9. Reports

The **District Officers Reports** [Chairman, Ringing Master, Belfry Advisory Committee SE District Technical Adviser] and **Treasurer Report** had been distributed via email to all SE District members prior to the meeting and are on the The Suffolk Guild of Ringers website listed under guild Information/SE District/SE District Reports. No questions or comments arose at the meeting.

The **District Area Tower Reports** had been distributed via email to all SE District members prior to the meeting and are on the The Suffolk Guild of Ringers website listed under guild Information/SE District/SE District Reports. A question arose as to why information from Tower Correspondents had been included in the Report this year, and not just information from the current Area Representatives. It was explained that not all Areas of SE District had Area Representatives in 2023 and where Tower Correspondents had shared news by email with the SE District Secretary during 2023, this had been included in this years SE District Area Tower compilation report. Through the Area Representative reports, news from 54 of the 55 towers in the SE District was shared.

The District Ringing Master gave a verbal report on behalf of the SE Representatives on the **Recruitment and Training Committee.** The most recent meeting discussed the awarding of grants, the need for more teachers,

encouraging attendance on ART [Association of Ringing Teachers] M1, M2F and M2C courses, the Golden Bottle Fund, the success of an ART Teaching Hub established in NE District [there is now a Teaching Hub in the SE], Guild Young Ringer Outings and discussions as to whether some training events will begin to be organised and delivered by the Guild.

The District Chairman gave a verbal report on behalf of the SE Representatives on the **Guild Management Committee** [GMC]. The most recent meeting discussed a proposal to increase grants, and matters linked to the Guild handbells. All minutes of this year's GMC meetings can be found on the **Suffolkbells website**.

11. Safeguarding

Members present were encouraged to check they had the current Safeguarding poster up in their ringing chambers **Suffolk Guild of Ringers Safeguarding Requirements poster**.

A reminder was shared that as bell ringing is a volunteer role within the church, safeguarding training is completed as soon as an individual either starts to learn to handle a bell or an experienced bell ringer joins your band. Help your new members to link up with the PSO [Parish Safeguarding Officer].

A member expressed concern that the 'What to do with a Safeguarding Concern' section is confusing to act upon. Their thoughts will be shared with the Diocesan Safeguarding Adviser and appropriate action taken, if required.

Members were directed to the 'Permission to Ring' and 'Permission to Attend an Outside Activity' Young Person permission forms [under 18yrs]. A reminder was shared that these are for every bell ringer across the age group, regardless of ringing ability and membership of the Suffolk Guild.

12. 2024 SE District events programme

The 2023 SE District Ringing Master informed the meeting that initial enquiries have been made for a District Ring from 10.00 - 12.00hrs on Saturday 6th January at Hollesley [TBC].

The 2024 SE District Ringing Master shared his reasoning behind introducing bimonthly Friday evening Surprise Major practices. The first one is at Ufford, 26th January, 19.30 - 21.00hrs. Methods will be from the Standard 8 to begin with. Details of all practices to be found on What's On.

- · test piece
 - method may be 120 changes [Doubles or Minor] or 12 courses of Plain Hunt Doubles/3 or 4 plain courses of Plain Bob Doubles or Grandsire Doubles
 - · call change teams
 - rounds teams
