took part. These were the successful attempts, the number of peal and quarter peal attempts which were unsuccessful is not known, but nonetheless they too are an important learning experience. Established training programmes are used to develop the skills of new ringers, and those new to teaching people to ring. Participants agree it is a valuable aid to the teaching and instruction of beginners, and a skills investment for the future.

Restoration activities—Members of the Belfry Advisory Committee have been very active throughout the year, carrying out inspections and making repairs to installations. Work has been completed at Stoke Ash - renovating decayed frame mountings; Otley - rectifying loose clappers; Cretingham - advisory work on installation of new tenor and fittings; Eye - work on clappers; Thornham Magna - minor adjustments; Melton Old Church, and Levington, - repairs to chiming bells; Badwell Ash - inspection of installation. In addition support and advice has been given for routine maintenance.

Guild Finances

Reserves Policy— In line with advice from Larking Gowen, the appointed examiners for the Guild, the Trustees have formulated a Reserves Policy. The Guild will expect to hold at the bank, a surplus of approximately one year's running costs.

Policies—All money in the Guild's funds not required for day-to-day working purposes is invested or deposited by the Treasurer, as directed by the Guild Management Committee. Grants from the Restoration Fund are authorised by the Guild Management Committee but are only paid after completed work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants are normally only offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmentation and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

In order to respond to the short term need to provide financial support to training activities, the General Management Committee (GMC) have introduced a process to enable grants of up to £50 to be made immediately, at the discretion of the Ringing Master, and grants of up to £500 to be made within seven days at the discretion of the Guild Executive. In both cases subject to appropriate records being kept and presented to the GMC.

General Fund - Compared with the 2015 account, income to the General Fund decreased by just 6%, although, as is always the case, some categories have increased, others decreased. Subscriptions were down 4%, but peal fee income had increased by 28%, albeit from an unusual low in 2015. Expenditure was 29% more than in 2015. Exceptional items were the purchase of lapel badges at £758 and administration costs of £687: together they account for virtually all of the expenditure increase. The remaining categories, affiliation fees, insurance, donations etc showed little variation from previous years. After transfers to other accounts, the General Fund stood at £4,817.

Restoration Fund The Restoration Fund income has increased by 11% to £59,783. There are two grants outstanding, each for £12,000. That for the restoration of Horringer bells is expected to be claimed in early 2017. The other, for proposed restoration work at St Margaret's, Ipswich, which has not yet started, will be claimed at a later date. No other funding requests for restoration work have been received.

Summary In 2016, there was a decrease in the General Fund balance mainly because of increased expenditure. All restricted funds have a positive balance. There are no new funding requests for restoration work.

Belfry Advisory Committee Report—Winston Girling

2016 proved to be another busy year for the Committee. At our February, June and October meetings a great deal of ongoing work was discussed. This included some ongoing or proposed major restorations.

At Horringer the bells should have been up and ringing by Christmas 2016. I understand that this will now be delayed owing to some instability in an interior wall. We look forward to this new 8 and wish them every success. Redgrave should have the bells removed in July. Here the 1700's timber frame is to be repaired and returned to service for the existing 6 bells only. This is a shadow of what was originally envisaged but was required by the CCT who own the building. The viability of repairing and continued use of yet another timber bell frame will be evident as time progresses. Cretingham and St. Margaret's, Ipswich are fast approaching restorations and there is news that Whatfield are also in the pipeline. In addition, John Taylor is working hard to get Little Cornard restored. It is also proposed to carry out restoration at Stowmarket. This could well involve retaining 3 listed bells for chiming and the clock and providing a new lighter peal of 10 in a steel frame.

At Laxfield there is much vertical and horizontal movement of the timber frame and restoration is likely in the future. Brome have been inspected and some maintenance advised. Here the tower roof is leaking badly. At Wickham Market timber shafted clappers are to be fitted to 5 and 6 to stop these bells going up wrong. This may well have been completed as I write. Iken have had problems with the clapper bushes seizing in hot weather and these have now been reamed to prevent this happening in the future.

I recently reported on the bells at Badwell Ash and here it is proposed long term to install a kitchen and toilet on the ground floor of the tower, moving the ringing chamber to a gallery above, and to restore the bells and possibly augment to 6 in a steel frame lower in the tower.

Many small jobs have also been carried out by the team. I am grateful to our members for all their hard work and assistance over the year. I apologise if I have missed anything out.

Ringing Master's Report -Tom Scase

It's an honour to become only the 12th different Ringing Master of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers. I would like to thank my predecessor, Jed Flatters, for his contribution over the last five years and support since the Annual General Meeting. Indeed, I'm grateful for all the words of encouragement I have received since April and am reassured in the knowledge that there's valuable advice available from seven former Guild Ringing Masters living in the county!

Having been elected as Guild Ringing Master, I continued in my role as South East District Ringing Master until the Annual District Meeting (ADM) in December and this overlap of roles meant I didn't hit the ground running as fast as I would have liked.

Nevertheless, I still managed to attend three of the four ADMs: the North East at Stradbroke, the South East at Debenham and the South West at Sudbury. At these ADMs, I was pleased to note the willingness of those present to ensure the majority of District roles were filled. What's concerning, though, and this is no new concern, or indeed one unique to Suffolk, is the proportion of members attending. There is, alas, no 'click of the button' solution to encourage greater engagement of members. If there were, it would have been pushed long ago. What we, as a Guild, must do, is to continue to foster a Guild that promotes opportunities in ringing. This has many aspects and it's my mission to oversee and develop this intent into fruition. The Guild's objectives -read them - offer a clear and concise reminder of what this means.

I was unable to attend the Guild Striking competitions, held at Reydon and Southwold, owing to a prior commitment in Prague. I am grateful to Jed Flatters for ensuring the day went well. Our thanks go to James Smith for judging and to all taking part. Congratulations go to the winners: St Mary le Tower, Ipswich, in both the Mitson Shield (six bell method) and Rose Trophy (eight bell method); and to Hollesley in the Lester Brett Trophy (six bell Call Changes).

Ten members represented the Guild in the Ridgman Trophy, held on the glorious ten at Daventry. The test piece was 212 Erin Caters and although we rang without obvious mistakes, our ringing didn't settle as well as others; nevertheless, we were disappointed to be placed sixth out of seven. We will be looking to improve in Cambridge in 2017.

One of the mainstays and highlights of the ringing year is the annual Veterans' afternoon at Debenham, on the second Wednesday in July. 2016 was the 25th event, all of which have been organised by Muriel Page and her team. Muriel is now, deservedly, taking a back seat- thankfully future arrangements are in capable hands. I'm sure everyone who has attended over the years reiterates our thanks to Muriel.

I was pleased to join several members on the Guild Social, in September, hosted by the North West, with an enjoyable ring and walk between Thornham Magna and Wickham Skeith.

Slightly fewer quarter peals were rung in Suffolk in 2016 than in 2015. Neal Dodge's analysis makes interesting ringing - thanks Neal for compiling this. Congratulations to David and Lesley Steed who, once again, are the leading quarter peal ringers in Suffolk. Likewise, Pettistree remains the leading tower. Quarter Peals are a good means for consolidating methods and improving striking. Peals, however, provide a prolonged period in which to advance the aforementioned. It's pleasing, therefore, that the 2016 peal total shows a slight increase compared to 2015. It's still the second fewest peals rung for the Guild in the last ten years, though. I would very much like to see more members participating in peals. I am minded to re-introduce a Guild peal week, which has proved very successful in previous years, with a particular emphasis on encouraging greater involvement. Many congratulations to Adrian M Craddock and Sal Jenkinson on ringing their first peals. It's unfortunate there were not more first pealers.

Since our last AGM I've been fortunate enough to fill the role of PRO, as Richard Munnings had decided to step down. So I'd like to thank Richy for all the effort that he devoted to the role as he enjoys a break from holding Guild Office.

My first task of 2016 came following the debate about whether ringing is a sport, as Radio Suffolk were intrigued by the rarely seen side of competitive ringing and wished to cover our Guild Striking contest. I gave two interviews on the day, to announce the winners in the middle of the football results! So at least Radio Suffolk sees ringing as a sport! The Lowestoft Journal also devoted a whole page to the event with some excellent photos.

Just as in previous years we were asked to ring to celebrate events including: the Queen's 90th Birthday, BBC Music Day, Heritage Open Days and many local occasions. Radio Suffolk covered these events so thanks to Philip Gorrod, Ralph Earey, Joe Lavington, and Matt Thomas for being interviewed live on air. Our local papers included many ringing related stories including the Lt Cornard Project, the Norman Tower, and the new bells at Horringer.

Another big event in 2016 was the Folk East festival where a band of willing volunteers ran a successful ringing workshop with the Vestey Ring. Their team taught over 100 people to ring rounds on the mini ring, and Catherine Draper produced a revised and updated leaflet on learning to ring, more copies of which will be printed for future use.

We were also invited to attend Kingsfleet Primary School's community day in Felixstowe where John Girt and Roger Coley ran a very worthwhile session and now 6 children and their parents have taken up ringing thanks to local ringer Jacky Savage.

The Guild twitter account, @suffolkbells, has grown considerably during the year. With 231 followers it has become one of the largest ringing accounts with some tweets being seen by over 4,000 users. It has become a great way to interact with the public. One tweet was even picked up by the Guardian and was featured in their article on the events at York Minster.

As we look into 2017 there will be some events in which bells will play their part so if you're doing some special ringing or having an open day please let me know as I'd be happy to help publicise or provide promotional material for your occasion. Equally if you're having complaints or trouble dealing with an organisation please do get in touch. It's what I'm here for! Finally I must thank all 700+ of you, because you're all ambassadors for ringing. People don't become ringers based on an article or a website they've read, but down to encouragement and explanation from you. So my challenge to all SGR members this year is to speak to your colleagues, neighbours, friends, and family and tell them what a great time can be had when you go ringing!

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor.

The key of a ring (i.e. the note of the tenor) is given in cents (i.e. hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C#-20m and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

District Report—Ruth Young





<u>Learning methods</u> first steps

- Identify your learning style do you prefer to learn by seeing, hearing or doing?
- 2) Learn the method in small bits to start with, then join the bits up
- 3) Relate any new method to what you already know
- Familiarise yourself with new types of work
- 5) Learn where you pass the treble and where you work with it
- 6) A poor handling style can affect progress so get someone to video you then listen to their advice!
- Try to maintain a constant rhythm (which should be the same as the rest of the band)
- Stand behind someone and follow them ringing the method you are learning
- Go out to other towers where they ring what you are learning (& attend Guild and District events)
- 10) Do not be afraid to ask for help ask several people as they may explain things differently
- 11) Do your homework (before the practice night)

Learning methods - next steps

- 1) Learn the basics first and then build up to more complicated methods
- Look for signposts (roll ups, familiar changes, passing & working with your before & after course bells)
- Learn the place bell order and all of the starts
- 4) Learn the structure of the method by using the grid (shows blue line for each bell for one lead)
- 5) Learn the bobs and singles
- Practise ringing the method on Abel
- Do your homework (before the practice night)
- Listen critically to your striking (whatever you are ringing)
- Attend Training Days & Ringing Courses
- 10) Attempt a quarter peal

Peal Secretary's Report—Christine Knight

The rise in the Guild peal total to 107 in 2016 was very welcome after the big drop of the previous year. However, it is disappointing to note a further decline, to 40, in the number of Suffolk towers which hosted Guild peals during the year. Excursions out of county have also diminished recently. There were just two such peals, at Ardleigh in Essex and Elloughton in the East Riding of Yorkshire. There were no peals following restoration projects in 2016, but on 7th August the last peal was rung on the old bells at Horringer prior to the casting of an eagerly awaited completely new ring.

There were fewer national commemorations to act as stimuli for peals in 2016, but it was good to see the Suffolk Guild feature prominently in the record of peals to celebrate the 90th birthday of HM Queen Elizabeth II. Peals were rung at Felixstowe on 22ndApril and at Aldeburgh and Wenhaston on 12th June. Also, Brian Whiting composed and conducted special 5090's of Elizabeth R Surprise Royal and Queen Elizabeth II Delight Major, rung at the Norman Tower (11th June) and Offton (16th June) respectively. Nationwide, World War One centenary peals continued throughout the year, both to honour individuals who made the ultimate sacrifice and to commemorate major battles in the conflict. On 31st May, a new method was rung at Grundisburgh to mark the centenary of the Battle of Jutland. A 5100 of Battle of Jutland S Major was rung in memory of RSM James Bennett (RM), who was a survivor of that battle and had been a ringer at Grundisburgh. Another local ringer was remembered in a footnote to the peal at Pettistree on 17th November. The peal was rung on the exact centenary of the death of village resident Private Edward George Cooper. The centenary of the commencement of the Battle of the Somme on 1st July 1916 was also a focus for peals. Stephen Pettman conducted another Brian Whiting composition, this time a 5100 of Somme S Major at Henley on 1st July, it having been the worst day in the history of the British army, which suffered 57,470 casualties on that day alone.

The 'First Peal 2015' initiative produced eight first pealers for the Guild. Without this impetus, there were just two first pealers in 2016. Congratulations must go to Adrian Craddock and Sal Jenkinson. It is interesting that the peals in which each of these reached this milestone also contained someone ringing a peal after a very long gap. At Grundisburgh on 16th May, Joanna Crowe rang her first peal for 35 years, and the peal at Wenhaston on 12th June was Michael Cowling's first peal for 50 years, both huge achievements. In fact, 2016 could be seen as 'the year of the returnee', an exceptional year in that Joanna and Michael were joined by no less than four other ringers who been absent from the peal columns for many years: Christine Pickup (Wissett, 2nd July) after a gap of 24 years, Rowan Wilson (Grundisburgh, 4th November) after 25 years and, although not claimed in footnotes, Martyn Crouch (Horringer, 7th August) after 19 years and Mark Ogden (Ufford, 30th July) after 25 years. Hopefully, they will be encouraged to ring further peals in the near future.

Many trends in Suffolk peal ringing have continued, with monthly attempts by the Aldeburgh peal band, and also attempts of Surprise Major on the light eight at St Mary-le-Tower. At The Wolery, the 350th peal on the bells was reached on 10th February. It was also pleasing to see more peals at Grundisburgh in 2016, where the 700th peal on the bells for the Guild was recorded on 9th April. After the huge dip in 10 and 12 bell peals in 2015, it is encouraging to see an increase, though still no peals of wrong place Royal or Maximus. Five handbell peals have boosted the Guild peal total, and it is good to see talented younger ringers taking part. On tower bells, one first each of Minor, Royal and Maximus, together with a first of Surprise Major, London Major and Bristol Major and three firsts of Cambridge Major were recorded; these are all encouraging, but there is scope for much more. It may be that there is a hiatus between a very able group of young ringers who are now well established and, in some cases, have left the county, and a new group of young ringers who are only just beginning to realise their potential in peal ringing. The peal rung on the Vestey Mini-Ring at Halesworth on 6th April, by a predominantly youthful band, with 5 firsts on a mini-ring, indicates that there is no lack of enthusiasm. Mini-bell ringing is a difficult skill, and the band is to be congratulated on this achievement. The List of Conductors also makes positive reading as 6 of the ringers

featured are aged under 30. Louis Suggett and Alex Tatlow maintain their interest in composition. Alex called his own composition of Yorkshire Major at Ixworth on 1st February, and Louis his own composition of Stedman Cinques at St Mary-le-Tower on 6th February. George Salter is also to be congratulated on calling a complex Alan Reading composition of Double Norwich at Ardleigh on 29th July. Stephen Pettman has always been keen to produce musical compositions and has developed an innovative series of compositions of Plain Bob using a 'shunt' call to shorten courses and cut out less musical parts. The Major version, rung at Leiston on 1st September, was particularly difficult to call.

As the number of peal venues declines, the number of Guild towers which used to host one or two peals a year, but now have not been pealed for several years is rising, with the regrettable effect that the difficulty of obtaining permission for a peal attempt can only increase. The peal rung at Clopton on 28th May during the church's flower festival is a good example of peal ringing for a local occasion, which, if organised carefully, can be such good PR for ringing in a local community. Such peals could, perhaps, involve ringers who ring peals infrequently, and thus bring the benefits of peal ringing to a wider cross section of our membership. Finally, I should like to thank David Salter, Brian Whiting and Michelle Williams for all their support in preparing the peals section of this Report.

Safeguarding Statement

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers takes the safeguarding and protection of children (under 18s) and vulnerable adults very seriously. It recognises that the welfare of children and vulnerable adults is paramount and that we have a duty of care when they are in our charge. We will do everything that we can to provide a safe and caring environment whilst they attend our activities. All children and vulnerable adults will be treated with respect and dignity.

Safeguarding Policy

The Guild, as advised by the CCCBR, follows the Safeguarding Procedures of the St Edmundsbury & Ipswich Diocese:

- Local tower arrangements should always be approved by the PCC in line with the Parish Safeguarding Policy¹. The Tower Captain should have a copy of the Parish Safeguarding Policy and ensure that ringers have access to it.
- All Tower Captains and ringing teachers MUST hold a current clear DBS check status IF their role includes the training of children or vulnerable adults
- In such circumstances Tower Captains and ringing teachers must attend Level 2 "face to face" Safeguarding Training (Raising Awareness of Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups) in the Diocese every three years.
- Any ringer involved with training children or vulnerable adults should complete Level 1
 Safeguarding Training (Induction Training) which is available to download from the
 Diocesan website, <u>tinyurl.com/edind</u>. Once completed the form should be seen and
 countersigned by the Parish Safeguarding Officer or the incumbent, who will store it
 securely.³
- Any person requiring safeguarding training in either of the above categories MUST also complete a Confidential Declaration Form, <u>tinvurl.com/edcdec</u>. The completed form should be handed to the incumbent for secure and confidential storage.

A ringer does NOT require a DBS check if acting in a supporting role, unplanned one-off teaching or deputising in an emergency, providing two adults (preferably one of each gender) are present, or transporting children or vulnerable adults as part of arrangements between families.

Where there is cause for concern this should be reported to the Parish Safeguarding Officer or Incumbent immediately.⁴

- The Parish Safeguarding Statement / Policy should be displayed in the church together with the name and contact details of the Parish Safeguarding Officer.

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers Objects, Constitution and Rules - 2014 revision

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- 1 Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
- 2 Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
- 3 Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
- 4 Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of the bells and their fittings.
- 6 Supporting restoration and/or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. NAME

- The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
- 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref. 266869).
- 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule J13, and shall be elected at the AGM.

B. MEMBERSHIP

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
- 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
- 2.2 Associate Member: A Person who wishes to support the Guild.
- 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
- 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside of the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation of an amount at least equal to the subscription payable by a Ringing Member aged between 65 and 74.

C. DISTRICTS

There shall be four Districts, North East, North West, South East and South West. Towers may move from one District to another with the agreement of both Districts and subject to approval by the Guild Management Committee (GMC).

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6.1 The President shall be the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 6.2 A Suffragan Bishop within the Diocese shall be a Vice-President.
- 6.3 Vice-Presidents elected before 2010 shall hold office for life and shall not be required to pay a subscription.

- A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM. Patrons shall hold office without re-election, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM.
- The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the GMC.
- 8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Chairman Technical Advisor Ringing Master
Librarian Secretary Handbells Trustee

Treasurer Peal Secretary Chairman of Belfry Advisory Cmttee

Report Editor Magazine Editor Public Relations Officer
Webmaster Mini Ring Trustee Central Council Reps

- The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to act as Independent Examiner in accordance with The Charities Acts.
- 10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment. The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

- All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
- 12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
- 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
- 13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
- The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be transferred to the Guild Restoration Fund. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
- Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC, but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Advisor. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
- The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
- 17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
- The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
- The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
- 20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.

- The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
- The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

- All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild and the Secretary shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of other Guild assets.
- The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
- 26.1 Fourteen days' notice of any proposed change to the Constitution and Rules of the Guild must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and the Guild website.
- 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from the date given in the proposal.
- 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild, any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild, but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. ELECTION OF MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
- 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year and shall be set at the preceding AGM, or SGM. If a change in subscription has not been passed, the existing rate shall continue.
- 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
- 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
- 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 65 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 75 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM after their nomination has been approved by the GMC. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.

- A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members. Any Non-Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese.
- For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM, but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
- 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
- 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received, election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

- 9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of the Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee, and up to five members from each District, elected in accordance with Rule 20.
- 9.1 Four members of the Committee shall constitute a guorum.
- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two members from each District.
- The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10 and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- The Guild Executive shall consist of: Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee. The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.
- The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
- 15 The GMC may request the attendance of other officers of members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
- The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
- The expenses of Guild Meetings (including District).
- Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
- Guild insurances.
- Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
- Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
- The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
- b) The appropriate peal fees.
- c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

M. DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary/ Treasurer, Magazine Correspondent, two members to serve on the RTC and up to five members to serve on the GMC.
- 20.1 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 20.2 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the Annual District Meeting on the year's work.
- 21 The District Secretary/Treasurer shall:
- Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
- Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
- Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
- Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- The District Magazine Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Magazine, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

The Suffolk Guild handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four sets of handbells:

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

- The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by other member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
- The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without the prior consent of the Trustee.
- The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that Committee.

THE MITSON SHIELD. LESTER BRETT TROPHY AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITION RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- The Mitson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows: Mitson Shield and Lester Brett Trophy
- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
- a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual Report
- b) The ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 3.2 a) For the Mitson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor Method(s). Opening rounds will not be marked.
 - b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Tittums. Marked changes start when the first change is made.

Rose Trophy

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a District or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method (s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 4 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
- The times of the draws are to be advertised in the Ringing World and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 7 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples, a cover bell must be used.
- The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- In the event of a large entry, the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
